"BAG" LIMIT FOR WILD DUCK AND GREY TEAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

The Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the twelfth day of January, 1932, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette

of the thirteenth day of January, 1932, respecting the "Bag" limit for Wild Ducks and Teal, and do hereby prescribe ten birds as the maximum number of birds whether wild ducks, including not more than five Chestnut Breasted Shelduck (Mountain Duck), or Grey Teal either alone or together which any person may kill or destroy or have in possession on any one day during the open season for such native game other than the first day of such open season, and for the first day of such open season, and for the maximum number of such birds, including not more than five Chestnut Breasted Shelduck (Mountain Duck), which may be so killed or destroyed or had in possession: And I do also hereby prescribe a sum of not less than Two pounds nor more than Ten pounds as the penalty for any contravention of this Proclamation.

Town and Country Planning Act 1944-1949. CITY OF HEIDELBERG. INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1944-1949 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the City of Heidelberg (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development

which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order.

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after publication of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3 of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used lawfully immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1944-1949, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.







SEED BEANS MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS.

TN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 43 (1) of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and on the recommendation of the Seed Beans Marketing Board, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Seed Beans Marketing Board" Regulations 1954.
- 2. Interpretation of Terms.-In construing these Regulations, the following words, if not inconsistent with the context or subjectmatter, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that is to say):-
 - "The Act" means the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).
 - "Board" means the Seed Beans Marketing Board, constituted and appointed under the Marketing of Primary Products Acts.
 - "Person" includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate, and any firm of partners.
 - "Producer" means a producer as defined by the Act who produces seed beans within Victoria.
 - "Schedule" means the Schedule to these Regulations.
 - "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Seed Beans Marketing Board, and includes any person appointed by the Board to act as Secretary during the absence of the Secretary. "Seed Beans" means Seed of any variety or strain of the genus
 - Phaseolus (including cultivated beans such as French, kidney, stringless, navy, butter, haricot, lima, and climbing beans).
- 3. At all meetings of the Board at which the Chairman is present he shall preside. In the absence of the Chairman through any cause whatsoever the Board shall elect from those members in attendance one who shall be Deputy Chairman for that meeting.
- 4. The Board shall meet on such dates, at such places, and at such times as the Chairman may in his discretion from time to time determine, but the Chairman, if so requested by any two members of the Board, shall call a Special Meeting of the Board at any time.
- 5. The Secretary shall cause to be delivered to each member of the Board a notice, in writing, or by telegraph, of any Ordinary or Special Meeting four clear days before the date of such meeting, provided that, if in the opinion of the Chairman it is desirable in the case of an emergency to do so, shorter notice may be given to each member of any Special Meeting.
- 6. If at the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present, one-half hour from the time so appointed shall be allowed for the formation of a quorum, and, if at the expiration of that period no quorum is present, the meeting shall lapse.
- 7. If the meeting lapses through the absence of a quorum, the business set down for such meeting shall be the business, or included in the business, of the next meeting of the Board.
 - 8. At all meetings of the Board every member present shall vote.
- 9. The Secretary shall keep proper minutes of all resolutions, business, and proceedings made or transacted at each meeting of the Board, which shall be submitted to the members for confirmation, and, when confirmed, shall be signed by the Chairman. Any entry in the minute book, and signed by the Chairman, that any resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.
- 10. All correspondence shall be signed by the Chairman, Secretary, Manager, or other person authorized by the Board.

- 11. The Secretary or any other person authorized by the Board shall receive and account for all moneys paid to the Board, and each day shall bank moneys received by him at a bank selected by the Board. Only the Secretary or such person authorized for that purpose may endorse cheques for collection on behalf of the Board, and all cheques so endorsed shall be passed through the Board's bank account.
- 12. All accounts due and payable by the Board shall be passed by the Board, provided that the Secretary, with the approval of the Chairman, may make payments not exceeding One hundred pounds in the aggregate in anticipation of and subject to the confirmation of the Board at its next regular meeting following any such payment or payments.
- 13. (a) All accounts due by the Board which exceed Five pounds shall be paid by cheque signed by any two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.
- (b) All accounts not exceeding Five pounds may be paid from a petty cash account, the standing balance of which shall not at any time exceed Twenty-five pounds.
- 14. The Secretary to the Board shall have the custody of the common seal of the Board, which shall be kept in such place as, the Board directs, and when not in use shall be kept in a place of safe custody secured by lock and key.
- 15. The common seal shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of a resolution of the Board. In every case where the common seal is authorized to be affixed to any document, such seal shall be affixed only in the presence of at least two members of the Board (one of whom shall be the Chairman or Deputy Chairman), who shall sign every such document, which shall be countersigned by the Secretary.
 - 16. The order of business at any meeting shall be as follows:-
 - (i) Reading and confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.
 - (ii) Matters arising from the minutes of previous meeting.
 - (iii) Correspondence.
 - (iv) Statement of receipts and payments since the previous meeting.
 - (v) Accounts.
 - (vi) Matters relating to servants, agents, and officers of the Board.
 - (vii) Such other matters as any member of the Board desires to bring before the Board.
- 17. A resolution of the Board shall not be revoked or altered unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration is given in writing to each of the members four days at least before the meeting at which the revocation or alteration is to be proposed.
- 18. There shall be conspicuously displayed at least every twelve months in the Board's public office a full and explicit statement of the Board's receipts and expenditure, stock transactions, and liabilities for the period since the last preceding statement was so displayed:
- 19. At least every year there shall be similarly displayed a full and explicit balance-sheet of the Board, audited in accordance with section 11 of the Act.
- 20. The statement and balance-sheet referred to in Regulations 18 and 19 shall remain displayed until they are replaced by any subsequent statement and balance-sheet, and shall be available for perusal and copying at reasonable hours by any person.
- 21. (a) Every producer of seed beans shall in each year before a date to be advertised in such newspapers as the Board determines register with the Board, and for such purposes shall complete and forward to the Board an application in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule.
- (b) The Board may allocate to each such applicant a distinctive registration number and send notification thereof to the applicant accordingly.
- (c) In this Regulation "year" means the calendar year commencing on 1st July.
- (d) Any grower having failed to register by the advertised date may apply to the Board for subsequent registration, and may be granted such registration at the discretion of the Board.
- 22. All seed beans delivered to the Board shall be delivered insound; clean sacks clearly marked with the brand allocated to the producer thereof, and with the name of the variety of the beans.

- 23. The certificate to be issued by the Board in accordance with and subject to section 24 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule.
- 24. The Board may replace any lost or damaged certificate issued in accordance with section 24 of the Act, provided that such duplicate certificates shall be clearly stamped across the face thereof with the words "Duplicate only."
- 25. The notice to be given by a producer in accordance with section 28 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule.
- 26. The notice to be given by any person claiming to be entitled to any bill of sale, mortgage, lien, charge, pledge, interest, trust, or encumbrance whatsoever of or upon or over any of the commodity delivered to the Board, or claiming to be the true owner of such commodity, shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule.
- 27. All seed beans delivered to the Board shall conform to one of the following grades:—
 - (1) "Premium Grade Government Certified."—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been certified under the certification scheme of the Department of Agriculture of Victoria, and which are sound, dry, of a good natural colour, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed, or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects, and capable of germinating 95 per cent. or over.
 - (2) "Grade I. Government Certified."—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been certified under the certification scheme of the Department of Agriculture of Victoria, and which are sound, dry, of a good natural colour, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects, and capable of germinating between 85 per cent. and 94 per cent.
 - (3) "Grade II. Government Certified."—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which have been certified under the certification scheme of the Department of Agriculture of Victoria, and which are sound, dry, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects, and capable of
 - germinating 85 per cent. or over.

 (4) "Premium Grade Commercial."—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which are sound, dry, of a good natural colour, free from broken, shriveled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 95 per cent or over
 - insects and capable of germinating 95 per cent. or over.

 (5) "Grade I. Commercial."—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which are sound, dry, of a good natural colour, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating between 85 per cent. and 94 per cent.
 - (6) "Grade II. Commercial."—This grade shall comprise whole beans of the same variety which are sound, dry, free from broken, shrivelled, malformed or sprouted seeds, undamaged by disease or insects and capable of germinating 85 per cent. or over:
- 28. The certificate of refusal to be given to a producer in accordance with the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule.
- 29. The Board may, in every sale, or agreement of sale, of seed beans by the Board to any person, insert conditions, and fix a sum as and by way of liquidated damages for any breach of condition, which damages shall be recoverable accordingly.
- 30. Applications, under the provisions of paragraph (d) of section 19 of the Act, for exemption from the operation of the said section shall not be considered by the Board unless—
 - (1) The producer makes application to the Board not later than 28 days after the completion of the harvesting of the seed beans, such application to be in or to the effect of Form 6 of the Schedule.
 - (2) The producer has paid all levies and other charges due by him to the Board.
 - (3) The producer has complied with all provisions of the Act and the Regulations made thereunder.

(4) The terms of any contract entered into or proposed to be entered into by the producer with respect to the seed beans have been submitted to the Board for consideration.

31. Any exemption granted by the Board from the operation of section 19 shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:—

The producer of seed beans to which an exemption applies-

- (a) shall permit any member of or person authorized by the Board to enter at any reasonable time any land, building, or premises of the producer for the purpose of inspection thereof, and to inspect any books, accounts, registers, documents or writings in the custody or control of the producer, and to take notes, copies, or extracts thereof or therefrom, and shall truthfully answer any questions relating to such books or accounts, or to any seed beans produced by him;
- (b) shall not without the consent of the Board use such seed beans for any purpose other than that for which the exemption was granted;
- (c) shall pay all levies and other charges due to the Board within the time prescribed;
- (d) shall, if required by the Board, deliver to the Board not later than 60 days after the completion of the harvesting of the seed beans a return in the form of a statutory declaration showing the total number of bags and weight of the seed beans produced from that harvest, the quantity delivered to the Board, the quantity otherwise disposed of, and the manner of its disposal and the prices obtained for any such seed beans sold.
- 32. Every person guilty of a breach of these Regulations shall, if no other penalty be provided, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

Firemen with twenty years' service may wear a red clasp below the badge; with twenty-five years' service a white clasp; with thirty years' service a blue clasp; with thirty-five years' service a green clasp; and with forty years' service a gold clasp. Applications for badges, certificates, and clasps must be made in the manner determined by the Authority from time to time.
- (2) Captains of urban brigades with not less than five years' service as captain under the Country Fire Brigades Board and/or the Authority, and not less than ten years' service in all, shall be entitled upon retirement to retain and wear their uniform. Any member of an urban brigade who has served for any period as a captain approved by the Country Fire Brigades Board or the

Authority shall be entitled to wear an ex-captain's badge. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this Regulation.



No person shall hereafter erect or construct or cause or permit to be erected or constructed any hoarding (other than a hoarding which does not exceed twenty square feet in area and other than a hoarding which does not exceed forty square feet in area affixed by the owner or occupier of any shop, factory, or theatre to such shop, factory, or theatre, or to any verandah attached to the front thereof for the purpose of indicating and which indicates the nature of the business carried on in such shop, factory, or theatre and/or for the purpose of advertising any goods manufactured or sold or any entertainment provided in connexion with such business, and which indicates advertisements or refers to no other matter or thing).

- 5. No person shall hereafter on any allotment of land (other than an allotment of land on which a shop, factory, or theatre is erected) erect or construct or cause or permit to be erected or constructed more than one hoarding for each frontage which such allotment of land has to a public highway or more than one hoarding facing any such frontage.
- 6. No person shall hereafter on any allotment of land on which a shop, factory, or theatre is erected, erect or construct or cause or permit to be erected or constructed more than one hoarding for each twenty feet of frontage which such allotment of land has to a public highway.
- 7. No person shall hereafter erect or construct or cause or permit to be erected or constructed any sky sign unless the form and mode of construction, the materials of which the same is to be constructed and the method of support and attachment thereof to the building or land on which the same is to be erected or constructed have first been approved in writing by the Council under the hand of its Building Surveyor.
- 8. No person shall hereafter erect or construct or cause or permit to be erected any such sky sign otherwise than in accordance with such approval in writing.
- 9. No person shall hereafter exhibit any advertisement in such place or in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of the landscape.
- 10. No person shall hereafter attach or affix to or paint on any hoarding or on any building or on any fence, rock, cliff, or tree any advertisement which is in the opinion of the Council unsightly or objectionable.

(a) If any person shall hereafter erect or construct or cause or permit to be erected or constructed any hoarding contrary to the provisions of this By-law the Council or its Building Surveyor may give to the owner of such hoarding if he shall be known or if he or his address shall not be known may post on such hoarding notice in writing requiring such owner within a time therein specified (not being less than fourteen days from the service or posting of such notice) to show cause to the Council why such hoarding should not be pulled down, demolished, and removed.
- (b) If after considering any reasons or representations against the pulling down, demolition, and removal of such hoarding which may be given or made by or on behalf of such owner the Council is of opinion that such hoarding should be pulled down, demolished, and removed, the Council may cause such hoarding to be pulled down, demolished, and removed and may sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down, demolishing, and removing such hoarding, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
