Land Act 1928.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN A CERTAIN CLASS DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish the area of Crown land comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

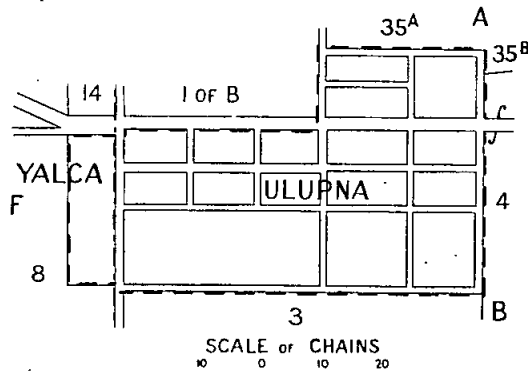

ORDER REVOKED AND TOWN ALTERED TO TOWNSHIP OF MERINO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933* do by this my Proclamation revoke the Order dated 8th August 1855 fixing the site for a Village at Merino at the Merino Water Holes about 43 miles from Portland, on the road to the Wannon and Upper Glenelg (see *Government Gazette* 1855 page 2049) and do hereby substitute the designation of Township for the designation of Town of the area of land in the Parish of Merino designated a Town distinguished by the name of Merino by Proclamation dated 18th February 1861 (see *Government Gazette* 1861 page 406).—(M.248(4) (C.95431).

And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that the said day should not be a public holiday throughout such part of Victoria:

Weights and Measures Acts.

ADDITION TO THE CENTRAL HIGHLANDS WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Weights and Measures Acts, it is amongst other things enacted that at the request of the Councils of all the municipalities concerned, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the Town of Castlemaine, the Borough of Daylesford and the Shires of Glenlyon, Kyneton, Maldon, Metcalfe, Newham and Woodend, and Newstead, do constitute a Union under the title of the "Central Highlands Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts:

And whereas the Councils of each of the said municipalities and the Councils of the municipalities of the Shires of Broadford, Kilmore, McIvor and Pyalong have requested that the Shires of Broadford, Kilmore, McIvor and Pyalong should be added to and form part of the said Union:

Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from the first day of October, 1953, the Shires of Broadford, Kilmore, McIvor and Pyalong shall be added to and form part of such Union, and do fix as follows the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union under the said Acts:—

1. The amount to be contributed by each municipality of the Union as re-constituted in accordance with this Proclamation shall bear the same proportion to the expenses devolving upon the Union as the number of persons residing in each such municipality bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union.
2. The number of persons residing in each such municipality shall be deemed to be the number of persons residing therein as disclosed by the last periodical census conducted by or on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.
3. The provisions set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof shall have effect from the first day of October next after the declaration or publication by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of Australia of the result of the periodical census showing the number of persons residing in each such municipality.

Provided that from the first day of October, 1953, until the thirtieth day of September next after the declaration or publication of the result of the census aforesaid, the

apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving upon the Union shall be as follows (that is to say):—

Town of Castlemaine	16 per centum.
Borough of Daylesford	9 per centum.
Shire of Broadford	6 per centum.
Shire of Glenlyon	7 per centum.
Shire of Kilmore	5 per centum.
Shire of Kyneton	23 per centum.
Shire of Maldon	6 per centum.
Shire of Metcalfe	6 per centum.
Shire of McIvor	8 per centum.
Shire of Newham and Woodend ..	5 per centum.
Shire of Newstead	7 per centum.
Shire of Pyalong	2 per centum.

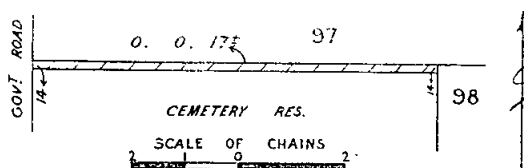

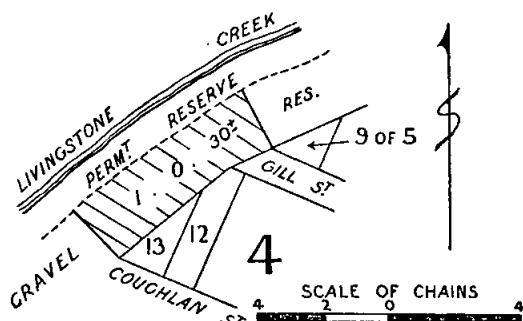

AMENDED REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 96 of the *Forests Act 1928*, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under section 55 of the *Forests Act 1915*, and section 65 of the *Forests Act 1918*, on the 7th day of April, 1925, by revoking the Twenty-first Schedule and inserting in lieu the following:—

FORESTS COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE STRIPPING AND REMOVAL OF WATTLE BARK.

Season.....

- (1) The licensee shall do everything within his power to strip and remove all bark available on the area upon which he is licensed to operate.
- (2) Stripping shall be commenced within six weeks from date of acceptance of offer unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.
- (3) No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified and is in possession of the requisite licence.
- (4) Notification in writing that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded to the officer in charge within 48 hours from date thereof.
- (5) No tree shall be felled or stripped on any area which the officer in charge directs is not to be operated upon and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped.
- (6) In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked and burned under the direction of and in accordance with the written conditions specified by the officer in charge.
- (7) No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse or to obstruct any road or track.
- (8) Except with the permission of the officer in charge no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety or less than 2½ inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground.
- (9) All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized in writing by the officer in charge.
- (10) Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.
- (11) No bark shall be removed without the permission of the officer in charge and it must be carted from the forest and weighed not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark unless otherwise authorized by the officer in charge.
- (12) The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officer in charge and at a rate satisfactory to the Commission.
- (13) All bark must be weighed at the weighbridge stipulated in the licence or at such other weighbridge as may be approved by the officer in charge and in all cases at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
- (14) Prior to removal of the bark satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty. The licensee shall pay such royalty at the rate tendered on weights as disclosed by the weighbridge dockets.
- (15) Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be determined by the officer in charge and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire otherwise than in accordance with the *Forests Acts and Regulations*.
- (16) The licensee shall forthwith comply with any direction given to him by the officer in charge for the effective protection from fire of the forest within the boundaries of the area upon which he is licensed to operate and he shall do everything that is reasonably within his power to prevent from spreading and to extinguish any fire which may break out on such area or which may spread to it.

(17) The violation of any of the above conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have absolute power to forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown and to seize all bark stripped to date of avoidance. The officer in charge shall have power to suspend operations pending the decision of the Forests Commission.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fungicides Acts, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Weed Destroyers Regulations 1953 (No. 1) and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. (i) No person shall sell any weed destroyer consisting of or containing:

Dinitro-ortho-cresol (DNOC; DNC); dinitro-sec-butyl-phenol (DNBP) or their salts,
unless such weed destroyer is contained in a package bearing a label on which are printed in accordance with the directions contained in the Schedule hereto the particulars set forth in the said Schedule.

(ii) No person shall sell any such weed destroyer in a package containing less than 1 gallon.

SCHEDULE.

Poisonous.

(To be printed in red letters of not less than 24 point.)

NOT TO BE TAKEN.

(To be printed in red letters of not less than 10 point.)

DO NOT OPEN UNTIL YOU HAVE READ SAFETY DIRECTIONS.

(To be printed in red letters of not less than 12 point.)

SAFETY DIRECTIONS.

Warning.

Extremely dangerous and may even be fatal if swallowed, inhaled as spray, or absorbed through the skin. Exercise extreme care in handling or using. Do not allow contact with the skin. If accidentally spilled on skin immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water. Do not breathe spray or mist. Wear protective waterproof clothing, rubber gloves and face mask when making up spray liquid or spraying. The face mask should be of the chemical cartridge type with canister of charcoal and filter pad. Wash clothing and gloves daily. Wash hands, arms and face thoroughly with soap and water before eating or smoking. Do not eat or smoke during spraying. Wash out and destroy empty containers. Wash spraying machines, hoses and lances at end of each shift and before repairs are made. Do not clear blocked jets by blowing out with the mouth.

Remedial Treatment.

The early symptoms may be fatigue, insomnia, sweating, thirst and loss of weight. On the first appearance of any of these symptoms, immediately cease work and call a doctor. Do not spray if suffering from a minor complaint such as a cold or stomach upset. Danger is greatest on hottest days.

Repeated mild effects may be very dangerous. If affected at all avoid further contact until medical approval has been given.

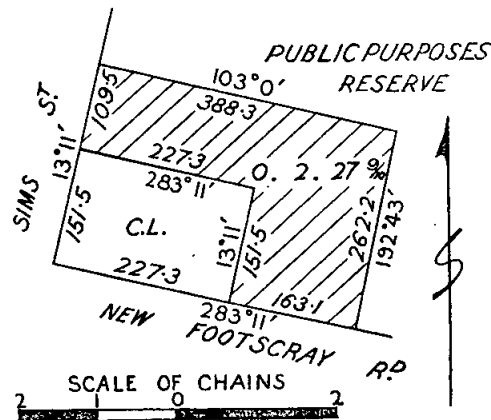

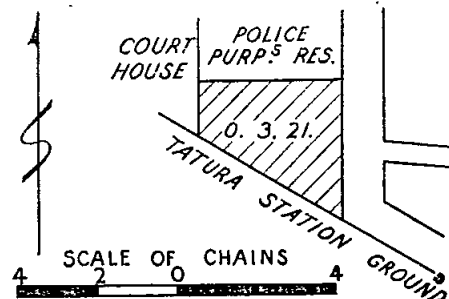

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "GRETA PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Greta temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 19th June, 1950, as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Greta Public Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"). The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"):

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall:—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained,

(e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.

(f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

7. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings on such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage and pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve, unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and

taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.4157.)

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy, numbered 106, made under and pursuant to the Local Government Acts and particularly section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and as business areas, and prohibiting and regulating trades, manufactures, industries therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 104 is hereby repealed.
2. The whole of the municipal district of the City of Fitzroy prescribed and defined as follows (save and except thereout the areas specified and defined in clause 4 hereof) is hereby declared to be a residential area, namely:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria-parade due south of the centre of Nicholson-street; thence north by a line passing through the centre of Nicholson-street to the southern boundary of the municipal district of Brunswick; thence east by the said southern boundary of the said municipal district to the Merri Creek; thence south-easterly by the Merri Creek to a bridge south of High-street, in the City of Northcote; thence south-westerly by a line passing through the centre of a Government road to the centre of the Heidelberg-road; thence south-westerly by a line passing through the centre of the Heidelberg-road to a point due north of the centre of Smith-street; thence south by a line passing through the centre of Smith-street to Victoria-parade before mentioned; and thence west by a line passing through the centre of Victoria-parade to the commencing point.

3. Within the said area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement is hereby prohibited.

4. The following areas are prescribed and declared to be business areas, namely:—The land abutting on the following roads or streets, or portions thereof, to a depth of 100 feet from the building or property line thereof, that is to say:—

Smith-street, west side, from Victoria-parade to Queen's-parade.
Brunswick-street, both sides, from Victoria-parade to Queen's-parade.
Gertrude-street, both sides.
Johnston-street, both sides.
St. George's-road, both sides, from Reid-street to Clausen-street.
Best-street, west side, from St. George's-road to Scotchmer-street.
Queen's-parade, north side, from Delbridge-street to Rushall-crescent.

5. In the areas prescribed and defined as above as business areas, the use of any land and the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of any of the following trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements is prohibited, that is to say:—

Abattoirs and slaughter houses.
Ammonia, chlorine, or bleach powder manufacture.
Animal by-products extraction or manufacture.
Arsenic recovery works.
Asphalt, asphalt product, tar, or tar product manufacture.
Bitumen or bitumen products manufacture.
Blast furnace or smelting works, structural steel works.
Blood albumen factories or blood boiling or blood drying works.
Boiling-down works.
Bone boiling or burning or grinding or milling works.
Bone manure works.
Bottle or glass factory.
Brick, tile, terra-cotta, or pottery manufacture.
Burnt clay products.
Cattle saleyards as defined in the Health Acts.
Celluloid manufacture.
Cement works and cement-bag cleaning works.
Cheese factory or maturing works.
Chemical fertilizer or manure works.
Coal gas manufacture, coke ovens, distillation of coal.
Creosote manufacture or its wholesale application to materials.
Dye-stuff manufacture, disinfectant or insecticide manufacture.
Explosive manufacture, excavation of land except so far as is necessary for building foundations.
Fat extracting or melting or rendering works.
Fellmongery, wool scouring, or scouring works.
Flock, shoddy, or mungo factories.

Gas manufacture.
Glue, size, or gelatine manufacture.
Gunpowder or explosives manufacture.
Gut cleaning or gut scraping or gut drying or gut spinning works.
Gypsum, lime or lime products, or plaster of paris manufacture.
Hydrochloric, sulphuric, or nitric acid works.
Incineration or reduction of garbage or refuse, except as approved by the Council.
Iron and steel foundries and rolling mills.
Knacker yards.
Linoleum or oilcloth manufacture.
Manure works.
Marine stores in which are received or stored any things which are or are likely to become offensive.
Match factories.
Oils, paints, shellac, turpentine, varnish, or enamel manufacture.
Paper and pulp manufacture.
Piggeries.
Potash works.
Poultry killing or cleaning or dressing.
Printing-ink manufacture.
Quarrying operations.
Rag picking or rag sorting.
Refining of petroleum or storage thereof in quantities exceeding 2,000 gallons in any one container.
Sand pits.
Soap or candle works, soap drying works.
Stock yards.
Stores for skins, hides, hoofs, hair, or bones.
Structural steel-works.
Sugar refinery, smelters, starch or glucose manufacture.
Tanning or curing of raw hides.
Timber mills, including sawmills, planing mills, and factories using woodworking machinery, but for the use of hand or power saw for cutting firewood in a woodyard or the establishment of a cabinet-making business or a joinery or furniture-making business is permitted if approved by the Council.
Timber stacking or storage, except as ancillary to any industry which is not prohibited hereunder.
Tripe-boiling establishment.
Vinegar manufacture.
Whitelead manufacture.
Works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal.
Yeast manufacture.
Any industry or use which creates odours, smoke, dust, noise, or vibration which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive or injurious to health.
Any business in which a total of more than 2 horsepower is used.

6. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not more than Twenty pounds, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

- (c) authorizing the Council to pull down and remove such erections or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by the By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such erections or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- (d) regulating, restricting, or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to effect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape;
- (e) regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or affixed to or painted on any hoardings or on any building, or on any fence, rock, cliff, or tree;
- (f) appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such Regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council under this By-law;

- (g) regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the City of Prahran or under the control and management of the Council;
- (h) generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality with respect to the foregoing matters or any of them.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, By-law No. 192, made and passed on the 26th day of October, 1936, confirmed on the 23rd day of November, 1936, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 12th January, 1937, is hereby amended to include the following clause:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in By-law No. 192 it shall not be lawful to have or erect, place on or posted on any portion of any land, building, tree, or structure any illuminated sign within a residential area, whether or not the property is being used as a business premises or residential purposes.
