PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF CERTAIN SEINE NETS IN THE WATERS OF PORT PHILLIP BETWEEN MENTONE PIER AND MORNINGTON PIER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation provide as follows:—

1. That a seine or hauling net, having attached thereto hauling lines or ropes, each exceeding seven hundred and fifty (750) fathoms in length, shall not be used, shot, hauled, or operated in any manner whatsoever from the eastern shore of Port Phillip for the purpose of taking fish in the waters of Port Phillip within or inside an area bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point at the water's edge at the shore end of Mentone Pier; thence by an imaginary line bearing due west seven hundred and fifty (750) fathoms; thence by an imaginary line running generally in a southerly direction parallel to the eastern shore of Port Phillip to a point distant seven hundred and fifty (750) fathoms due west from the water's edge at the land end of Mornington Pier; thence by an imaginary line running due east to the water's edge at the shore end of the Mornington Pier; thence generally in a northerly direction by the water's edge of the eastern shore of Port Phillip to the commencing point.

2. That a seine or hauling net, having floats of any kind whatsoever attached to such net or the hauling lines attached thereto (other than corks threaded on the top or cork line of the net and a bunt or centre buoy thereof), shall not be used for the purpose of taking fish in the waters of that portion of Port Phillip within an area bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point at the water's edge at the shore end of Mentone Pier; thence by an imaginary line bearing due west seven hundred and fifty (750) fathoms; thence by an imaginary line running generally in a southerly direction parallel to the eastern shore of Port Phillip to a point distant seven hundred and fifty (750) fathoms due west from the water's edge at the land end of Mornington Pier; thence by an imaginary line running due east to the water's edge at the

shore end of the Mornington Pier; thence generally in a northerly direction by the water's edge of the eastern shore of Port Phillip to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intituled the *Licensing (Amendment) Act 1953* (No. 5767) it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, as the day on which the said *Licensing (Amendment) Act 1953* shall come into operation.

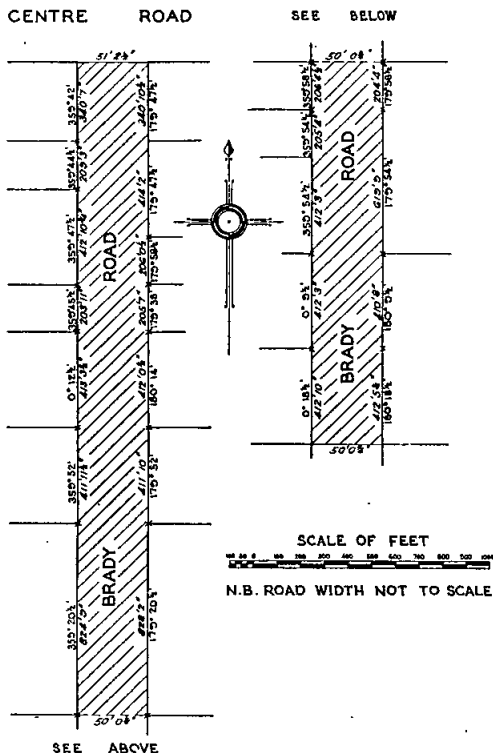
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a road within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land used for a road, being part of the land described in certificate of title, volume 7600, folio 047, conveyance book 4, memorial No. 805; conveyance book 160, memorial No. 3; conveyance book 87, memorial 179; conveyance book 16, memorial No. 540; conveyance book 36, memorial No. 738; and conveyance book 166, memorial No. 919; and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Footscray has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been acquired for streets within the said City, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land described hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act:

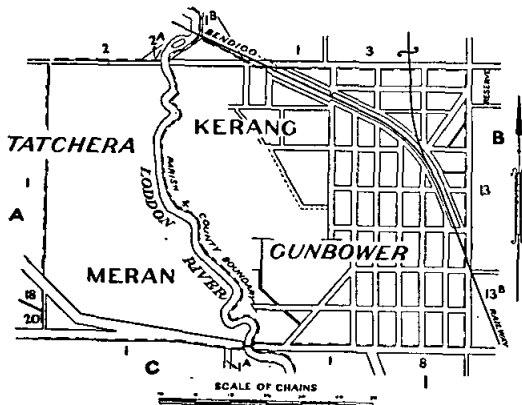
PROCLAMATIONS RESCINDED AS TO PART AND AS TO WHOLE AND TOWNSHIP OF KERANG PROCLAIMED.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twelfth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI. intituled the *North West Mallee Settlement Areas Act 1948*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare any area of land in the North West Mallee to be a North West Mallee Settlement Area for the purpose of the aforesaid Act: And whereas by Proclamations dated the twentieth day of September 1949, the

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT LAL-LAL ESTATE, IN THE PARISHES OF LAL-LAL AND BUNINYONG, COUNTY OF GRANT.

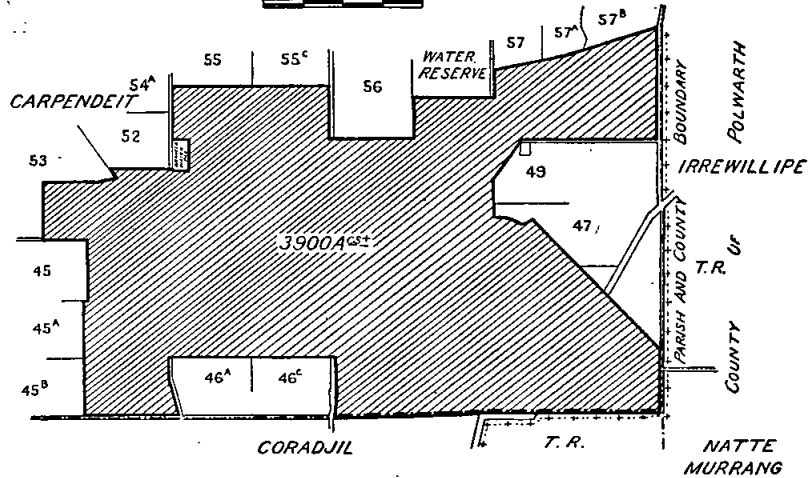

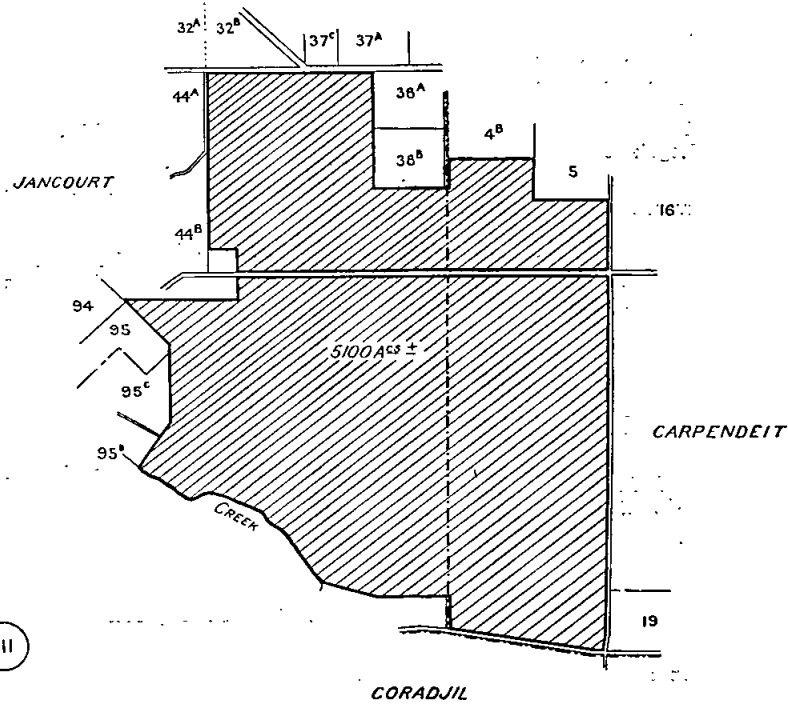

Marine Act 1928.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1928*, the Marine Board of Victoria with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

(1) This Regulation shall form portion of "The Pilot Regulations 1931", made by the Board on 6th day of May, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 252) of 11th November, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations), and shall be read and construed as one therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*, on which date Regulation 121 shall be repealed.

(2) For Regulation 121 of the principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

121. The master of any ship, being the holder of an exemption certificate under the Regulations may, subject to the approval of the Board, have his exemption certificate endorsed as applicable within the limits therein described to such other ship or ships as the owner, in writing to the Board, indicates may come under the command of such master, provided that such ships are employed in coasting only or actually trading between a port of Victoria and a port of New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, Western Australia, New Zealand and Fiji.

The foregoing amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*: And whereas a Crown grant has issued in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Kilda and their successors in respect of the land in the said borough (now City) of St. Kilda permanently reserved for Public Recreation, and known as the "Alma-road Reserves" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves"): Now therefore, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda (hereinafter referred to as the "Trustees"), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid and every other power so enabling, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Reserves:—

1. All rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, or in any corresponding previous enactment hitherto made in respect of the Reserves by the Trustees and their predecessors, are repealed.

2. In these Regulations the expression "improvement" shall be deemed to include any fence, gate, post, notice board, seat, building, appliance, equipment, or other property of the Trustees in the Reserves.

3. No person shall, unless authorized by the Trustees—

(a) pluck, cut, remove, interfere with, or damage any flower, shrub, tree, plant, grass, or other thing growing in the Reserves;

- (b) remove, interfere with, or damage any improvement in the Reserves;
- (c) post, stick, affix, append, set up on, paint, stencil, print, write, carve, cut, delineate, or by any other means make visible on any improvement, or on any tree or other thing growing in the Reserves or on any portion of the Reserves, any advertisement, or any poster, bill, sign, placard, or notice, or any mark or symbol, or any name, letter, or figure of any kind;
- (d) light any fire in the Reserves;
- (e) bring any motor car, motor cycle, motor scooter, or other motor vehicle, or any caravan or trailer into the Reserves;
- (f) ride any bicycle in the Reserves;
- (g) leave or deposit in the Reserves (other than in a basket, bin, or other receptacle provided by the Trustees for the purpose) any bottle, tin, can, container, paper, fruit skins, garbage, litter, or refuse of any kind;
- (h) consume any intoxicating liquor in the Reserves;
- (i) bring any animal, other than a dog, into the Reserves;
- (j) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her or in his or her charge to enter upon or remain in the Reserves for the purpose of being trained or exercised for coursing or other purposes of sport;
- (k) leave or deposit in the Reserves any clothing or dead animals or birds;
- (l) throw or shoot any stone or other missile in the Reserves;
- (m) have in his or her possession, carry, use, or discharge any firearm in the Reserves;
- (n) offer for sale or hire, or hawk any goods or articles of any kind in the Reserves;
- (o) camp in the Reserves;
- (p) set up or erect any tent, booth, building, or other structure, or by any other means occupy any site in the Reserves;
- (q) play, engage in, or practice cricket, football, or any other athletic sport or game of any kind in the Reserves;
- (r) preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind in the Reserves;
- (s) make, or cause to be made, by any means, any violent outcry or loud noise in the Reserves;
- (t) conduct, assist to conduct, or take part in any fête, carnival, concert, band, or musical recital, or entertainment of any kind, or any assembly for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking, or any activity or meeting of a like character in the Reserves;
- (u) cause to fly in, through, or over the Reserves any model aeroplane, glider, or aircraft, or similar apparatus of any kind.

4. No person in the Reserves shall commit any nuisance, or be in a state of intoxication or under the influence of alcohol, or behave in an indecent, threatening, offensive, or disorderly manner, or use obscene, indecent, threatening, offensive, or insulting language, or create or take part in any disturbance, or interfere with the peaceable enjoyment of the Reserves by any other person therein.

5. (a) The Trustees may, from time to time, by notice set up in the Reserves, order that dogs shall not be permitted to enter upon or remain in any portion of the Reserves specified in the order.

(b) No person shall, unless authorized by the Trustees, cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her, or in his or her charge to enter upon or remain in—

- (i) any portion of the Reserves so specified;
- (ii) any portion of the Reserves not so specified, unless such dog be under his or her effective control by means of a chain, cord, or leash, and be effectively restrained from interfering with or causing annoyance to any other person, and from damaging or interfering with anything growing or any property of the Trustees in the Reserves.

(c) Any dog found in the Reserves in contravention of this Regulation may be seized and/or destroyed by any officer or servant of the Trustees, and the owner, or the person in charge, of any dog so found shall not only be guilty of an offence against this Regulation but shall, if

the case so requires, make compensation to the Trustees for any damage done by the dog to anything growing or to any property of the Trustees in the Reserves.

6. The Trustees may, from time to time, set apart a portion or portions of the Reserves for the playing of any particular sport or game, and may grant the use of such portion or portions accordingly to any individual, school, club, organization, or association of clubs or organizations on such terms and conditions as the Trustees may decide.

7. The Trustees may, from time to time—

- (a) set apart a portion or portions of the Reserves as and for the purposes of a children's playground;
- (b) determine and regulate the hours during which a children's playground shall be open for use;
- (c) determine and regulate the extent to which and the manner in which any improvement in a children's playground shall be used.

8. No person shall—

- (a) bring any bicycle, tricycle, scooter, or box on wheels into a children's playground;
- (b) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or her, or in his or her charge, to enter upon or remain in a children's playground;
- (c) enter upon or remain in a children's playground, except during the hours the same is open for use;
- (d) use any improvement in a children's playground—
 - (i) for a purpose other than that for which the improvement is provided;
 - (ii) to an extent or in a manner contrary to the extent or the manner determined or regulated by the Trustees.

9. No person who has attained the age of fourteen years shall—

- (a) use any play appliance or play equipment in a children's playground;
- (b) enter upon or remain in a children's playground, except for the purpose of watching over a child therein, who is then in his or her charge.

10. Every person in a children's playground shall comply with any direction in respect of his or her conduct, or in respect of the use of any improvement therein given to him or her by any officer, employee, servant, or authorized agent of the Trustees.

11. No person in the Reserves shall molest, disturb, or obstruct any officer, employee, servant, or authorized agent of the Trustees in the execution of his work or duty.

12. Any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer, employee, or servant of the Trustees, or any member of the Police Force shall have the right to remove forthwith and to exclude from the Reserves any person found offending against these Regulations, and such person shall also be liable to any other penalty prescribed by these Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).—(Rs.1497.)

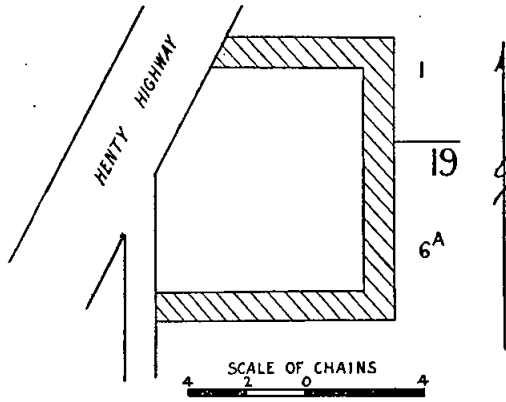
