AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—


PROCLAMATIONS RESCINDED AS TO PART AND TOWNSHIP OF FOSTER PROCLAIMED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25

of the Land Act 1928 do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 28th June 1886 defining certain areas of land as Townships in so far as it refers to the Township at Foster (see Government Gazette 1886 page 1914) and the Proclamation dated 5th December 1893 defining certain areas of land as Townships in so far as it refers to the extension of the Township at Foster (see Government Gazette 1893 page 4684) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Foster the area of land in the Parish of Wonga Wonga South, County of Buln Buln within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(F.100(s) (W.353(s) (C.93059).

PROCLAMATION

EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1953.

THE Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Euroa Urban District.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 30,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.




