Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT MAIZE SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE MAIZE MARKETING BOARD.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation, or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and
- of the board as the owner thereof; and

  (b) make such further provisions as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a proclamation made on the 5th day of May, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Covernor in Council declared maize to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 2nd November, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to maize and assigned to such board the name of "The Maize Marketing Board:" Now therefore, I, the Covernor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice

of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclomation hereby: Provide and deciare that on and from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, all maize shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 be divested from the producers of maize and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any maize coming into existence within two (2) years from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Maize Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same: I do further provide that all such maize shall subject to and in accordance with provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Maize Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Maize Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

#### PROCLAMATION

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-wealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide that no persons shall use any net and/or fixed engine in any inland waters in which the use of nets and/or fixed engines is or may be permitted, unless there is clearly and distinctly marked on each buoy stake or other similar object attached to such net and/or fixed engine, the number of his fishing licence.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1953.

THE Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings and ten pence in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Warracknabeal Urban District, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237, of the Water Act 1928.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne numbered 332 for the good rule and government of the City and for the prevention and suppression of all nuisances within the

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria 6 Victoria No. 7 intituled "An Act to incorporate the Inhabitants of the Town of Melbourne," the Council of the said Town (now the City) of Melbourne is empowered to make by-laws for (inter alia) the good rule and government of the said Town (now City) and for the prevention and suppression of all nuisances whatever.

And whereas the trespassing of persons on property within the City belonging to the Corporation of the said City and the committing of nuisances on property within the City belonging to the said Corporation or under the control of the Council of the said City are nuisances and contrary to the good rule and government of the said City, and it is therefore desirable and and it is therefore desirable and necessary to prevent and suppress the same accordingly be it and it is hereby enacted by the Council of the City of Melbourne as follows, that is to say:

- 1. From and after this By-law coming into operation any person who
- (a) trespasses upon any land or premises within the City belonging to the Corporation of the said City,
- (b) commits a nuisance upon any land or premises within the City belonging to the said Corporation or under the control of the Council of the said

shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law.

2. Any person who is convicted of an offence under this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the City of Melbourne the 11th day of March, 1953, and confirmed the 8th day of April, 1953.
