Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 663.

MEAT MEAL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 663.

#### Maximum Prices.

2. I fix and declare the maximum price at which Meat Meal may be sold by any person to be—  $\,$ 

£35 per ton of 2,240 lb. avoirdupois, bagged.

#### Delivery of Invoices.

- 3. (a) Any person who sells meat meal shall deliver with that meat meal an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—
  - (i) Name and address of the seller;
  - (ii) Name and address of the purchaser;
  - (iii) The date of sale;
  - (iv) The quantity of meat meal contained in the sale;
  - (v) Price charged.
- (b) A copy of any invoice or docket issued under the provisions of this clause shall be preserved by the seller.

### Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which meat meal specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
