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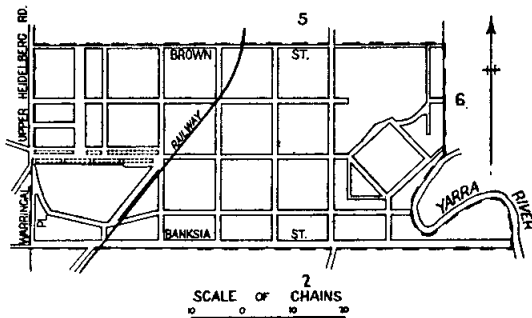

TOWN OF WARRINGAL RESCINDED AND TOWNSHIP
OF HEIDELBERG PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933* do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 18th February 1861 defining certain areas of land as Towns in so far as it refers to the Town of Warringal (see *Government Gazette* 1861, page 409) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Heidelberg the area of land in the Parish of Keelbundora, County of Bourke within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(K.25(4) (W.15(1) (C.95188).

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of South Barwon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land in the municipal district of the Shire of South Barwon described hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

“All that piece of land in the Parish of Barrarbool, County of Grant, commencing at the north-east angle of lot 53 on plan of subdivision No. 5569, lodged in the Office of Titles, thence due west 1,192 ft. 2 in. to the north-west corner of lot 77 on the said plan, thence due north 50 feet to the south-west corner of lot 78 on the said plan, thence due east 1,222 ft. 7 in. to the south-east corner of lot 52 on the said plan and thence south-westerly 211 deg. 21 min. 58 ft. 6 1/2 in. to the point of commencement.”

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF BOX HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or hereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Box Hill has requested that the lands hereinafter described, which have been used for streets within the said city, be so declared to be public highways: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land described hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act:—

Serpentine-street and part Rowland-street.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of Elgar-road a distance of 368 ft. 10 in. on a bearing of south 0 deg. 25 min. west from the intersection of the southern boundary of Churchill-street with the western boundary of Elgar-road; thence south 89 deg. 52 min. west a distance of 244 feet; thence north 89 deg. 44 min. west a distance of 164 ft. 1 in.; thence south 55 deg. 40 min. west a distance of 159 ft. 4½ in.; thence by an arc of a circle of radius 182 ft. 3 in. a distance of 215 ft. 1½ in., to a point distant a chord length 202 ft. 10½ in. on a bearing south 84 deg. 20½ min. west; thence by an arc of a circle of radius 149 ft. 1 in. a distance of 71 ft. 2 in. to a point distant a chord length 70 ft. 6 in. on a bearing north 48 deg. 10 min. west; thence by an arc of a circle of radius 157 ft. 7 in. a distance of 89 ft. 2½ in. to a point distant a chord length 88 ft. 0½ in. on a bearing north 50 deg. 42 min. west; thence north 33 deg. 14 min. west a distance of 11 ft. 1 in.; thence north 89 deg. 34 min. west a distance of 19 ft. 3½ in.; thence north 0 deg. 43 min. east a distance of 5 inches; thence north 89 deg. 34 min. west a distance of 120 feet; thence south 0 deg. 43 min. west a distance of 54 ft. 3 in.; thence north 89 deg. 59 min. east a distance of 120 feet; thence by an arc of a circle of radius 107 ft. 7½ in. a distance of 67 ft. 10 in. to a point distant a chord length 66 ft. 8½ in. on a bearing south 52 deg. 32 min. east; and thence by an arc of a circle of radius 199 ft. 1 in. a distance of 95 ft. 0½ in. to a point distant a chord length 94 ft. 1½ in. on a bearing south 48 deg. 10 min. east; and thence by an arc of a circle of radius 232 ft. 3 in. a distance of 63 ft. 3 in. to a point distant a chord length 63 ft. 1½ in. on a bearing of south 69 deg. 39 min. east; thence south 38 deg. 46 min. east a distance of 12 ft. 6 in.; thence south 0 deg. 05 min. east a distance of 16 ft. 6½ in.; thence east a distance of 66 feet; thence north 0 deg. 05 min. west a distance of 13 feet; thence north 41 deg. 0 min. east a distance of 13 ft. 1½ in.; thence by an arc of a circle of radius 232 ft. 3 in. a distance of 88 ft. 3 in. to a point distant a chord length 87 ft. 8½ in. on a bearing of north 71 deg. 12 min. east; thence north 55 deg. 40 min. east a distance of 178 ft. 11½ in.; thence south 89 deg. 44 min. east a distance of 148 ft. 7½ in.; thence north 89 deg. 52 min. east a distance of 233 ft. 8 in.; thence south 44 deg. 52 min. east a distance of 14 ft. 1 in.; thence north 0 deg. 25 min. east a distance of 60 feet to the point of commencement, and being land reserved for a street on plan of subdivision No. 15135 lodged in the Office of Titles, Melbourne.

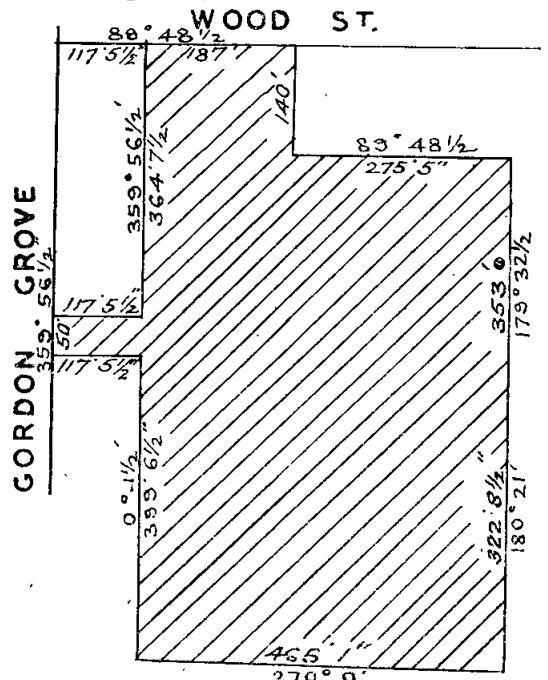
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the *Mental Hygiene Act* 1928 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time by Order published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim and constitute any house or premises provided by the State to be a receiving house:

And whereas it is desired to proclaim and constitute as a receiving house to be known as the Receiving House, Pleasant View, all premises on certain land at Preston being part of portion 146 in the Parish of Jika Jika, County of Bourke:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do hereby as from the 1st July, 1953, proclaim and constitute premises on land shown hachured on the plan annexed hereto as a receiving house to be known as the Receiving House, Pleasant View.

Marine Act 1928.
PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ALTERATION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act* 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria and frame rules and Regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and that any such Regulation may from time to

time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal the Port Rules for the management of Patent Slips and Motor Boat Slips which rules were made by Proclamation dated the 30th day of October, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st November, 1939, and substitute the following rules in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF SLIPS.

Hours.

1. Except on Sundays and holidays, the gates of the slipyard will be opened at 7.45 a.m. and closed at 4.30 p.m. daily. Should any extension of hours be required in consequence of continuous repairs to a vessel on the slip, such may be obtained on application to the officer in charge, and on payment of the requisite overtime, viz., time and a half.

Admittance to Slipyard.

2. Only those persons employed in connexion with operations in progress within the slipyard, officers and crew of vessels on slip or moored at the slip wharf, and persons having special permission, will be admitted into the slipyard.

Dues.

3. All vessels will be required to pay dues according to the schedules hereunto annexed, the said rules including and covering the cost of hauling up and launching, shoring, wedges and blocks, as hereinafter provided, the cost of all labour on shore connected with the slipping or launching of a vessel, and the use of the warp required for warping a vessel on or off the slip. Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays will not be counted as lay days, except when work is carried out on vessels.

Blocks, Shores, &c.

4. Where available, blocks, shores and stages will be provided by the Government.

All necessary stage planks and cross-bearers, where available, with the use of the yard during the carrying on of repairs, will be allowed the persons effecting the repairs without any additional charge; but any damage occurring to the same, or to the slip-cradle, or other material, shall be made good at the expense of the applicant for the use of the slip, and all such materials lent by the Government to the person using the slip shall be returned in the same order as received, and stacked to the satisfaction of the officer in charge previous to the vessel being launched, and no such materials will be allowed to be taken from the slip premises whilst effecting repairs after the vessel is launched.

Registration.

5. The owner, master or agent of any vessel desiring the use of the slip should make his application to be registered on the form to be obtained from the officer in charge of the slipyard, such application to be lodged between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on week days, which will be duly registered in order of receipt. Should any dispute arise as to priority for registration, such shall be submitted to and decided by the Commissioner of Public Works or other Minister acting in his behalf, whose decision shall be final. With the application for registration, and before registration is made, minimum charges shall be paid to the officer in charge as "entrance fee" for all slips, which sum shall be allowed as part payment of slip dues, provided that such slip dues shall be settled within seven days after delivery of the account for the same, otherwise such fee shall be liable to forfeiture, and slip dues to be paid in full. No vessel will be taken on the slip until all claims due in respect of such vessel, or other vessels belonging to the same owners, or having the same master or agent, shall have been paid. The officer in charge of the slipyard will duly intimate to the applicant the date when the slip will be available.

Turns Lapsing.

6. Should any vessel not be in a position and ready to be warped over slip-cradle at such time as may be specified in writing by the officer in charge of the slipyard, and addressed to the person making the application, the turn of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the entrance fee being also forfeited, and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in connexion with the slipping, unless the inability to slip shall have occurred through stress of weather, which the officer in charge of the slipyard shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the entrance fee.

Accidents and Delays.

7. The Government will not hold itself responsible for any delay or accident occurring to any vessel during hauling up or launching, nor while on the slip, the vessel being during the whole of such time entirely at the risk of the owners.

Control of Vessels.

8. So soon as any warp shall have been made fast to any vessel by instruction of the officer in charge of the slipyard, such vessel having been placed in position by and at the expense of the master or owner in line with the fairway and within 20 feet of the entrance of the slipway, and until relieved by the withdrawal of such warp, such vessel shall be held to be under the control of the officer in charge whose directions must be implicitly and promptly attended to.

Sufficient Crew.

9. There shall be a sufficient number of officers and crew on board every vessel while warping her between the platforms and steadying her on the cradle, and assisting on board and attending to such orders as may be given by the officer in charge.

Changes of Turns.

10. Changes of turns between vessels will be allowed with the written sanction of the officer in charge of the slipyard, but not otherwise.

Breaking up or Scuttling.

11. No vessel shall be broken up or scuttled while on the slip, except with the written permission of the officer in charge of the slipyard; and should any master, owner or agent commence to break up or scuttle any vessel on the slip without such permission, the officer in charge of the slipyard may at once remove such vessel from the slip, and the master, owner or agent shall be responsible, in addition to slip dues, for any expenses which may be incurred by such officer in charge of the slipyard in so doing.

Delay in Launching.

12. Should wind and weather or tide not permit of a vessel being launched when the repairs are completed, she may be allowed to remain on the slip, without any additional charge, subject to the decision of the officer in charge of the slipyard, but no demand for demurrage can be entertained.

Dues Charged by Tonnage.

13. Vessels are to be charged dues on their gross tonnage.

Regulations and Cleanliness to be Observed.

14. The officers, crew and workmen of any vessel while on the slip shall strictly comply with the printed rules and Regulations of the establishment, copies of which will always be posted at the slip gates and in the slip office. Any workman committing any breach of the Regulations will be liable to be prohibited from entering the slip premises. Before any vessel be launched from the slip, the slipways must be cleaned up to the satisfaction of the officer in charge by or at the expense of the person who registered the vessel.

Contractors having the right of entry for their employees engaged on any work in the slipyard will be held responsible for their proper conduct, and any complaint made by the officer in charge must be promptly inquired into and satisfaction given, otherwise such workman or workmen will be refused further admission to the slipyard.

Special Arrangements.

15. Should the slip be engaged for the purpose of slipping any vessel requiring extensive repairs for a period of not less than six working days, the Commissioner of Public Works may remit such portion of the slip dues as he may deem fit. Vessels using the slip under this rule shall be kept in such a condition as to be able to leave the slip (if required for another vessel) within a period of two (2) days after notice has been given to leave, otherwise full dues will be charged for every day the vessel remains on the slip after the date of notice has expired.

16. Vessels are to be trimmed, so far as may be possible, to float upright on an even keel before being submitted to the officer in charge for slipping purposes, and the masters or owners of vessels which are not floating upright when taken on to the slip shall be responsible for all expense and delay caused by righting such vessels. Cargo of any description or coals shall not be shipped or moved within vessels whilst such vessels are supported on the slip-cradle.

Repairs.

17. Where facilities are provided, repairs may be undertaken by the Government when practicable.

SCHEDULE OF SLIP DUES.

Large Slips (capacity of more than 10 tons gross)—

Boats with a gross tonnage of 10 tons or under—Slipping and launching, £3; each lay day, 10s. Minimum total charge, £4.

Boats with a gross tonnage over 10 tons—Slipping and launching, 6s. per ton; lay days, 2s. per ton per diem. Minimum total charge, £5.

Slips up to 10 tons gross—

Boats with a gross tonnage of 4 tons or under—Slipping and launching, 15s.; each lay day, 3s. Minimum total charge, £1 10s.

Boats with a gross tonnage over 4 tons and up to 10 tons—Slipping and launching, £3; each lay day, 10s. per diem. Minimum total charge, £4.

Small Boat Slips—

Slipping and launching, 10s.; each lay day, 1s. Minimum total charge, £1.

The 24 hours constituting a day of slipping shall commence at the time the vessel is hauled up on the slip, after which lay days shall commence.

Vessels remaining on the slip for a longer period than 24 hours shall be charged full rates for each complete day of 24 hours or part thereof.

MACHINES.

Any such gear as screw-jacks, cramps, union screws, hand-boring machine, &c., that may be on the premises, will be rented to contractors for use at the slip only, on the payment of One shilling (1s.) per day for each jack, cramp, screw or hand-boring machine, &c.

Smith's fire, with fuel, 1s. 6d. per hour.

Such rates to be increased 50 per cent. during "overtime."

The hirer of any machines or tools will be responsible for, and will make good, any damage sustained by such machines or tools when in use, fair wear and tear excepted.

PARKING OF VEHICLES ACT 1953 (No. 5677).

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Parking of Vehicles Act 1953*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do, by this my Proclamation, fix Monday, the sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, as the day upon which the said *Parking of Vehicles Act 1953* shall come into operation.

Parking of Vehicles Act 1953 (No. 5677).
SPECIFYING AREA OF APPLICATION OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 2 of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Parking of Vehicles Act 1953*, it is enacted that the said Act shall apply only in respect of parking infringements occurring in any area or circumstance specified for the purpose of the Act by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* and occurring after the date of such Proclamation, provided that no such Proclamation shall be made in respect of any area beyond the municipal district of the City of Melbourne.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation specify for the purpose of the *Parking of Vehicles Act 1953* all that area within the boundaries hereinafter described:

Commencing at the intersection of the western alignment of Spencer-street and the northern alignment of Latrobe-street, bounded thence by the northern alignment of Latrobe-street and a line in continuation thereof bearing easterly to the northern alignment of Victoria-street, by the northern alignment of Victoria-street bearing easterly to a point in line with the eastern alignment of Spring-street, by a line the eastern alignment of Spring-street and a line in continuation thereof bearing southerly to the southern alignment of Wellington-parade, by the southern alignment of Wellington-parade the southern alignment of Flinders-street and a line in continuation thereof bearing westerly to the western alignment of Spencer-street, and thence by the western alignment of Spencer-street bearing northerly to the point of commencement, such area being situated wholly within the municipal district of the City of Melbourne.

THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

BY-LAW No. 4 (TRADE WASTES).

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 2, duly passed by the Authority on the 17th day of January, 1924, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 25th day of March, 1924, and gazetted on the 2nd day of April, 1924.

2. The said By-law No. 2 is hereby amended as follows:—

For clauses 5 (c) and 5 (d) of the said By-law there shall be substituted the following clauses respectively:—

“(c) Causes or permits to be discharged into any sewer of the Sewerage Authority, excepting with the written consent of the Authority, any trade or manufacturing liquid, refuse, or waste other than domestic sewage.”

“(d) Causes or permits to flow or pass or be carried from any manufactory or business or other premises of any such person into any sewer of the Sewerage Authority or any drain or pipe communicating therewith, any wastes, liquid or refuse:—

- (1) The pH of which is less than five (5) or greater than ten (10).
- (2) Containing more than ten (10) parts per million of the following gases:—Hydrogen sulphide, sulphur dioxide, nitrous oxide, or any of the halogens.
- (3) Containing any explosive substance.
- (4) Containing any flammable substance with a flash point lower than 187° Fahrenheit.
- (5) Having a temperature higher than 140° Fahrenheit.
- (6) Containing grease or oil or other substance that will solidify or become viscous at temperatures between 32° and 140° Fahrenheit.
- (7) Containing substances in suspension exceeding a daily average of 500 parts per million.
- (8) Containing total solids in solution and suspension in excess of 20 000 parts per million or exceeding a daily average of 2,000 parts per million.
- (9) Containing gases or vapours either free or occluded, in concentrations which are toxic or dangerous to humans or animals.
- (10) Containing more than 100 parts per million of any antiseptic substance.
- (11) Containing phenols in excess of 0.005 parts per million.
- (12) Containing any toxic or irritating substance which will create conditions hazardous to public health and safety.
- (13) Containing in excess of 100 parts per million or exceeding a daily average of 25 parts per million of any grease or oil or any oily substances.

Leave granted under the provisions of this sub-clause shall not be regarded as a debit against the member and shall not exceed a continuous period of fifty-two weeks inclusive of any other leave which may be granted with pay.

The Tribunal in determining whether an injury suffered by a member as a result of an accident arose out of or in the course of the discharge of duty shall have regard to the interpretative provisions of section 8 of the *Workers Compensation Act 1951*.”

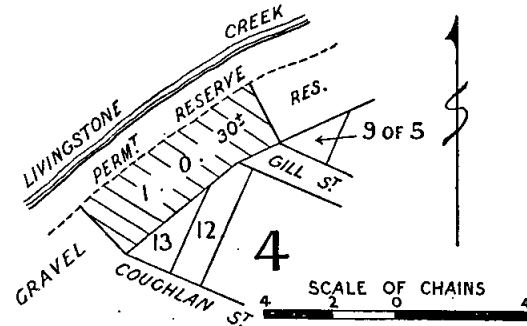

- (d) Authorizing the Council of the said shire at the expense of the owner (the amount of which expense may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily):—
 - (1) To remove or lop trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under any By-law made under paragraph (b) hereof.
 - (2) To reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under any By-law made under paragraph (c) hereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into effect immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

The owner of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads upon which property any trees, shrubs, or hedges are growing, abutting on or within 10 feet from such streets or roads shall, if such trees, shrubs, or hedges be of a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. from the surface level of the street or road nearest to any such tree, shrub or hedge upon notice, in writing, under the hand of the municipal clerk of the said Shire, and within the time therein specified, remove or lop, or cause to be removed or lopped all trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1946*) to such extent as may be necessary to bring such trees, shrubs, or hedges into conformity with the requirements of the preceding clause hereof.

4. The owner of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads upon which private property there is a fence within 10 feet from the junction of such streets or roads shall, if such fence be of greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. from the surface level of the street or road nearest to such fence, upon notice, in writing, under the hand of the municipal clerk of the said shire, and within the time therein specified, cause to be reduced to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in., above the surface level of the street or road nearest such fence any portion of such fence within 10 feet of the junction of such streets or roads.

5. - (1) The word "junction" shall mean the point at which the building line of a street or road meets the building line of another street or road, and in cases where the corner has been rounded off or splayed the word "junction" shall mean and include the whole of the arc or line to which such corner has been rounded off or splayed.
- (2) The words "Surface level" shall mean—
 - (a) where the footway on that side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved, the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question.

 - (c) Otherwise the actual level of that part of such street or road nearest to the private property in question.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 558.

POTATOES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 558.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 520 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "Potato Marketing Board" means the Potato Marketing Board constituted under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* of the State of Victoria.
 - "Primary wholesaler," in relation to the sale of potatoes, means a person who purchases potatoes for the purpose of resale to another wholesaler whose normal business is to sell potatoes by wholesale.
 - "Secondary wholesaler," in relation to the sale of potatoes, means a person who purchases potatoes from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale.
 - "Ton" means a long ton of 2,240 lb. or a quantity of fifteen bags of potatoes each containing not less than 149 lb. weight.
 - "By wholesale" means and refers to a sale of potatoes in lots of one bag or more.
 - "Lb." means pound avoirdupois or pounds avoirdupois as the case requires.
 - "Metropolitan area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - "Point of delivery" means, in relation to the sale of potatoes, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such potatoes to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

Sales by the Potato Marketing Board.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by the Potato Marketing Board to be as follows:—

- (a) at any point of production in Victoria—£37 10s. per ton, less cost of transport from point of production to Cowper-street, Melbourne, or
- (b) at any place other than a point of production in Victoria—£37 10s. per ton, less the cost of transport properly incurred from the point of production to Cowper-street railway siding, plus the cost of transport properly incurred from the point of production to the point of delivery.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by wholesale to be as follows:—

(1) For sales in the metropolitan area—

- (a) by primary wholesaler, Cowper-street—£37 10s. per ton;
- (b) by secondary wholesaler—
 - (i) where the seller delivers the potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market—£38 17s. 6d. per ton;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the potatoes into the buyer's shop—£39 10s. per ton.

(2) For sales outside the metropolitan area—

- (a) where such potatoes have been purchased in the metropolitan area, the sum of the following:—
 - (i) purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £37 10s. per ton, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) cost of rail transport from Cowper-street railway siding to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;
 - (iii) a margin—
 - (A) where the seller delivers the potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, £1 7s. 6d. per ton; or
 - (B) where the seller delivers the potatoes into the buyer's shop, or £2 per ton;
- (b) where such potatoes have been purchased outside the metropolitan area, the sum of the following:—
 - (i) an amount calculated at a rate of £37 10s. per ton less the usual cost of transporting such potatoes by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises to Cowper-street railway siding, plus the usual cost of transporting such potatoes by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;
 - (ii) a margin—
 - (A) where the seller delivers the potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, of £1 7s. 6d. per ton; or
 - (B) where the seller delivers the potatoes into the buyer's shop, or £2 per ton.

Maximum Price—Sales by Retail.

6. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by retail in the metropolitan area to be Ten pence halfpenny per 2 lb.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by retail outside the metropolitan area to be the price fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sale in the metropolitan

area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such potatoes from the point of delivery to the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed Five pence halfpenny per pound.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

7. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail potatoes shall attach to or display with those potatoes a ticket or label setting forth the maximum retail selling price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of these potatoes.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any potatoes shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those potatoes and so as to be properly associated with such potatoes.

Delivery of Invoices.

8. Any person who sells by wholesale potatoes shall deliver with such potatoes an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) name and address of seller;
- (b) name and address of purchaser;
- (c) date of sale;
- (d) the point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the potatoes sold, number of bags, and price per unit of such potatoes; and
- (e) total price of such potatoes.

Records.

9. Any person who sells any potatoes shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such potatoes and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such potatoes showing—

- (a) the name and address of supplier;
- (b) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such potatoes;
- (c) the quantity purchased and the price thereof;
- (d) the point of delivery; and
- (e) transport cost properly attributable to the transport of such potatoes from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any potatoes specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
