Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 17 of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that, to the weekly carnings of each pieceworker shall be added the sum of six shillings. Where less than 40 hours is worked in any week by any pieceworker, a proportionate amount of such sum of six shillings shall be added in lieu thereof.
