Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337). DECLARING THAT EGGS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- reto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

 (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and

 (b) make such further provision as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner, and to deal with the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 16th day of June, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared eggs to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on 8th February, 1937, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to eggs and egg pulp and assigned to such Board the name of "The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on from and after the sixteenth day of August, 1951, all eggs shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, be divested from the producers of eggs and become vested in and be the absolute property

of The Egg and Egg Plup Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any eggs coming into existence within two (2) years from the sixteenth day of August, 1951, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and to enable The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as owners of the abovementioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such eggs shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act. the said Act.







THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:

as conflicts therewith:—

1. A person shall not remove from any part of a shed, platform, or yard any goods which are in any railway goods yards at which a pass-out docket is issued, unless he has previously obtained from the authorized employee controlling the delivery thereof a pass-out docket containing a complete and accurate record of the said goods.

2. A person who takes delivery of any goods within the said goods yards and before departing therefrom consigns the same for outwards despatch by rail shall at the time of making the said consignment deliver to the employee receiving the goods a pass-out docket containing a complete and accurate record of the goods.

3. (a) A person shall on reaching the checking place at or near an exit from the said goods yards—

(i) stop and permit the employee thereat to inspect

(i) stop and permit the employee thereat to inspect any goods in his possession, including the con-tents of any case, bag, receptacle, or other container; and

- (ii) deliver to the said employee a pass-out docket or dockets containing a complete and accurate record of all goods then in his possession other than goods which he proves have not been removed from any part of the said goods yards.

 (b) A person who delivers to the said employee a pass-out docket or dockets not containing a complete and accurate record of all goods then in his possession shall be guilty of an offence, unless he proves that any goods then in his possession which are not specified on the said docket or dockets have not been removed from any part of the or dockets have not been removed from any part of the

said goods yards.
4. (a) The driver of a road vehicle shall on reaching the checking place at or near an exit from the said goods vards-

stop the said vehicle and permit the employee thereat to inspect any goods in or on the said

vehicle; and

(ii) deliver to the said employee a pass-out docket or dockets containing a complete and accurate record of all goods then in or on the said vehicle.

(b) The driver of a road vehicle who delivers to the said

(b) The driver of a road vehicle who delivers to the said employee a pass-out docket or dockets not containing a complete and accurate record of all goods then in or on the said vehicle shall be guilty of an offence irrespective of whether or not the goods then in or on the said vehicle have been removed from any part of the said goods yards.

5. An offence shall be committed for any failure to comply strictly with the requirements of this By-law, whether such failure was caused or occasioned intentionally, by mistake, inadvertently, or otherwise howsoever.

6. The expression "goods" in this By-law shall include any animal, article, passage, or thing.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932 (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

By deleting clauses 1 to 7 inclusive, under the heading "Overtime," and inserting in lieu thereof the following:---

" Overtime. 1. All time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary hours of work shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter on any day.

2. When a worker is required to work in such a way that he cannot commence his crib by the usual time or within a period of not less than one hour after such commencement, he shall be paid at overtime rates from the commencement of his usual meal time until he is permitted to commence his crib.

3. When a worker is required to continue his shift for more than two hours beyond the usual termination thereof without being notified in time to enable

him before leaving home for work to provide himself with a meal, provision shall be made to procure a meal for him, or else he shall be paid 3s. in lieu thereof. When it appears that such overtime work will extend over a long period, provision shall be made to procure a meal for him as soon as possible after the usual termination of his shift; thereafter he shall be dealt with in accordance with clause (4) hereof.

- 4. A worker working overtime shall be allowed a crib time of 30 minutes without deduction of pay after each four hours of overtime worked, and provision shall be made to procure a meal for him at each such crib interval, or else he shall be paid 3s. in lieu thereof.
- 5. When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, a time shall be stated from which he is to hold himself in readiness; and unless such call has been previously countermanded, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he has held himself in readiness.
- 6. When a worker, having left the employer's premises after completion of his ordinary shift, is recalled to work, he shall be paid at least as for four hours' work at ordinary rates, except where otherwise provided in any other award of this Tribunal.
- 7. The provisions of clause (6) hereof are not to be applied to workers in the grades of foreman carpenter, foreman electrical fitter, foreman fitter, foreman stables, or foreman yards."
- (3) That Award No. 74, dated 19th December, 1950, be varied as set out hereunder:-

By deleting from clause 2 the margin of "43s, 6d," prescribed for the grade of gardener, and inserting in lieu thereof a margin of "48s. 6d."

- (4) That the provisions of this Award shall come into operation-
 - (i) with respect to clause (1), as on and from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in January, 1951;
 (ii) with respect to clause (2), as on and from 19th March, 1950;





- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Insecticides Regulations 1951 and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. If a wholesale dealer in his application for registration of an insecticide claims that an active constituent in such insecticide is diethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate the label required to be affixed to every package of such insecticide shall state this constituent and the proportions thereof as follows:—
 - "diethylparanitrothiophosphate (Parathion)—not less than
- 3. (i) No person shall sell any insecticide consisting of or containing any one or more of the following substances:—
 - (a) diethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers whether known as such or as Parathion, Niram, E605, Phosfone, Paraphos or by any other name;
 - (b) dimethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers whether known as such or by any other name;
 - (c) tetraethylpyrophosphate, whether known as such or as T.E.P.P., Tephos or by any other name;
 - (d) hexaethyltetraphosphate, whether known as such or as H.E.T.P., Hexone, Demite, Hetraphos or by any other name.

unless such insecticide is contained in a package bearing a label on which are printed in accordance with the directions contained in the Schedule hereto the particulars set forth in the said Schedule.

- (ii) No person shall sell any such insecticide-
 - (a) (if it is in the form of a liquid or emulsion) in a package containing less than 1 pint;
 - (b) (if it is in the form of a dust or powder) in a package containing less than 4 lb.

Extremely dangerous and may even be fatal if swallowed, inhaled as vapour, spray or dust, or absorbed through the skin. Exercise extreme care in handling or using. Do not allow contact with the skin. If accidently spilled on skin, immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water. Do not breathe vapour, spray, mist or dust. Wear protective waterproof clothing, rubber gloves and face mask when making up spray liquid or spraying, and when handling or using dust. The face mask should be of the chemical cartridge type with canister of charcoal and filter pad. Wash clothing and gloves daily. Wash hands, arms and face thoroughly with soap and water before eating or smoking. Do not eat or smoke during spraying or dusting. Wash out and destroy empty containers.

Antidote.—Secure on a doctor's prescription an emergency supply of six atropine tablets (1/100 grain) for each person, and keep them handy on the job. The early symptoms may be nausea, headache, giddiness,

blurred vision, contraction of the pupils of the eyes, vomiting. On the first appearance of any of these symptoms, immediately cease work and call a doctor. While awaiting him take one atropine tablet each quarter hour for one hour and then one every half hour for another hour.

To comply with Food and Drug Regulations and to protect pickers, do not spray within three weeks of harvesting.

Important.—Repeated mild effects may be very dangerous. If affected at all avoid further contact until medical approval has been given.

AMENDMENT OF THE URBAN MOTOR OMNIBUS REGULATIONS.

IIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Omnibus Act* 1928 (No. 3742), doth by this Order amend, as set out hereunder, the Urban Motor Omnibus Regulations, i.e.:—

Amend clause "27" to read "27 (1)" and add a new sub-clause thus---

- "27. (2) The driver of any urban motor omnibus shall-
 - (a) upon approaching any railway level crossing cause the vehicle to be brought to a full stop so that the nearest portion of the vehicle shall be within 40 feet, but not less than 10 feet, from the nearest rail of such crossing;
 - (b) before proceeding over such crossing open a door or window situated in the foremost part of the vehicle on the near side or open a window situated in the foremost part of the vehicle on the offside and take all reasonable precautions to satisfy himself that there is no danger from an approaching train or other railway vehicle. The door or window so opened shall not be closed, unless and until the rear of the vehicle has completely cleared such crossing by a distance of at least 10 feet; and
 - (c) cause the vehicle to be driven over such crossing in such a manner as to avoid the necessity for changing gear until the entire length of the vehicle has completely cleared the railway line.

Provided that nothing herein shall apply in respect of a railway crossing which is protected by vehicular road gates and/or booms when such gates or booms are open for the normal passage of road traffic."

Licensing Authority.—Pursuant to the provisions of section 62 (2) of the said Act (No. 3742), the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authorities for the Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong Urban Districts full power and authority for the carrying into effect in their respective districts of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

The door or window so opened shall not be closed, unless and until the rear of the vehicle has completely cleared such crossing by a distance of at least 10 feet; and
 - (c) cause the vehicle to be driven over such crossing in such a manner as to avoid the necessity for changing gear until the entire length of the vehicle has completely cleared the railway line.

Provided that nothing herein shall apply in respect of a railway crossing which is protected by vehicular road gates and/or booms when such gates or booms are open for the normal passage of road traffic."

- (5) On application by any officer or employé who is not a member of the head office secretarial or clerical staff and whose conditions of employment are not covered by an industrial award determination or agreement, the Chief Officer may grant leave of absence in respect of overtime work performed by such applicant: provided that no such leave of absence shall be granted unless—
 - (a) the Chief Officer certifies to the Authority that the overtime was unavoidable and was not due to the applicant's inefficiency or want of diligence; and
 - (b) the Authority approves of the granting of such leave of

The minimum area, depth, width of frontage, and distance of outer walls from frontage and boundaries specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, width of frontage and distance of outer walls from frontage and frontage, and distance of outer walls from frontage and boundaries for land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, the said Council, upon written application being made to it, may permit any person to—

de to it, may permit any person to—

(a) construct a building of Class I. Occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from the boundaries than those specified in column 3 of Table 803 of the Regulations or in this By-law;

(b) construct a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. Occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached, on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 808 of Regulations.

Provided in all such cases that on the day of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area, or was shown on a plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

4. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the Council may, upon written applica-tion being made to it, dispense with the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations.

By-LAW No. 28.

A By-law of the Shire of Chiltern made under Part vII., of the Local Government Act 1946, and numbered 28 for prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence and for the good rule and government of the Municipality. Municipality

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Chiltern order as follows:—

- No person being the owner, hirer, drover, shepherd, or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.
- 2. If any cattle are found without any person having charge of them-
 - (a) in any street, or
 - (b) upon any land (not being a common) which is not enclosed or fenced with some sufficient fence within the meaning of the Fences Act 1928, or any amendment thereof, and the openings (if any) in which fence are not secured and barred with gates or other fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with the fence

any officer of the council authorized in that behalf may seize such cattle and impound them, or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and any person rescuing or attempting to rescue or interfering with cattle placed at any such place of safe custody or seized for the purpose of being placed at any such place shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months.

- 3. The owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not 3.
