Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 277.

SUGAR.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

*Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 277.

*Definitions and Interpretations.*

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—  
“Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.  
“Ton” means 2,240 pounds weight avoirdupois.  
“By Wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of sugar, that such sale is of a quantity in excess of 70 pounds.

*Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Metropolitan Area.*

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which sugar of the description specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale in the Metropolitan Area to be the price specified in that Schedule.

*Maximum Prices—Sales By Wholesale—Outside Metropolitan Area.*

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which sugar of the description specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale in Victoria other than in the Metropolitan Area to be the price specified in such Schedule plus the actual cost of transporting the sugar from the Metropolitan Area to the seller's place of business but not in any case in excess of the current freight charges of the Victorian Railway Commissioners for the transport of a like quantity of sugar from Yarraville Railway Station to the Railway Station nearest to the seller's place of business.

*Discounts.*

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare that where payment for the sugar is made within seven (7) days from the date of sale a reduction shall be made in the price set out in the Schedule to this Order of not less than three (3) per cent. or where payment is made within thirty (30) days from the date of sale a reduction shall be made in the price set out in the Schedule to this Order of not less than two and a half (2½) per cent. of such price.

*Delivery of Invoices.*

6. Every person who sells or has for sale in Victoria sugar the maximum price of which is fixed by or under this Order shall deliver with the sugar an invoice or docket containing the following particulars :—

- (i) Name and address of seller ;
- (ii) Name and address of purchaser ;
- (iii) The date of sale ;
- (iv) Full description of grade and weight of sugar ;
- (v) The price charged.

*Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.*

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which sugar specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
