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



WHEREAS by the State Electricity Commission (Yallourn Area) Act 1947 (No. 5219), section 13, it is amongst other things enacted that the Yallourn Works Area shall be the area occupied by the works of the Commission as defined by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette:

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT "BULN GHERIN" NEAR BEAUFORT IN THE PARISH OF MAHKWALLOK, COUNTY OF RIPON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

I. THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in purof the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

PART OF VICTORIA ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts.
- 5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
- 6. Subject to the requirements of section 3 (6) of the Town and Country Planning (Metropolitan Area) Act 1949 (No. 5404), and unless revoked by the Governor in Council, this Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme.
- 7. Schedule of Land Affected.—All that area bounded by a line commencing on the southern boundary of the Shire at the south-eastern corner of allotment 9, section

Approved rubber flooring of not less than a inch thickness laid with an approved bituminous, rubber, or other approved solution, will be permitted in lieu of lead around water closet pans provided it is carried continuously under the closet pan and has no joins under the base of the pan, and that all joins within 2 feet of the pan are carefully made to ensure their being waterlight.

·Where the skirting is within 2 feet of the base of the pan, the floor covering must be finished at the skirting by either of the following methods, viz.:—

(a) the floor covering may butt hard up against the skirting and be securely fixed to the floor by means of a 1-in. beading or mould-ing set in an approved bituminous rubber or other waterproof material and securely nailed or screwed to the floor through the

floor covering; or

(b) the floor covering may be turned up at the
wall at least 1 inch and the skirting
finished down on it.

Where 'S' trap pans are used the rubber flooring must be laid and fitted to the collar of the pan, soil pipe, or drain, and approved rubber compounds used to form a joint over the rubber flooring and around the pan, soil pipe, or drain."

Three copies of the notice referred to in Rule 2 hereof, together with one copy of the trust deed agreement or other document constituting the scheme referred to in section 6 (1) (a) of the Act shall be lodged with the Registrar, who shall thereupon fix a time and day for the hearing of the application and shall issue sufficient copies of the notice for service and posting in accordance with these Rules.

- 4. A copy of the notice issued as aforesaid shall, together with a copy of the aforementioned trust deed agreement or other document, be served upon the Secretary of the Trades Hall Council not less than 21 clear days before the date fixed in the said notice, for the hearing of the application.
- 5. A copy of the notice issued as aforesaid shall be posted in a conspicuous place at the premises of the applicant, accessible to all employees who may be affected by the application, and shall remain so posted for not less than 21 clear days before the date fixed for the hearing of the application.
- 6. Unless a notice of objection signed by an officer or member of an industrial organization representing persons affected by the application or by any person so affected in the form or to the effect set out in Form 2 of the Schedule hereto, together with a copy of the said notice of objection, is served upon the Registrar not less than seven clear days before the date fixed for the hearing of the application the Court may consider the application in the absence of the parties, and may, on being satisfied by affidavit declaration or otherwise that the copy notices referred to in Rules 4 and 5 hereof have been duly served
 - (a) grant the application. Notice of such granting of the application shall be served upon the applicant and the Secretary of the Trades Hall Council by the Registrar in the form or to the effect set out in Form 3 of the Schedule to these Rules; or
 - (b) defer the application to a day to be fixed, notice of which shall be given by the Registrar to the applicant and to the Secretary of the Trades Hall Council. 'Such notice shall contain a short Hall Council. 'Such notice shall contain a short statement of the grounds upon which the application has been deferred, and upon the date fixed as aforesaid for the hearing of the application, the applicant and an officer or member of an industrial organization representing persons affected by the application and any person so affected may appear before the Court and shall be heard and the Court may make such order as it thinks fit.
- 7. If not less than seven clear days before the date fixed 7. If not less than seven clear days before the date fixed for the hearing of the application a notice of objection, together with a copy thereof, is lodged with the Registrar, he shall forthwith cause such copy to be served upon the applicant, and on the date fixed for the hearing of the application the applicant and an officer or member of an industrial organization representing persons affected by the application and any person so affected shall be heard, and the Court may make such order as it thinks fit.

 - (a) only one candidate has been nominated for an election the Secretary shall declare him elected and notify the Authorities or Trusts which would have been entitled to vote at the elec-tion and the Chairman of the Board accordingly;
 - tion and the Chairman of the Boat accordingly.

 (b) more than one candidate has been nominated for an election the Minister shall nominate an officer of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission as Returning Officer and the Secretary shall notify each Authority or Trust entitled to vote at the election of the names, addresses and occupations of the candidates so nominated and of the name of the Returning Officer.

6. Each of the Authorities or Trusts notified in accordance with paragraph (b) of the last preceding Regulation shall appoint a delegate to attend the election and vote on its behalf.

7. The Returning Officer and each delegate shall, at the time and date fixed for the election, attend the place of election. Each delegate shall deliver to the Returning Officer written notification of the name of the candidate for whom he votes.

The Returning Officer shall declare elected the candidate who has received the greatest number of votes, including, if necessary, the casting vote of the Returning Officer (which casting vote the Returning Officer is hereby authorized to give if all candidates receive an equal number of votes or if more than one candidate each receive an equal number of votes which is higher than the number of votes received by each other individual candidate). (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
