Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 443.

LINSEED OIL—SALES BY RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 443.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Raw,” “Boiled,” and “Pale Boiled” mean, in respect of linseed oil of Australian manufacture, linseed oil conforming to specifications K.2, K.5, and K.4 respectively of the Standards Association of Australia dated October, 1928.

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Point of Delivery” means, in relation to the sale of linseed oil, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such linseed oil to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased such goods.

“Oz.” means ounces of fluid measure.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil may be sold by retail in containers supplied by the seller to be as follows:—

- (1) Where the linseed oil is delivered to the purchaser at a place within the Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (2) Where the linseed oil is delivered to the purchaser at a place outside the Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of the linseed oil from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil may be sold by retail in containers supplied by the purchaser to be as follows:—

- (1) Where the linseed oil is delivered to the purchaser at a place within the Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (2) Where the linseed oil is delivered to the purchaser at a place outside the Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the Second Schedule to this Order plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of the linseed oil from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
