AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I., section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—



By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 17th June, 1895, defining a certain area of land as a Township at Olinda, in the Parish of Mooroolbark (see *Government Gazette* 1895, page 2468), and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Olinda the area of land in the Parish of Mooroolbark, County of Evelyn, within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(M.152⁽⁴⁾), (O.25⁽²⁾) (C.93942).



I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 18th February, 1861, defining certain areas of land as Towns in so far as it refers to the Town of Portland (see *Government Gazette* 1861, page 408), and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Portland the area of land in the Parish of Portland, County of Normanby, within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(P.69^(7, 8)) (C.93958).



I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 18th February, 1861, defining the boundaries of certain areas of land as Towns in so far as it refers to the Town of Pentridge (see *Government Gazette* 1861, page



PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF MOORABBIN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used for streets within the said city, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land described hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Hall-street (south end)—

Commencing at the intersection of the north street alignment of Park-road and the east street alignment of Hall-street, as defined on lodged plan of subdivision No. 7225; thence westerly on a bearing of 269 deg. 56 min. for a distance of 50 feet; thence northerly on a bearing of 359 deg. 42 min. for a distance of 289 ft. 4½ in.; thence easterly on a bearing of 89 deg. 51 min. for a distance of 50 feet; thence southerly on a bearing of 179 deg. 42 min. for a distance of 289 ft. 5 in. back to the commencing point.

Hall-street (north end)—

Commencing at the intersection of the south street alignment of Barker-street and the east street alignment of Hall-street, as defined on lodged plan of subdivision No. 10613; thence southerly on a bearing of 179 deg. 38 min. for a distance of 289 ft. 8 in.; thence westerly on a bearing of 269 deg. 42 min. for a distance of 50 feet;

thence northerly on a bearing of 359 deg. 38 min. for a distance of 290 ft. 1 in.; thence easterly a distance of 50 feet on a bearing of 90 deg. 9 min. back to the commencing point.

Maude-street—

Commencing at the intersection of the east street alignment of Hall-street and the north street alignment of Maude-street, as defined on lodged plan of subdivision No. 10613; thence easterly on a bearing of 89 deg. 56 min. for a distance of 460 feet; thence southerly on a bearing of 179 deg. 38 min. for a distance of 50 feet; thence westerly on a bearing of 269 deg. 56 min. for a distance of 446 ft. 3 in.; thence further westerly on a bearing of 269 deg. 42 min. for a distance of 13 ft. 9 in.; thence northerly on a bearing of 359 deg. 38 min. for a distance of 50 feet back to the commencing point.

DEFINITION OF THE MOUTH OF THE MERRI RIVER AND PROHIBITION OF NETTING NEAR SUCH MOUTH AND IN LADY BAY AT WARRNAMBOOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Revoke the Proclamation made the second day of October, 1899, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of October, 1899, respecting the mouth of the Merri River.
2. Revoke the Proclamation made the fourth day of December, 1916, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of December, 1916, respecting prohibition of netting in Lady Bay, Warrnambool.
3. Revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-fifth day of November, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-seventh day of November, 1935, respecting prohibition of netting at the mouth of the Merri River, Warrnambool.
4. Define the mouth of the Merri River as an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction from a fishing boundary post situated on Pickering Point to a fishing boundary post on the northern end of Merri Island and prohibit during the whole of each year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters eastward of the said line defining the mouth of the Merri River and northward of an imaginary line running in an easterly direction from the said fishing boundary post on Merri Island to a fishing boundary post situated on the viaduct leading to the Breakwater.
5. Prohibit during the whole of each year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters of Lady Bay, Warrnambool, within or inside an area bounded as follows:—

Commencing at a fishing boundary post situated on the viaduct leading to the Breakwater; thence along such viaduct in a south-easterly direction to high-water mark on the shore of Lady Bay; thence in a north-easterly direction by such high-water mark to a point due south of the south-east corner of the kiosk on the foreshore of Lady Bay; thence by an imaginary line running in a

southerly direction from the said point to the seaward end of the Breakwater; thence by the said Breakwater and viaduct to the point of commencement.

THE GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 84.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Acts and the Water Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following By-law:—

(1) Clauses 2, 3, and 4 of By-law No. 36 of the Trust as amended by any other by-law shall be and the same are hereby repealed and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following:—

Maximum Allowance for Rated Premises.

- "2. Where any lands and tenements are rated by the Trust the owner or occupier thereof shall be supplied without further charge with a quantity of water determined by allowing 900 gallons for each £1 of the net annual value.

Charge for Excess Water.

Any water supplied in excess of the quantity so determined shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

Water Supplied for Other than Rated Premises to be by Measure Only.

3. Where any owner or occupier of lands and tenements other than lands or tenements rated by the Trust, or any other person is supplied with water by the Trust, such water shall be supplied by measure only.

Charges for Water Supplied by Measure.

4. (a) The amounts to be charged (subject to clause 5 of By-law No. 36 and to any provision to the contrary contained in the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust Acts or the Water Acts), shall be as follows:—

Shipping.

- (i) To the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for use in shipping other than shipping owned by the said Commissioners at the rate of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

Parks, Gardens, and Rockeries.

- (ii) For parks (but excluding areas used as football or cricket ovals or sports grounds), gardens, and rockeries under municipal control at the rate of Six pence per 1,000 gallons.

Victorian Railways or Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners.

- (iii) For the Victorian Railways Commissioners or the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for the use of such Commissioners at the rate of Six pence per 1,000 gallons, as prescribed under section 52 of Act No. 3692.

- (iv) In all cases other than the foregoing at the rate of One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

Minimum Charges for Water Supplied by Measure.

- (b) Where the owner or occupier of lands and tenements is supplied with water by measure under the preceding clause the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be the quantity determined by allowing 900 gallons for each £1 of the net annual value of the said land and tenements, the said net annual value to be ascertained in the same manner as the net annual value of lands and tenements rated by the Trust.

Save as aforesaid, in every case where the supply is by measure the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, if charged for as provided by paragraph (iv) of the preceding sub-clause, would give a sum of Ten shillings for any continuous period of six months or portion of six months.

Nothing in this sub-clause shall affect the charges for the supply of water determined pursuant to paragraphs (i), (ii), and (iii) of the preceding sub-clause.

- (2) Clause 9 of By-law No. 36 of the Trust as amended by any other by-law shall be amended by substituting for the words "seven" and "twenty-one" the words "nine" and "twenty-seven."

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust on the 26th day of September, 1952, and the common seal of the Trust was on the date aforesaid hereto affixed in the presence of—

(b) Where arrangements have been made for the establishment of a transport service under sub-clause (a) of this clause, the Director shall, on receipt of written applications for the necessary approval, permit pupils attending a registered secondary school to travel by the same transport service: Provided that the pupils reside at least 3 miles from the school attended and attend the nearest centre of secondary education providing the required standard of education: Provided further that pupils who reside less than 3 miles from the school attended shall not be conveyed under the provisions of this sub-clause unless there is accommodation for them in the vehicle used for the transport service."



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "YALLA-Y-POORA RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Yalla-y-poorra temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated 13th May, 1952, and known as the "Yalla-y-poorra Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall—

- Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
- Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or on any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony, games, or sports, on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, by way of guarantee, that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

10. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

11. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any buildings or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

14. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

15. No organized sport shall be played in the Reserve on Sundays without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. No person, other than players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey, or golf), and other than any competitor and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TRAWALLA AND DISTRICT RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, or for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Livingstone, County of Ripon, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 15th July, 1952, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Trawalla and District Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve." The Reserve has been placed under the control of a "Committee of Management" hereinafter referred to as the "Committee":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

(b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

(c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

(d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such

Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.6965.)

(c) The erection or use of any building for office accommodation combined with a shop or shop dwelling, or bank, or bank combined with office accommodation, will be permitted on any land having a frontage to those streets, or portions thereof, set out in Schedule "B" hereto.

2. That the following be added to Schedule "D" of By-law No. 74, as amended by By-laws Nos. 133 and 142:—

Drew-street, south side, from Broinyard-street to Wilkins-street.

3. That the following be added to the First Schedule of By-law No. 148:—

(3) That portion of the municipal district of Footscray consisting of land and buildings commencing at a point on the east side of Hyde-street 217 ft. 4 in. south from the intersection of that street with the south side of Hall-street and bounded on the west by Hyde-street in a line bearing further south along the east side of Hyde-street 100 feet; thence by a line at right angles to the last line bearing east 330 feet; thence by a line at right angles to the last line bearing north 100 feet; thence by a line at right angles to the last line bearing west 330 feet back to the commencing point.

4. That clause 3 of By-law No. 153 be amended by deleting therefrom the figures 74 and by substituting for the figures deleted the following figures "95."

A By-law of the City of Horsham, made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 35, for—

- (a) Prohibiting on, from, and after a date specified herein the erection or placing against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street, or part thereof, specified herein of any verandah over or across such footway, unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and not otherwise.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal before a date specified herein of all verandahs before the first-mentioned date erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any such public footway, which verandahs are upon, over, or across such footway and are supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting support.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Horsham order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 5 to the extent to which it adopts paragraphs 2, 3, and 6, under heading (1) "(Porticoes, Projections, &c.)" of Part 1 of the 15th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1946* (which at the time of passing the said By-law was the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874*), is hereby repealed.

2. On, from, and after the 31st day of December, 1952, no verandah shall be erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street, or part thereof, in the City of Horsham, or over or across such footway, unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and not otherwise.

3. The owner of any verandah which is now or before the 31st day of December, 1952, shall have been erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway of any street in the City of Horsham, which verandah is upon, over, or across such footway and is supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, shall pull down and remove such verandah before the 31st day of January, 1963.
