WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 3 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—


ORDER REVOKED AND TOWNSHIP OF TRARALGON PROCLAIMED.



Poisons Acts. AMENDMENT OF THE FOURTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Poisons Act 1928 it is among other things enacted that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by proclamation amend the Fourth Schedule to the Poisons Act 1928 by adding thereto and removing therefore. Act 1928 by adding thereto and removing therefrom any substance or preparation:

And whereas the said Pharmacy Board has recommended that the substances or preparations—

"Crayons, pastels and coloured chalks containing lead or arsenic in greater proportion than the following limits:—

Lead as Pb 0.5 per centum Arsenic as arsenious oxide As, 0<sub>3</sub>-1 grain to the pound"—

be removed from the said Fourth Schedule and that the substance or preparation—

"Finger colours, show-card colours and poster paints in liquid or powder form, crayons, school pastels and coloured chalks containing more than 0.5 per centum of lead or more than one-thirtieth of one per centum of arsenic"—

be added thereto:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation remove from the Fourth Schedule to the Poisons Act 1928 the following substances or preparations:—

"Crayons, pastels and coloured chalks containing lead or arsenic in greater proportion than the following limits:-

Lead as Pb 0.5 per centum
Arsenic as arsenious oxide
As, 0,-1 grain to the pound",
and add to the said Fourth Schedule the substance or
preparation—

"Finger colours, show-card colours and poster paints in liquid or powder form, crayons, school pastels and coloured chalks containing more than 0.5 per centum of lead or more than one-thirtieth of one per centum of arsenic".

Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258).

DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of the opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria-

In the Cities of Caulfield, Prahran, and Malvern commencing at the intersection of Inkerman-road and Orrong-road; thence easterly along Inkerman-road to Hawthorn-road; thence northerly along Hawthorn-road to Dandenong-road; thence easterly along Dandenong-road to Glenferrie-road; thence northerly along Glenferrie-road to Gardiner's Creek; thence westerly and north-westerly along Gardiner's Creek to the River Yarra; thence generally west along the River Yarra to Chapel-street; thence southerly along Chapel-street to High-street; thence easterly along High-street to Orrong-road; thence southerly along Orrong-road to the commencing point at Inkerman-road,

to be a proclaimed area.

- 2. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector for the purpose of destruction or examination or treatment.
- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which, in the opinion of an inspector, is necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of fruit files and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetable or prohibited plant.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—

(a) to remove all plants of—

Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.).
Pepper (Capsicum sp.).
Egg Plant (Solanum melongena),
Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.),
Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.),
Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
Cucumber (Cucumis sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis),
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
Boxthorn, provided that where boxthorn is
grown as a hedge along a boundary or
dividing fence the occupier or owner may
continue to so grow it on the following
conditions:—

(1) Cut back the hedge forthwith and

(i) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet

(ii) That when such hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four-dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives, to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.), and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit—

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force;

(b) to remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all of the following fruits and/or vegetables:—

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries, grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines, passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force;

- (c) to dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one half-ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2.0 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or by otherwise treating them, as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ, and pupæ of fruit flies;
- (d) to spray all trees and plants growing on the said land with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days, during the period specified in such notice:
- (e) to treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) at the rate per square yard of surface.
  - (i) not less than one and one-half gallons of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the para para isomer of D.D.T.; or
  - (ii) one and one-half pounds of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the para para isomer of D.D.T.;
- (f) to reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or -sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Vegetation Diseases (Fruit Fly) Act 1947 (No. 5258), it is provided that, where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any property within the area and from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside the area of any fruit or vegetable, and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria-

In the Cities of Box Hill and Camberwell and within a boundary commencing at the intersection of Reid-street and Whitehorse-road; thence easterly along Whitehorse-road to Balwyn-road; thence northerly along Balwyn-road to Winmallee-road; thence easterly along Winmallee-road to Union-road; thence easterly along Erne-street to Kinsale-crescent; thence southerly and easterly to Kenmare-street, easterly along Kenmare-street to Rostrevor-parade, southerly along Rostrevor-parade to Victoria-crescent; thence westerly and southerly to Whitehorse-road; thence southerly along Rightheory whitehorse-road; thence westerly along Elgar-road to Riversdale-road; thence westerly along Elgar-road to Riversdale-road; thence westerly along Riversdale-road to the Outer Circle railway line; thence north-westerly along the Outer Circle railway line; thence northerly along the Canterbury-road; thence easterly along Mangarra-road; thence easterly along Mangarra-road to Mont Albert-road; thence easterly along Mangarra-road to Salisbury-street; thence easterly by a lane to Reid-street; thence northerly along Reid-street to the commencing point at the intersection of Whitehorse-road— In the Cities of Box Hill and Camberwell and Whitehorse-road-

to be a proclaimed area.

- 2. Prohibit the removal from any property within the proclaimed area to any other property within the area and from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside the proclaimed area of any fruit or vegetable grown within the proclaimed area excepting fruit and vegetables removed on the instruction of an inspector for the purpose of destruction or examination or treatment.
- 3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an inspector and/or his assistants for the purpose of applying to trees and plants on such properties any spray material which, in the opinion of an inspector, is necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of fruit flies and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetable or prohibited plant.
- 4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the pro-claimed area to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an inspector and within the time specified in such notice—
  - (a) to remove all plants of-

Tomato (Lycopersicum sp.),
Pepper (Capsicum sp.),
Egg Plant (Solanum melongena).
Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.). Ornamental Solanum (Solanum sp.).
Rock Melon (Cucumis sp.),
Sweet Melon (Cucumis sp.),
Cucumber (Cucumis sp.),
Cape Gooseberry (Physalis edulis),
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),
Boxthorn, provided that where boxthorn is
grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:-

- (1) Cut back the hedge forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2)

Apples, apricots, brambles and other berry fruits, cape gooseberries, cherries, citrus fruits, cucumbers, egg fruit, figs, gooseberries. grapes, guavas, loquats, medlars, nectarines. passion fruit, peaches, pears, peppers, persimmons, plums, prunes, quinces, rock melons, sweet melons, tomatoes and all edible fruits of all trees and plants including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force;

  (c) to dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvæ of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil of at least 3 feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one half-ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2.0 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T., or by otherwise treating them, as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvæ, and pupæ of fruit flies;

- (e) to treat the soil beneath and around trees suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an inspector Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) at the rate per square yard of
  - (i) not less than one and one-half gallons of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the para para isomer of D.D.T.; or

    (ii) one and one-half pounds of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the para para isomer of D.D.T.;

- (f) to reduce, if necessary, all tall growing trees and plants covered by this Proclamation to a height which will permit them to be stripped of fruit and/or sprayed to the satisfaction of an inspector.

18A. No person shall sell any finger colours show-card colours or poster paints in liquid or powder form, crayons, school pastels and coloured chalks containing more than one-half of one per centum of lead or more than one-thirtieth of one per centum of arsenic unless there is attached thereto or to the packet containing the same the words "unfit for use by children" in addition to any other words required by these Regulations.

The foregoing Regulations were recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria on the 9th December, 1953.





  - (a) For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule--5s. per quarter;
  - (b) for every cow or heifer-5s. per quarter;
  - (c) for every steer (up to 12 months' old only)-5s. per quarter;
  - (d) fillies, colts, and calves shall run free on the Common until six months old, provided the mother is registered on the Common.

The amended Regulation, as set out above, is hereby approved by the Board of Land and Works.—(Rs.666.)

"The Regulations made by the Board on the 2nd April, 1936, and the 22nd December, 1953 (as notified in the Government Gazettes of the 8th April, 1936, and the 6th January, 1954, respectively), in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 20th August. 1888, as a site for a Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish and Town of Cranbourne, and now known as 'Cranbourne Racecourse and Recreation Reserve,' are hereby applied to the land in the said Parish and Town temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 23rd February, 1954, as a site for Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation."—(Rs.2359.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "COBDEN RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regula-tions in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the

Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Town (now Township) of Cobden temporarily reserved as a site for Tublic Recreation by Order in Council dated the 8th November, 1886, and known as the "Cobden Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"):—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, sports, fêtes, shows, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve; but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

#### 2. No person shall-

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) offer any articles for sale or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without, in either case, the consent of the Committee of Management;
- (d) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve;
- (e) spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee of Management may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.
- 5. The Committee of Management shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances in the Reserve and to make a charge for admission thereto as herein before provided.
- 6. The Committee of Management shall have power to let portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, company, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, person, or company to make a charge for admission thereto as provided hereinbefore in the Regulations. The maximum fee payable therefor shall not exceed 20 per cent. of the admission charges. admission charges.
- 7. No club, association, society, person, or company shall hold any entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person, except the Committee of Management or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is being made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.
- 9. No person, not being a player or official, shall trespass on the playing area or riding track during the progress of any football or cricket match, show, gathering, sports or race meeting.
- 10. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders or climb, jump, get upon or over any of the fences or gates, or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.
- 11. No person shall camp in the Reserve without first obtaining the permission of the Committee of Manage-

- 12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve except in such places as may be permitted by the Committee of Management or an authorized officer thereof, and any such person shall take all precautions against the spread of such fire, and shall not leave it unattended and shall extinguish same before leaving it.
- 13. No person shall use the Reserve for the purpose of training or exercising horses without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 14. No person shall use any motor vehicle (which includes motor cycles) for the purpose of practising or racing in the Reserve.
- 15. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, to. No person snall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works and Works.
- 16. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.
- 17. Persons, clubs, or associations renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Twenty pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Committee of Management in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons, clubs, or associations so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

# REGULATION FOR PARKING OF MOTOR-CARS.

- 18. (i) "Motor-car" shall mean any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and shall include a motorcycle.
- (ii) The Committee of Management may set apart any portion or portions of the Reserve for the parking of motor-cars.
- (iii) A driver may park his car in such portion or portions of the Reserve as may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose at such times as are hereinafter mentioned and not otherwise.
- (iv) The Committee of Management may appoint from time to time such officers as it may think proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall pay to any such officer a fee not exceeding Two shillings and six pence per day or portion of a day for each motor-car parked by such driver.
- (v) The days and hours during which such parking areas shall be available for occupation shall be those days and hours as are provided in clause 1 of these Regulations, when the Reserve is set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, shows, or holiday amusements.
- (vi) Any person who, without authority, shall on any (vi) Any person who, without authority, shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer appointed by the Committee of Management to receive fees from drivers for parking motor-cars, or shall in any way assume the duties of a parking attendant or such other officer as aforesaid, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant or other officer as aforesaid in the execution of his duty under this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation. Regulation.

(vii) A driver shall in any parking area park his motorcar-

- (a) as directed by the officer-in-charge of the parking area; or
- (b) if no such officer be present shall take up his position thereon in the order of his arrival thereat in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor-cars already parked, and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty, and not otherwise.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds—(RESR3) Ten pounds.—(Rs.683.)





By-law No. 39.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT" OF THE "MOUNT BULLER RECREATIONAL RESERVE."

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of Section 56 of the Forests Act 1928, the Governor in Council is enabled to make rules and regulations in regard to the care, protection and management of any land forming part of any Reserved Forest, such land being a place of natural beauty or interest, or a health resort, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such land, or any specified part or parts thereof, and by such Rules and Regulations to extend and apply for the purpose of such section, and the Rules and Regulations thereunder, the provisions of sub-sections (2), (3), (4) and (5) of section one hundred and eighty-two and section one hundred and eighty-five of the Land Act 1928 (as amended by section 11 of the Land Act 1941), with such alterations, substitutions, additions, omissions and modifications as are necessary or expedient for the purposes of carrying out the objects of this section: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Rules and Regulations in respect of the land forming portion of the Reserved Forest in the Parish of Changue, County of Wonnangatta, known as the "Mount Buller Recreational Reserve", and containing 34 acres more or less being the area shown by pink colour on plan marked  $\frac{50/764}{11151}$  in file of correspondence number 50/764 of the Forests

Department.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MOUNT BULLER RECREATIONAL RESERVE"—HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RESERVE."

- 1. For the purpose of these Regulations-

  - "Commission?" means the Forests Commission of Victoria.
    "Committee" means the Committee of Management duly appointed under the Forests Acts to control and manage the Reserve.
  - "Duly authorized person" means any person specially authorized in writing by the Committee to enforce any or all of these Regulations.
  - "Licensee" means any person, club or organization to whom a permissive occupancy licence has been issued by the Commission.
- 2. No person who, in the opinion of any forest officer or member of the Committee or duly authorized person has offended against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, shall remain on the Reserve after having been requested or ordered by such officer or member or duly authorized person to leave.
- 3. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the Reserve' except in accordance with the provisions of the Forests Acts and the Regulations made thereunder.
  - 4. No person shall within the Reserve-
    - (a) camp or establish any encampment of any kind;
    - (b) carry or use firearms of any description.
  - 5. No person shall-
    - (a) set any trap or snare, or shoot, poison, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any bird or animal (excepting hares, rabbits, wild dogs or wombats), or any skin, egg, feathers or nest;

- (b) bring into the Reserve any dog without the permission in writing of a duly authorized person;
- (c) deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, broken glass or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee;
- (d) intentionally break any glass bottle or other container within the Reserve;
- (e) commit a nuisance in any part of the Reserve or in or on any building in the Reserve.

#### 6. No person shall-

- (a) without being the holder of a licence for the purpose remove, cut or in any way damage any trees (whether alive or dead), or any shrubs, ferns, plants, leaves or flowers, within the Reserve;
- (b) bring into the Reserve any seed or portion of any plant or plant any tree or plant without the permission in writing of the Committee.
- 7. No person (other than an officer or employee of the Commission or a duly authorized person) shall enter any plot enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs or flowers, or for the protection of young native species naturally grown, or remove therefrom any plant, bark, fruit, seed, leaves or flowers.
- 8. No building, booth or other structure shall be erected by any body or person unless—
  - (a) application in due form has been made, plans and specifications of the proposed structure submitted and the appropriate fees paid to the Committee;
  - (b) written approval of the Committee has been obtained for such plans and specifications;
  - (c) such body or person is a licensee within the meaning of these regulations; and
  - (d) subject to the foregoing, construction is strictly in accordance with such approved plans and specifications and is restricted to the terms and conditions of the licence.
- 9. Any requirement of the Committee relating to drainage, sanitation, garbage or other condition of occupation of that site and directed in writing, either generally or specifically to any licensee shall be fulfilled by such licensee within the period if any stated in such direction.

#### 10. No person shall---

- (a) mark, write on, or deface or in any way damage any buildings, posts, fences, railings, pillars or any other structure or property within the Reserve;
- (b) affix any bill or sign to any tree or structure within or around the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 11. No licensee shall create or permit any nuisance within any building erected on any land the subject of his licence or permit such building to be used in a disorderly manner through the consumption of liquor or otherwise.
- 12. No person shall offer for sale in the Reserve any article without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained. Such written permission shall be produced at any time on demand to a duly authorized person.
- 13. (a) No person shall reside or remain overnight within the Reserve during the period 1st December in any year to 31st March in the following year, unless such person is properly accommodated in a building erected in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.
- (b) Whenever during the last-mentioned period: the district forest officer considers it desirable for fire protection purposes or for the safety of any person he may direct any person to leave the Reserve and any person so directed shall thereupon promptly leave the Reserve.
- 14. No person shall park any motor-car within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee for that purpose and subject to payment of the prescribed fees.

- 15. The Commission may fix and collect from licensees such annual fees or other charges for the purpose of improvement, development and maintenance of the Reserve as may be deemed necessary upon recommendation of the Committee from time to time.
  - 16. The maximum fees payable to the Committee shall be—for plans—

17. For the purposes of these regulations the provision of subsections (4) and (5) of Section 182 and of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (e) and (f) of sub-section (1) of Section 185 of the Land Act 1928 are extended and applied with such alterations, substitutions, additions, omissions and modifications that the said sub-sections (4) and (5) of Section 182 and the said paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (e) and (f) of sub-section (1) of Section 185 shall read as follows:—

Section 182. (4) Every person offending against these regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any forest officer, duly authorized person or member of the police force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such forest officer, duly authorized person or member of the police force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

(5) The Governor in Council may at any time disallow and annul any such rule or regulation, and thereupon such rule or regulation shall have no force or effect.

Section 185 (1) The Committee of Management or a majority of its members—

- (a) may exercise all such powers functions and authorities and shall carry out all such duties as are conferred or imposed upon such Committee by any regulations made by the Governor in Council in respect of such land and shall have exclusive authority to do all such acts matters and things as are necessary for or incidental to the carrying into effect or enforcement of all such regulations;
- (b) may either in the name of any one or more of its members or in the name of some other person appointed in that behalf by the Committee or a majority of its members take any legal proceedings for the purposes aforesaid;
- (c) may manage improve and maintain such land for the purposes for which it is reserved;
- (e) may expend any tolls fees charges or any other moneys received by the Committee in the management improvement and maintenance of such land as aforesaid and with the approval of the Commission may employ officers servants and workmen for such purposes; and
- (f) shall keep a full and particular account of all sums of money received and expended by the Committee and shall furnish annually to the Commission a statement of such receipts and expenditure and of the balances in hand and (if so requested by the Commission) full particulars of any or all of such receipts and expenditure.

And the Honorable John William Galbaily, Her Majesty's Minister of Forests for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
