AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 5, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—







NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DEFINE THE MOUTH OF THE TIDAL RIVER AT WILSON'S PROMONTORY AND PROHIBIT NETTING WITHIN A RADIUS OF A QUARTER OF A MILE THEREOF.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the Government foazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation for the following purposes:—

1. Defining what shall be deemed to be the mouth of the Tidal River as an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river enter Norman Bay (near Wilson's Promontory).

2. Prohibiting during the whole of each year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters of Norman Bay, near Wilson's Promontory, within a quarter of a mile of the mouth of the Tidal River as herein defined.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who shall or may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who shall or may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve for sale or disposal without the consent of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
 - (d) Carry, fire, or discharge any gun, pistol, or firearm in or upon the Reserve, or throw or cause to be thrown any stones, sand, or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve or in any buildings or other enclosures thereon.
 - (e) Obstruct or hinder any person under authority from the Committee of Management or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties,
 - (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 3. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 4. The Committee of Management shall have power to let the whole or any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person other than members of the Committee of Management, or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 8. No person shall be entitled to play any game or practise, or take part in such practise, in any part or division of the Reserve, unless he be a member or authorized guest of one of the clubs that have been granted permission, in writing, to play or practise, as the case may be, by the Committee of Management, and unless he can produce, on demand, satisfactory evidence that he is a

member or authorized guest of the club concerned, provided, however, that the rights of the public to engage in recreation in the Reserve are not arbitrarily denied.

- 9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays or Good Fridays.
- 10. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage and pay to the Committee of Management the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.
- 11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures thereon, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever thereon, except in receptacles provided for the purpose, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures thereon.
- 12. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve, unless with the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee and approved of by the Board of Land and Works.
- 13. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management.
- 14. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle or other animals without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 16. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 17. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.
- 19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

growing on any part of the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

- A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered No. 155, for altering By-laws Nos. 95 and 97, prescribing residential areas, and for prescribing certain classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements which may be carried on therein, and for repealing By-law No. 101, amending By-law No. 97.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—
- (1) (a) Clause 3 of By-law No. 95 as amended by any By-law shall be amended by inserting after the words "No person shall" in line 1 the following words "(save as is hereinafter specified in clause 4 of this By-law)".
- (b) Clause 1 of By-law No. 97 as amended by By-law No. 101 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:-
 - "1. By-law No. 95 as amended by this or any By-law now or hereafter to be in force shall (subject to the provisions of clause 4 thereof) apply with respect to all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements."
- (c) Clause 2 of By-law No. 97 as amended by By-law No. 101 is amended as follows:-
 - (i) In place of the words "any residential areas" shall be substituted the words "any Residential Area.'
 - Area."

- (2) (a) That clauses 3 and 4 of By-law No. 97 be and the same are hereby repealed.
- (b) In clause 5 of By-law No. 97 the words "this By-law or" in line 2 are hereby deleted and the words "as altered by this By-law" in line 3 are hereby deleted and the words "as amended by this or any By-law" substituted therefor.
- (c) In clause 7 of By-law No. 97 the words "this By-law or" in line 3 are hereby deleted, and the words "as altered by this By-law" in line 4 are hereby deleted, and the words "as amended by this or any By-law substituted therefor.
- (d) In clause 8 the words "as altered by this By-law" in lines 1 and 2 are hereby deleted, and the words "as amended by this or any By-law" substituted therefor, and after the words "prescribed by clause 2 of the said By-law No. 95" shall be added the words "or by any amendment therefor." thereof."

 (b) the enlargement, rebuilding or extension of any building and the continuance of the use of the building as so enlarged, rebuilt or extended for the purposes for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law so long as the building as so enlarged, rebuilt or extended does not extend beyond:—

 (f) The premises on which the building
 - (i) The premises on which the building was situated immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law;

- (ii) Any adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership and might lawfully have been used for the same purposes; or,

 (c) the continuance of the use for the purposes of
- a motor service station and/or motor garage for public services of any land and/or building
- for public services of any land and/or building which was prior to and at the date of the coming into operation of this clause being used for such purpose, or,

 (d) the use (subject to the proviso hereinafter contained) for any of the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto of any land or any building which immediately before the coming interesting of this Pulsay was lawfully into operation of this By-law was lawfully used for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business or public amusement.

Provided always that no person shall use any land on building referred to in this sub-clause for any of on building referred to in this sub-clause for any of the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto if the use of such land and/or building by the occupier for any of such purposes creates odours, fumes, smoke, dust, noise or vibration to such an extent as to cause discomfort or annoyance to the residents of premises in the visibility of such lead or building. in the vicinity of such land or building.

- (7) Depot for collection and delivery for dyers and clothes cleaners (but not including the use of such premises for dyeing or clothes cleaning operations).
