Note.—The Board determines that no person shall be employed as an apprentice.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination as amended on the 13th April, 1951, shall remain in force, provided that to the weekly earnings of each pieceworker the sum of 27s. shall be added, provided that where less than 40 hours are worked in any week a proportionate amount shall be added in lieu of such sum.
