Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Port Melbourne has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved for streets within the said city, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all those streets in the municipal district of the City of Port Melbourne specified hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Centre-avenue, The Bend, Batman-road, Sandridge-avenue, Weeroona-street, Dunstan-parade, Pye-street, Enterprise-avenue, Ozone-street, Cumberland-road, Hygeia-street, Edina-avenue, Gellibrand-road, Rosny-street, The Boulevard, Barak-road, the right-of-way between lots 2 and 3 on plan of subdivision No. 22327 lodged in the Office of Titles, and the right-of-way between lots 4 and 5 on the said plan of subdivision number 22327 lodged as aforesaid, being all of the roads coloured brown on the said plan of subdivision number 22327 lodged as aforesaid, together with all of Barak-road and all of The Boulevard shown on the said plan of subdivision number 22327 lodged as aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS, SUBSTANCES AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1953 (No. 1), shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 and any Regulations amending the same, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Sub-regulation (3) (b) of Regulation No. 10 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion of the expression "737 Lissamine Green B.N.S." immediately below the expression "670 Light Green S F, Yellowish."

3. Paragraph (b) of Sub-regulation (4) of Regulation No. 33 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"(b) Every person who sells any package containing pasteurized milk shall attach thereto a label in which shall be written the words Pasteurized Milk in letters of not less than ten points."

4. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of sub-regulation (8) of Regulation No. 34 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 are hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(8) (a) Every person who sells any package of cream, re-constituted cream, thickened cream, or prepared cream shall attach thereto a label in which shall be written its descriptive name.

(b) In the case of thickened cream the label shall immediately after the name Thickened Cream include the name of the substance used as a thickener.”

5. Sub-regulation (10) of Regulation No. 34 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“(10) All words required to appear in the label shall be written in letters of not less than ten points.”

6. Paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (5) of Regulation No. 36 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “Unfit for Infants” and the substitution therefor of the words “Unsuitable for Babies except on Medical Advice.”

And the Honorable William Peter Barry, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And it is further enacted that every Order constituting any new shire shall assign a name to such shire, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions:

And it is further enacted that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same; and in case any such Order does not abolish all the subdivisions, the same shall be deemed to cancel every entire subdivision severed, and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day specified in the Order in that behalf, or if no day is specified—as from the day of the publication of the Order in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas a request has been submitted to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act that the North-west Riding be severed from the Shire of Tungamah and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Cobram, and whereas the proposal set out in such request has been submitted to and carried at a poll of ratepayers entitled to vote in respect of property held in such area:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this Order doth grant such request, and, with effect on and from the 1st April, 1953, doth constitute the area hereinafter described a shire, to be known as the Shire of Cobram, and doth Order that the said shire shall be subdivided into four ridings as described hereunder, that the Council of the said shire shall consist of twelve members, and that the boundaries of the Shire of Tungamah and of the subdivisions thereof shall be those set forth and described hereunder, such descriptions to be in lieu of those published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 31st May, 1889, and of the 17th April, 1891.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Milk Board Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the following Determination of milk prices by the Milk Board, such Determination to take effect from 1st April, 1953.

DETERMINATION.

1. The price which shall be paid by the Board to dairy farmers for milk for sale or distribution in Milk Districts shall be as follows:—

- (A) For milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agent named in Schedule 1 hereto—3s. 4½d. per gallon.
- (B) For milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agent named in Schedule 2, hereto—3s. 3½d. per gallon.
- (C) For milk supplied to any of the Board's Authorized Agents other than those named in the Schedules hereto—3s. 6½d. per gallon.

Provided that, for milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agents other than the Authorized Agents named in Schedules 1. and 2. hereto, the Board shall be entitled to deduct from the said price such sum per gallon as may be determined by the Board from time to time in respect of the transport of such milk.

2. Minimum price payable to dairymen (in the case of sales other than sales by retail) for milk for sale or distribution in Milk Districts:—

- (i) By dairymen (other than the owners of milk shops and owners of house trade dairies)—
 - (a) For pasteurized bottled milk (at the dairy premises of the vendor)—
 - Half pints—4s. 8½d. per gallon.
 - Pints—4s. 4½d. per gallon.

- (b) For pasteurized bottled milk (delivered to the premises of the purchaser)—
 - Half pints—4s. 8½d. per gallon.
 - Pints—4s. 4½d. per gallon.

- (c) For bulk milk—3s. 10½d. per gallon.

(ii) By prescribed charitable institutions—

- (a) For bottled milk delivered—
 - Half pints—5s. 4d. per gallon.
 - Pints—4s. 11½d. per gallon.

- (b) For bulk milk delivered—4s. 7½d. per gallon.

(iii) By owners of milk shops and owners of house trade dairies and by any other persons—

- (a) For bottled milk delivered—
 - Half pints—5s. 8d. per gallon.
 - Pints—5s. 2½d. per gallon.

- (b) For bulk milk delivered—4s. 9½d. per gallon.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES.

3. (a) The maximum prices at which milk may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan and Bendigo Milk Districts shall be as follows:—

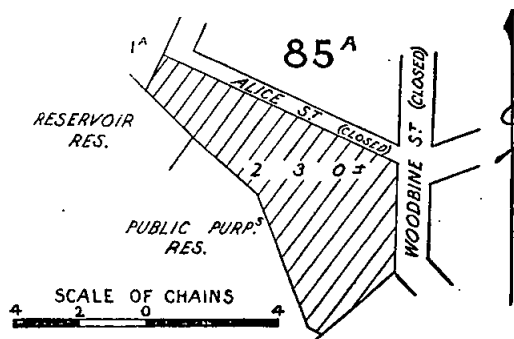
