WANGARATTA SUB-REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE, COMPRISING REPRESENTATIVES OF THE MUNICIPALITIES OF THE BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA, THE SHIRE OF OXLEY, AND THE SHIRE OF WANGARATTA.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

THE Wangaratta Sub-Regional Planning Committee, comprising representatives of the Municipalities of the Borough of Wangaratta, the Shire of Oxley, and the Shire of Wangaratta, hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority," having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme, in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. *Schedule of Land Affected:* All the land contained within the boundaries of the Parishes of Wangaratta North and Wangaratta South, Counties of Bogong, Delatite, and Moira.



REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE USE OF X-RAY
FLUOROSCOPY IN SHOE-FITTING.

WHEREAS the use of X-ray machines in connexion with shoe-fitting may endanger the health of persons operating such machines or of other persons:

And whereas it is necessary in order to safeguard the health of persons operating such machines or of other persons that the amount of exposure to the radiations given off by such machines should be controlled:

And whereas in order to prevent excessive radiation from such machines it is necessary that the design and construction of such machines should be controlled:

And whereas it is provided amongst other things by section 95 of the *Health Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 10 of the *Health Act* 1941, that the Governor in Council may make Regulations safeguarding the public health and the health of persons engaged in such processes and occupations as are likely to endanger or impair health:

Now therefore, by virtue of and pursuant to such powers and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the X-ray Fluoroscopy (Shoe-Fitting) Regulations 1951, and shall come into operation two months after publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

“X-ray Machine” means any device which is capable of producing X-rays, and includes the high tension supply and all the equipment of such device.

“Fluoroscopy” means the visual examination of the structure of an object made by placing the object in a beam of X-rays directed towards a screen coated with fluorescent material and observing the image on the screen.

“Dosage” means the amount of radiation delivered, expressed in rontgens or millirontgens (a millirontgen being 1/1000 of a rontgen).

“Exposure” as referring to actual viewing of the foot or feet, shall mean a single viewing of one shoe or pair of shoes on the feet.

“Shoes” includes boots and other footwear.

3. (1) A person shall not install or maintain or cause to be installed or maintained any X-ray machine for the purpose of shoe-fitting unless he is in possession of a current licence or renewal of a licence to do so in respect of such machine from the Secretary of the Commission, in the form of the First Schedule to these Regulations.

(2) A person shall not install, maintain, or operate any X-ray machine for shoe-fitting unless the licence number is displayed on the machine on a warning notice.

(3) Every such licence or renewal thereof unless previously revoked shall remain in force until the thirty-first day of December of the year in which it was issued and may be renewed annually.

(4) Every application for a licence or renewal thereof shall be made in writing on a form supplied by the Department of Health, in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and shall set out the particulars shown therein.

(5) Such application shall be signed by the applicant or, in the case of a body corporate, by a person duly authorized by such body corporate to make the application in its name and on its behalf, and lodged with the Secretary of the Commission.

(6) Unless an exact model of the X-ray machine, for which a licence is sought, has already been approved by the Commission, such application shall be accompanied by—

- (a) the X-ray machine itself or an exact model thereof; and
- (b) plan and specification of such machine.

(7) Every application for a renewal of a licence shall be made not less than 28 days before the expiration of such licence and shall quote the number of such licence.

(8) Any licence or renewal thereof issued under these Regulations may be revoked at any time by the Commission for contravention of any part of these Regulations or such other cause as deemed sufficient by the Commission.

4. An X-ray machine used for shoe-fitting shall be so constructed and maintained that—

- (1) the maximum permissible output of such machine shall be as set out in the Third Schedule hereto;
- (2) the milliamperage and kilovoltage are maintained within the limits required in order to ensure that the maximum permissible output is not exceeded;
- (3) the X-ray tube is provided with a filter equivalent to not less than 1.0 millimetre of aluminium;
- (4) the exposure is automatically terminated when the maximum dosage per exposure set out in the Third Schedule hereto has been reached;
- (5) the dosage rate in any region which may be occupied by the operator or operators of the machine shall not exceed the amount set out in the Sixth Schedule hereto;
- (6) the only apertures through which any part of the body may be exposed to the useful beam are those provided for the insertion of the feet.

5. The X-ray machine shall be so located and orientated and screened that scattered radiation from the front of the machine does not exceed the value set out in the Sixth Schedule hereto in any region which may be occupied by any person other than the examinee.

6. (1) The switch by which an X-ray machine used for shoe-fitting is operated shall be—

- (a) of such a nature that it cannot be operated without a key; or
- (b) so placed as to be inaccessible from the public part of the premises in which the said machine is installed.

(2) If such switch is operated by a key, such key shall not be left in the switch when such machine is not in use.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

*Maximum Permissible Dosage for Exposure of Customers, and
Maximum Permissible Number of Exposures.*

The output of the machine shall not exceed 12 röntgens per minute as measured at the upper surface of the fluorescent screen.

The dose per exposure shall not exceed 1 röntgen.

There shall not be more than three exposures per day, nor more than twelve exposures per year for each customer.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Warning to the Public.—Danger.

Repeated exposures to X-rays may be harmful, even the exposure of human feet in shoes. You must not view your feet by X-rays more than three (3) times in any one day, nor more than twelve (12) times in any year, and you should not view your feet by X-rays unless you are wearing shoes.

FIFTH SCHEDULE.

Instructions for Operators of X-ray Shoe-Fitting Machines.

Excessive exposure to the X-rays from this machine may be harmful to both sales people and customers.

The feet should not be exposed to the X-rays in the machine for more than five (5) seconds at a time.

The feet should not be exposed to the X-rays in the machine for more than three (3) times in any one day, and not more than twelve (12) times in any one year. People should not view their feet by X-rays unless they are wearing shoes.

Before permitting a customer to view the feet in the machine, you should inquire whether he or she has had other exposures to X-rays in such a machine, and if so, then how many times and when.

Customers must not be allowed to operate the machine.

The machine must be switched off when not actually in use.

It is advisable for operators of these machines to be examined by a medical practitioner and have a blood examination done at least once per year.





EXCISION SCHEDULE N°106 PLAN B ^{51/1321}_{37.8.31.}







VARIATION OF SPECIFICATION FOR SCHEME OF
PRIVATE STREET CONSTRUCTION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government (Private Streets Construction) Act 1947*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1949*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, being satisfied that owing to shortages in supplies of materials, the works provided for in the scheme adopted by the Council of the City of Preston for the construction of Viola and Cleeland streets and parts of Spring and Henty streets, being private streets within the municipal district of the said city, cannot be satisfactorily executed in accordance with the specifications, maps, plans, sections, and elevations in the scheme, doth by this Order, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, authorize the Council of the City of Preston to execute the works with the following variation of the said specifications, viz.:-

The paragraphs under the headings "Asphaltic Base Course" and "Bituminous Top Coat" shall be deleted and replaced by the following paragraphs:-

Asphaltic Base Course:

A layer of clean, evenly graded 3-in. screenings shall be spread to a loose thickness of 3 inches, and consolidated with a mechanical footpath roller weighing not less than 1½ ton. Should any patches of dirt, dust, or fine material appear after rolling, they shall be removed and fresh screenings added and rolled.

The screenings shall then be given a penetration spray with No. 2 grade distilled tar, applied hot at the rate of ½ gallon per square yard. Spraying shall be by an approved hand sprayer or hand spraying attachment to a large sprayer, and care shall be taken to ensure that there is no splashing of fences, kerbs, or channels. The contractor will be held responsible for all damage caused to the property during spraying.

Immediately after the tar is applied, the path shall be given a light covering of ½-in. screenings and thoroughly broomed and rolled, the wheels of the roller being kept oiled to prevent the lifting of the pavement. Should, during this rolling, any of the base course be damaged or be covered with dirt or other foreign material, it shall be replaced by the contractor at no additional expense.

After the rolling has been completed to the satisfaction of the engineer or his representative, the contractor shall apply a seal coat of emulsion at the rate of ½ gallon per square yard.

Immediately after the emulsion is applied, the path shall be covered with a light covering of ¾-in. gauge screenings and thoroughly broomed and rolled, the wheels of the roller being kept oiled to prevent the lifting of any part of the pavement. Any damaged pavement shall be removed and replaced in accordance with the specification.

Bituminous Top Coat:

Within seven days of consolidation of the base course, the contractor shall spread a premix carpet layer at the rate of 1 cubic yard to 40 square yards. The premix so used shall consist of—

mixed with not less than 11 gallons of cut back bitumen binder, and shall be dragged by a long base drag to an even surface and rolled with a mechanical roller weighing not less than 1½ ton.

Any unevenness in the surface shall be removed and replaced with new material.

Within fourteen days of the application of the premix, the whole of the surface of the path shall be spread with emulsion at the rate of 1/6th gallon per

square yard and covered with clean grit or coarse sand at the rate of 1 cubic yard to 300 square yards, and shall be broomed so that a smooth, even surface shall result.



AMENDMENT OF COOKING TRADE APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation 13 of the Cooking Trade Apprenticeship Regulations, and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. For Regulation 13 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following:—

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

13. (a) The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer in the said trade at any time and in any place shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trade in such place.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) of this Regulation, an employer may, with the consent of the Commission and upon satisfying the Commission that he has the training facilities deemed adequate by the Commission for the training of each apprentice concerned, employ apprentices in the said trade in excess of the proportion prescribed by the said sub-clause. Any apprentice employed pursuant to this sub-clause (b) shall not be included for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices who may otherwise be employed in accordance with the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof.

(c) For the purposes of this Regulation—

- (i) an employer working at the trade shall be deemed to be a journeyman;
- (ii) the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trade by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time; and
- (iii) "apprentices" means apprentices or probationers.

2. The rescission of any Regulations by these Regulations shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or the liability of any person under such rescinded Regulations, where such right accrued or such liability was incurred prior to the coming into operation of these Regulations.







REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WHITWAM RESERVE," MARKET-STREET, NEWPORT.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the municipal district of Williamstown, at Newport, reserved by Order in Council of 6th March, 1951, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Whitwam Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

- The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—
 - 1st Division.—Bowling green.
 - 2nd Division.—Tennis courts and tennis pavilion.
 - 3rd Division.—Remainder of the Reserve.
- The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, lawns, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person shall climb or jump over the gates in or around the Reserve, nor stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, gates, fences, seats, or trees, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind, therein.
- No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any dog, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person shall camp in the Reserve.
- No person shall erect in the Reserve any structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve any article or articles without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or notice and fixed or set by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

13. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

15. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of membership of any of the clubs playing bowls or tennis in the Reserve, or any part thereof, with the consent of the Committee of Management:—

- (a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Walking on the bowling greens or tennis courts at any time, unless entitled to use the same as provided in Regulation No. 18 hereof, and unless wearing rubber-soled footwear without heels.
- (d) Crossing or trespassing on the playing areas of the bowling and tennis clubs during the progress of a match or practice.

16. Public betting in any part or division of the Reserve shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

17. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

18. No person shall be entitled to play any game or practice, or take part in such practice, in any part or division of the Reserve, unless he be a member or authorized guest of one of the clubs that have been granted permission, in writing, to play or practice, as the case may be, by the Committee of Management, and unless he can produce, on demand, satisfactory evidence that he is a member or authorized guest of the clubs: Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Second Division of the Reserve and play tennis thereon, on paying to the club or association for the time being permitted to use the Second Division of the Reserve, or to the Committee of Management, a reasonable amount as court fee.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the City of Williamstown as a Committee of Management thereof, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

Security.—Five per cent. of total amount of tender accepted, but in no case will security of less than £3 be received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information afforded to persons tendering.

Should the tenderer be in a position to supply a suitable substitute of Commonwealth production or manufacture in place of any sample exhibited that may be of imported origin, he may tender for such substitute, but must submit with his tender a sample of the article offered.

In all cases the country of origin of the articles tendered must be stated, and the total cost of each item extended in the columns provided.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit book, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of one year, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ————" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Common-

wealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly received, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a

triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in Clause 7.

15. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest of otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for supplies to Technical Schools, or by any article being made at any Government establishment and supplied for the use of the Education Department, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in Clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated

therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

REGULATION No. 5.

Amended Regulation for the Care, Protection, and Management of the Essendon Recreation Reserve.

WHEREAS, by section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Essendon (now called the City of Essendon), and to their successors in respect of land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 20th February, 1884, as a site for Public Recreation in the municipal district of Essendon, and known as the "Essendon Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve": Now therefore in view of the power conferred as aforesaid and every other power so enabling, the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Essendon do hereby rescind Regulation No. 5 of the Regulations made in 1949 in respect of the said Reserve and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following Regulation (to be numbered 5):—

REGULATION.

(5). No charge or fee for admission to the Reserve shall exceed six shillings for each adult person and two shillings for each child under the age of 12 years and over 4 years old.

Resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council on the 7th day of May, 1951, and confirmed on the 18th day of June, 1951.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

By-Law No. 122.

A By-law of the City of Essendon, made under the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts, and numbered 122, for regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any animals in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power thereunto enabling it, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon order as follows:—

1. For the purposes of this By-law the word "dog" shall mean and include a dog of either sex over the age of six months.

2. By-law No. 110 of the City of Essendon is hereby repealed.

3. No person shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any greyhound on any premises occupied by him save in accordance with and during the currency of a permit in writing issued by the Council.

4. No person shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept on any premises occupied by him more than two dogs save in accordance with and during the currency of a permit in writing issued by the Council.

5. Every permit issued pursuant to clause 3 or clause 4 hereof shall expire at the expiration of a period of twelve months from the date of the issue thereof but may be from time to time renewed by the Council for a period not exceeding twelve months.

6. The occupier of any premises upon which a dog is kept shall cause the kennel run or yard in which such dog is kept to be at all times maintained in a clean wholesome and sanitary state and condition to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector of the Council.

7. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day upon which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Essendon, and shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD.

By-LAW No. 22.

Traffic and Parking.

A By-law of the Borough of Ringwood, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 22, for repealing By-law No. 4, for suppressing nuisances, regulating traffic and processions, prohibiting or minimizing noises in any public highway, appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars, regulating the driving of cattle in or along any specified streets, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ringwood order as follows:—

In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Driver" means the person in charge of a vehicle or a horse.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the municipality habitually used by pedestrians and not generally used for vehicular traffic.

"Safety zone" means a place of refuge for pedestrians prescribed in any street.

"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

"Instrument" means any instrument, device, or thing whatsoever capable of making or being used for making sound or noise and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes any loudspeaker, amplifier, broadcasting set, wireless receiving set, gramophone, piano, player piano, or other instrument or device.

"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle whether or not such streets cross.

"Traffic-control signal" includes any device using coloured lights or words, or any combination thereof, whether operated mechanically, electrically, manually, or otherwise by which traffic is directed to stop and/or proceed.

1. The driver of a vehicle or horse reaching the intersection of two streets at approximately the same time as another vehicle or horse which is on his off or right side shall give the right of way to such other vehicle or horse: Provided that this clause shall not apply to an intersection where an officer of the Council or a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic or a traffic-control signal is installed and is operating.

2. (a) The portions of the streets or roads specified in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as standing places for motor cars.

(b) The portions of the streets or roads specified in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as standing places for hackney carriages.

(c) The portions of the streets or roads specified in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as safety zones.

3. No person shall drive any vehicle, or any part thereof, or drive, ride, or load any horse either over, along, through, or on any safety zone.

4. The driver of a vehicle or a horse shall while driving the same in any street keep such vehicle or horse as near as practicable to the left or near side of the carriage-way of such street.

5. No person shall allow a vehicle to remain without any person in charge thereof in any of the following places:—

- (a) Within 30 feet of any intersection;
- (b) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway or within 20 feet of points on the kerb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone;
- (c) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (d) in front of a private driveway;
- (e) alongside or opposite any street, excavation, or obstruction when traffic would be obstructed.

6. The driver of a vehicle upon any street shall not stop such vehicle for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger or goods save as near as may be to the footpath on the left or near side of such vehicle.

7. The driver of a vehicle or horse shall, on the sounding of the warning bell of a fire brigade vehicle, ambulance, or police patrol car, give the right of way to such fire brigade vehicle, ambulance, or police patrol car, and shall draw his vehicle or horse as near as practicable to the footway on the left or near side of the street and parallel thereto in order to allow such fire brigade vehicle, ambulance, or police patrol car to pass.

8. No person shall drive any vehicle, or drive, ride or lead any horse upon any street in such manner or in such order that more than two vehicles and/or horses are travelling side by side in the same direction: Provided that this clause shall not prevent three horses abreast being attached to one vehicle or prevent any vehicle from passing two bicycles travelling side by side in the same direction.

9. (i) Every person alighting from a vehicle shall, as soon after alighting therefrom as the exigencies of traffic permit, pass by the shortest and most direct route to the footway which is nearest to him at the time of alighting as aforesaid.

(ii) No person while waiting to board a vehicle shall stand on any portion of the carriage-way of a street or move on to or across such carriage-way until such vehicle has stopped to take up such person or for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers.

(iii) This clause shall not apply to any person upon a safety zone.

10. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to the left or near side of such footway and shall when overtaking any person pass on the right or off side of such person.

11. No pedestrian shall cross the carriage-way of any street, or any part thereof, except by the shortest line from the point on the footway from which he left the same to the other footway of such street. (This clause shall not apply to pedestrians crossing the gardens or tree reserves set out in Maroondah Highway, Ringwood.)

12. (1) Every person shall at all times observe and comply with any notice, indication, or sign given, made, or displayed by any traffic control signal now or at any time hereafter to be erected or established by the Council of the Borough of Ringwood, and in particular shall stop for so long or proceed in such manner and direction as shall be notified or indicated by such traffic control signal as aforesaid—

(a) The colour amber in the aforesaid traffic control signal is a notice that—

- (i) No driver of a vehicle or horse facing such traffic control signal shall cause such vehicle or horse to proceed beyond the stop mark (if any) on the approach side of such intersection, or if there be no such stop mark to enter such intersection until such traffic control signal changes so as to display the colour green.
- (ii) No pedestrian facing such traffic control signal shall proceed beyond the kerb alignment of the footway of the street which he is approaching until such traffic control signal changes so as to display the colour green.

(b) The colour green in the aforesaid traffic control signal is a notice that—

- (i) The driver of a vehicle or horse facing such traffic control signal shall, subject to the provisions of this By-law, proceed forthwith.

- (ii) A pedestrian facing such traffic control signal and about to cross such intersection shall, subject to the provisions of this By-law, proceed forthwith.
- (c) The colour red in the aforesaid traffic control signal is a notice that the driver of a vehicle or horse facing such traffic control signal or a pedestrian facing such traffic control signal and about to cross such intersection shall remain stationary until such traffic control signal changes so as to display the colour green.
- (2) Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any such notice, indication, or sign given, made, or displayed as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- (3) Any person who, not being an officer or employee of the Council or otherwise authorized by the Council, shall destroy, remove, or in any manner interfere with any such traffic control signal as aforesaid, or any part thereof, respectively, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
13. No person shall erect or use in the vicinity of such traffic control signal or of any street intersection any coloured light or sign which imitates or resembles or may reasonably be confused with or which obscures a traffic control signal.
14. No person shall wilfully deface, injure, move, obstruct, or interfere with any traffic control signal or traffic sign or notice.
15. No person shall in any street or road alight from or board or join a vehicle which is in motion.
16. No person shall leave any vehicle stationary in any street unless all the left or near side wheels of such vehicle are parallel with and not more than 10 inches from (where such street has a kerbed footway on the left or near side of such vehicle) the kerb of such footway or (where such street has no kerbed footway on the left or near side of such footway) the edge of the carriage-way on the left or near side of such vehicle and unless every such vehicle is not less than 3 feet from every part of any other stationary vehicle.
17. No person shall stop, stand, or leave any vehicle in any street in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave less than 10 feet of the width of the carriage-way or such street available for the free movement of traffic.
18. No person riding a bicycle, motor car coaster, or any toy vehicle shall cling to or attach his vehicle or himself to any other vehicle upon any street.
19. The driver of a vehicle shall not in any street or road drive the same backwards unless such movement can be made without danger to other traffic.
20. In the event of any accident, collision, or commotion, or any congestion of or obstruction to traffic in any street, the driver of any vehicle or horse in the vicinity thereof shall at all times obey the reasonable direction or instruction of an officer of the Council or a member of the Police Force.
21. No person shall march, drive, ride, or take part in any procession which is held or takes place or proceeds contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law.
22. (i) Every person shall upon any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council, in order to enforce the due observance of any law, By-law, regulation, or lawful notice, holding up his hand or giving an order or direction, stop for so long or proceed in such manner and direction as such member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council deems necessary to allow free space between any persons, procession or vehicles, or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.
- (ii) If any horse or vehicle in his charge is causing or is likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council to remove such horse or vehicle, remove the same either from the vicinity or to some such adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as is indicated by the member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.
23. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footpath.
24. No person shall throw, place, or leave upon any public highway any orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter.
25. No person shall in any street carry upon a vehicle any material, article, or thing which whether forming the whole or part only of the load projects more than 2 feet outside the line of the wheels of the vehicle.
26. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage.

27. (1) No person shall in or upon any land, house, building, or place, make or cause or permit or suffer to be made or caused such a volume or amount of sound or noise as to be an annoyance or nuisance to any other person being in or upon any other land, house, building, or place in or upon any public highway—

- (a) by shouting out, calling out, haranguing, or singing, or
- (b) by using, operating, controlling, sounding, or playing any instrument.
- (2) No person shall in any public highway cause, permit, or suffer to be caused any noise—
- (a) by shouting, calling out, haranguing, or singing, or
- (b) by using, operating, controlling, sounding, or playing any instrument.

28. No person shall sell any food from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, box, basket, bag, or other vehicle or receptacle standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the area set forth in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

29. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) any motor car or other vehicle standing in any part of any street or road specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto, provided always that nothing in this clause contained shall prevent any trader in the course of his business leaving for a period not exceeding 10 minutes a motor car or other vehicle standing on the north side of Maroondah Highway between its intersection with the west side of Adelaide-street and a point 185 feet westerly therefrom for the purpose of delivering goods to any shop before half-past 4 o'clock in the afternoon of any week-day other than Saturday or before the hour of 9 o'clock in the morning of any Saturday, and no person shall leave (whether unattended or not) any motor car or other vehicle (other than a hackney carriage) standing in any part of any street or road specified in the Second Schedule.

30. No person shall feed any horse in any street or road except by means and out of a sound nosebag attached to the head of the horse.

31. (a) No person shall drive any cattle in or along any street specified in the Sixth Schedule, paragraph No. 1, hereto.

(b) No person shall between the hours of 6 o'clock in the forenoon and 9 o'clock in the afternoon of any day drive any cattle in or along any street specified in the Sixth Schedule, paragraph No. 2, hereto.

32. This By-law shall, except as herein expressly provided, apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the municipality.

33. By-law No. 4 of the Borough of Ringwood is hereby repealed.

34. See By-law No. 9, also applying to traffic in the vicinity of the Soldiers' Memorial Tower.
