AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By: the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

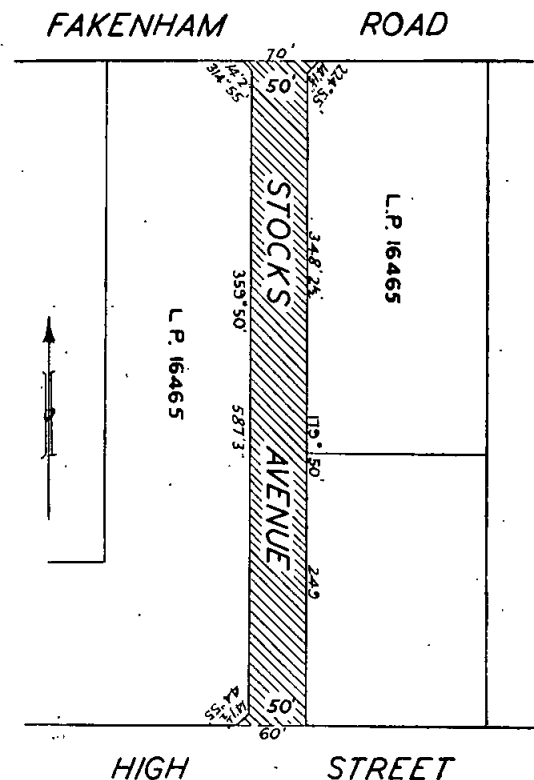
PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Camberwell has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street, being part of Crown portion 140, Parish of Boroondarra, County of Bourke, and being the street shown as Stocks-avenue on plan of subdivision, No. 16465, lodged in the Office of Titles, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act:—

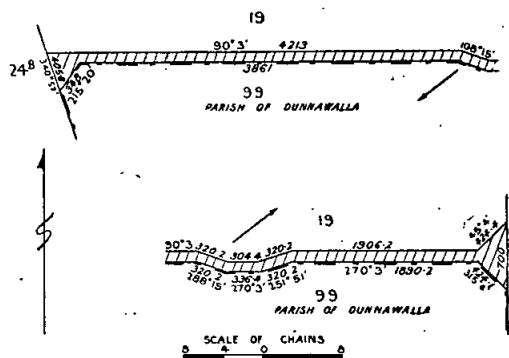

(b) In sub-regulation (ii) of Regulation 23 for the expression "2s. 6d." there shall be substituted the expression "5s."

(c) In Regulation 24 for the expression "5s." there shall be substituted the expression "10s."

(d) In paragraph (b) in Regulation 25 for the expression "5s." there shall be substituted the expression "10s."

(e) In Regulation 29 for the expression "10s." there shall be substituted the expression "£1 1s."

NURSES REGULATIONS 1954.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act 1928* (No. 3744), as amended by any Act, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1954 and shall be read and construed as one with the Nurses Regulations 1941 and all Regulations amending the same.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation upon approval by the Governor in Council and publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The Nurses Regulations 1941, as amended by any Regulations, are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In Form 5 of the First Schedule—

(i) for the expression "fee of 7s. 6d. for registration" there shall be substituted "fee of 10s. for registration"; and

(ii) for the expression "the fee 12s. 6d." there shall be substituted the expression "the fee 15s."

(b) In the Third Schedule—

(i) For the amount £0 7s. 6d. (Seven shillings and six pence) shown opposite the words "For registration as a nurse" there shall be substituted the amount £0 10s. 0d. (Ten shillings).

(ii) For the amount £0 5s. 0d. (Five shillings) shown opposite the words "For annual fee" there shall be substituted the amount £0 10s. 0d. (Ten shillings).

(iii) For the amount £0 10s. 0d. (Ten shillings) shown opposite the words "For restoration of a name to the register in case of default in payment of an annual fee" there shall be substituted the amount £1 1s. 0d. (One guinea).

(iv) For the amount £0 10s. 0d. (Ten shillings) shown opposite the words "For like restoration in any other case" there shall be substituted the amount £1 1s. 0d. (One guinea).

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

The Dried Fruits Regulations are hereby amended as follows:—

1. In Regulation 27—

- (a) for the expression "27" substitute the expression "27(1)";
- (b) at the end thereof add the following sub-regulations:—

- (2) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Regulation, "Dried Currants—Manufacturers' Quality" may be sold by persons approved by the Board for manufacturing purposes only.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation—

- (a) "Dried Currants — Manufacturers' Quality" shall comply with the following conditions and restrictions:—

Where the currants are not size-graded, the following riddles shall be used:—

- (a) dust riddle, 6/32 inch; and
- (b) buck riddle, 13/32 inch.

Where the currants are graded into two sizes, the following riddles shall be used:—

- (a) dust riddle, 6/32 inch;
- (b) intermediate riddle, 9/32 inch; and
- (c) buck riddle, 13/32 inch.

Where the currants are graded into three sizes, the following riddles shall be used:—

- (a) dust riddle, 5/32 inch;
- (b) intermediate riddle, 8/32 inch;
- (c) intermediate riddle, 9/32 inch; and
- (d) buck riddle, 13/32 inch.

The currants which pass through an 8/32-in. riddle and over a 5/32-in. riddle shall consist of dark-coloured currants of good bloom, flavour, and texture for the size of berries.

The currants shall consist of dark-coloured berries of good flavour, free from shotty and pin-head specimens, and from all foreign matter. No package shall contain more than 50 per centum by number of red and unripened currants, nor more than 5 per centum by number of berries containing seeds.

- (b) For the purposes of this Regulation, "Manufacturing Purposes" means mincing, boiling, milling, or other process whereby the character of the dried currants is altered or destroyed.

- (4) "Dried Currants—Manufacturers' Quality" shall not be sold except by the persons and for the purposes set out in sub-regulation (2) hereof.
2. In Item 12 of the Second Schedule to the said Regulations—
- (a) in the first column for the words "Manufacturers' Quality" substitute the word "Plain";
- (b) in the third column for the expression word "Manufacturers'" substitute the expression word "Plain".

BOROUGH OF KYABRAM CONSTITUTED AND SHIRE
OF RODNEY REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to constitute any part of Victoria not exceeding in area 9 square miles and having no point in such area distant more than 6 miles from any other point therein, and containing a population of inhabitant householders not less than five hundred, a borough:

And it is further enacted that every Order constituting any new borough shall assign a name to such borough, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions:

And it is further enacted that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide the same; and as regards every subdivision of which portion only is severed may cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision, or may declare that such residue shall thenceforth be deemed such subdivision and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and shall take effect as from the day specified in the Order in that behalf, or, if no day is specified, as from the day of the publication of the Order in the *Government Gazette*:

And whereas a request has been submitted to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act that a certain area described in such request be severed from the Shire of Rodney and the Kyabram Riding thereof and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Borough of Kyabram:

And whereas the proposal set out in such request has been submitted to and carried at a poll of ratepayers entitled to vote in respect of property held in such area:

Now, therefore, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this Order doth grant such request, and with effect on and from the 1st April, 1954, doth constitute portion of the Kyabram Riding of the Shire of Rodney a borough, to be named the Borough of Kyabram, and doth order that the residue of the Kyabram Riding shall henceforth be deemed to be the Kyabram Riding, that the municipal district of the said Borough of Kyabram be unsubdivided, that the Council of the said borough consist of nine members, and that the boundaries of the said borough, the boundaries of the Shire of Rodney, as reduced, and the boundaries of the subdivisions of the said shire be those set forth and described, such descriptions to be in lieu of those published in the *Victoria Government Gazettes* of the 18th May, 1888, and the 26th May, 1948:

Borough of Kyabram (Constituted).

Commencing at the north-western angle of the Parish of Kyabram East; thence easterly by the northern boundary of that parish to the north-western angle of allotment 14 in the aforesaid parish; thence southerly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 22A; thence westerly by a road to the western boundary of the parish; and thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

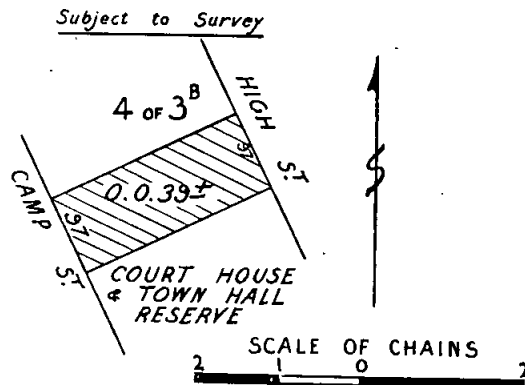

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 622.

FIBROUS PLASTER.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 622.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 497 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Fixation of Maximum Prices and Rates.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which any fibrous plaster products specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the price specified in that Schedule.
(2) I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any service specified in the Second and Third Schedules to this Order may be supplied by any person to be the rate specified in those Schedules.

Delivery of Invoices.

5. Any person who sells any fibrous plaster products or supplies any service in connexion therewith shall deliver with those fibrous plaster products or on completion of the service in connexion therewith an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—

- (a) The name and address of the seller or supplier;
- (b) the name and address of the purchaser;
- (c) the address at which those fibrous plaster products are delivered or at which the service in connexion therewith is supplied;

- (d) the date of the sale of those fibrous plaster products or the supply of such service;
- (e) a full description of those fibrous plaster products including thickness or width or dimensions as the case may be;
- (f) the quantity of each thickness, width or dimension of fibrous plaster products sold or used;
- (g) full particulars of any service supplied in connexion with the fixing of fibrous plaster products, including total measurements charged for and the rate at which such measurements are charged;
- (h) full particulars of any service of cartage supplied in connexion with the sale or supply of fibrous plaster products, including the rate at which such service is supplied and the total amount charged therefor.

Fixation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice—Specified Persons.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price or rate at which any fibrous plaster products specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause or any service in connexion with the sale of those fibrous plaster products so specified may be sold or supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 623.

FIBROUS PLASTER—COUNTRY.

I IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 623.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 498 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Area 1” means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 20 miles but within a radius of 75 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Area 2” means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 75 miles but within a radius of 175 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Area 3” means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 175 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Fixation of Maximum Prices and Rates.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which any fibrous plaster product specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold in any part of Victoria which lies beyond a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, to be the price specified in that Schedule which is appropriate to the area in which the sale takes place.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any service specified in the Second and Third Schedules to this Order may be supplied in any part of Victoria which lies beyond a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, to be the rate specified in that Schedule which is appropriate to the area in which the service is supplied.

Delivery of Invoices.

5. Any person who sells any fibrous plaster products or supplies any service in connexion therewith, shall deliver with those fibrous plaster products, or on completion of the service in connexion therewith, an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—

- (a) The name and address of the seller or supplier;
- (b) the name and address of the purchaser;
- (c) the address at which those fibrous plaster products are delivered, or at which the service in connexion therewith is supplied;
- (d) the date of the sale of those fibrous plaster products or the supply of such service;
- (e) a full description of those fibrous plaster products, including thickness or width, or dimensions, as the case may be;
- (f) the quantity of each thickness, width, or dimension of fibrous plaster products sold or used;
- (g) full particulars of any service supplied in connexion with the fixing of fibrous plaster products, including total measurements charged for, and the rate at which such measurements are charged;
- (h) full particulars of any service of cartage supplied in connexion with the sale or supply of fibrous plaster products, including the rate at which such service is supplied, and the total amount charged therefor.

Fixation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice—Specified Persons.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price or rate at which any fibrous plaster products specified in a notice in writing, given in pursuance of this clause, or any service in connexion with the sale of those fibrous plaster products so specified may be sold or supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
