



REGULATION 4.

Rescind the whole of clause 16 and substitute therefor the following:—

Leave for Defence Training Purposes.

16. (a) The Minister may grant leave of absence without pay to any member who is a voluntary member of the Citizen Forces for the purpose of attending an annual training camp and not more than two schools, classes, or courses of instruction in any year.

(b) The Minister shall grant leave of absence without pay to any member who, under the provisions of the Commonwealth National Service Act 1951, is required to render service with the Citizen Forces.

- (c) Where the amount of pay (not including any payment by way of overtime, penalty rates, higher duties allowances, or any payment of a temporary character) which a member would have received had he remained on duty, exceeds the amount of pay (including marriage and separation allowances) received by him as a member of the Citizen Forces, he shall be entitled to receive an amount equal to the difference.
- (d) A member may, at his election, be granted any recreation leave due to him in lieu of an equivalent period of leave under this Regulation.
- (e) The Minister shall grant leave of absence with full pay to any member who is required under sections 19 and 22 of the said Act to present himself for medical examination.
- (f) Any member who requires leave under this Regulation shall submit, in writing, an application therefor to the Minister, and, upon completion of the period of such leave he shall furnish satisfactory evidence that he has attended for the purpose for which the leave was granted.
- (g) Except where otherwise provided, any period of leave granted to a member under this Regulation shall not affect his seniority, subdivisional promotion, incremental progression, accruing recreation and sick leave credits or eligibility for long-service leave.
- (h) Any member who, while serving with the Citizen Forces, sustains injury or contracts illness necessitating his absence from duty beyond the period of leave granted under this Regulation, may be granted leave on the following terms:—
 - (i) If compensation is not paid to the member by the Department of Defence in respect of such absence, the leave may be granted as sick leave.
 - (ii) If compensation is paid and is equal to or exceeds the amount of pay which the member would have received had be been granted sick leave, the leave shall be granted without pay.
 - (iii) If compensation is paid and is less than the amount of pay which the member would have received had be been granted sick leave, he may be paid an amount equal to the difference, and his sick leave credit with full pay or half pay (as the case may be) reduced as if he had been granted sick leave for such number of days as is appropriate to the amount of the difference.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO BEDDING AND UPHOLSTERY.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Bedding and Upholstery Regulations 1951, and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. (1) In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—
 - "Approved" means approved in writing by the Commission.
 - "Filling material" means flock, kapok, rags, hair, cotton linters, fibre, or any other material used or likely to be used for the filling of bedding or upholstery.
 - "New rags or clippings or waste material" means any such rags or clippings or waste material which have been obtained from materials which have not been used for the purpose for which they were manufactured or in the manufacture of any other article and have not been previously used for any other purpose.
- (2) Without limiting in any way the generality of the word "dirty" it shall be sufficient proof for the purpose of these Regulations that any filling material (other than new rags or clippings or waste material) is dirty if it be proved in respect of it that it contains more than four parts by weight of free and saline ammonia expressed as ammonia (NH_3) or more than thirty parts by weight of chlorine in one hundred thousand parts by weight of the dry material.
- 3. Every person who carries on the trade of making, remaking, repairing, refilling, or renovating any bedding or upholstery shall cause the premises wherein any of his trade processes are carried on to be properly and sufficiently ventilated in every part, and shall keep such premises in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 4. Every person carrying on any trade, business, or calling which involves any process of teasing, shaking, or renovating hair, fibre, kapok, flock, or other filling material shall cause the dust arising from such process to be effectually caught, collected, and disposed of in such a manner as not to be a danger to health or to cause a nuisance of any kind, and shall cause the compartment wherein any such process is carried on to be effectively enclosed.
- 6. No person engaged in the business of manufacturing or repairing bedding, upholstery, or any similar articles shall receive or retain on the premises at which he conducts such work any filling material unless it is contained in a bale or package legibly and durably branded with the name and address of the maker or packer of such filling material.
- 7. No person engaged in the business of manufacturing or repairing bedding upholstery or any similar articles shall store or have on any premises used for or in connexion with the conduct of any such business any filling materials which are dirty.
- 8. (1) No person shall remake or repair any bedding mattresses or similar articles until the casings or coverings and (except in the case of sponge rubber) the filling material have been boiled for a period of not less than 30 minutes or otherwise completely cleansed by an approved process.

- (2) No person shall sell any upholstery which is dirty or vermininfested.
- 9. The council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as are necessary for such purposes.
- 10. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
