PUBLIC HIGHWAY, SHIRE OF MULGRAVE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mulgrave has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land acquired for a street and being part of Crown portion 60, Parish of Mulgrave, bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of the said Crown portion; thence bearing south for 10 inches; thence bearing north 89 deg. 45 min. west for 495 ft. 5½ in.; thence bearing north for 1 ft. 8½ in.; thence bearing south 89 deg. 39 min. east for 495 ft. 5½ in., to the point of commencement shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

PORTS OF VICTORIA, ADDITION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act* 1928 (19 Geo. V., No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame Rules and Regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such Regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules, that is to say:—

62A. In the areas within the port of Port Phillip defined hereunder the Master or person in charge of any motor or steam launch, yacht, sailing vessel under 15 tons, or rowing boat—

- (a) shall not, unless compelled by emergency, permit the vessel to be at anchor;
- (b) shall keep clear and not obstruct the movement of any vessel of 500 tons or upwards.

Area (1) South Channel—commencing at No. 1 buoy in latitude 38 deg. 18 min. S., longitude 144 deg. 43 min. E. (approximately), thence to No. 3 buoy, thence to No. 5 buoy, thence to No. 7 buoy, thence to No. 9 buoy, thence to No. 11 buoy, thence to No. 13 buoy, thence to No. 15 buoy, thence to the Hovell Pile Light, thence by a prolongation of the last line bearing 067 deg. to a position due north of Eastern Shore Light, thence by a line bearing 180 deg. (due south) to the 30-foot contour, thence by that contour to a position in line with No. 8 and No. 6 buoys, thence to No. 8 buoy, thence to No. 6 buoy, thence to No. 4 buoy, thence to No. 2 buoy, thence to No. 1 buoy the point of commencement.

Area (11) West Channel—commencing at No. 3 light in latitude 38 deg. 16 min. S., longitude 144 deg. 42 min. E. (approximately), thence to Antioch buoy, thence to No. 5 light, thence to No. 7 pile, thence to No. 9 buoy, thence to the West Channel Pile Light, thence to No. 16 buoy, thence to No. 14 buoy, thence to No. 12 buoy, thence to No. 10 light, thence to No. 8 buoy, thence to No. 6 light, thence to No. 4 buoy, thence to No. 2 light, thence to No. 3 light the point of commencement.

AMENDMENT No. 28.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946* and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby make Regulation L.—Studentships and Courses at Teachers' Colleges or other Approved Institutions, as follows:—

REGULATION L.—STUDENTSHIPS AND COURSES AT TEACHERS' COLLEGES OR OTHER APPROVED INSTITUTIONS.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, award studentships at teachers' colleges and other approved training institutions.

2. (a) Training shall be conducted at teachers' colleges, at the University of Melbourne, and at such other institutions as may from time to time be approved by the Governor in Council.

(b) Training schools for the training of students in teaching shall be associated with the teachers' colleges, the University of Melbourne, and other institutions approved by the Governor in Council for the training of teachers, and training therein shall be conducted under the supervision of the Principal or head and other officers of the appropriate training institution.

3. The teachers' colleges and other approved training institutions shall provide training for students taking the courses mentioned in clause 4.

4. The courses and the period of training for each course at the teachers' colleges or other approved training institutions shall be—

(a) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate—four years or five years;

(b) Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate—four years or five years;

(c) Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—one year or two years;

(d) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate—two years or three years;

(e) Trained Special Teacher's Certificate—two years or three years;

(f) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts)—three years;

(g) Diploma of Domestic Arts—four years;

(h) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Art and Crafts)—three years;

(i) Trained Art and Crafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary)—two years or three years;

(j) Trained Speech Teacher's Certificate—two years or three years;

(k) Trained Homecrafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary)—two years or three years;

(l) Trained Teacher-Librarian's Certificate—two years or three years;

(m) Such other courses as may from time to time be recommended by the Director.

5. The Director shall from time to time prescribe the details of the subjects of the courses for the certificates mentioned in clause 4.

6. Awards of studentships shall be made in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

7. (a) Studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be distributed among applicants specially qualified in the following groups:—(i) English and History, (ii) Modern Languages, (iii) Classics, (iv) Mathematics, (v) Science, (vi) Geography and Geology, (vii) Commercial Subjects, and (viii) such other groups as may from time to time be determined by the Director.

(b) When the number of qualified applicants for studentships in any of the courses mentioned in clause 4 exceeds the number of studentships available, studentships shall be awarded in order of merit as determined by the following considerations:—

- (i) The number and standard of the subjects passed at examinations by the applicants;
- (ii) the age of applicants;
- (iii) the personal qualities of the applicants.

8. (a) In special cases any holder may have his studentship suspended by the Minister for a period up to one year, and, if necessary, for a further period.

(b) The Minister may at any time cancel a studentship if he is satisfied—

- (i) that the prescribed conditions of tenure have not been complied with; or
- (ii) that the aptitude, attendance, conduct, or progress of the student has been unsatisfactory; or
- (iii) that the student is not of sound constitution, or is suffering from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher;

and thereupon all advantages connected with such studentships shall cease and determine.

9. (a) The award of a studentship shall be subject to the receipt of a certificate from a school medical officer, or from a qualified medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director, that the applicant is of sound constitution and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher.

(b) When the medical examination discloses minor defects of a remedial character, such as unsound teeth, post-nasal growths, or defects in eyesight or hearing, the applicant may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to enter upon his studentship for a period of three months, and, at the end of this period, the studentship may be withdrawn if satisfactory treatment of the defects referred to has not been carried out.

(c) No applicant shall be awarded a studentship in any of the courses of training prescribed in clause 4 unless he is a natural born or naturalized British subject.

Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate.

10. Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be—

- (a) qualified for Matriculation at the University of Melbourne; and
- (b) recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

11. (a) The course of training for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall be the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, or of Commerce, or of Science, or of Music, or of Agricultural Science, or of Engineering, at the University of Melbourne, together with the first year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Education.

(b) In each or any year of the course of training as set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause, there may be included, if the Director so determines, a course in art, in music, in crafts, in physical education, in speech training, and in teaching.

(c) During the whole of the period of his studentship, the holder shall be under the general direction of the officer in charge of the appropriate training institution.

(d) An applicant holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or the third or the fourth or the fifth year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate may, if awarded a studentship, be admitted by the Director to the year for which he is qualified.

Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate.

12. Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate shall be—

- (a) qualified for entry to the third year of an approved Diploma course or an approved art course in a senior technical school, and
- (b) recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

13. (a) The Director shall determine the course to be undertaken by the holder of a studentship.

(b) An applicant holding qualifications higher than the required minimum may, if awarded a studentship, be admitted by the Director to the year for which he is qualified.

Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.

14. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of the month in which their course commences;
- (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne, or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English, or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification, and
- (iii) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate.

15. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
- (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification; and
- (iii) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

(b) The Director may, if he considers there are special circumstances, authorize the holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate to transfer, at the end of the first year of the course, to a studentship in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate; or authorize the holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate to transfer, at the end of the first year of the course, to a studentship in the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate.

(c) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

Trained Special Teacher's Certificate.

16. Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate shall have successfully completed the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and shall have been specially recommended by a principal of a teachers' college, who shall take into consideration the temperament and personality of the applicants and their experience and ability in teaching normal children.

Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts).

17. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts)—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
- (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification; and
- (iii) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(c) An applicant who holds the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause and who has completed a technical school diploma course in institutional management, or an approved equivalent or higher course, may be awarded a studentship in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts), and, on satisfactory completion of such course, shall be appointed to a classified position, on probation, for a period of twelve months.

Diploma of Domestic Arts.

18. Applicants for studentships in the course for the Diploma of Domestic Arts shall have successfully completed the first two years of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts) and shall have been specially recommended by the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools.

Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Art and Crafts).

19. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Art and Crafts)—

- (i) shall be at least sixteen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
- (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
- (iii) shall produce satisfactory evidence of ability in Art; and
- (iv) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(c) Applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the second or third year of the course or equivalent qualifications, may, on being awarded studentships, be admitted by the Director to the year for which they are qualified.

(d) Holders of studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Art and Crafts) shall, for the duration of the course, be students of a teacher's college, but they may be required, in each year of the course, to attend classes of instruction at approved technical schools, or other schools approved for the purpose.

Trained Art and Crafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary).

20. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Art and Crafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary)—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
- (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
- (iii) shall have completed satisfactorily at an approved training institution the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or an approved equivalent course; and
- (iv) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

Trained Speech Teacher's Certificate.

21. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Speech Teacher's Certificate—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
 - (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
 - (iii) shall have completed satisfactorily at an approved training institution the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or an approved equivalent course; and
 - (iv) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.
- (b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

Trained Homecrafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary).

22. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Homecrafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary)—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
 - (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
 - (iii) shall have completed satisfactorily at an approved training institution the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or an approved equivalent course; and
 - (iv) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.
- (b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

Trained Teacher-Librarian's Certificate.

23. (a) Applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Teacher-Librarian's Certificate—

- (i) shall be at least seventeen years of age on the first day of February in the year in which the studentships are awarded;
 - (ii) shall have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
 - (iii) shall have completed satisfactorily at an approved training institution the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or an approved equivalent course; and
 - (iv) shall be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools or an officer approved for the purpose by the Director.
- (b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants not possessing all the qualifications set out in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

Agreements.

24. Each applicant awarded a studentship shall, as a condition of such studentship, enter into an agreement in the appropriate form prescribed by order of the Governor in Council pursuant to section 58 of the *Teaching Service Act 1946*.

Examinations.

25. Examinations in courses for trained teachers' certificates, except in subjects that comprise part of a university degree course or of a technical school diploma course, shall be conducted by committees of examiners appointed for the purpose by the Director.

26. Holders of studentships who complete successfully any of the courses under clause 4 shall be awarded the trained teacher's certificate for that course on the completion of two years' satisfactory service after the termination of their studentships.

27. (a) Any holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, or the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Art and Crafts), or the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts) who fails to pass a satisfactory examination in the first year of his course may be allowed by the Director to enter upon the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, (in any one of which cases he shall be transferred to the Classified Roll for the Primary Schools Division), and, upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects of the course to which he has been transferred, shall be regarded as having completed such course; or such holder may have his studentship suspended by the Minister for one or more years in order that he may complete such year of the course at his own expense.

(b) Any holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, or the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Art and Crafts), or the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate (Domestic Arts), or the Diploma of Domestic Arts, who fails to pass a satisfactory examination in the second or third, or in the case of a music or engineering or agricultural science student the fourth year of his course, shall have his studentship suspended by the Minister for one or more years in order that he may complete such year at his own expense.

(c) Any holder of a studentship in the course for the Trained Technical Teacher's Certificate who fails to pass satisfactorily in any year of his Diploma course shall have his studentship suspended by the Minister for one or more years in order that he may complete such year at his own expense.

(d) Holders of studentships who at the end of their course of training have failed to pass in any subject or subjects prescribed for a trained teacher's certificate may be allowed to present themselves in such subject or subjects at any subsequent examination for such trained teacher's certificate.

(e) The Director, on the recommendation of the principal or head of a college or other approved training institution shall determine the conditions under which the course may be continued by a student whose failure to pass the prescribed examination was due to illness or other exceptional circumstances.

(f) Special consideration shall be given by the Director in the case of a student whose failure to pass the prescribed examinations was, in the opinion of the Director, due to his having been on service with the Naval or Military or Air Forces of the King or the Commonwealth in connexion with the war commencing in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.

Extensions of Studentships.

28. Each year holders of studentships recommended by the principal or head of a college or other training institution may have their studentships extended by the Minister in the various courses under the conditions as set out hereunder:—

(a) In all cases the course of study to be undertaken during the period of extension shall be as determined by the Director, upon the recommendation of the principal or head of a college or other training institution.

(b) Extensions shall be granted only to holders of studentships who have successfully completed the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or approved equivalent or who have successfully completed an approved diploma course in a senior technical school and who are otherwise qualified to enter upon a course set out in sub-clause (c) of this clause, and who are recommended by the principal or head of a college or other training institution as exhibiting special merit and possessing the personality and aptitude to profit by further training.

(c) The courses which may be undertaken during the period of extension are—

- (i) Any University course approved by the Director;
- (ii) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate;
- (iii) Trained Special Teacher's Certificate;
- (iv) Diploma of Agriculture at Dookie Agricultural College;
- (v) Trained Art and Crafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary);
- (vi) Trained Speech Teacher's Certificate;
- (vii) Trained Homecrafts Teacher's Certificate (Primary);
- (viii) Trained Teacher-Librarian's Certificate;
- (ix) Any other course approved by the Director.

General.

29. The principal or head of a college or other training institution shall once each year furnish to the Director a report on the conduct, efficiency, and aptitude of each student and shall assign to each an assessment mark.

30. (a) With the approval of the Director students other than holders of studentships may be admitted to the courses of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate at teachers' colleges provided that they—

- (i) are at least seventeen years of age;
- (ii) have obtained the School Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or have passed in five subjects of the School Leaving examination including English or hold an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
- (iii) are of good moral character and of good physique; and
- (iv) pay to the Accountant of the Education Department the prescribed fee of £10 10s. per annum.

(b) With the approval of the Director students other than holders of studentships may be admitted to a teachers' college or other approved training institution for portions of any of the courses mentioned in clause 4, provided that they pay to the Accountant of the Education Department, for subjects not taken at the University, fees as prescribed hereunder:—

- (i) For Education (Theory and Practice), £6 6s. per annum.
- (ii) For Education (Theory only), £3 3s. per annum.
- (iii) For Education (Practice only), £3 3s. per annum.
- (iv) For any portion of Theory of Education or other subjects, £1 1s. per annum.

(c) Receipts for the above-mentioned fees shall on or before the first day of each term be submitted to the Principal or head of the teachers' college or other training institution.

31. Students who have paid the prescribed fees and have attended a course of training specified, and have complied with the prescribed conditions, shall without further payment be admitted to the final examinations for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, as the case may be.

32. (a) Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and have qualified for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Special Teacher's Certificate, and have complied with the conditions prescribed in clause 26, shall be awarded certificates in the courses for which they have qualified.

(b) Such certificates shall not necessarily entitle the holders to employment as teachers in State schools.

(c) Such students may apply to be recorded on the Employment Register for appointment to positions as classified teachers in State schools.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1946* and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby make Regulation LI.—Student Instructors in Technical Schools; as follows:—

REGULATION LI.—STUDENT INSTRUCTORS IN TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, grant studentships to persons desirous of undergoing a course of training as trade and craft instructors in technical schools who have the qualifications referred to herein.
2. Persons granted such studentships shall be known as student instructors in technical schools.
3. The courses undertaken by student instructors shall be under the supervision of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, and such other officers as may be approved by the Director.
4. (a) The qualifications of applicants for studentships in these courses shall be as follows:—
 - (i) Applicants shall be natural born or naturalized British subjects and shall be at least nineteen years and not more than forty years of age on the first day of January in the year in which the studentships are awarded.
 - (ii) Applicants for studentships shall have completed a trade or craft course approved by the Director in a technical school or other institution approved by the Governor in Council and shall have had at least five years of trade experience approved by the Director.

(b) If there is not a sufficient number of fully qualified applicants, the Minister may award studentships to applicants who have entered upon the final years of the courses mentioned in paragraph (ii) of sub-clause (a) of this clause.
5. When the number of qualified applicants for any course exceeds the number of available studentships for the course, the awards shall be made in order of merit determined by the following considerations:—
 - (a) The educational qualifications of the applicants as shown in their school records.
 - (b) The special qualifications of the applicants in respect of industrial or commercial experience approved by the Director in the branch of technical work undertaken.
 - (c) The respective aptitude of the applicants for the work of teaching.
 - (d) The personal qualities of the applicants.
 - (e) The ages of the applicants.
6. (a) The award of a studentship shall be subject to the receipt of a certificate from a school medical officer, or from a qualified medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director, that the applicant is of sound constitution and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher.

(b) When the medical examination discloses minor defects of a remedial character, such as unsound teeth, post-nasal growths, or defects in eyesight or hearing, the applicant may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to enter upon his studentship for a period of three months and, at the end of this period, the studentship may be withdrawn if satisfactory treatment of the defects referred to has not been carried out.

(c) No student, instructor, shall receive an appointment to a classified position unless during the last year of his course he has obtained from a school medical officer or from a medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director a certificate that he is free from any defect or disease likely to impair his efficiency as a teacher and that he is suitable for permanent appointment to the Teaching Service.

7. (a) Except in cases provided for in clause 8, the course of training for student instructors shall be for a period of two years.

(b) Student instructors shall be required to attend classes of instruction, pass examinations, give criticism lessons, and perform duties as may from time to time be determined by the Director.

8. The Director may, in special circumstances, reduce the period of training to one year.

9. The Minister may extend a studentship to enable a student instructor to undertake a further course of training to be prescribed by the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools.

10. (a) In special cases any holder may have his studentship suspended by the Minister for a period up to one year, and, if necessary for a further period.

(b) The Minister may at any time cancel a studentship if he is satisfied—

(i) that the prescribed conditions of tenure have not been complied with; or

(ii) that the aptitude, attendance, conduct, or progress of the student has been unsatisfactory; or

(iii) that the student is not of sound constitution, or is suffering from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher;

and thereupon all advantages connected with such studentship shall cease and determine.

11. Each applicant awarded a studentship shall, as a condition of such studentship, enter into an agreement in the appropriate form prescribed by Order of the Governor in Council pursuant to section 58 of the *Teaching Service Act 1946*.

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1949*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. The occupier of any licensed pasteurizing premises shall ensure that all milk pasteurized at such premises is bottled and sealed immediately after it is pasteurized.

2. The prescribed containers and the prescribed methods of bottling and sealing milk are as follows:—

(i) In the case of milk which is to be sold or delivered in a single service container, such container shall—

- (a) be formed, filled, and sealed by apparatus of a type approved by the Minister;
- (b) be of material, design, and closure approved by the Minister;
- (c) bear the name and address of the licensed pasteurizing premises at which the milk was pasteurized and bottled.

(ii) In the case of milk which is to be sold or delivered in a bottle, such bottle shall be mechanically filled and mechanically sealed with a milk-tight seal which completely covers the outer lip of the bottle to a distance of at least 3/16ths of an inch from the top.

- (iii) In the case of milk which is to be sold or delivered in quantities of two gallons or more, such milk may be bottled in a can closed with a tight-fitting lid and sealed with a lead seal bearing the initials of the occupier of the licensed pasteurizing premises at which the milk was pasteurized and bottled.

3. The occupier of a licensed pasteurizing premises shall not bottle or suffer or permit to be bottled any pasteurized milk unless the bottles or the cans into which it is filled have been cleansed and sterilized by mechanical equipment immediately before they are filled.

4. The occupier of any licensed pasteurizing premises shall provide a room of at least 100 square feet floor space, adequately lighted, appointed, and ventilated for the performance therein of the following tests:—

- (a) Phosphatase Test.
- (b) Standard Plate Count.
- (c) Coliform Test.
- (d) Methylene Blue Reductase Test.

Provided that such facilities, equipment, and materials need not be provided by the occupier of any such premises who satisfies the Minister that he has made satisfactory arrangements for the use of a laboratory approved by the Minister for the regular testing of his milk supplies by the aforesaid tests.

5. In applying the Phosphatase Test, the Standard Plate Count, and the Coliform Test to pasteurized milk, the following standard methods shall be followed:—

- (a) The Phosphatase Test shall be performed according to the modified Kay Graham Neave technique as described in "Standard Methods for the Examination of Dairy Products," Ninth Edition, American Public Health Association.
- (b) The Standard Plate Count shall be performed according to the procedure laid down in "Standard Methods for the Examination of Dairy Products," Ninth Edition, American Public Health Association.
- (c) The Coliform Test shall be performed according to the procedure laid down in "Standard Methods for the Examination of Dairy Products," Ninth Edition, American Public Health Association.

6. A pasteurization licence granted by the Minister shall be in the form of the Schedule of these Regulations.

7. The quantity of milk pasteurized on any one day at any licensed pasteurizing premises shall not exceed the quantity set out in the licence.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Benefit Associations Act 1951* and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "*Benefit Associations Regulations 1951*" and shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Act" means the *Benefit Associations Act 1951*.

3. These Regulations shall be divided into Parts as follows:—

Part 1.—Registration of Associations;

Part 2.—Rules of Associations;

Part 3.—Payments to trustees and claims made for payments by trustees.

Part 4.—Trustees, Duties and Remuneration of, &c.

Part 5.—Miscellaneous.

PART 1.—REGISTRATION OF ASSOCIATIONS.

4. (1) Before making application for registration of an association under the Act the public officer of such association shall apply to the Registrar in writing for the nomination of a person for appointment as a trustee of each Benefits Trust Fund of such association pursuant to Section 7 of the Act.

(2) The Registrar upon receiving such application shall nominate a person accordingly and shall notify the public officer of the association in writing of the name and address of such nominee.

5. Every application for registration as an association under the Act shall be made in the form of or to the effect of Form 1 of the First Schedule hereto and shall contain the particulars specified therein.

6. The statutory declaration to be made by the public officer of an association verifying a copy of the rules or the proposed rules of such association shall be in the form of or to the effect of Form 2 of the First Schedule hereto.

7. The statutory declaration to be made by the public officer of an association verifying a copy of the instrument creating the trust under which the trustees are to administer each Benefits Trust Fund of the association shall be in the form of or to the effect of Form 3 of the First Schedule hereto.

8. (1) The report by an approved actuary accompanying an application for registration as an association under the Act shall, in addition to the statements specified in Section 8 of the Act, contain the following particulars:—

- (a) The rate or rates of contribution;
- (b) the amounts of benefits;
- (c) the mortality table used;
- (d) the interest rate used in the valuation of each Benefits Trust Fund;
- (e) the sickness experience used;
- (f) the date of the valuation in respect of which the report is submitted; and
- (g) a statement of the assets of each Benefits Trust Fund as at the date of its valuation.

(2) The report shall be signed by the actuary and shall bear the date of his signature thereto.

9. (1) If the Registrar, after consultation with the Government Statist, is of the opinion that—

- (a) the proportion of contributions; and
- (b) the amount of other moneys (if any) to be paid into the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund (such other moneys being hereinafter called "the accumulated funds")—

in accordance with the opinion of the actuary as provided in Section 8 (b) of the Act are inadequate to provide the benefits to contributors and other persons for whom contributions are to be made provided for in the rules of the association he shall refuse to register the association.

(2) In any case where an actuary's report is not required to be submitted with the application for registration of an association in respect of any hospital benefit scheme or medical benefit scheme if the Registrar, after consultation with the Government Statist is of the opinion that the proportion of contributions to be paid to the trustees of the relevant Benefits Trust Fund is inadequate to provide the benefits to contributors and other persons for whom contributions are to be made provided for in the rules of the association he shall refuse to register the association.

(3) If the Registrar, after consultation with the Government Statist, is of the opinion that the payments required under the Rules of the Association to be made by contributors is excessive in the light of the proportion of each contribution required to be paid to the Trustees of the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund he shall refuse to register the association.

10. The notification of the registration of an association under the Act shall be in the form of Form 4 of the First Schedule hereto.

11. If the Registrar refuses to register an association under the Act he shall notify the association of his refusal and of the ground of his refusal by posting or delivering to the association at the address given in the application a notice in the form of or to the effect of Form 5 of the First Schedule hereto.

12. Upon the Registrar refusing to register an association under the Act the applicant for the registration of such association may appeal to the Minister against such refusal by lodging with the Minister within 30 days of the date appearing on the notification of refusal to register a notice (in triplicate) signed by the applicant in the form of or to the effect of Form 6 of the First Schedule hereto.

PART 2.—RULES OF ASSOCIATIONS.

13. In addition to provisions in respect of the matters specified in Section 6 of the Act the rules of every association registered under the Act shall contain provisions in respect of the following matters:—

(1) For the keeping by the association of a record in the name of each contributor showing therein—

- (a) the benefits to which the contributor and other persons for whom contributions are made are entitled and the amounts payable for such benefits;
- (b) details of payment of contributions and period to which such payment relates;
- (c) the benefits paid to such contributor or other person and the period or periods to which they relate.

(2) For the issue by the association to each contributor of a receipt book showing thereon—

- (a) the name of the association and the address of its registered office;
- (b) the full name and address of the contributor;
- (c) the full name and address of each other person (if any) for whom or on whose behalf contributions are made;
- (d) the amount of the periodical contribution and the period which it covers;
- (e) the benefits payable or receivable; and
- (f) a synopsis of the conditions under which a contributor and/or other persons for whom or on whose behalf contributions are made by a contributor, are entitled to such benefits.

(3) For the recording in the receipt book by the association its agent or servant of—

- (a) the receipt of any contribution of the contributor of the amount paid by him;

- (b) the date of payment;
 - (c) the date to which contributions have been paid; and
 - (d) the signing of such record by the association its agent or servant.
- (4) That in the event of the contributor handing or delivering his receipt book to the association, its agent or servant with a view to such book being retained for any length of time by such association, its agent or servant, the contributor shall be given a receipt for such book which shall also specify the total payments made and the date to which they have been paid;
- (5) that the posting to the person making any claim at the address given in such claim in a properly stamped letter of a crossed not-negotiable cheque drawn on the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund shall constitute payment of the claim to the extent of the amount of the cheque, if the cheque is duly honored;
- (6) for the adequate protection of the rights of a contributor and ensuring that the benefits for which he contributes shall be paid or given to the person entitled thereto:

14. The receipt book referred to in the immediately preceding regulation shall be in the form of or to the effect of Form 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, provided that upon the written application of any association the Registrar may consent to the use by the association for such period as he specifies of receipt books in the form he specifies and during such period the use of a receipt book in such form shall be deemed to be a compliance with this regulation.

15. Any application for the registration of an amendment of the rules of an association shall be made by the public officer of the association in the form of or to the effect of Form 2 of the Second Schedule hereto and the due making of such amendment shall be evidenced by statutory declaration by the public officer in the form of or to the effect of Form 3 of the Second Schedule hereto. The application shall be accompanied by a printed copy of the existing rules marked to show where the alterations occur, and what they are, and by three copies of the amendment.

16. The acknowledgment by the Registrar of the registration of an amendment to the rules of an association shall be in the form of or to the effect of Form 4 of the Second Schedule hereto.

PART 3.—PAYMENTS TO TRUSTEES AND CLAIMS MADE FOR PAYMENTS BY TRUSTEES.

17. Every association shall, within twenty-one days of notification of registration, pay to the trustees of the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund the accumulated funds; provided that with the consent of the Registrar such association may transfer to such trustees securities or investments of equal value to such accumulated funds.

18. Every association shall forthwith upon receipt from time to time of the following moneys pay to the trustees of the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund the proportion of contributions specified in its rules as being payable to the trustees, and shall forward with each such payment to the said trustees a statement of the number of contributors from whom contributions have been received. Such statement shall be verified by a statutory declaration endorsed on such statement and made by the public officer of the association in the form of or to the effect of Form 1 of the Third Schedule hereto.

19. (1) Upon receipt of any claim for the payment of a benefit in accordance with the Act or for payment of an account for the provision of a benefit by way of services in accordance with the Act the public officer of an association shall ascertain whether the money claimed is properly payable from the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund to the person making the claim.

(2) Upon being satisfied that the claim is properly payable the public officer shall list the particulars of such claim on a Schedule of Claims in the form of or to the effect of Form 2 of the Third Schedule hereto (in duplicate), verify the correctness of the contents of the Schedule of Claims by statutory declaration and forward the original to the trustees of the appropriate Benefits Trust Fund.

(3) The association shall retain for at least three years after lodgment of each Schedule of Claims all papers and documents relating to claims referred to therein.

PART 4.—TRUSTEES, DUTIES AND REMUNERATION OF, ETC.

20. A person nominated by the Registrar as a trustee of a Benefits Trust Fund established by an association under the Act shall, while he holds the office of trustee of such trust fund, be entitled to receive from such association remuneration for his services as a trustee at the following rates:—

In the case of an association having less than 1,000 contributors—remuneration at the rate of five per centum per annum of the total annual amount of contributions of contributors paid into the said trust fund but so that the total remuneration shall not exceed £75 per annum:

In the case of an association having 1,000 but not more than 2,000 contributors—remuneration at the rate of three and three-quarters per centum per annum of the total annual amount of contributions of contributors paid into the said trust fund but so that the total remuneration shall not exceed £100 per annum.

In the case of an association having more than 2,000 but not exceeding 5,000 contributors—remuneration at the rate of two and one-half per centum per annum of the total annual amount of contributions of contributors paid into the said trust fund but so that the total remuneration shall not exceed £150 per annum.

In the case of an association having more than 5,000 contributors—remuneration at the rate of £200 per annum.

21. If at any time the Registrar removes a trustee nominated by him from his trusteeship of a Benefits Trust Fund he shall forthwith notify such trustee and the public officer of the association of the fact of his removal.

22. Whenever a trustee nominated by the Registrar ceases for any cause to hold the office of trustee of a Benefits Trust Fund of an association, the Registrar shall nominate another person as trustee in his place and shall forthwith notify the public officer of the association in writing of the name and address of the person so nominated.

23. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the office of trustee of a Benefits Trust Fund, other than that of the trustee nominated by the Registrar, the public officer of the association shall advise the Registrar of that fact and, as soon as possible thereafter shall submit for the approval of the Registrar the name and address of the person whom it is proposed to appoint to the vacant office.

24. Notice of change in the office of any trustee of a Benefits Trust Fund of an association shall be lodged in duplicate with the Registrar in the form of or to the effect of Form I of the Fourth Schedule hereto.

25. The trustee nominated by the Registrar in respect of any Benefits Trust Fund shall be Chairman of the trustees of that fund.

26. The trustees of each Benefits Trust Fund of an association shall open a bank account in the name of the fund in respect of each such fund.

27. Such account shall be operable upon by any two trustees one of whom is the chairman, provided that in the absence of the chairman he may nominate in writing a deputy chairman in his place, and while such deputy chairman is so acting he may sign such cheques in the place of the chairman.

28. The trustees shall keep and maintain complete and accurate books of account and records including the following:—

- (1) A Trustees Receipt Book containing numbered receipts in duplicate;
- (2) A Trust Fund Cash Book;
- (3) A Trustees Investment Ledger; and
- (4) A Trustees Petty-Cash Book.

29. On receipt of any money from the association for payment into any Benefits Trust Fund the trustees shall—

- (1) make out a receipt in the Trustees Receipt Book for such money and cause to be delivered to the association such receipt and retain the duplicate thereof;
- (2) enter in the Trust Fund Cash Book the amount of money so received, the date of receipt, the matter in respect of which it was received and the date of banking such money;
- (3) forthwith pay such money into the appropriate bank account; and
- (4) retain and file the statement received from the association in respect of the payment of such money.

30. A receipt from the Trustees Receipt Book signed by any two trustees shall be a sufficient discharge for the payment of any money to the trustees.

31. The trustees may withdraw money from the bank account of a Benefits Trust Fund only for the following purposes:—

- (1) of investing such money in the manner provided by the Act;
- (2) of payment to the person stated on a properly verified Schedule of Claims to be entitled thereto the amount to which according to such Schedule he is entitled;
- (3) of payment, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, to the trustees, other than the trustee nominated by the Registrar, the remuneration to which they are entitled; and
- (4) of payment, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, of the costs and expenses properly incurred by the trustees in the administration of the particular Benefits Trust Fund.

32. The trustees shall record in the Trust Fund Cash Book and the Trustees Investment Ledger particulars of each and every investment and of all securities purchased, the date thereof, the amount expended thereon, the date of realization or sale thereof and the amount obtained therefor.

33. All interest or other income received in respect of any such investment or security shall be forthwith paid by the trustees into the appropriate bank account.

The amount received, the date of receipt, the particulars of the investment or security in respect of which such interest or other income was received and the date of payment into the bank account shall be recorded by the trustees in the Trust Fund Cash Book.

34. Upon the realization of any investment or the sale of any security the trustees shall forthwith pay the money received therefrom into the appropriate bank account and shall record the date of banking in the Trust Fund Cash Book.

35. (1) Each payment made under regulation 31 (2) shall be made by cross not-negotiable cheque drawn in favour of the person stated to be entitled thereto in the Schedule of Claims verified by statutory declaration made by the public officer of the association. Provided that the trustees shall not sign any such cheque without the written approval of the Registrar if they have any reason to believe that any of the facts stated in the Schedule of Claims in respect of the item to which it refers is incorrect.

(2) In the event of the trustees having reason to believe any of the facts stated in the Schedule of Claims to be incorrect they shall thereupon make a written report to the Registrar setting out their reason or reasons for such belief.

(3) If the items contained in the Schedule of Claims are passed by the trustees for payment the Chairman, or in his absence, the duly appointed deputy chairman of the trustees shall certify in the place provided on the Schedule of Claims, the fact that the items contained therein were passed for payment and the date of the meeting of trustees at which they were so passed.

(4) Such cheques shall be delivered to the public officer of the association for transmission to the persons in whose favour they are drawn.

36. (1) The trustees shall forthwith record—

- (a) on the Schedule of Claims opposite the appropriate line the number of the cheque to cover such item;
- (b) in the Trust Fund Cash Book the amount and date of the total payments made in respect of such Schedule of Claims and a reference to such Schedule.

(2) The trustees shall retain and file such Schedule of Claims.

(3) The trustees shall cause such cheques to be delivered to the public officer of the association for transmission to the persons in whose favour they are drawn.

37. Each payment made under regulation 31 (3) shall be made by cross not-negotiable cheque drawn in favour of the person entitled thereto and the fact and date of such payment and the name of the person to whom such payment was made shall be recorded forthwith in the Trust Fund Cash Book.

38. The costs and expenses incurred by the trustees in the administration of a Benefits Trust Fund shall be supported by signed vouchers or receipts and shall be recorded in the Trustees Petty Cash Book. The amount and date of all withdrawals from the bank account for the reimbursement of the Petty Cash Account shall be recorded in the Trust Fund Cash Book and the Trustees Petty Cash Book.

39. Upon the banking account of a Benefits Trust Fund being transferred the trustees shall forthwith notify the Registrar of the fact of the change and of the name of the account and of the bank and branch to which it has been transferred.

40. (1) The trustees shall meet at such times and places as directed by the Chairman.

(2) Except insofar as is otherwise provided in the Act, these regulations or the rules of the association the trustees shall regulate their own procedure.

PART 5.—MISCELLANEOUS.

41. Upon the Registrar cancelling the registration of an association, the association may appeal to the Minister against such cancellation by lodging with the Minister within thirty days of the date of the notification of such cancellation a notice (in triplicate) signed by the public officer of the association in the form of or to the effect of Form 1 of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

42. Notice of each change of the registered office of an association registered under the Act shall be given in the form of or to the effect of Form 2 of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

43. Notice of change in the office of public officer of an association registered under the Act shall be given in the form of or to the effect of Form 3 of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

44. Upon the banking account of an association being transferred the public officer shall forthwith notify the Registrar of the fact of the transfer, and of the name of the account and of the bank and branch to which it has been transferred.

45. (1) In the case of an association having a governing body the public officer shall, within seven days of any change taking place in the membership or constitution of such governing body, notify the Registrar in writing of the change and of the name and address of each person who has become a member of such governing body as a result of such change.

(2) In the case of an association not having a governing body the public officer shall, within seven days of any change taking place in the membership of such association, notify the Registrar of such change and of the name of each person who has ceased to be a member of the association and of the name and address of each new member of the association.

46. (1) Any document lodged with or furnished to the Registrar pursuant to the Act or these regulations shall be admissible in evidence in any proceedings in which it is relevant and shall constitute prima facie evidence of the truth of the contents of such document.

(2) A copy of any such document certified by the Registrar to be a true copy of any document so lodged or furnished to him shall be equally admissible and of equal probative force as the original document.

47. The fees set out in the Sixth Schedule hereto are prescribed.
