PROCLAMATION

Silybum Marianum, Gaertn., "Spotted Thistle" (syn. *Carduus Marianus*, L.).

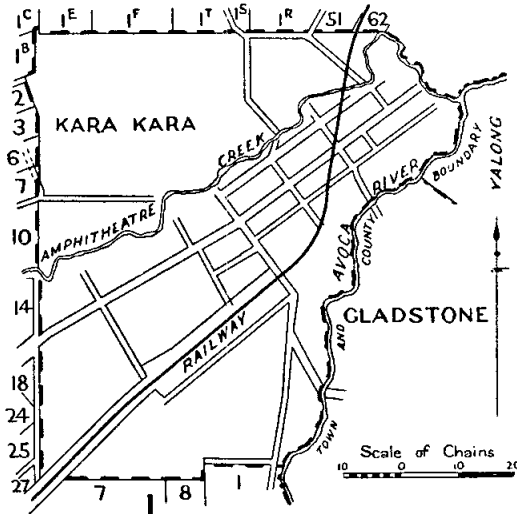
TOWN OF GLENLOGIE RESCINDED AND TOWNSHIP OF AMPHITHEATRE PROCLAIMED.

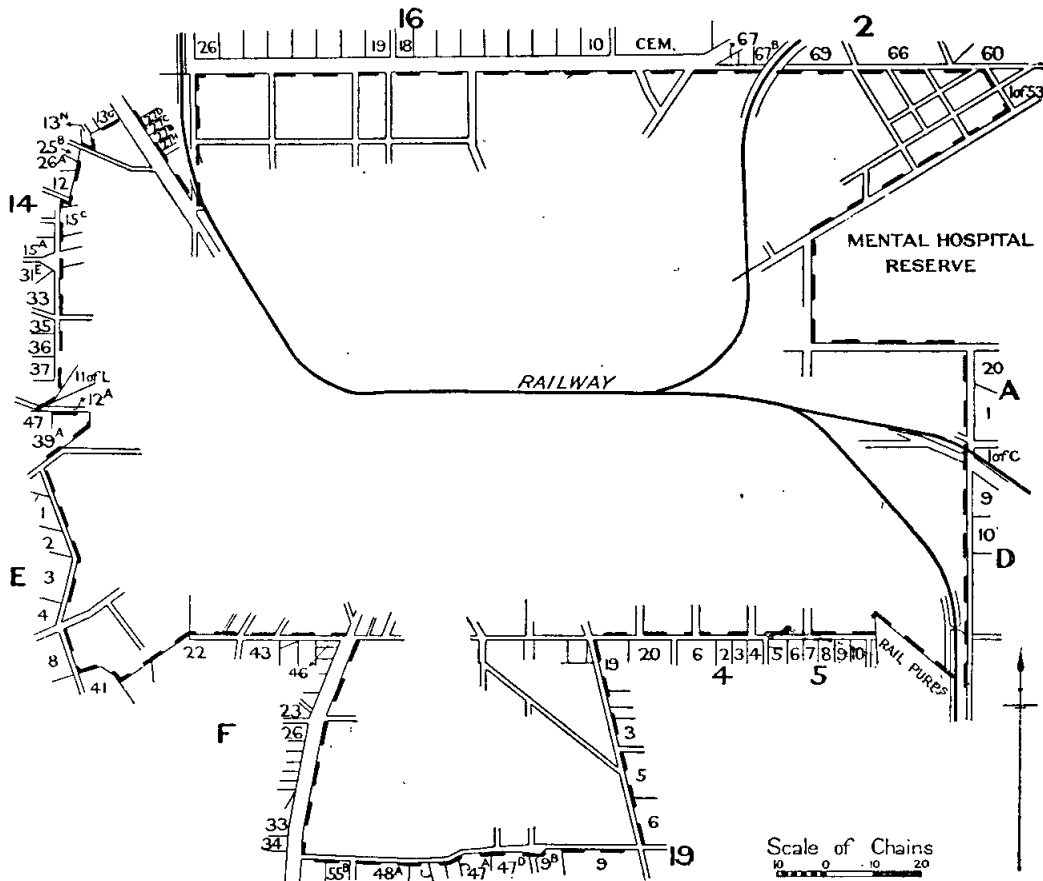

ORDER REVOKED, PROCLAMATIONS RESCINDED AS TO PART AND AS TO WHOLE AND TOWNSHIP OF ARARAT PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the Land Act 1928, as amended by section 2 of the Land Act 1933, do by this notice revoke the Order dated 28th December, 1857, fixing the site for a Township at Ararat at the Mount Ararat Gold Field, County of Ripon (see Government Gazette 1857, page 2501), and rescind the Proclamation dated 4th February, 1861, defining certain areas of land as towns insofar as it relates to the Town of Ararat (see Government Gazette 1861, page 255), the Proclamation dated 8th March, 1887, defining certain areas of land as townships insofar as it relates to the township adjoining the Town of Ararat (see Government Gazette 1887, page 717), the Proclamation dated 9th July, 1888, 16th September, 1889, and 22nd April, 1904, defining certain areas of land as townships adjoining the Town of Ararat (see Government Gazettes 1888, page 2302, 1889, page 3147, and 1904, page 1287) and the Proclamation dated 5th May, 1896, defining certain areas of land as townships insofar as it relates to the extension of the township in the Parish of Ararat, proclaimed on the 16th September, 1889 (see Government Gazette 1896, page 2041), and in lieu thereof do proclaim as a township under the designation of Ararat the area of land in the Parish of Ararat, County of Ripon, within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(A.148(4, 5, 6), (A.149(20, 21), (C.87990).

MUNICIPAL CLERKS BOARD.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY AS MUNICIPAL CLERK.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Local Government Acts, the Municipal Clerks Board appointed under the said Acts hereby rescinds the Regulations published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 17th July, 1946, and, in lieu thereof, makes the following Regulations governing examinations of such persons as desire to qualify themselves to hold the office of municipal clerk:—

1. Examinations shall be conducted in writing and shall be held at least once in every year, at such place or places and at such times as the Board may from time to time determine.

2. The subjects of the examination shall be—

(a) Bookkeeping, with particular reference to Local Government Bookkeeping.

(b) Local Government Law, embracing—

(i) The Local Government Acts;

(ii) Any other Acts and Regulations which confer powers or impose duties on the council of a municipality or its officers and which are from time to time specified by the Board.

(c) Secretarial duties and Commercial Law.

3. Every applicant for permission to sit for the examination shall, not less than twenty-eight (28) days before the examination, furnish the following:—

(a) Documentary evidence of having passed the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne, the Matriculation Examination of an Australian university, or such other examination as may, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto: Provided that, in the case of an applicant over 35 years of age, or an applicant who produces evidence that he served with Her Majesty's naval, military, or air forces in time of war, the Board may otherwise satisfy itself that such applicant has reached an adequate standard of education: Provided further that, in the case of any applicant for permission to sit for the examinations to be held in 1953 and 1954, the Board will accept documentary evidence that such applicant has passed the Intermediate Examination of the University of Melbourne, or such other examination as, in the opinion of the Board, is its equivalent.

(b) Two recent testimonials relating to conduct and character.

(c) Evidence of age and place of birth.

(d) Particulars of experience.

4. The Board may exempt from any of the requirements of clause 3 hereof any person who has been granted permission to sit for a previous examination of the Board.

5. The Board will grant to any applicant who complies to its satisfaction with the requirements of these Regulations permission to present himself at the examination for which application has been made.

6. A candidate must sit, at the one examination, for all subjects which he is required to pass to qualify for a certificate. A candidate who passes in not less than two subjects may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted exemptions in such subjects.

7. (a) A certificate of competency shall not be issued to any person until he has attained the age of 21 years.

(b) The Board may require any applicant for a certificate to produce further evidence of good conduct and character and may refuse to grant a certificate of competency to any person if, in its opinion, his general conduct and character do not entitle him to receive such certificate.

(c) No person shall be eligible to receive a certificate of competency unless he is a natural born or naturalized subject of Her Majesty.

8. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, the Board will issue a certificate of competency to any candidate who has passed the prescribed examination.

Hairdressers Registration Acts.

HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1952 (No. 1).

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Hairdressers Registration Acts, doth hereby make the additional Regulation following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1952" and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be read and construed as one with the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937 and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937 (No. 2) and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1945 and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1947 and the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1947 (No. 2).

BEECHWORTH PUBLIC CEMETERY REGULATIONS.
MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY AT BEECHWORTH.

- Orders for interment must be lodged with the sexton, at his residence adjoining the cemetery grounds, between the hours of 10 o'clock in the morning and 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the day prior to the funeral.
- The name, age, and late residence of the deceased must be furnished at the time of giving order.
- All fees or charges payable must be paid before the burial takes place.
- The funeral procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the burial.
- Usual hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive. For interments on those days outside the usual hours an extra charge as set out in Schedule A hereunder will be made.

6. For interments on Saturdays or Sundays extra charges as set out in said Schedule A will be made.

7. Second or subsequent interment in any one grave will not be permitted except in purchased ground.

8. If, in the opinion of the trustees, the financial position of the relatives or friends of any deceased person is such that they are unable to meet or pay the fees or charges payable for the burial of such deceased person in full, the trustees may remit such portion of such fees or charges as they, in their discretion, think fit.

9. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery must be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the applicant on payment of the fees or charges therefor, as set forth in said Schedule A.

10. The trustees will arrange for the digging of all common graves. Should a brick grave or vault be required it must be constructed under the supervision of the trustees or of some person duly appointed by them. If case interment is required in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be obtained and deposited with the order.

11. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences surrounding the same must be kept in good order and condition at the expense of the owner or owners thereof.

12. Every coffin contained in a brick grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of free-stone, granite, slate, or iron.

13. A drawing of every tombstone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

14. Wooden fences will be permitted, but if not kept in good order and condition same may be removed by the trustees without notice to the owner thereof.

15. The plan of the cemetery and register kept by the trustees may be inspected, free of charge, at the residence of the sexton.

16. No servant or other person employed by or engaged on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to accept any gratuity for or in connexion with the carrying out of any duty or duties assigned to him.

17. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, doing, or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in and about the cemetery shall be guilty of an offence, and being convicted thereof, shall be liable to be punished as prescribed by section 38 of the *Cemeteries Act 1928*.

18. Under no circumstances will dogs be permitted to enter the cemetery grounds.

19. The trustees reserve the right to from time to time alter and amend the foregoing Regulations, and also the fees and charges set forth in the Schedule A hereunder.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE BOILERS INSPECTION ACTS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Boilers Inspection Acts and of all other powers thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made by Order in Council dated the 22nd July, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th July, 1947, and Order in Council dated the 25th May, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd June, 1948, amending the said Regulations, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Citation and Commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Boilers Inspection Regulations 1952 and shall come into operation upon the first day of April, 1952.

Introductory.

2. All Regulations heretofore made under the Boilers Inspection Acts 1928 or any corresponding previous enactment are hereby repealed.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Air Receiver” or “Gas Receiver” means any closed vessel in which air or gas (as the case may be) is held under pressure greater than 30 pounds to the square inch above atmospheric pressure.

“British Board of Trade rules relating to the design, construction and survey of marine boilers” means the rules of the Board of Trade England relating to the design, construction and survey of marine boilers as contained in the Instructions as to the Survey of Passenger Steamships, Volume One, issued by the Ministry of War Transport, and published by His Majesty's Stationery Office in 1946.

“Boiler” includes steam boiler, air receiver, and gas receiver.

“Hiller's Rules” means the rules as to the material, construction and design of unfired pressure vessels contained in *Steam Boiler Construction*, by Edward G. Hiller, Chief Engineer of The National Boiler and General Insurance Company Limited, Third Edition, published at Manchester, England, by Charlton and Knowles, in 1931.

“S.A.A. Boiler Code” means “Australian Standard Rules recommended for the design, construction, inspection, and operation of boilers and unfired pressure vessels and their appurtenances” published by the Standards Association of Australia in 1942 and distinguished as Code No. CB.1-1942.

“Lloyd's Rules for Welded Pressure Vessels” means the rules contained in Rules for Welded Pressure Vessels printed and published by Lloyd's Register of Shipping of London, England, with the additions and amendments thereto.

“Steam Boiler” means any closed vessel used for generating or holding steam under pressure greater than atmospheric pressure and includes a digester.

“Welded Boiler” means any boiler the joints of which are welded.

Calculation of Pressure and Horse-power of Boilers.

4. The mode in which the pressure which any boiler is calculated to sustain shall be ascertained as follows:—

- (a) In the case of a boiler other than a welded boiler—
 - (i) by applying either the British Board of Trade rules relating to the design, construction, and survey of marine boilers, the S.A.A. Boiler Code or Hiller's rules where such is practicable;
 - (ii) when it is not practicable to apply such last-mentioned rules, by such mode as is approved by the Chief Inspector of Boilers; and
- (b) In the case of a welded boiler—
 - (i) by applying Lloyd's Rules for Welded Pressure Vessels;
 - (ii) when it is not practicable to apply such last-mentioned rules, by such mode as is approved by the Chief Inspector of Boilers.

5. The method of reckoning the horse-power of a steam boiler shall be on the basis that every 10 square feet of heating surface is equivalent to 1 horse-power.

Fittings to be Provided on Boilers.

6. (1) Every steam boiler shall be provided with—

- (a) a proper steam gauge;
- (b) two water gauges, or one water gauge and three test cocks;
- (c) two proper safety valves of a design approved by the Chief Inspector of Boilers, one such safety valve to be covered over and locked and the key kept in the possession of the manager or owner; and
- (d) other proper appurtenances, fittings and connexions.

(2) Every water gauge shall be fitted with strong metal guards around the glass.

(3) If the working pressure of any steam boiler exceeds 50 pounds a square inch, every water gauge, blow-down cock, and check cock fitted to such steam boiler shall be of the packed gland type.

7. Every air receiver and every gas receiver shall be provided with—

- (a) a proper safety valve of a design approved by the Chief Inspector of Boilers and not less than half-inch in diameter;
- (b) a proper pressure gauge with a face not less than 3 inches in diameter;
- (c) one drain cock not less than half-inch in diameter, such cock to be fitted to the lowest part of the receiver; and
- (d) one Y piece, fitted with two cocks to enable the screwing on of an Inspector's test-gauge.

Every Air Receiver and Gas Receiver Shall Comply with the Following Requirements:—

- (a) Up to 12 inches diameter—minimum of 1½ inches diameter, gas plug in each end.
- (b) 12 inches to 15 inches diameter—4-inch x 3-inch doors; cylinders to 3 feet long to have one door; above 3 feet—two doors.
- (c) 15 inches to 30 inches diameter—7-inch x 5-inch inspection door; cylinder to 5 feet to have one door; above 5 feet long—two doors.
- (d) Above 30 inches diameter—cylinders to have door, minimum 15 inches x 11 inches.
- (e) Pressure gauge to read to at least 1½ times the working pressure. Diameter 3 inches.
- (f) Drain cock—minimum size ½ inch.
- (g) Safety valve—minimum ½-inch diameter or to S.A.A. Code.
- (h) Stop valve.

Where by this Regulation two inspection doors are required to be fitted to any air receiver or any gas receiver such doors shall be fitted near the ends of the receiver and shall be so placed as to enable to be obtained a view of each end of the receiver and, if the receiver is welded, a view of the weld.

8. (1) Where any boiler is fitted with a lever safety valve which is adjusted by means of a weight attached or hung (whether loosely or otherwise) from the arm of the lever, the owner of the boiler shall not permit any part of the lever to project beyond the point at which such weight is so attached or hung.

(2) Every owner of a boiler who permits any contravention of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Placing of Identification Stamps on Boilers.

9. Identification stamps shall consist of the registered number, test and working pressures, and date of test, and shall be stamped with steel letter punches by an inspector in a conspicuous place on the front of the boiler, or alongside a manhole, as hereunder illustrated—

10. No person shall obscure, deface, alter, or remove, either wholly or partly, any identification stamp placed on a boiler.

General Provisions.

11. On the first inspection of any new boiler, the boiler shall be tested by hydraulic pressure to $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the working pressure allowed plus 50 lb. a square inch.

12. On any inspection of any boiler other than a new boiler, or after any boiler has been repaired or altered, the Chief Inspector may, if he thinks fit, have such boiler tested by hydraulic pressure to $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the working pressure allowed.

13. No person shall place in position or cause to be placed in position or build in or cause to be built in any steam boiler before an inspector has inspected it internally and externally and a Certificate of Inspection has been issued in respect of such boiler.

14. No person shall lease or sell a boiler for use unless such boiler has been registered and is certified with a current certificate for such use.

15. Upon any inspection of a boiler an inspector shall cause every steam gauge and every pressure gauge thereon to be tested and if necessary adjusted and no such gauge shall be passed which varies more than 5 lb. from the standard gauge kept at the Department of Mines, Melbourne.

16. Where any boiler is made, altered, or repaired by the process of welding, a Certificate of Inspection shall not be issued in respect of such boiler unless the welding has been carried out by a welder having—

- (a) the "A" Grade Welding Operator's Certificate or the Supervisory Welder's Certificate of the Australian Welding Institute; or
- (b) the Victorian Education Department's Trade Course Certificate in Electric Welding in addition to not less than four years' experience as a tradesman in, or apprentice to a metal trade; or
- (c) such other qualifications as may be approved by the Chief Inspector of Boilers.

Provided, however, that where two or more boilers in the same premises are inspected on the same day, the fee payable for each such inspection other than the principal inspection shall be reduced by 20 per centum. The term "principal inspection" used in this proviso shall mean the inspection for which the highest fee is payable in respect of the inspections made on the day, or if there are two or more boilers for the inspection of each of which such fee is payable, then the first of such inspections.

Provided further that where the inspection of any boiler is made on a Saturday, Sunday, or gazetted public holiday at the request of the owner of such boiler to the Chief Inspector of Boilers the fee payable for the inspection of the boiler shall be the amount due under the above scale of charges plus the sum of Three pounds. If more than one boiler is inspected in the same premises on the same day, double inspection fees are to be charged on other than the first inspection.

18. Every receipt given by an inspector for the fees paid by an owner for the inspection of any boiler shall be in the form or to the effect of the form in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Offences.

19. Every person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act required to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

TRADE COMMITTEES REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Trade Committees Regulations."

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

3. When a trade or group of trades has been proclaimed an apprenticeship trade or apprenticeship trades, a Trade Committee shall, wherever practicable, be appointed by the Commission and shall consist of—

(a) in the case of a single trade, not more than three representatives of employers and not more than three representatives of employees;

(b) in the case of a group of trades, such number of members as shall be decided by the Commission, subject to the provisions of the Acts.

4. The organized body or bodies of employers and the organized body or bodies of employees concerned shall be requested in writing to nominate within a period of 30 days such number of representatives as aforesaid.

5. Where in pursuance of Regulation 4 of these Regulations, an organized body of employers or employees has been requested to nominate representatives for appointment to a Trade Committee, and fails to nominate such representatives within the period prescribed, the Commission may, subject to the provisions of Regulation 6 of these Regulations, appoint any persons to be members of such Trade Committee as representing employers or employees (as the case may be).

6. Members of every Trade Committee shall be persons actually engaged in the apprenticeship trade or in any of the group of apprenticeship trades concerned, and shall as far as possible possess an expert knowledge of the trade which they represent: Provided that one member may be appointed as representing employers and one member as representing employees if (though not actually engaged in such trade at the time of his appointment) he has at any time prior to his appointment been engaged for five years in such trade.

7. Subject to the provisions of the next two succeeding Regulations, all members of Trade Committees shall be appointed by the Commission for a period of three years.

8. Where a vacancy occurs (otherwise than by the retirement of a member on the expiration of his term of office), the person appointed to fill the same shall be entitled to hold office during the residue of the term of the member whose office he fills and no longer, but at the expiration thereof shall be eligible for re-appointment.

9. A member of a Trade Committee shall vacate his seat—
- (a) by resignation under his own hand;
 - (b) by absenting himself from three consecutive meetings without leave granted by the Commission;
 - (c) on the expiration of the term for which he was appointed;
 - (d) subject to the approval of the Commission, by the nomination of another member in his stead by the organized body of employers or employees by whom he was nominated;
 - (e) by order of the Commission.
10. The duties of any Trade Committee shall be—
- (a) to confer with the Commission on matters relating to apprenticeship in the trade or trades concerned as provided for in the Acts;
 - (b) to endeavour to promote apprenticeship in apprenticeship trades up to the limit prescribed in Regulations made under the said Acts for each such trade;
 - (c) to keep in touch with the work of apprentices in the school by periodically visiting the school class rooms or workshops during hours of instruction;
 - (d) to bring under notice of the Commission any matters concerning the equipment and staffing of technical schools for trade instructional work, which will make for the more efficient training of apprentices;
 - (e) to assist the Commission as required in the preparation of information setting out the nature and possibilities of various skilled trades, the opportunities for employment therein, and the personal qualities, physical development, or peculiar skill required, to enable young persons to make an intelligent choice of occupation;
 - (f) to bring under the notice of the Commission any matters conducing to increased efficiency in the training of apprentices;
 - (g) subject to the Acts, to exercise such powers and perform such duties as are delegated to it in writing by the Commission.
11. Each Trade Committee shall meet at such times and at such places as may from time to time be appointed by the Commission.
12. Minutes of meetings of each Trade Committee shall be kept by the Secretary to the Commission, or by such other person as the Chairman of the Committee may appoint.
13. The mode of conducting the business for which any Trade Committee is appointed may be determined by any such Trade Committee, or may be left to the decision of the Chairman.
14. The quorum for a Trade Committee shall be decided by the Commission when the number of members of such Trade Committee has been determined.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MURRAY RIVER FRONTAGE PARK," MILDURA.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of those lands in the Parish of Mildura as are indicated by red colour on plan marked M/18-12-50, attached to Lands Department correspondence C.74988, and known as the "Murray River Frontage Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days as the Committee of Management shall determine by Resolution from time to time, upon which days the reserve may be set apart for entertainments, fêtes, sports, competitive

matches, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum to be fixed by the Committee of Management by Resolution may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person may enter or remain on the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the reserve the Committee of Management or any of its employees may refuse any person admission to the reserve or to any structure therein.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the reserve, stick bills or posters thereon or cut names on or in any way damage, mark, or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein, nor remove any sand or soil from the reserve.

4. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from any enclosures of the reserve.

5. No person shall remove, deface, or displace any board, plate, or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the reserve.

6. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the reserve, dressing rooms, conveniences, or appurtenances therein.

7. No person shall light any fire in the reserve, except in a place set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management or as indicated by an authorized officer of the Committee. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth.

8. Every person whilst in the reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.

9. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game, sport, or entertainment in the reserve at any time without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management having first been obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee deems reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

10. All fees prescribed herein as from time to time by the Committee of Management shall be paid to the secretary or its specially authorized officer, on demand.

11. No person shall bathe or prepare to bathe in the reserve unless clad in a bathing costume which meets with the approval of the Committee of Management.

12. The Committee of Management may set apart a portion or portions of the reserve as and for the purposes of a children's playground.

13. No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter on or play on swings or other appliances erected on any children's playground, but parents and other attendants shall be at liberty to enter such playground to watch the children who are in their charge.

14. The Committee of Management may, at its discretion, on such terms and conditions as it deems reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and at such times as it may from time to time fix rent or hire to persons, clubs, or associations any part or parts of the reserve.

15. No assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place on the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage in any way, destroy or have in his possession in the reserve, or take away therefrom any animal, bird, bird's egg, or any live or dead or dressed timber, or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plant, or flowers.

17. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the reserve any rifle or firearm of like nature, or sporting gun or air gun, except with the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals belonging to him or under his control or care to be at large in the reserve, or to graze or wander over or upon the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and upon the payment of such fees as may be fixed by the Committee.

19. No person shall bring or allow any dog or animal belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the reserve, unless such dog or animal is held on a leash by such person, and all dogs or animals found swimming in any water or wandering in the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

20. The Committee of Management may at any time by notice set up prohibit the taking of any dog or dogs into any portion of the reserve, and any dog or dogs found therein shall be liable to be seized and destroyed by such Committee or its authorized officer, and the owner or any person having the custody of the dog or dogs so found shall be

guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall also make compensation for any damage done to the property of such Committee by such dog or dogs.

21. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area enclosed for a special purpose.

22. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse in the reserve, except on a road or parking area made for the purpose, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.

23. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle, or horse within the reserve or in any parking area or along any road thereon recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of the road, parking area, or reserve, and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on such road, parking area, or in the reserve.

24. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, erection or booth on any site on the reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained, and no person shall use or cause to be used, or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth for residential purposes.

25. The Committee of Management shall have full power to order the removal from the reserve of any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, dwelling, caravan, trailer, structure, erection or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn, or which was constructed, erected or established prior to the operation of these Regulations.

26. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, dwelling, caravan, trailer, structure, erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the reserve, within fourteen (14) days after the Committee of Management has sent by registered post to his last known address or by personal delivery by an authorized officer of such Committee, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, dwelling, caravan, trailer, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee of Management.

27. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above-mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee of Management may remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, dwelling, caravan, trailer, structure, erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

28. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any appliance or property of the Committee nor from any cause whatsoever arising within the reserve.

29. Every person or club using the facilities or any kiosk, building, or conveniences provided or erected on the reserve may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee of Management may determine from time to time, provided always that the moneys received in such fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

30. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum of money not exceeding Twenty-five pounds (£25) which the Committee of Management may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee at its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by any stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

31. No person shall take into the reserve, nor park therein, any caravan or trailer without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first

obtained and then only within any specified area set aside by the Committee of Management for such purpose in the reserve.

32. No person shall bring into the reserve any alcoholic drink or beverage nor shall any person under the influence of any drug, stimulant or alcohol enter or remain upon any part of the reserve.

33. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928 as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(C.74988.)
