SPECIAL RATES.

- 3. In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 2 hereof the following special rates and allowances shall be paid:-
 - (a) Leading hands in charge of not less than three and not more than ten employees, including apprentices, 9s. per week extra; more than ten and not more than twenty employees, including apprentices, 18s. per week extra; more than twenty employees, including apprentices, 27s. per week extra.
 - (b) Working in wet places, 12d. per hour extra. Working in confined spaces, 3d. per hour extra.
 - (c) Working for more than one hour in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees Fahrenheit, 14d. per hour extra; in places where the temperature exceeds 130 degrees Fahrenheit, 3d. per hour extra. Where work continues for more than two hours in temperatures exceeding 130 degrees Fahrenheit, employees shall also be entitled to twenty minutes' rest after every two hours' without deduction of pay. The temperature shall be decided by the foreman of the work after consultation with the employees who claim the extra rate.
 - (d) Dirty work, i.e., work which a foreman and workman shall agree is of an unusually dirty or offensive nature, lid. per hour extra.
 - (e) Compensation to the extent of the damage sustained shall be made for work in which clothing or tools are damaged or destroyed by the use of acids.
- (f) Where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job, the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, viz., the highest for the disabilities so prevailing. No. 618.-7170/33.-PRICE 3D.
