NOTICE OF SUSPENSION BY MINISTER OF OPERATION OF PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 571.

No. 571.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Prices Regulation Acts, the Prices Commissioner did, by Prices Regulation Order No. 571 published in the Government Gazette No. 690 of the twelfth day of August, 1953, fix the maximum prices at which certain fermented liquors might be sold in Victoria: And whereas, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me under those Acts, I, William Slater, the responsible Minister of the Crown, for the time being administering those Acts, did on the twelfth day of August, 1953, request the Prices Commissioner to consider further certain matters dealt with by that Order: Now therefore, in further pursuance of the powers so conferred upon me, I do hereby suspend the operation of the whole of Prices Regulation Order No. 571 for a period of twenty-eight days from the said twelfth day of August, 1953.
