#### EMPLOYERS IN FREEZING CHAMBER.

<sup>2.</sup> Notwithstanding the rates provided in Clause 1, any employee who is required to work in a freezing chamber, the temperature of which does not exceed 40° F., for an aggregate of time exceeding one hour on any day, shall be paid for all work (whether inside or outside the chamber) done on such day at the rate prescribed for chamber hands by the Determination of the Frozen Goods Board.
