PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section fifty-seven of the Weights and Measures Act 1939 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation dissolve any Union at the request of not less than half of the Councils constituting such Union:

And whereas the Shires of Bacchus Marsh, Bulla, Gisborne, Keilor, Melton and Romsey do constitute a Union for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts, under the name of the Bacchus Marsh Weights and Measures Union:

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the Local Government Act 1946 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX, of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Camperdown has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality, and the Council of the Shire of Gordon has

requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946 to the municipal district of the Borough of Camperdown and the Townships of Boort and Pyramid Hill, within the municipal district of the Shire of Gordon, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the municipal district of the Borough of Camperdown and the above-mentioned parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Gordon on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 10th March, 1955, except insofar as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 10th March, 1955.

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944 it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the eighth day of December, 1954, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:

The Second Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Bendigo, the Borough of Eaglehawk and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Twenty-first Fire Control Region;

the Twelfth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Alexandra and Yea;

those portions of the Sixteenth Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Borough of Stawell and the Shires of Avoca and Stawell;

the Seventeenth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Horsham and the Shires of Arapiles, Dimboola, Dunmunkle, Kaniva, Kowree, Lowan, Warracknabeal and Wimmera;

those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Town of Castlemaine, the Shires of Maldon and Metcalfe and those portions of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye not included in the Second Fire Control Region;

and those portions of the Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Benalla and Wangaratta and the Shires of Benalla, Mansfield, Oxley, Ruthergien and Wangaratta.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FORESTRY PRACTICES ON PRIVATE LAND WITHIN, THE GISBORNE-SUNBURY WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Acts the Soil Conservation Authority has determined that the most suitable use in the public interest of all land within the Gisborne-Sunbury Water Supply Catchment shall be primarily for water supply and that all such land unless specially exempted shall be used permanently for forest purposes, the following Regulations are prescribed for use in connexion with forestry operations on privately-owned land:—

- 1. All forestry operations in the catchment are to conform with good forestry practice, with particular regard to the safeguarding of the area for water supply purposes.
- 2. No timber is to be felled for sale except with the written approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.

Where such approval is granted-

- (a) all trees to be felled must be marked by an officer
- or representative of the Authority;
 (b) logging operations must be carried out in a manner approved by the Authority, or its representative, each case being determined according to the particular conditions.
- 3. No burning operations are to be carried out except with the approval and under the direction of the Authority or its representative.
- 4. No saw-bench or mill may operate within the catchment.
- 5. The destruction of living trees by means other than felling is prohibited except where permission has been given by the Authority or its representative for the killing of damaged trees which are likely to impede the growth of young trees.
- 6. Dead timber may be removed for any purpose.
- 7. A landholder may remove poles or fencing timber for use on his own property or firewood for his own domestic use.
- 8. The Chief Forest Officer at Macedon is the representative of the Soil Conservation Authority.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN IN ENTERING INTO CONFINED SPACES.

WHEREAS the presence in certain confined spaces of certain gases or vapours or fumes or mists or dusts, or the absence of oxygen or a reduction in the amount of oxygen present in such confined spaces, is likely to cause injury to or the death of a person who enters such a space:

And whereas the entry of any person into such confined spaces, may, unless adequate precautions are taken, endanger life or impair health: And whereas it is provided amongst other things by section 95 of the *Health Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 10 of the *Health Act* 1941, that the Governor in Council may make Regulations safeguarding the public health and the health of persons engaged in dangerous trades, or in such occupations and processes as are likely to endanger or impair health:

Now, therefore, by virtue of and pursuant to such powers and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Entry into Confined Spaces Regulations 1954" and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—
 - "Fumes" shall mean gas, vapour, fume, mist, dust or smoke.
 - "Confined space" shall mean any vat, tank, pit, pipe, flue, silo, container, reaction vessel or receptacle which contains or has contained any harmful fumes, or substances capable of producing them, or which contains or has contained or is made of or lined or coated with any substance or substances capable of causing the amount of oxygen present to be reduced to a dangerous extent, but shall not include any mine within the meaning of the Mines Acts.
 - "Properly made harness" shall mean a harness so constituted that the point of attachment of the harness to the rope is between the head and the centre of gravity of the body and with shoulder and crutch straps to prevent the body slipping through the harness.
 - "Distant Breathing Respirator" means a respirator consisting of a face piece equipped with appropriate valves, and attached to a hose through which air can be inhaled, the hose being of such a length that the end distant from the face mask can be placed in fresh air, and remain therein during the period of use in any particular circumstance.
 - "Positive Pressure Respirator" means a respirator consisting of a face piece equipped with appropriate valves, and attached to a hose through which fresh air may be supplied by compressor, or air blower, or air pump.
 - "Self-contained breathing apparatus" means a face piece equipped with appropriate valves and attached to a supply of compressed air or oxygen carried on the person.

- 3. No person shall cause permit or suffer any person in his employ to enter any confined space unless either—
 - (a) the person entering the space is equipped with one or other of the following types of breathing apparatus in efficient working order, namely—
 - (i) a suitable distant breathing respirator;
 - (ii) a suitable positive pressure respirator;
 - (iii) a self-contained breathing apparatus; or
 - (b) immediately prior to the entry fresh air has been blown into the confined space for a time sufficient to remove dangerous amounts of any harmful fumes or to supply sufficient oxygen which time shall in no case be less than ten minutes.
- 4. (1) When any person equipped with a positive pressure respirator enters a confined space the employer shall see that the compressor, air blower or air pump supplying such respirator is kept operating throughout the period during which the wearer of the respirator remains in the confined space.
- (2) When fresh air is blown into a confined space for the purposes of regulation 3 the employer shall see that the following procedure is followed:—
 - (a) The fresh air shall be blown in through a hose having its outlet inside the confined space at a point as remote as possible from the manhole or opening through which entry is to be made, and the blowing shall be such that a positive current comes out of the confined space through the said manhole or opening.
 - (b) The blowing shall be continued throughout the period during which any person not equipped as set out in paragraph (a) of regulation 3 hereof remains in the confined space.
- 5. No person shall cause, permit or suffer any person in his employ to enter any confined space—
 - (a) unless the person entering the space is equipped with properly made harness and rope by means of which he may be quickly removed from the space;
 - (b) unless another person or persons is or are outside the space and holding the rope so that at the first sign of danger to the person inside the space he may be at once removed from the space;
 - (c) unless a person skilled in the application of artificial respiration is in attendance and readily available.
- 6. (1) In every case where it is known from the use to which a confined space has been put prior to the proposed entry that fumes of any of the substances listed in Column One of the Schedule hereto or of any other dangerous substance are likely to be present or that the air in the confined space is likely to be deficient in oxygen, entry shall not be made until the air within the space has been tested by appropriate means for the substance or substances likely to be present or for the lack of oxygen, as the case may be, and has been shown
- (2) In the case of the substances listed in Column One of the Schedule the air shall not be deemed to be safe if it contains concentrations in excess of the quantities set out in Columns Two, Three and Four respectively of the said Schedule.
- (3) The provisions of regulations 3, 4 and 5 shall be applicable notwithstanding that the air has been tested and found to be safe.
- 7. In any premises where entry into confined spaces occurs there shall be prominently displayed in the vicinity of each such space a notice setting out the danger of entry, the fumes likely to be encountered, the presence of inflammable or explosive gases or vapours, or the absence of adequate oxygen, as the case may be.
- 8. The apparatus for blowing out, the harness and ropes, the breathing apparatus, the testing apparatus, shall be tested at intervals and kept in good order.

- 9. Where entry to the confined space is through a manhole the size of the manhole shall be not less than 18 inches long by 16 inches wide if rectangular, and not less than 18 inches in diameter if circular, except in the case of tank wagons when the dimensions shall be not less than 16 inches long by 14 inches wide if rectangular and not less than 16 inches in diameter if circular.
- 10. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.



- 4. An information for an offence under these Regulations may be laid by any person appointed generally or in respect of any special proceeding by the responsible authority, or without restricting the generality of the foregoing, by the Town Clerk where the responsible authority is the council of a municipality, or by the Secretary where the responsible authority is the Board or the Board of Works.
- 5. Clauses 6, 8 and 11 of the Town and Country Planning Regulations (No. 4)—Preparation and Submission of Planning Schemes, and the Sixth and Seventh Schedules thereto are hereby repealed.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 664.

CORRUGATED AND PLAIN ZINCANNEAL AND GALVANIZED IRON AND TERNE PLATE OF AUSTRALIAN MANUFACTURE.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 664.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 483 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears:—
 "Point of delivery" means, in relation to the sale of specified goods, the place at which liability for payment of transport. charges in conveying such goods to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased such goods.
- "Prevailing rate" in relation to the cartage of specified goods by any person on any terms or conditions means the rate approved to the Victorian Road Transport Association at the time of sale.
- "Sales by retail" means, sales to contracting plumbers, builders, and users.
- "Sales by wholesale" means, sales to recognized resellers such as timber merchants, storekeepers, and hardware merchants, but does not include sales to plumbers, builders, or users.
- "Sheets" means, sales of specified goods of less than one-half ton lots in any one size.
- "Specified goods" means, Corrugated and Plain Zincanneal and Galvanized Iron and Terne Plate of Australian Manufacture.
- "Ton-" means, a weight of 2,240 lbs. avoirdupois.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Wholesale.

- (4). (i) I fix and declare the maximum price at which specified goods may be sold by wholesale by any person to be such price as is specified in a notice in writing given by the Commissioner to that person.
- (ii) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Order and issued after 18th October, 1954, which operate to fix maximum prices for the sale by wholesale of specified goods by any person and which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Retail.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the specified goods set out in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be:—
 - (i) The appropriate price specified in that Schedule; plus
 - (ii) The cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such specified goods from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business and which is clearly recorded in his books of account or records.
- 6. I fix and declare the maximum rate which may be charged for the cartage of specified goods to be the prevailing rate.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any specified goods may be sold by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this clause is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

- 8. (i) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any specified goods, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall at all times whilst such goods are in his possession keep attached to or displayed with such goods, a ticket or label, setting forth his selling price thereof.
- (ii) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (i) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods and so as to be properly associated with such goods.

Application for Maximum Prices.

9. Any person who purchases for resale any specified goods for which a maximum price is not fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall not sell those specified goods unless and until that person has made a written request to the Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which those specified goods may be sold and the Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.

Delivery of Invoices.

- 10. Every person who sells specified goods shall deliver with those goods an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:— $\,$
 - (i) Name of seller,
 - (ii) Address of seller,
 - (iii) Date of sale,
 - (iv) Name of purchaser,
 - (v) Address of purchaser,
 - (vi) Quantity of specified goods sold,
 - (vii) Full description of goods showing gauge, width, and length,
 - (viii) Price at which those goods are sold.

 - (vii) Bulk salt stores, stores in which stores are stocked (except store or oven manufacturers' stores) and stores in which sausage casings are stored, packed or sorted.
 - (viii) Stove or oven manufacturers' stores.
 - (ix) Dye stores connected with the business of dyeing, or the manufacture of piece-goods or apparel.
 - (x) Wholesale softgoods warehouses.
 - (xi) Wholesale chemists, or manufacturing chemists' establishments.
 - (xii) Tobacco stores.

CASUAL WORK.

24. Casual employees, i.e., persons employed in Bond or Free Stores or Establishments engaged in the general bulk storage business for less than four weeks, shall be paid at the rate of 7s 6½d. per hour.

Clauses, other than clauses 2, 3, and 4, of Part I., and clause 24 of Part III., of the said Determination shall remain in force.
