PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1949* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specify a day on from and after which any vermin shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land within the whole of Victoria or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the second day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, as the day on from and after which certain vermin, to wit rabbits, shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land within the whole of Victoria.

PROCLAMATION

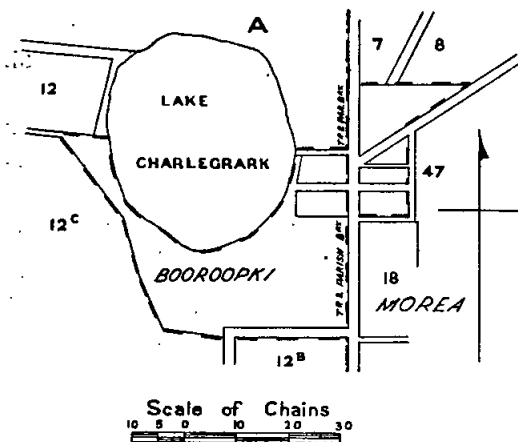

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 11th November, 1875, defining certain areas of land as Villages in so far as it refers to the Boorookpi Village (see *Government Gazette 1875*, page 2168) reduced in area by Proclamation dated 8th April, 1913 (see *Government Gazette 1913*, page 1865) and the Proclamation dated 1st November, 1886, defining a certain area of land as a Township at Boorookpi, in the Parish of Morea (see *Government Gazette 1886*, page 3122), and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Boorookpi the area of land in the Parishes of Boorookpi and Morea, County of Lowan, within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(B.664(2, 4, 6) (M.518(3) (C.94053).

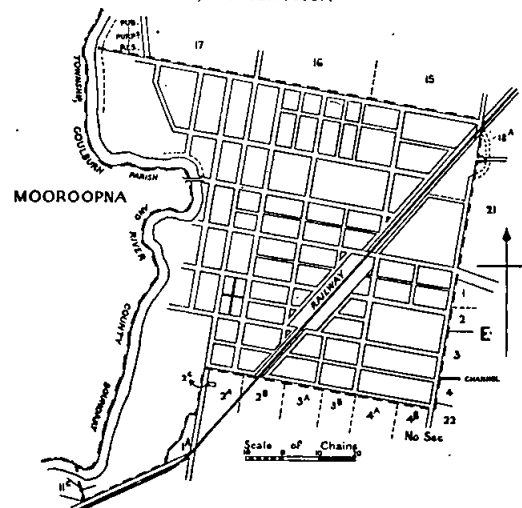

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act*

1933, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Order dated 29th July, 1852, fixing a site for a Village at Skipton, at Wright and Montgomery's Station on the Emu Creek (see *Government Gazette* 1852, page 801), and the Order dated 15th October, 1852, fixing the site for a Township at Skipton on the Emu Creek on the road from Geelong to the Grange, at Messrs. 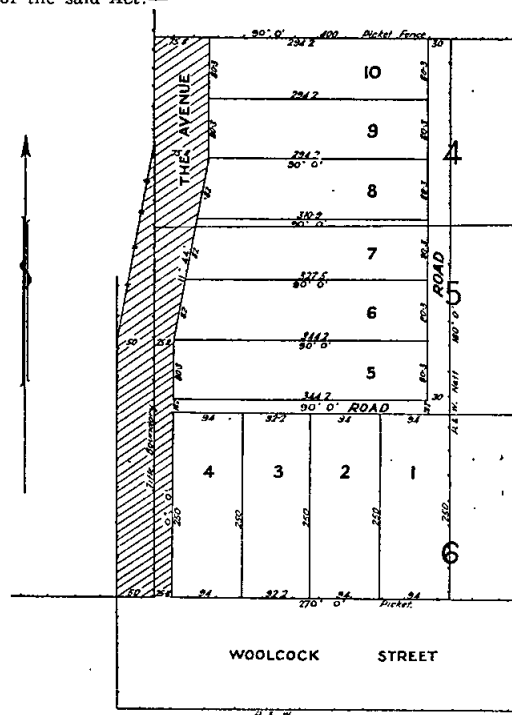

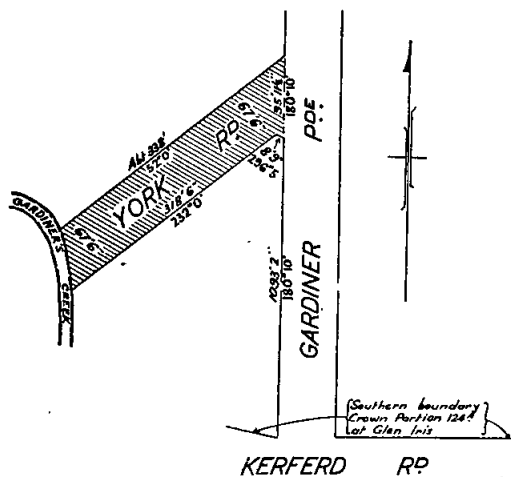

Nurses Acts.

AMENDMENT TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria by virtue of the provisions of section 29 of the *Nurses Act* 1928, as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following amendments to the Nurses Regulations 1941 as amended by any Regulations, which amendments shall come into force on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

1. These Regulations shall be known as the Amending Nurses Regulations 1952 (No. 2), and shall be read and construed as one with the Nurses Regulations 1941, and any regulations amending the same.

2. In these Regulations "midwife" shall mean "midwife within the meaning of the *Midwives Act* 1928", and "midwives" shall have a corresponding meaning.

3. All or any of the provisions of the Nurses Regulations relating to the election by registered nurses of five registered nurses as members of the Nurses Board shall with such adaptations as are necessary also apply to and in relation to the election by midwives of a midwife as a member of the Nurses Board.

4. Without affecting the generality of the last preceding Regulation in the extension and application by these Regulations of any provision of the Nurses Regulations to and in relation to such election of a midwife, any reference to "registered nurse", "representatives of registered nurses", "nurses", "nurse under the Nurses Acts", "Nurses Register", "five", "five votes", or "five candidates", shall be read and construed as "midwife", "representative of midwives", "midwives", "midwife under the *Midwives Act* 1928", "Midwives Register", "one", "one vote", or "candidate" respectively.

RULES OF COURT UNDER THE CRIMES ACT 1928, PART V.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part V. of the *Crimes Act* 1928 and all other powers hereunto enabling, the following Rule of Court is made and shall take effect from the date on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*:—

Rule 23 is deleted and the following Rule substituted therefor:—

23. An appellant after he has duly served Notice of Appeal or of application for leave to appeal, or of application for extension of time within which under the Act such notices shall be given may abandon his appeal or application as the case may be without leave of the Court by giving notice of abandonment thereof, in the Form III. in the Schedule to these Rules, to the Prothonotary, at a time not later than two clear days prior to the date on which his appeal or application is to be heard and at any later time by leave of the Full Court.

Upon such notice being given or leave being granted by the Full Court the appeal or application shall be deemed to have been dismissed from the date on which such notice was given or such leave granted.

SHIRE OF KANIVA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1953 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KANIVA.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Kaniva Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rate and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1953 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Kaniva, as such district has been proclaimed and defined.

For the supply of water for domestic purposes, a rate is hereby made of Two shillings and three pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of such lands

and tenements. Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust shall be an amount equal to the district rate of Two shillings and three pence in the pound on the valuation of the property by the Trust, provided that such charge shall not be less than Forty shillings. Allowance and excess water to be at district charge per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

Public Institutions and Others.—The charge for water supplied to all Government Departments shall be by special agreement, or shall be an amount equal to the district rate of Two shillings and three pence in the pound on the valuation of the property by the Trust, provided that such charge shall not be less than Forty shillings. Meter to be installed if required by Trust; allowance and excess water to be at district charge per 1,000 gallons. Water supplied to churches shall be by measure at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied to parks and recreation grounds, and cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs, the charge shall be subject to arrangements with the Trust.

Water Troughs.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twelve shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

Period of Rate.—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1953, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1953, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of February, 1953, at the office of the said Trust. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate and charges.

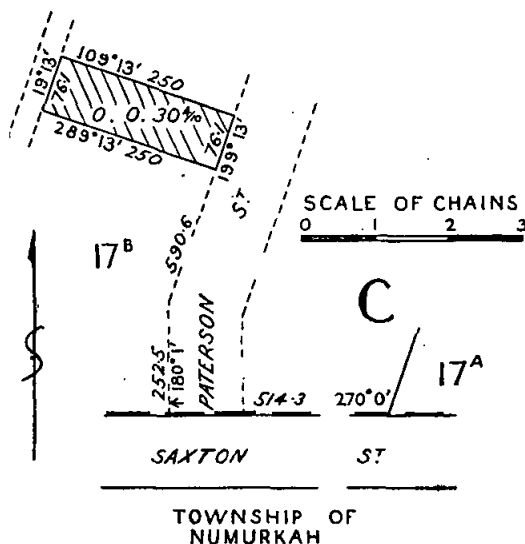

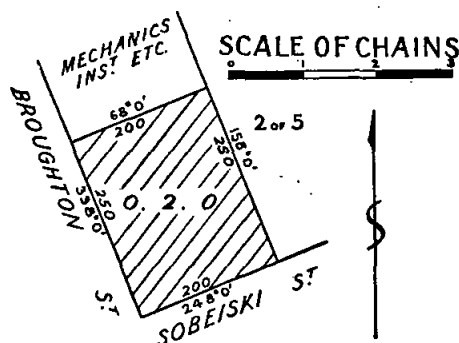

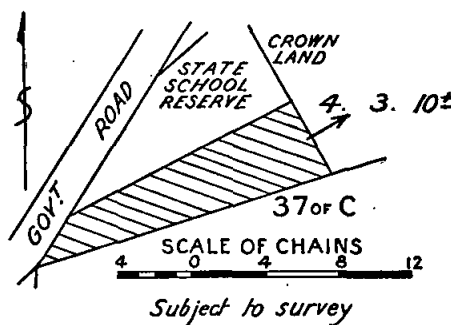

WHEREAS the Tawonga District General Hospital is an incorporated institution within the meaning of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1948*: And whereas it appears to a majority of the members of the Committee of Management thereof that a new Nurses Hostel at the said hospital should be completed: And whereas the Hospitals and Charities Commission is satisfied that the work proposed to be done would assist the said hospital in carrying into effect the objects for which it was incorporated: And whereas the said Commission has reported that the said hospital has no money or funds which may be applied to the completion of this work and has recommended that the said hospital be authorized to raise Four thousand five hundred pounds to complete this work.

REGULATIONS—CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL ON PRE-SCHOOL
CHILD DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 11 of the *Ministry of Health Act* 1943, the Minister of Health may by Order under his hand establish a Consultative Council in respect of such matters and consisting of a chairman and such number of members as are specified in the Order:

And whereas the said Minister of Health did on the 24th day of November, 1952, establish a Consultative Council on Pre-School Child Development:

And whereas pursuant to the said section, the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to—

- (a) prescribing the powers and duties of consultative councils established under that section and of the chairman and other members thereof, and
- (b) generally, carrying into effect the objects of that section:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

These Regulations may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Pre-School Child Development) Regulations, 1952.

DEFINITIONS.

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context—

"Council" means the Consultative Council on Pre-School Child Development, appointed by the Minister on the 24th day of November, 1952, and includes such persons as may be appointed thereto subsequent to that date.

"Member" means a person (other than an officer of the Departments of Education or Health appointed to act as an observer only) appointed by the Minister as Chairman or member of the Council.

"Minister" means the Minister of Health.

"Pre-School Child" means a child over the age of two years and below the compulsory school entrance age.

TIME PLACE AND CONDUCT OF MEETINGS.

For the purpose of carrying out the duties set out hereunder the Council shall hold its first meeting at such time and place as directed by the Minister and until the submission to the Minister of its report, may meet thereafter at such times and places as may be deemed advisable.

The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Council at which he is present and in the event of his absence from a meeting the Council shall appoint one of its members to act as chairman.

At all meetings of the Council the Chairman of the meeting shall have a deliberative vote and in the case of an equality of votes a second or casting vote.

The powers and duties of the Council may be exercised and performed by a quorum of not less than a majority of the total number of the members.

Subject to the foregoing the Council may regulate its own proceedings.

REMUNERATION OF MEMBERS.

Members shall be paid a fee of Three pounds three shillings for each meeting attended with a maximum payment of Eighteen pounds eighteen shillings to any one member.

DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council shall prepare for submission to the Minister a report covering pre-school work generally including—

- (a) suggestions as to future policy;
- (b) development of facilities for training kindergartners, play leaders, &c.;
- (c) the standards of such training;
- (d) development of kindergarten facilities;
- (e) staffing of pre-school centres;
- (f) siting of pre-school centres;
- (g) desirable standards of construction and equipment for kindergartens, play centres, &c.;
- (h) financing of pre-school centres and services, and
- (i) any other matters relating to future policy and development of pre-school work.

Upon completion of this report and its submission to the Minister the Council will have fully carried out the duties for which it was appointed.

When preparing such report the Council may invite the attendance of any expert from outside the public service to confer with the Council on any special topic and with the concurrence of the Secretary, Department of Health, may discuss with any officer of that Department any medical engineering or accounting matters relating to pre-school problems.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—Six pence (6d.) per unit.

Section 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 10s. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

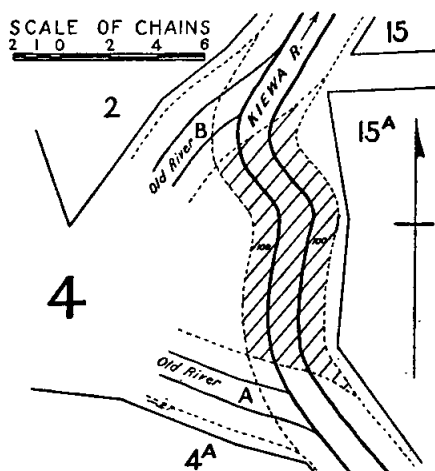

BY-LAW No. 14.—RUBBISH TIPS, &c.

A By-law of the Town of Colac, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946* and every other power thereunto it enabling, and numbered 14, for suppressing nuisances, preventing fires and generally for maintaining the good rule and government in the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Colac order as follows:—

1. No person shall do or permit to be done any of the following matters at any refuse tip or incinerator under the control of the Council of the Town of Colac:—

- (a) Trespass on any part of such area.
- (b) Deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish except as directed by the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas.
- (c) Obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any person lawfully using such area.
- (d) Neglect or refuse to obey the lawful directions of the Council's Engineer or other officer or employee in charge of any such areas.
- (e) Deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, factory waste, or any other material which, in the opinion of the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas is inflammable or subject to spontaneous combustion, or liable to ignite or if ignited to cause smoke or fumes. Provided that this prohibition shall apply for only such period of the year as the Council or its Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas shall determine.
- (f) Bring, deposit, or leave any refuse or rubbish obtained from any place outside the municipal district of the Town of Colac without the written authority of the Town Clerk of the Town of Colac.
- (g) Light any fire in any part of the tip, unless with the consent of the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas.

- (h) Remove any sand or material.
- (i) Interfere with the surface of the tip or with any materials deposited or about to be deposited at the tip.

- (j) Behave in an unseemly, indecent, or improper manner, or use any profane or indecent language, or commit any nuisance at the tip.

- (k) Disfigure, damage, destroy, or interfere with any notice board, post, fence, building, appliance, tree, gate, or other equipment at the tip.

2. No person in or upon any road, street, footway, or public place within the municipal district of the Town of Colac shall drive any vehicle laden with sand, dust, paper shavings, iron, steel, or metal shavings, or waste or any other material which may drop or be blown about, unless such vehicle is provided with adequate sides and, where necessary, completely enclosed to the satisfaction of an officer of the Council.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Colac.

4. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20.
