AREAS OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1923 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1923, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1923 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the area of Crown land comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1923 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that on the request of the council of any municipal district and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, and that thereupon such municipal district, or portion thereof, shall for the purpose of the said Act, he included in and form part of such fire district: And whereas the Councils of the municipal districts of the Shire of Mulgrave, City of Moorabbin, and Shire of Dandenong have requested that a portion of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Metropolitan Fire

Brigades Board that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the portions of the municipal districts of the Shire of Mulgrave, the City of Moorabbin, and the Shire of Dandenong comprised within the boundaries set forth hereunder shall, from the thirty-first day of December in the year One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, viz.:—

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Milk Pasteurization Act 1949 (No. 5444) it is provided that a day be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas the municipal district of the City of Brunswick has been prescribed as a district for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Saturday the first day of January, 1955, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed district of the City of Brunswick—

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-law No. 4947.—Sale and Distribution of Water for Irrigation.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

- 1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Irrigation and Water Supply Districts named in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto except within any Urban Division of such Districts, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1955.
- 2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.
- 3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission and shall be installed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be recorded by the Water Bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.
- 4. If it appears to the Commission that any gauge or appliance for measurement is inaccurate or not registering, the quantity of water supplied in any watering during the period such gauge or appliance was deemed to be inaccurate or not registering shall be computed on the basis set out in the Schedule to this By-law according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied, and the quantity so computed shall be deemed to be the countity complied during the said position. quantity supplied during the said period.
- 5. In the absence of any specific means of measurement, the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being the volume of water set out in the Schedule to this By-law over any area watered according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied, and for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge a watering means the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be the volume of water set out in the Schedule to this By-law over any area watered according to the classification of the lands and the crops to which the water was supplied. Provided that in the case of lands planted to tomatoes in any district named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this By-law, the quantity of water supplied during any year shall be accounted as 2 acce-feet for each acre of land watered.
 - 6. In respect of any District named in Column 1 of the Schedule to this By-law-
 - (a) The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned during the irrigation period as fixed by the Commission each year shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for that District for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any such lands during such period, the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to such lands as

 - of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to such faints as rights.

 (b) The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned during the irrigation period as fixed by the Commission each year shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

 (c) The charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of all lands during the period outside the irrigation period as fixed by the Commission each year shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed by the By-law making an irrigation charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of lands within that District to which water rights have been apportioned during the last preceding irrigation period.
- 7. For the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge, an acre-foot of water shall be and is hereby deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot, and graded land means land which, in the opinion of the Commission, has been effectively laid out for the purpose of irrigation on the border, check, or contour system.
- 8. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the Water Bailiff in charge of that portion of the District in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.
- 9. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than that supplied under a water right, shall be payable on demand at the office of the Commission at the place set down in Column 8 opposite the name of the respective Irrigation and Water Supply District in Column 1 of the Schedule to this By-law.
- 10. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.
- 11. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through such outlets, at such times in such order, and in such manner as the Commission or its authorized officers may direct; any person who wrongfully takes water from any such works shall be guilty of an offence.

12. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Water Bailiffs of the District, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission; any person not so authorized who interferes with the flow of water in any channel or with any works of the Commission, or with any registering appliance in connexion therewith, shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to the penalty provided in the Water Acts. Such penalty shall be recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.





REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF PETROL AND OTHER VOLATILE FLUIDS, APPLICABLE TO THE WHOLE OF VICTORIA.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by Part XXVII. of the Local Government Act 1946, His Excellency, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby makes the following Regulations-which shall be in lieu of the Regulations made under the Local Government Act 1928, and published in the Government Gazette of the 12th June, 1940and orders that the said Regulations shall apply to the whole of Victoria and take effect on publication in the Government Gazette.

REGULATIONS.

STORAGE OF MORE THAN 50 GALLONS OF PETROL, ETC., OR MORE THAN 250 GALLONS OF KEROSENE, ETC.

- 1. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:-
 - (1) The site of all buildings or premises shall be first approved of by the Council.
 - (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron, or other non-inflammable material, except that in the case of a galvanized iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.

(3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.

(4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls shall be without break or opening, the capacity of such 'enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored, or retained in any such building.

PRECAUTIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN BUILDINGS.

- 2. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than 1 pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, or more than 250 gallons of petroleum, or any products of petroleum. turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:-
 - (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and, where practicable, to be under the supervision of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade or the Country Fire Authority, as the case may be.
 - (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand, shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
 - (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
 - (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

CONDITIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF TANKS.

- 3. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—
 - (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
 - (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
 - (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank, but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

STORAGE OF LESS THAN 50 GALLONS OF PETROL, ETC., OR LESS THAN 250 GALLONS OF KEROSENE, ETC.

- 4. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an imflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—
 - (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material, including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustile goods and will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than 1 pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.
 - (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass, earthenware, or metal, and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises.

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Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers,

5. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

CONTAINERS TO BE LABELLED FOR RETAIL SALE.

6. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in clause 2 of these Regulations and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—" Highly Inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

REGULATIONS NOT TO APPLY UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

- 7. Nothing in these Regulations shall apply to the keeping or storing of— $\,$
 - (a) Alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.
 - (b) Lubricating oil when kept in overhead closed tanks, provided the following conditions are complied with:—
 - (i) The maximum quantity kept or stored in this manner shall not exceed in the aggregate 520 gallons and the rated capacity of any one tank shall not exceed 130 gallons.
 - (ii) Each tank shall be carried on incombustible supports and constructed of not less than 12-gauge mild steel sheets.
 - (iii) Each tank shall be vented to the open air and, shall have an overflow pipe of a greater diameter than the fill pipe discharging to a safe location, preferably in the open air.
 - (iv). A fire valve shall be placed as close as possible to the outlet of each tank and, by the provision of a fuseable link, be automatically self-closing in case of fire.

- Power to Enter and Inspect.

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

OFFENCE.

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

PENALTY.

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

EXEMPTIONS MAY BE MADE BY THE COUNCIL.

The Council may, if it considers reasonable care will be observed, exempt from any one or more of these Regulations inflammable liquids when kept for private use, provided the store is exclusively used for inflammable liquids, and not less than 50 feet intervene between the store and other buildings or an adjoining property boundary.

Note.—Private use does not include inflammable liquids kept for sale or for purely business activities.

DEFINITIONS.

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context "Council" means the Council of the municipality in whose municipal district the site of such buildings, premises or storage tanks is situated. "Approved" means approved in writing by or on behalf of such Council. "Engineer" means the engineer or deputy engineer of such municipality. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test, if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Methylated spirit, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

And the Honorable Samuel Merrifield, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions accordingly.

YALLOURN WORKS PROTECTION REGULATIONS 1954.

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred by section 27 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1928 (No. 3776), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, make the following Regulations for or with respect to the protection of works and electric lines of the Commission, and the prevention of any interference therewith, and generally for or with respect to the safety of persons and property, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Yallourn Works Protection Regulations 1954."
- 2. These Regulations shall come into force on the date on which they are published in the Government Gazette.
 - 3. In these Regulations the words-
 - "the Commission" mean the State Electricity Commission of Victoria:
 - "the General Superintendent" mean the officer of the Commission who for the time being fulfils under the Commission the duties of the supervision of administration at Yallourn or his authorized deputy:
 - or his authorized deputy;
 "the Camp Foreman" mean the officer of the Commission
 who for the time being fulfils under the Commission the
 duties of the officer known as Camp Foreman at Yallourn.
- 4. These Regulations shall apply to and in respect of all land and property occupied by the Commission or owned by the Commission and not occupied by a person pursuant to a lease or agreement for a lease in writing, which land in either case is situate within the Yallourn Works Area as proclaimed from time to time pursuant to the State Electricity Commission (Yallourn Area) Act 1947 and in addition any land or property owned or occupied by the Commission for the purposes of and incidental to constructing, maintaining and operating any works, undertakings or activities of the Commission its agents or contractors constructed or being for the time constructed for purposes of or incidental to the works, undertakings and other activities of the Commission within the Yallourn Works Area, and to and in respect of all property and works of the Commission on such land and to and in respect of all property, works, bridges, culverts, drains, sewers of the Commission, or by the Commission built, constructed, laid, or done on or upon any road or street constructed or laid out by the Commission in that area whether such road or street be now or hereafter dedicated to the public, and shall operate within that area.
 - 5. The penalty, pecuniary or other, set out-
 - (a) at the foot of any clause of these Regulations, or
 - (b) separately set out at the foot of each sub-clause of a clause of these Regulations

shall indicate that any contravention of the clause or of the sub-clause (as the case is), whether by act or omission, shall be an offence against these Regulations, punishable upon conviction by a penalty not exceeding the penalty mentioned.

Provided that where the penalty is expressed to apply to a part only of the clause or sub-clause it shall apply to that part only.

Damaging or Posting Notices on Walls, &c., Prohibited.

6. No person shall damage or disfigure or unless he has the authority of the General Superintendent so to do post or cause to be posted any notice or advertisement on the wall or walls of any building or on any road, footpath, or on any other works of the Commission.

Penalty: One pound.

No Person to be About Working Places Without Permit.

7. No person shall be or remain in or about any enclosed area or working place or open cut or any tramway, railway, ropeway, or haulage system or apparatus or electric machinery or open storage area unless he is either engaged on the work there being carried out or has a written official permit from the Secretary of the Commission or the General Superintendent to be or remain therein.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Riding, &c., on Tramways, &c.

8. No person unless he has the authority of the General Superintendent shall be or ride on or in any truck or other vehicle, motor or otherwise, tramway, railway, ropeway, or haulage system, plant or apparatus of the Commission unless and except insofar as it is necessary for him to be or ride in the same truck or other vehicle in pursuance of his duty.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Protection of Streets, Watercourses, &c.

9. No person shall, unless he has the authority of the General Superintendent so to do, displace, take up, make any alteration in or remove the soil, pavement, flags, sod, scrapings or sand or other material of any street or road or any fence on any street or road.

Penalty: Five pounds.

- 10. No person shall unless he has the authority of the General Superintendent so to do--- $\,$
 - (a) construct any dam or embankment in or across any watercourse or drain or channel or otherwise obstruct in any way or direct any water away from or into any reservoir, tank, stream, conduit or channel; or
 - (b) wilfully obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain;or
 - (c) interfere with, obstruct, damage or pollute any pumps, machinery, reservoirs, mains, or other things pertaining to the Commission's water supply or sewerage system.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

Water Not to be Wasted.

11. No person having access to or taking water from the waterworks of the Commission shall negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe, tap, or conduit.

Penalty: Two pounds.

12. No person shall unless he has the consent of the General Superintendent so to do, use water from the Commission's water supply system for the purpose of driving any water motor, water fan, or other water power device.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Use of Streams, Pools, &c.

13. No person shall bathe in the Latrobe River, within one-half mile of the water supply pump-house nor in the portion of the said river situated between 100 yards upstream from the power station screen pits and 100 yards downstream from the power station weir.

Penalty: One pound.

14. No person shall wash or cleanse any animal in the waters hereinafter named or cause any animal, whether alive or dead, to be thrown into or enter the water of (a) the Commission's water supply reservoirs, or (b) the Latrobe River between points situated one-half mile upstream from the water supply pump-house and 100 yards downstream from the power-house weir, or (c) any lake, pond, reservoir, or other water constructed for the purposes of a baths or swimming pool.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

Material Not to be Removed.

15. No person shall take, remove, or carry away or cause to be taken, removed or carried away or have in his possession or under his control any material or thing owned or held by the Commission for the purpose of any of its works unless he has the authority of

the Commission's officer who is responsible for its custody to do so, and no person shall convert or apply any material or thing of the Commission to his own or any other unauthorized use.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Electric or Other Appliances Not to be Interfered With.

16. No person shall, without the permission of the General Superintendent, damage, interfere, or tamper with any electric fittings or appliances, or water taps, valves, float valves, hydrants or water supply or fire-fighting plant, fittings or appliances owned or used by the Commission for the purpose of any of its works.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

False Alarms.

17. No person shall wilfully cause to be operated any alarm apparatus of the Commission, whether it is operated by hand, compressed air, electricity, steam or otherwise except on an occasion and for a purpose for which such apparatus was installed

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Firearms Not to be Carried or Discharged.

18. No person shall without the consent of the General Superintendent, have or discharge any loaded firearm, gun or explosives on any part of the Yallourn Works Area.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Riding, Driving, &c.

19. No person shall wilfully and without lawful excuse ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal, or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, motor-cycle, motor-car, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or water channel or gutter, save in each case upon and by or at some proper crossings which shall be provided for such purpose.

Penalty: Two pounds.

20. No person shall drive, ride, or cause or permit to be driven or ridden any motor or other vehicle on any street or road on property, of the Commission at such a speed or leave or allow to stand such vehicle in such a manner as to prejudice the convenient use and enjoyment by the Commission of its roads and streets or as to be dangerous to persons lawfully using or likely to be using them.

Penalty: Fifteen pounds.

21. Notwithstanding the provisions of these Regulations the Commission may, from time to time, or at any time, by signs or notices erected at any place on, over or near any street or road within the Yallourn Works Area not being a public highway, restrict, prohibit or impose conditions as to maximum speed and otherwise as to the manner of driving or leaving any or all traffic on any such street or road, any person driving or being in charge of any vehicle on any such street or road shall obey and conform to all such signs or notices and all directions as to restrictions or prohibitions on traffic given verbally or in writing by any officer of the Commission whether as to all streets or roads.

Provided that proof of the existence of any such sign or notice shall be prima facie evidence that such notice was erected by and under authority of the Commission.

Penalty: Five pounds.

No Trading Without Permit.

22. No person shall sell or expose for sale any article unless he has the permission of the General Superintendent so to do.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Burning Off and Bonfires.

23. No person shall, unless he has the authority of the General Superintendent so to do, burn off any rubbish or grass, or wilfully or negligently light or cause to be lit any timber, scrub, undergrowth, grass, or other inflammable material not in a properly constructed and protected fireplace.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

24. No person shall light or burn any bonfire, tar barrel, or incendiary fireworks within 60 yards of any street or building.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

25. No person shall on any land of or occupied by the Commission for purposes of or incidental to the said scheme or within 1 mile of any building, store, or vehicle park or any place where brown coal briquettes or brown coal products are placed, transported, processed or used, or any inflammable material is used for the said scheme wilfully or negligently light or cause to be lit any timber, scrub, undergrowth, grass, or other material likely to cause a spread of fire, or shall burn off any rubbish not in a properly constructed and protected fireplace.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

No Smoking or Naked Lights in Prescribed Areas.

26. No person shall smoke or shall have, bring, make, or use any unprotected light or any fire in or in the vicinity of any store, magazine, stable, timber stack, coal, briquette or firewood dump, or in any other place where anything of an inflammable nature may be or may be stored.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

27. No person shall smoke or shall have, bring, make, or use any unprotected light or any fire in any part of the briquette works enclosure or stores or of any part of the screen-house, or within 50 yards of any part of the open cut.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

Cubicles, Tents, or Other Buildings Not to be Occupied Without Permission.

28. No person shall occupy any cubicle, tent, or accommodation or site for accommodation unless he has the consent of the General Superintendent or some other authorized officer of the Commission so to do.

Penalty: Ten shillings.

Fires in Cubicles or Tents Prohibited.

29. No person shall light or have any fire in any cubicle or tent except in a fireplace or stove specifically approved by the General Superintendent.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Use of Electrical Appliances and Apparatus.

30. No person shall in any cubicle of the Commission connect an electric radiator or stove to any electrical outlet, other than a power point provided for same by the Commission, or connect to the Commission's supply any electrical apparatus the sale of which would be an infringement of the State Electricity Commission Acts.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Cubicles, Tents, and Camps to be Kept Clean.

31. Any person or persons occupying cubicles, tents, huts, or other buildings of the Commission in the areas set apart for the purposes of accommodation shall keep such quarters at all times in a clean and sanitary condition, and no person shall use or permit to be used such cubicle, tent, hut, or building for any other purposes than a dwelling.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Stretchers and Fittings Not to be Removed.

32. No person shall without permission of the Camp Foreman remove from any cubicle, tent, or other place any stretcher, fitting, or other material the property of the Commission.

Penalty: One pound.

Animals in Cubicles, Tents, or Camp Areas or on Other Commission Property.

- 33. (a) No person shall keep a dog or other animal in any cubicle, tent, or camp area unless he has the consent of the General Superintendent so to do.
- (b) No person shall keep any stock within the Yallourn Works Area unless he has the consent of the General Superintendent so to do and complies with the conditions (if any) upon which such consent is given.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Liability of Persons Erecting Tents and Buildings to Remove on Demand.

34. (a) No person shall erect any tent or other structure or place any caravan on the Commission's property without the consent of the General Superintendent, and if any person who erects or occupies any tent, building, or other structure or places any caravan upon any land of or occupied by the Commission within the Yallourn Works Area shall not remove the same at his own expense within seven days after being ordered by the General Superintendent so to do by notice in writing, given personally or to any apparent occupant of the tent, building, other structure, or caravan, or left fixed to the site in a conspicuous position, the Commission may cause the tent, building, or other structure to be entered and removed forcibly and without compensation.

(b) No person shall prevent or obstruct any officer or agent of the Commission from entering or removing such tent, building, or other structure or caravan.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Negligently Suffering Chimney to be on Fire.

35. No person shall wilfully set on fire or negligently permit to be set on fire any chimney flue, smoke, vent, or stove pipe in any premises occupied by him.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Storage of Petrol or Inflammable Material.

36. No person shall install or allow to be installed unless he has permission of the General Superintendent so to do any underground storage for petrol or other inflammable liquid.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

37. No person or persons shall keep or store other than in one or more motor vehicles any quantity of petrol or other inflammable liquid in excess of 44 gallons in any one garage or building.

Penalty: Five pounds.

38. No person shall keep or store any quantity of petrol or other inflammable liquid in excess of 4 gallons within a radius of 20 feet of any domicile or building other than a garage.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Flowers or Shrubs in Gardens or Parks and Trees in Street Plantations Not to be Damaged or Destroyed.

39. No person shall, unless he has the authority of the General Superintendent so to do, pluck any of the flowers or walk on any of the beds or borders in any park, road, or cultivated area of the Commission, or damage or destroy any plant or thing therein.

Penalty: Two pounds.

40: No person shall wilfully or negligently damage or destroy any tree that is in a street plantation.

Penalty: Ten pounds.

Trees or Plants Not to be Removed or Destroyed.

41. No person shall cut down, damage, or remove any tree, plant, shrub, fern, or other vegetation in the property of the Commission unless he has permission of the General Superintendent so to do.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Permits-Conditions: Revocation.

42. (a) Either the General Superintendent or an officer of the Commission who has given any person consent or permission or authority to do any act which is by these Regulations forbidden, except if done with consent or permission or authority, may at any time by notifying the person to whom consent or permission or authority has been given, or to his agent engaged in doing the act, revoke such consent or permission or authority already given to do that act. Any act or default of such person or of any person as his agent done or made after he or his agent has been so notified shall be deemed to have been done or made without the consent or the permission or authority required by these Regulations.

(b) If any permission given to any act referred to in these Regulations is limited to doing the act in a manner or in conditions or circumstances or at a time or times or between times or on a day or days or between days or with or by means of a vehicle or vehicles, obstruction or obstructions, dam or dams, thing or things, or at a place or places, or between points specified, described, or referred to in writing signed by the General Superintendent or other authorized officer of the Commission relating to the permission, it shall be an offence against these Regulations to do that act otherwise than in the manner, conditions, or circumstances or at the time or times, or between the times, or on the day or days, or between the days, or with or by means of any vehicle, obstruction, dam, or thing, or at any place other than that or those elsewhere than between the points respectively so specified, described, or referred to.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(c) If any permission of the General Superintendent, or other authorized officer of the Commission given to any such act is given on or subject to a condition or term that it is not to be done in a manner or in conditions or circumstances, or at a time or times or between times, or on a day or days or between days, or with or by means of a vehicle or vehicles, obstruction or obstructions, dam or dams, thing or things, or at places or between points specified, described, or referred to in such writing as aforesaid, it shall be an offence against these Regulations to do that act in the manner, conditions, or circumstances, or at the time or times or between the times, or on the day or days or between the days, or with or by means of the vehicle or vehicles, obstruction or obstructions, dam or dams, thing or things, or at the places or between the points respectively so specified, described or referred to.

Penalty: Five pounds.

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General

43. Any reference in these Regulations to the consent, authority, or permission of any officer of the Commission means consent, authority, or permission, in writing, signed by such officer or by his deputy.

In any proceedings for any breach of these Regulations, a certificate, purporting to be issued or written by or under the direction of the Commission, and purporting to be signed by the Secretary of the Commission, and stating the absence of any consent, authority, or permission, proof of the absence of which is material in any such proceedings, shall be prima facie evidence of the absence of such consent, authority, or permission. It shall not be necessary for such certificate to specify any date or dates on which such consent, authority, or permission had not been given, but it shall be sufficient if the said certificate states that at no material time was any such consent, authority, or permission given.

- 44. (a) Nothing in these Regulations shall render unlawful an act which is reasonably necessary in and is done in the proper performance of a contractual obligation to the Commission or a statutory duty.
- (b) Nothing in these Regulations shall render lawful any act or omission which is unlawful by virtue of any statute or other Regulations made under any statute.

Revocation.

45. The Regulations made on the twenty-sixth day of August, 1940, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of August, 1940, pursuant to the provisions of section 27 of the *State Electricity Commission Act* 1928 (No. 3776) and of other provisions of the State Electricity Commission Acts or any additions or amendments thereto or variations thereof, are hereby repealed.

And the Honorable John William Galbally, Her Majesty's Minister in Charge of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

STATE SAVINGS BANK ACT 1928 (No. 3777).

In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may remove such bathing-box, boat-shed, or other structure and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

By-LAW No. 77.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1928, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

- 1. By-law No. 24 of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully is hereby expressly repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the North, Centre, and East Ridings of the Shire, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.
- 4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.
 - "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises, but does not include garden prunings.
- 5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.
- 6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.
- 7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 3 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.
- 8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.
- 9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deoderant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

- 10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.
- 11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.
- 12. The proprietor (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the Contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.
- 13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.
- 14. The Contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception. Such Contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.
- 15. The Contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitably covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.
- 16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.
- 17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.
- 18. The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor.
- 19. The Contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.
- 20. Where refuse is authorized to be disposed of at a tip the proprietor thereof shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950, or any amendment thereof.
- 21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.
- 22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

SHIRE OF KYNETON.

BY-LAW No. 40.

A By-law, numbered 40, for the regulation and management of the Abattoirs of the Shire of Kyneton, and for fixing the dues and fees to be charged thereat.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Kyneton (and hereinafter called the Council) makes the following By-law:—

Regulations heretofore made relating to matters herein are hereby repealed.

Management.

1. The land of the Council held for Abattoir purposes, and all buildings and structures thereon and appurtenances thereto, hereinafter called the establishment, shall be under the charge, care, management, and direction of the manager appointed thereto by the Council with one or more assistants as the Council have appointed or shall appoint for that purpose.

Assistant Manager, &c.

2. During the absence of the manager, his duties shall devolve upon and be performed by the assistant or other person in the service of the Council then in charge of the establishment, and such assistant or person shall for the time being have all the power, authority, and duty of the manager.

Hours for Use.

- 3. The establishment shall be open for use on days and hours as determined by the Council and given in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary but not on Sunday, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Meaday, Anac Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or any other day or days which may from time to time be Proclaimed as Public Holidays and at no other time.
- 4. Every person who shall pay the dues and fees as hereinafter fixed shall be entitled to the following services:—

Services Rendered at Kyneton Municipal Abattoirs.

- (a) Services shall include taking delivery of live stock at Abattoirs where stock is forwarded by motor transport or driven in by road. In all cases the owners will be required to have each head of stock plainly branded with their operating number as assigned to them by the Manager.
- (b) Penning up, slaughtering, dressing, inspection, branding, chilling, and placing together with edible offals ex Abattoirs.
 - (c) Delivery of hides, skins, and inedible offal to be given ex killing floors.

Stock to be Reported.

5. Every person who shall bring any animals to the establishment shall forthwith inform the manager or his deputy of the number and description thereof, together with the name and address of the owner thereof, and the locality or district from which the same were brought and the manager shall thereupon cause such particulars to be entered in a Record Book to be kept at the Abattoirs, and every such person shall place such animals in such portion of the establishment as directed by the manager, and in no case shall any animals once brought into the establishment be removed without the consent of the manager.

Fees and Dues Payable.

6. The following fees and dues shall be payable to the Council for the above-mentioned services in connexion with the Abattoirs:

Subject to space being available the Council may, at the request of owners, hold meat in the chilling chambers beyond the 72 hours prescribed. The following additional charges for meat so held shall be:—

Cattle and calves over 250 lbs. s. bobby-calf, goat, lamb, sheep, pig s. 1 3 for up to another 72 hours.

Food for Stock.

7. The owner of all animals placed in the establishment shall provide the same with good and sufficient food at least once in every 24 hours, and shall provide that all milch animals shall be duly milked, and in case he shall fail to do so the Council may do so and such owner shall pay the Council all expenses incurred in connexion therewith, provided that no animal shall be allowed to remain in the holding pens for a longer period than 48 hours, nor any carcass or portion of any carcass to remain in the chilling chambers for a longer period than 72 hours, unless with the consent of the manager.

Diseased Animals.

8. No animals visibly or known to be affected with any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into the establishment except with the express permission of the manager.

Lien.

9. The Council shall have a lien on all animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal for the time being in the establishment of any person indebted to the Council, and if any person shall make a default for seven (7) days in payment of any fees or sums due by him, the Council may (without and demand or giving any notice) sell by public auction or private contract all or any part of such animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal, and after deducting all fees and sums due to the Council shall pay the surplus thereof to the owner of such animals, carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal.

Liability for Death, Injury, or Escape.

10. The Council will take all reasonable care of stock brought into the establishment for slaughter, but will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any stock.

Liability for Loss of Carcass.

11. The Council will take all reasonable care of carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and offal while in its possession, but the Council will not be responsible for any loss thereof or any damage thereto.

Liability for Bone-taint, Hides, and Skins.

12. The Council will take no risk or responsibility with respect to carcasses, skins, hides, fat, and/or offal of animals slaughtered at the establishment, and the Council will under no circumstances whatever be responsible for bone-taint or any other condition which may occur in carcass meat in the chilling chambers.

Hours for Opening and Closing Chilling Chambers.

13. The chilling chambers at the establishment shall be opened and closed daily at such times as the manager shall direct, and at no other times, and all persons doing business at the establishment in connexion with the chilling chambers shall conform to the directions of the manager or the inspector or other person on duty at the time.

Carcass to be Examined and Passed Before Removal.

14. No person shall remove from the establishment any carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the inspector and passed by him as fit for human food, and branded by him with the regulation brand.

Slaughtermen.

15. No person shall be permitted to commence or continue to work at the establishment as a slaughterman unless his name shall be entered in the Register of Slaughtermen hereby required to be kept by the manager, and he shall have signed an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every one of the rules and regulations of the establishment under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register of Slaughtermen. No slaughtering shall be done during the last hour before the closing time prescribed.

Diseased Animals to be Reported.

16. Immediately any animal slaughtered is discovered to be diseased the slaughterman in charge shall immediately stop the work of dressing such animal for food and report the fact to the manager or inspector on duty at the time, and shall not proceed further with such dressing until authorized to do so.

Organs of Diseased Carcasses.

17. It shall be the duty of slaughtermen to see that the organs of diseased carcasses are not mixed with the Disfiguring Walls, &c.

18. No slaughterman or other person shall-

- (a) Write on, soil, disfigure, any of the walls, floors, ceilings, fittings, or fixtures of the establishment, or remove, deface, or disfigure any signboard, or written or printed matter, or notice on or in the
- (b) Except with the permission of the manager, interfere in any way with the electric light, switches, motors, fans, ventilation arrangements, or the steam or water pipes of other appliances whatsoever in the establishment.
- (c) No slaughterman shall leave the establishment attired in his slaughtering clothes. Every slaughterman shall keep such, when not in use, in such part of the establishment as shall be made available and assigned to him for such purpose by the manager.

Mess Room for Meals,

19. Every slaughterman and every other person having meals at the establishment shall use the mess room provided for the purpose, and shall not use any other portion of the establishment for the purpose.

Cruelty to Animals.

20. No person shall ill-treat or unnecessarily frighten or irritate any animal or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal at the establishment.

Dogs.

21. No dogs, other than cattle or sheep dogs, shall be brought upon or allowed to remain in the establishment, and every such cattle and sheep dog, when not in use, shall be securely tied up by the person in charge of such dog in such place as is assigned for that purpose by the manager. All other dogs found on the establishment whether in charge of any person or not, will be destroyed.

Liability for Breakages, &c.

22. Every person using the establishment who shall do any breakage, injury, damage, or destruction thereto, or to any of the appliances, used in connexion therewith, whether accidentally or otherwise, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the manager, and if he shall have so acted wantonly or maliciously, he shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Persons Illegally on the Premises.

23. No person, unless having lawful business to transact at the establishment, shall enter thereon or remain therein, and if any such person does not leave immediately upon being requested to do so by the manager, the assistant, or other person in charge thereof for the time being, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and may be forcibly removed.

Offensive and Indecent Behaviour, &c.

24. Any person who shall be under the influence of liquor, or who shall be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive or offensive language or conduct, or of obscenity or indecency, or who shall conduct himself riotously or create disturbance, or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty any manager, inspector, or other officer, or person appointed by the Council to conduct or aid in the good management of the establishment, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any request of any such manager, inspector, officer, or other person. shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and may be forcibly removed from the establishment.

25. Any person who shall deposit or cause to be deposited, any blood, offal, filth or refuse matter upon any portion of the establishment, or on any road or land abutting thereon, save in the pits, bins or receptacles provided for same, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. The owner of any animals slaughtered at the establishment shall cause all skins, hides, viscera, and all inedible parts of the animal to be removed from the establishment on the same day of slaughter and at least half an hour before the time due for the Council employees or contractors as the case may be to cease work.

Urinals---Use of.

26. No person shall, without the consent of the manager, place any insoluble or germicidal or other foreign matter in any urinal or water closet at the establishment. Every person using such urinal or water closet shall use only the sanitary roll paper provided therein by the Council, and shall before leaving such convenience use the flushing water provided for the discharge of the excrement deposited in such convenience.

Clean Clothing.

27. The manager, assistant, or other person in charge for the time being may refuse to allow any person not wearing clean clothing or clean overalls to load or handle any meat in the establishment.

Penalty.

28. Any contravention of this By-law, or any part thereof, by act or omission, shall be an offence against this By-law, and every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Operation of By-law.

29. This By-law shall apply to and have effect throughout the whole of the Shire of Kyneton.
