Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

PROPORTION (in any Factory or Place).

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 227s, per week of to hours.

An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by the Board was approved on 30th July, 1930.

Improvers.

Cement Tilemakers' Section.

Three improvers to Four improvers to five or six improvers to Six improvers to eight workers, and thereafter one improver to every two workers ...

Receiving not less than 227s. per 40 hours.

All Other Sections.

One improver to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 227s, per week of Apprentices and improvers operating a cement sprayer shall be paid 1s. 6d. per week extra in addition to the prescribed rate.
