PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—TOWN OF CASTLEMAINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Town of Castlemaine has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said town, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land described hereunder, used for a street, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of Crown allotment 100, section C, Parish of Castlemaine, County of Talbot; thence on a bearing of 16 deg. 40 min. for 103 feet; thence on a bearing of 120 deg. 30 min. for 69 ft. 6 in.; thence on a bearing of 229 deg. 57 min. for 103 ft. 4 in.; thence on a bearing of 286 deg. 37 min. for 10 ft. 9 in. to the point of commencement.

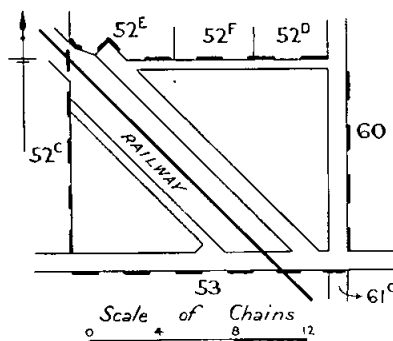

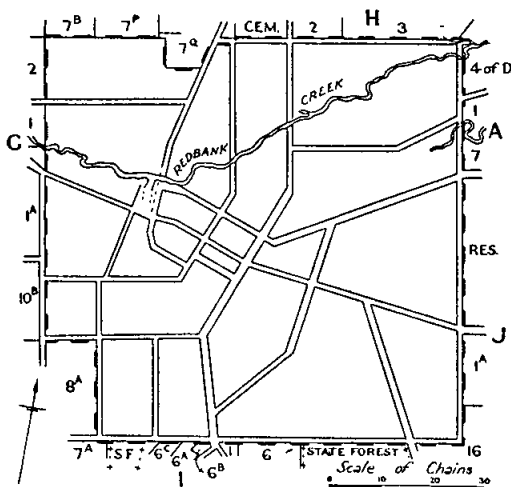

MILK AREA PROCLAIMED.—BOROUGH OF
INGLEWOOD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 51 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* (No. 3736) it is enacted that on the recommendation of the Minister any portion of the State of Victoria may be proclaimed a Milk Area by the Governor in Council: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is also enacted that the said Act shall have effect as regards any milk area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the Milk Areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine, and Port Fairy, on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Honorable Clive Phillip Stoneham, Minister of Agriculture, do by this my Proclamation declare the Municipal District of the Borough of Inglewood together with the whole of the premises of each and every dairy or dairy farm outside such Municipal District wherever situated from which milk is sold within such Municipal District shall constitute a milk area to be called the Inglewood Milk Area: And I do further declare that the first day of October 1953 shall be the day on which the Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force or which may from time to time be made under the said Act shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such Milk Area.

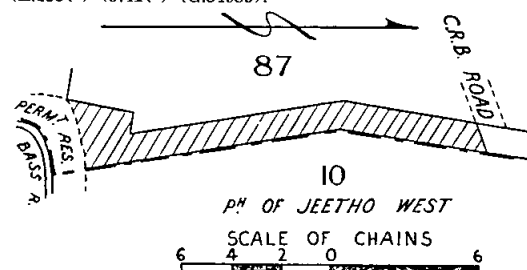

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act* 1946, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Public Service (Governor in Council) Regulations in the manner following, that is to say:—

PART IV.—LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

SPECIAL PART-TIME LEAVE TO ATTEND APPROVED COURSES OF STUDY.

Regulation 55.

In clause (3) for the words "the Schedule" read "Schedule A".

After Regulation 56 the following sub-heading and Regulation are inserted:—

SPECIAL LEAVE TO UNDERGO TRAINING FOR THE GENERAL NURSING
CERTIFICATE.

56A. (1) The Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Public Service Board, grant special leave to any officer on the nursing staff in the Mental Hygiene Branch, Department of Health, for the purpose of undergoing training to obtain a general nursing certificate who—

- (i) has obtained a certificate under Regulation 52 of the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as a Trained Mental Nurse or a Trained Mental Deficiency Nurse; and
- (ii) has been selected by the Mental Hygiene Authority to undergo such training.

(2) Before commencing such leave, an officer shall enter into an agreement with the Minister of Health in the form prescribed in Schedule B to these Regulations (with an approved surety) that he will not seek to terminate his training without the consent in writing of the Minister and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of two years after the termination of the special leave or completion of the course of training.

(3) Where any such leave is granted, and the amount of pay (not including any payment by way of overtime, penalty rates, higher duties allowances or any payment of a temporary character) which an officer would have received had he remained on duty exceeds the amount of pay received by him from the hospital employing authority while undergoing training, he shall be entitled to be paid an amount equal to the difference.

(4) Any period of leave taken by an officer under this Regulation shall not affect his seniority, subdivisional promotion, incremental progression, accruing sick leave credits or eligibility for long-service leave but no recreation leave shall accrue to an officer during such leave.

These Regulations shall have effect as on and from the 1st September, 1953.

This agreement is made the _____ day of _____ One thousand nine hundred and _____ between _____ of _____ in the State of Victoria an officer in the Mental Hygiene Branch of the Health Department of the Public Service of the said State (hereinafter called "the officer") of the first part _____ of _____ (hereinafter called "the surety") of the second part and the Honorable the Minister of Health of the said State (hereinafter called "the Minister") of the third part: Whereas the officer has applied for and has in accordance with the Public Service (Governor in Council) Regulations been granted leave of absence for the purpose of pursuing and completing a course of training for qualification as a registered nurse under the *Nurses Act 1928* at

(hereinafter called "the training school"): And whereas in accordance with the said Regulations the said leave has been granted upon the condition that if the amount of pay (excluding any payment by way of overtime or penalty rates, higher duties allowances or any payment of a temporary nature) which the officer would have received had he remained on duty in the said Department exceeds the amount of pay received by him from the training school while pursuing the said course he shall be entitled to be paid an amount equal to the excess and in consideration thereof the officer and the surety have agreed to enter into this agreement: And whereas the Minister has approved of the party hereto of the second part as a surety for the officer: Now these presents witness that in consideration of the premises the officer and the surety do hereby for themselves and their respective executors and administrators and also as separate covenants each of them doth hereby for himself his executors and administrators covenant with the Minister in manner following that is to say:—

1. That the officer will apply himself diligently to the said course and will not relinquish or discontinue it without the consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained and will remain in the said Public Service for a period of two years after the latest date (hereinafter called "the said date") on which he is absent from duty on leave granted as aforesaid.

2. That if the officer has received any payment pursuant to the condition hereinbefore recited then in the event of—

- (a) the termination of the services of the officer on account of any cause whatever (other than death or physical or mental incapacity to perform his duties) at any time during the period in which leave is granted;
- (b) the revocation by the Board of the grant of leave on the ground that the officer has failed to make satisfactory progress in the said course; or
- (c) any relinquishment or discontinuance by the officer of the said course without the consent of the Minister—

the officer and the surety or one of them will forthwith on demand pay or cause to be paid to the Minister by way of liquidated damages a sum equal to the amount of that payment.

3. That if the officer has received any payment pursuant to the said condition then in the event of the termination of the services of the officer on account of any cause whatever (other than death or mental or physical incapacity to perform his duties) after the said date but before the expiration of the period of two years aforesaid the officer and the surety or one of them will forthwith on demand pay or cause to be paid to the Minister by way of liquidated damages a sum equal to the amount of that payment: Provided that for every six months of service completed by the officer subsequent to the said date the sum last mentioned shall be reduced by one-quarter.

4. That the liability of the surety hereunder shall not be in any way released or discharged by reason of any time or other indulgence which the Minister may in his absolute discretion grant to the officer whereby the time or mode of payment by the officer of the whole or any portion of the moneys referred to in clauses 2 or 3 of this agreement may be extended or altered.

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE MAIN NEERIM ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

WHEREAS by sections 21 and 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Act has by Resolution declared a deviation to be a main road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a main road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution; And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a main road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

BY-LAW No. 165.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 165 for the purpose of suppressing a nuisance hereinafter described existing throughout the municipal district.

WHEREAS there exists throughout the municipal district a nuisance caused by the dropping from vehicles of offensive matter, material or substance on its streets, lanes, and public places, and whereas it is considered by the Council of the said city to be necessary for the purpose of suppressing such nuisance to make this By-law.

Now, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and of all other powers (if any) in that behalf existing, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray do order as follows:—

1. No person shall convey or permit to be conveyed in any vehicle upon any of the streets, lanes, or public places within the City of Footscray any matter, material, or substance, or any portion thereof, mentioned in Schedule "A" of this By-law, unless such vehicle is completely covered so as to effectively prevent the dropping therefrom of any such matter, material, or substance, or alternatively, is so loaded as to effectively prevent such droppings.

SCHEDULE "A."

Glass, dust, crushed rock, material known in the quarrying industry as salamander, briquettes, briquette dust, coal, coal dust, coke, soil, soot, sludge, mud, galena, phosphate-rock, pyrite, sulphur, sulphur-ore, powder or powdery or dusty matter, material or substance.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
