AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6, of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## The Fisheries Acts.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS RESPECTING FISHING IN THE GLENMAGGIE RESERVOIR AND THE MACALISTER RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

## PROCLAMATION

His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation as follows:—

(a) Revoke the Proclamation made the tenth day of June, 1931, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventeenth day of June, 1931, respecting prohibition of fishing in the Macalister River below Glenmaggie Weir from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August in each year.

(b) Revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-first day of November, 1938, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-third day of November, 1938, respecting prohibition of fishing in the Macalister River within a distance of 100 yards below the Glenmaggie Weir.

(c) Revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-seventh day of November, 1944, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of November, 1944, respecting prohibition of fishing in the Glenmaggie Reservoir and the Macalister River above the Glenmaggie Weir.

(d) Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Macalister River and its tributaries and their tributaries (and including the waters impounded by the Glenmaggie Weir) above or upstream from its junction with the Thomson River, from the first day of May to the last day preceding the first Saturday in September (both days inclusive) in each year: Provided that all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Macalister River

is prohibited from the first day of May to the last day preceding the first Saturday in October (both days inclusive) in each year, above or upstream from an imaginary line running between two posts situated approximately 100 yards below or downstream from the wall of the Glenmaggie Weir.

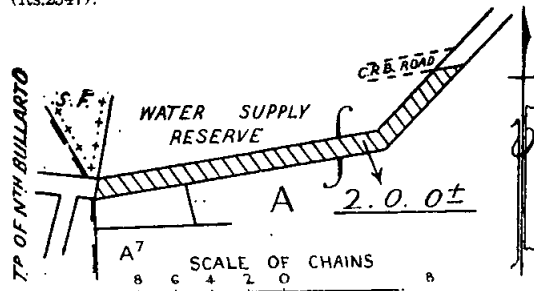

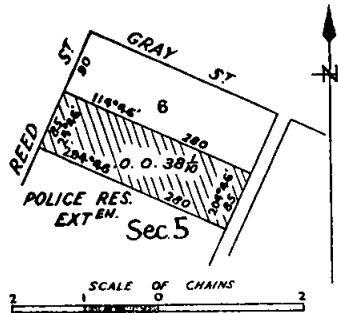

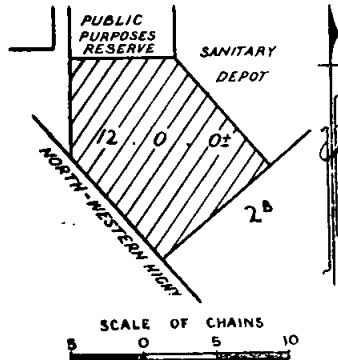

AMENDMENTS OF PRESCRIPTIONS OF CERTAIN METROPOLITAN MOTOR OMNIBUS ROUTES.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order amend, as set out hereunder, the prescriptions of certain routes within the metropolitan area, along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted may ply for hire, viz.:—

## REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 43 of the *Stamps Act 1946* (No. 5204), as amended by Section 2 of the *Stamps (Cheques) Act 1951* (No. 5540), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby makes the following Regulations (that is to say) :—

*Title.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Stamps (Cheques) Act 1951* Regulations and shall be read and construed as one with the *Stamps Regulations 1948*.

*Definitions.*

2. For the purpose of these Regulations :—

“Authorized Printer” means any banker or other person holding an effective written current authority given by the Comptroller of Stamps authorizing him to print cheque forms.

“Cheque Form” means a cheque form having the words “Stamp Duty Paid” printed thereon such cheque form having been printed for and on the order of a banker on the banker’s usual form for supply to the banker’s customers and liable to stamp duty under the provisions of the *Stamps Acts*.

“Licence” means a licence issued pursuant to the provisions of Section 43 (2) (a) of the *Stamps Act 1946*.

“Licensed Banker” means any banker licensed by the Comptroller of Stamps pursuant to the provisions of Section 43 (2) (a) of the *Stamps Act 1946*.

*General Provisions.*

3. Every cheque form issued pursuant to a licence shall have the words “Stamp Duty Paid” printed thereon and such printing shall be in accordance with a design approved by the Comptroller of Stamps.

4. The Comptroller of Stamps is hereby empowered to authorize any banker or other person to print cheque forms. Each such authority shall be in writing. The Comptroller of Stamps may at any time revoke any such authority by notice in writing forwarded by registered post to the last known address of the holder thereof and immediately upon the expiration of seven (7) days from the posting of such notice, such authority shall cease to have any force or effect.

5. No banker or other person unless he is the holder of a current authority issued by the Comptroller of Stamps pursuant to the provisions of Regulation 3 hereof shall print or have printed the words “Stamp Duty Paid” on any cheque form.

6. Within seven (7) days after the date of the dispatch by him of any cheque forms to a licensed banker, an authorized printer shall complete in quadruplicate a return in or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto and shall forward the original thereof to the Comptroller of Stamps, shall retain the duplicate thereof, shall forward the triplicate thereof to the Branch Office of the licensed banker to which the cheque forms have been dispatched and shall forward the quadruplicate thereof to the Head Office for Victoria of the licensed banker. Only forms numbered in sets and issued by the Comptroller of Stamps shall be used for the purpose of these returns. All such forms shall be used by the authorized printer in consecutive order and all forms issued to him shall be accounted for to the Comptroller of Stamps.

7. An authorized printer shall not deliver any cheque forms to any person other than a licensed banker.

8. Within seven (7) days after the end of the month immediately succeeding any month in which a licensed banker receives cheque forms from an authorized printer, such licensed banker shall complete a return in or to the effect of Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto of all cheque forms so received by him within that month and shall forward such return to the

Comptroller of Stamps together with the receipted triplicate copy or copies of Form No. 1 relating to such cheque forms and a remittance for the amount of the value of the stamp duty payable in respect of such cheque forms.

9. Any authorized printer and any licensed banker shall at all reasonable times permit the Comptroller of Stamps or any person on his behalf authorized by him so to do to inspect books, records or documents that have reference to cheque forms printed pursuant to these Regulations.

10. The provisions of Part III. of the *Stamps Act* 1946 relating to allowance of spoiled stamps shall apply to cheque forms printed and issued pursuant to these Regulations, but no allowance shall be made in respect of the stamp duty paid on any such cheque forms unless the application therefor is made by the licensed banker who paid the stamp duty sought to be recovered and is accompanied by a statutory declaration by a responsible officer of such licensed banker setting forth such information as the Comptroller of Stamps may require.

11. Any banker, printer or other person committing any breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds in respect of each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BALLAN PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 12th December, 1950, as a site for Public Park and Public Recreation in the Town of Ballan, together with the abutting permanent reservation along the Werribee River, both of which are indicated by red colour on plan "B" over 2.10.50 attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Rs.6597, and known as the "Ballan Public Park and Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve," such reservation having been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (d) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any, building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage, and pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve, unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee and approved of by the Board of Land and Works.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and

be taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
