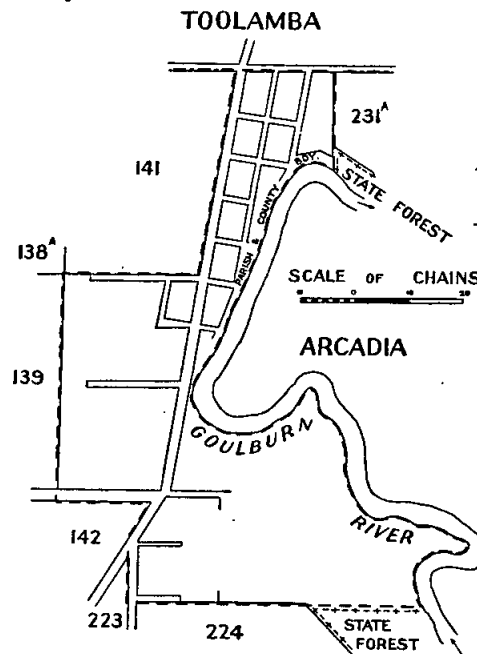
PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AND TOWNSHIP OF TOOLAMBA PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933* do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 17th November 1873 defining a certain area of land in the Parish of Murchison North as the Town of Toolamba (see *Government Gazette* 1873 page 2028) and do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Toolamba the area of land in the Parish of Murchison North, County

of Rodney within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(M.273(s) (T.201(A²) (C.95093).

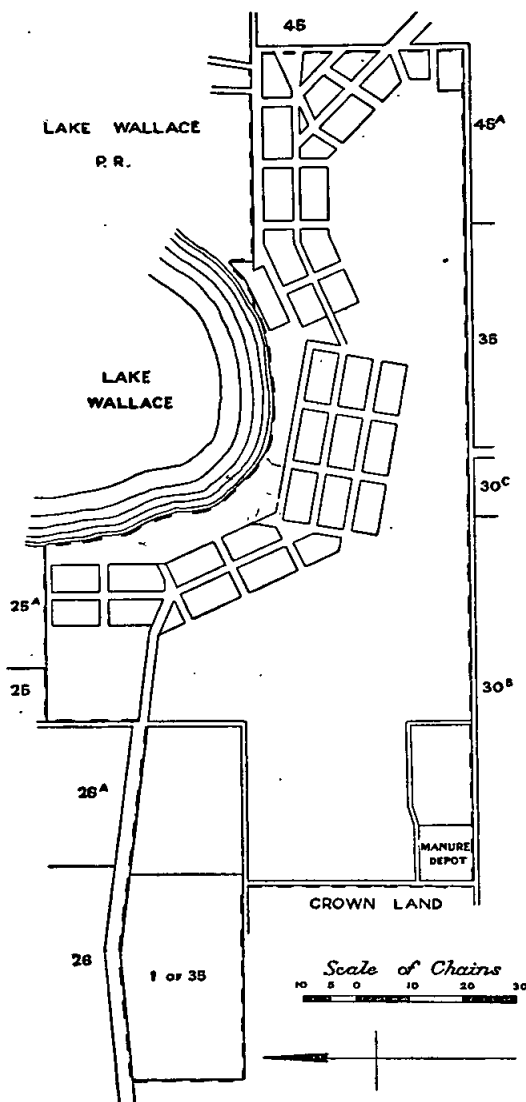

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933* do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 7th June 1869 defining a certain area of land as the Town of Edenhope (see *Government Gazette* 1869 page 865) and the Proclamation dated 22nd July 1935 defining a certain area of land as an Extension of the Town of Edenhope (see *Government Gazette* 1935 page 1966) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Edenhope the area of land in the Parish of Edenhope, County of Lowan within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(E.91(2,c1) (C.95057).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of
Victoria passed in the first year of the reign of Her
Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Motor Car
(Amendment) Act 1952*, No. 5641, it is amongst other
things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation
on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in
Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,
in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my
Proclamation fix Wednesday, the first day of July, 1953, as
the day on which the said *Motor Car (Amendment) Act
1952* shall come into operation.

KERANG TOWN COMMON DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act
1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the
Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and,
after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*,
diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from
time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any
such common for any of the purposes and subject to the
provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that
nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of
the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with
respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised
in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to
diminish the Kerang Town Common has been duly pub-
lished in the *Government Gazette* for one month: Now
therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the
Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of
the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish
the Kerang Town Common by deducting therefrom 6 acres
2 roods 32 perches, more or less, of land in the Parish of
Kerang comprised within the boundaries as defined by
description published in the *Government Gazette* of 11th
February, 1953.

DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258)*, it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

In the Cities of Prahran, St. Kilda, and Melbourne, commencing at the intersection of Punt-road and Nicholson-street; thence easterly along Nicholson-street to Moore-street; thence northerly along Moore-street and continuing northerly by lane to Fawkner-street; thence easterly along Fawkner-street; thence continuing easterly by a line projected from Fawkner-street to the Melbourne-Sandringham railway line; thence southerly along the Melbourne-Sandringham railway line to the intersection of Peel-street; thence westerly along Peel-street to Upton-road; thence southerly along Upton-road to Wellington-street; thence westerly along Wellington-street to Barkly-street; thence southerly along Barkly-street to Princes-street; thence north-westerly along Princes-street to Burnett-street; thence south-westerly along Burnett-street to Grey-street; thence north-westerly along Grey-street to Fitzroy-street; thence north-easterly along Fitzroy-street to Lake-road; thence generally northerly along Lake-road on the east side of Albert Park Lake to a point of intersection of a line extended from Lorne-street; thence north-easterly along the projected line across Queens-road and continuing north-easterly along Lorne-street to St. Kilda-road; thence north-westerly along St. Kilda-road to Commercial-road; thence easterly along Commercial-road to Punt road; thence northerly along Punt-road to the commencing point at the intersection of Punt-road and Nicholson-street.

to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*).

3. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area, excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector for the purpose of destruction or examination or treatment.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take the following action within the time specified in a notice given by an inspector to such occupier or owner—

- (a) to remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:— Apples, apricots, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, figs, gooseberries, guavas, locquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, tomatoes, peppers, egg fruit, rock melons, sweet

melons, cucumbers and all edible fruits of all trees and plants; and remove all growing plants named in clause 2 above;

- (b) to dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one half-ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2.0 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or by otherwise treating them, as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvae and pupae of fruit flies;
- (c) spray all trees and plants which bear fruit and which are not included in clause 4 (a) of this Proclamation with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days, during the period specified in such notice.

5. Require the occupiers and owners in the proclaimed area to—

- (a) eradicate all blackberries;
- (b) eradicate all boxthorn; provided that where boxthorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—
- (i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.
- (ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four-dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.), and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit.

6. Require the occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

7. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which, in the opinion of an inspector, is necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of fruit flies and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetable or prohibited plant.

(commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

In the Cities of Collingwood, Richmond, Hawthorn and Kew and within a boundary commencing at the intersection of Swan-street and Lord-street; thence northerly along Lord-street to Wall-street; thence westerly along Wall-street to Coppin-street; thence northerly along Coppin-street to Abinger-street; thence westerly along Abinger-street to Mary-street; thence northerly along Mary-street to Bridge-road; thence westerly along Bridge-road to Gleadell-street; thence northerly along Gleadell-street to Highett-street; thence westerly along Highett-street to Newlands-street; thence northerly along Newlands-street to Kent-street; thence easterly along Kent-street to Lambert-street; thence northerly along Lambert-street to Victoria-street; thence easterly along Victoria-street to South Audley-street; thence northerly along South Audley-street to Southampton-street; thence easterly along Southampton-street to Duke-street; thence northerly along Duke-street and thence continuing northerly by a straight line projected from Duke-street across the Yarra River to the Yarra Boulevard; thence westerly and generally north-easterly along the Yarra Boulevard to Yarra Vale-road; thence easterly along Yarra Vale-road to Studley-avenue; thence southerly along Studley-avenue to Holroyd-street; thence easterly along Holroyd-street to Barry-street; thence northerly along Barry-street to A'Beckett-street; thence easterly along A'Beckett-street to Princess-street; thence northerly along Princess-street to Malmesbury-street; thence easterly along Malmesbury-street to Walpole-street; thence southerly along Walpole-street to Walton-street; thence easterly along Walton-street to Peel-street; thence southerly along Peel-street to High-street north; thence north-easterly along High-street north to Derrick-street; thence southerly along Derrick-street to Cotham-road; thence easterly along Cotham-road to St. Johns-parade; thence southerly along St. Johns-parade to Wellington-street; thence easterly along Wellington-street to Glenferrie-road; thence southerly along Glenferrie-road to Wattle-road; thence westerly along Wattle-road to Burton-avenue; thence southerly along Burton-avenue to Lisson-grove; thence westerly along Lisson-grove to Through-street; thence southerly along Through-street across Riversdale-road; thence continuing southerly along Fairview-street to Yarra-lane; thence westerly along Yarra-lane to the Yarra River; thence by the line of the Yarra River to the intersection of Swan-street; thence westerly along Swan-street to the commencing point at the intersection of Swan-street and Lord-street,

to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*).

3. 2. Sub-regulation (3) (b) of Regulation No. 10 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion of the expression "737 Lissamine Green B.N.S." immediately below the expression "670 Light Green S F, Yellowish."

3. Paragraph (b) of Sub-regulation (4) of Regulation No. 33 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(b) Every person who sells any package containing pasteurized milk shall attach thereto a label in which shall be written the words Pasteurized Milk in letters of not less than ten points."

4. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of sub-regulation (8) of Regulation No. 34 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(8) (a) Every person who sells any package of cream, re-constituted cream, thickened cream, or prepared cream shall attach thereto a label in which shall be written its descriptive name.

(b) In the case of thickened cream the label shall immediately after the name Thickened Cream include the name and the substance used as a thickener."

5. Sub-regulation (10) of Regulation No. 34 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(10) All words required to appear in the label shall be written in letters of not less than ten points."

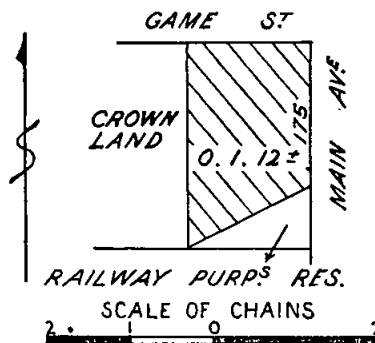

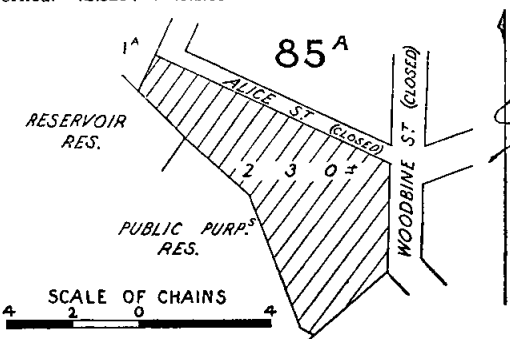
