Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 270.

CLOTHING, GARMENTS, APPAREL AND DRAPERY-SALES BY RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 270.

### Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 267 is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to sales by a retail trader of any goods specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order.

#### Amendment.

3. Prices Regulation Order No. 236, as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 258, is hereby further amended by omitting the First Schedule thereto and inserting in its stead the Schedule to this Order.
