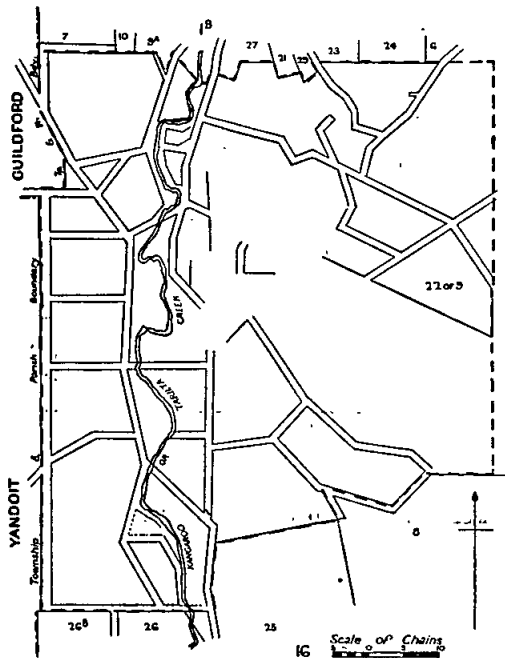

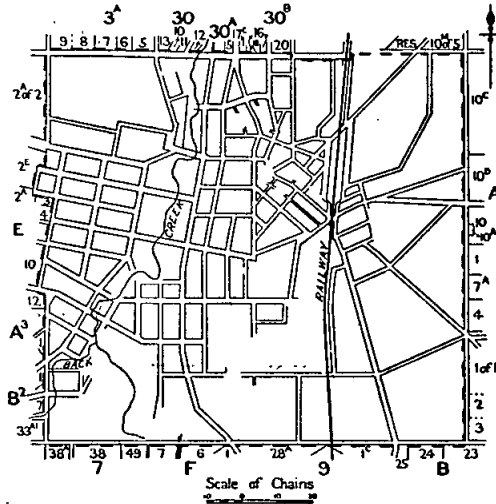

Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258).
DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258)*, it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area

and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

(a) in the Cities of Camberwell and Box Hill and within a boundary commencing at the intersection of Whitehorse-road and Marlborough-street; thence southerly along Marlborough-street to Trafalgar-street; thence easterly along Trafalgar-street to Wolseley-street; thence southerly along Wolseley-street to Mont Albert-road; thence easterly along Mont Albert-road to Leopold-crescent; thence southerly and south-westerly along Leopold-crescent across Windsor-crescent to Albert-crescent; thence south-easterly along Albert-crescent to Balmoral-crescent; thence southerly along Balmoral-crescent to Canterbury-road; thence easterly along Canterbury-road to Broughton-road; thence generally southerly along Broughton-road to The Crescent; thence generally southerly and thence westerly along The Crescent and westerly along Boisdale-street to Glendale-street; thence southerly along Glendale-street to Riversdale-road; thence easterly along Riversdale-road to the intersection of the Burwood main drain; thence generally south-westerly along the line of the Burwood main drain through Wattle Park across Warrigal-road to its intersection at Ruyton-street; thence westerly along Ruyton-street to Highfield-road; thence northerly along Highfield-road to Nevis-street; thence westerly along Nevis-street to Glyndon-road; thence northerly along Glyndon-road to Immarna-road; thence westerly along Immarna-road to Cooloongatta-road; thence southerly along Cooloongatta-road across Fordham-avenue to the Outer Circle railway line; thence north-westerly along the Outer Circle railway line to its intersection at Canterbury-road; thence easterly along Canterbury-road to Mangarra-road; thence northerly along Mangarra-road to Mont Albert-road; thence easterly along Mont Albert-road to Salisbury-street; thence northerly along Salisbury-street; thence easterly by lane to Reid-street; thence northerly along Reid-street to Whitehorse-road; thence easterly along Whitehorse-road to the commencing point at the intersection of Whitehorse-road and Marlborough-street,

to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the planting or growing on any land in the proclaimed area of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*).

3. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area, excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector for the purpose of destruction or examination.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take the following action within the time specified in a notice given by an inspector to such occupier or owner—

(a) to remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—Apples, apricots, cape gooseberries,

cherries, citrus fruits, figs, gooseberries, guavas, locquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, tomatoes, peppers, egg fruit, rock melons, sweet melons, cucumbers, and all edible fruits of all trees and plants;

(b) to dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one half-ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2.0 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T.;

(c) spray all trees and plants which bear fruit and which are not included in clause 4 (a) of this Proclamation with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days, during the period specified in such notice.

5. Require the occupiers and owners in the proclaimed area to—

(a) eradicate all blackberries;

(b) eradicate all boxthorn; provided that where boxthorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

(i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet.

(ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four-dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.), and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit.

6. Require the occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

Country Fire Authority Act 1944.

ABOLITION OF THE URBAN DISTRICT AT MARYSVILLE IN THE THIRTEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the twentieth day of February, 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-first

day of February, 1945, the urban fire district at Marysville in the Thirteenth Fire Control Region was (amongst other things) proclaimed:

And whereas by section sixteen of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is (amongst other things) enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* abolish any urban district and amend or alter the boundaries of rural districts within any region:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report in relation to the urban district of Marysville within the Thirteenth Fire Control Region, the boundaries of which are set forth and described in the Schedule hereunder:

Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after considering the report of the Country Fire Authority, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section sixteen of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, do by this my Proclamation proclaim—

- (a) that the whole of the urban fire district at Marysville in the Thirteenth Fire Control Region within the boundaries set forth and described in the Schedule hereunder shall be and is hereby abolished;
- (b) that the boundaries of the rural fire district in the said Thirteenth Fire Control Region are hereby altered so that the area set forth and described in the said Schedule shall form part of the rural district in the said region.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Healesville, Township of Marysville, Parish of Steavenson, County of Anglesey: Commencing at the intersection of the south-western boundary of the Township of Marysville with the Steavenson River; thence south-westerly by the boundary aforementioned, a distance of 46 chains more or less to a road; thence north-westerly by that road and a road forming the boundaries of allotments 15, 14, 13, 12 and 11 of section 5 to Mt. Kitchener-avenue; thence south-westerly by the aforementioned avenue to the most southerly angle of allotment 15 of section 4; thence generally in a north-westerly and northerly direction by a road to the most easterly angle of allotment 26 of section 2; thence generally in a westerly direction by a road forming the southern boundaries of allotments 26, 27, 32 and 31 to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly and north-easterly by a road forming the boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and allotments 30, 29, 28, 23, 22 and 21 to a point opposite the western boundary of allotment 20 of section 1; thence westerly by a road to Wilks Creek; thence generally in a north-easterly direction by the creek aforementioned to its junction with the Steavenson River, and continuing generally in a north-westerly direction by the river aforementioned to a point in line with the north boundary of allotments 33 and 34 of section 1; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to a road; thence generally in a south-westerly direction by that road to the most westerly angle of allotment 1A of section F; thence north-easterly, south-easterly, and southerly by the last-mentioned allotment and south-easterly by allotments 1, 2, 3 and 4 to the northern boundary of allotment 5; thence north-easterly by allotment 5 to a road; thence generally south-easterly and easterly by that road to the western boundary of the Township of Marysville; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

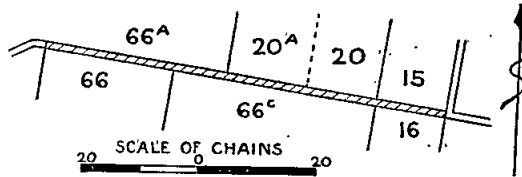

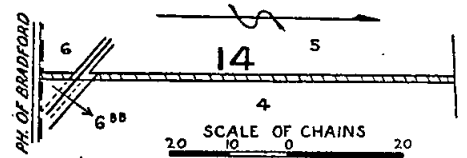

No person between 7 o'clock p.m. and 12 o'clock midnight shall, without reasonable cause or excuse (the proof whereof shall be upon such person), leave or allow to remain a vehicle (other than a tram-car) in that portion of St. George's-road on the east side from the south side of the Merri Picture Theatre to the Merri Creek Bridge, and on the west side from the north side of Clausen-street to the Merri Creek Bridge.

4. Every person who shall authorize or purport to authorize any act or thing contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

5. The owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing in any street or road shall give information to any constable of police or officer of the Council with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control, who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle) which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle standing in such street in contravention of any By-law.

(b) No person without a permit signed by or on behalf of the Town Clerk shall at any time between 30 minutes past Seven o'clock in the forenoon and 30 minutes past Six o'clock in the afternoon of any day drive or cause to be driven any vehicle (other than a motor omnibus) which whether laden with any goods equipment or material or unladen as the case may be exceeds in length 25 feet and in width 8 feet in through or along Queen-street or Russell-street between the north side of Lonsdale-street and the south side of Flinders-street or in through and along Flinders-street, Flinders-lane, Collins-street, Little Collins-street, Bourke-street, Little Bourke-street or Lonsdale-street between the west side of Queen-street and the east side of Russell-street.

(c) No person without a permit signed by or on behalf of the Town Clerk shall at any time between the hours of Six o'clock in the forenoon and midnight of any day drive or cause to be driven any vehicle (other than a motor omnibus) which whether laden with any goods equipment or material or unladen as the case may be exceeds in length 25 feet and in width 8 feet in through or along Elizabeth-street or Swanston-street between the north side of Lonsdale-street and the south side of Flinders-street.

(d) The Town Clerk shall issue a permit for the use of any of the streets by any of the vehicles mentioned respectively in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this clause for any of the special purposes following that is to say—

The carriage of the following:—

- (i) Building materials including structural steel latticed girders plated girders columns and other steel and wood components essential to the construction of buildings.
- (ii) Materials essential to the construction of scaffolding lifting masts.
- (iii) Equipment essential for the excavation and movement of earth.
- (iv) Equipment essential for the hoisting and placing of material of all kinds.
- (v) Equipment essential for the installation of escalators and elevators in buildings.
- (vi) Heavy electrical equipment.
- (vii) Industrial machinery.
- (viii) Motor bodies.
- (ix) Agricultural equipment.
- (x) Military, Naval and Service equipment including boats and aircraft.

Provided that he is satisfied that the use of such streets by any such vehicle for such special purposes is reasonably justified having regard to the nature of the particular special purpose and the destination of such vehicle.

(e) Every permit provided for in this clause—

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 145, for altering By-law number 142 of the said City and for prescribing areas within the municipal district as business areas and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, with the approval of the Governor in Council, orders as follows:—

(i) for the conduct of any business of the class referred to in clause 6 (i) and clause 6 (ii) of this By-law, or

(ii) as a shop.

For the purpose of this By-law the word "shop" shall be deemed to mean a building complying with all requirements of the Council with regard to the erection and construction of buildings and the materials and size thereof where articles or commodities are sold by retail to or where essential services are provided for the public but shall not include a building where articles or commodities are manufactured repaired, resericed or reconditioned either wholly or in part except as ancillary and incidental to such sale by retail and/or provision of service (in which case not more than two-thirds of the total floor area of the part of such building used for the purpose of sale by retail and/or provision of service excluding the portion of such building used as a dwelling and/or for other purposes shall be used for manufacturing repairing resericing and/or reconditioning).

7B. In respect of the areas set out in the said Schedule D the provisions contained in clause 5 of this By-law shall be of application except that the prohibition therein contained shall not preclude (in addition to other matters expressly therein referred to as not being precluded) the erection including adaptation for use or the use of any building—

(i) for the conduct of any business of the class referred to in clause 6 (i) and clause 6 (ii) of this By-law, or

(ii) as a shop or

(iii) as a factory having a floor area (excluding all usual outbuildings (not exceeding 600 square feet and in which not more than ten persons inclusive of working proprietors are employed).

(c) By substituting the figures "138" for the figures "66" in the last line of the area described under the heading "William-street" in Schedule A.

(d) By substituting the figures "433" for the figures "633" wherever occurring in the area described under the heading "Grey-street" in Schedule B.
