THE SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

Legal Profession Practice Act 1946.

SOLICITORS' (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE) RULES 1953.

PURSUANT to section 43 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1946* and all other powers thereunto enabling the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria hereby make the following rules of the institute:—

1. (1) These rules may be cited as the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1953 and shall be read and construed as one with the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948 and any rules amending the same, all of which rules and these rules may be cited together as the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules.

(2) These rules shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. Rule 6 of the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules is repealed and the following rule is inserted in lieu thereof:—

"6. Where any complaint is made to the Council or the Secretary concerning the conduct of a solicitor in his professional capacity, such solicitor shall, within fourteen days after being called upon by the Council so to do, furnish to the Council in writing a full and accurate account of his conduct in relation to the subject matter of the complaint, unless he has a sufficient and satisfactory reason for not furnishing an account thereof."
