SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944 it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the first day of April, 1952, and ending on the ninth day of April, 1952, to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Twelfth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Alexandra, Mansfield and Yea; those portions of the Seventeenth Fire Control Region

comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Arapiles and Kowree; and those portions of the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Euroa, Goulburn, McIvor, Pyalong, Seymour and Wielet Town and Violet Town.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this first day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, and in the first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

MILK BOARD ACTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of April, 1952.

#### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria. Mr. Swinburne.

1st April, 1952:-

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Milk Board Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the following Determination of milk prices by the Milk Board, such Determination to take effect from

### Determination.

- 1. The price which shall be paid by the Board to dairy farmers for milk for sale or distribution in Milk Districts shall be as follows:-
  - A. For milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agent named in Schedule I. hereto—2s. 114d. per gallon.
  - B. For milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agent named in Schedule II. hereto—2s. 11½d. per gallon.
  - C. For milk supplied to any of the Board's Authorized Agents named in Schedule III. hereto—3s. 1d. per gallon.
  - D. For milk supplied to any of the Board's Authorized Agents other than those named in the Schedules hereto—3s. 2d. per gallon.

Provided that, for milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agents other than the Authorized Agents named in Schedules I. and II. hereto, the Board shall be entitled to deduct from the said price, such sum per gallon as may be determined by the Board from time to time, in respect of the transport of such milk.

- 2. Minimum price payable to dairymen (in the case of sales other than sales by retail) for milk for sale or distribution in Milk Districts—
  - (i) By dairymen (other than the owners of milk shops and owners of house trade dairies)-
    - (a) For pasteurized bottled milk (at the dairy premises of the vendor)-Half pints—4s. 1½d. per gallon. Pints—3s. 9½d. per gallon.

(b) For pasteurized bottled milk (delivered to the premises of the purchaser)— Half pints—4s. 2d. per gallon. Pints—3s. 10d. per gallon.

(c) For bulk milk—3s, 4½d. per gallon.

(ii) By prescribed charitable institutions-

(a) For bottled milk delivered—4s. 3d. per gallon.

(b) For bulk milk delivered-4s. per gallon.

(iii) By owners of milk shops and owners of house trade dairies and by any other persons-

(a) For bottled milk delivered-Half pints—5s. per gallon. Pints—4s. 8d. per gallon.

(b) For bulk, milk delivered—4s. 3d. per gallon.

#### Maximum Retail Prices.

3. (a) The maximum prices at which milk may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan and Bendigo Milk Districts shall be as follows:—

For sales of	Bulk.	In Sealed Bottles.
<pre>½ pint 1 pint</pre>	4åd. per å pint 8d. per pint	5d. per ½ pint 8½d. per pint
1 quart or more	1s. 3½d. per quart	1s. 4⅓d. per quart

Provided that the charge for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of one quart or more per day shall be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the price per quart.

(b) The maximum prices at which milk may be sold by retail in the Dandenong Ranges Milk District shall be as follows:-

(i) Where the milk sold is taken delivery of by the purchaser at a dairy or milk shop—

For sales of-Bulk.In Sealed Bottles. 1 pint . 4 d. per 1 pint 5d. per 1 pint 1 pint . 8d. per pint 8 d. per pint 1 quart or more 1s. 3 d. per quart 1s. 4 d. per quart

(ii) Where the milk sold is delivered to the purchaser elsewhere than at a dairy or milk shop—

For sales of--Bulk.In Sealed Bottles. a pint 41d. per 1 pint 5d. per 1 pint 1 pint . 8åd. per pint 9d. per pint 1 quart or more 1s. 4åd. per quart 1s. 5åd. per quart

Provided that the charge for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of one quart or more per day shall be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the price per quart.
