Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 635.

LIQUORS.—METROPOLITAN AREA.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

*Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 635.

*Revocation.*

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 580 is hereby revoked.

*Definitions.*

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Liquor or Liquors” means and includes ale, beer, lager, stout, porter, and any mixtures thereof; or any mixtures thereof with aerated waters;

“Metropolitan area” means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;

“Oz. or Ozs.” means fluid ounce or ounces as the case may be;

“4-oz. Glass” means any glass or similar container holding 4 ounces or more, but less than 7 ounces;

“7-oz. Glass” or “Long Glass” means any glass or similar container holding 7 ounces or more, but less than 10 ounces;

“10-oz. Pot” means any glass or similar container holding not less than 10 ounces;

“Reputed Pint” means 13 ounces;

“Reputed Quart” means 26 ounces;

“Nip” means 6½ ounces;

“Demi Nip” means 4½ ounces;

"Sales by the glass in a lounge or a dining room" means sales of liquor by the glass either—

(a) in a lounge where seats and tables are provided in a separate room apart from the bar and where service is made by a waiter or waitress to the tables in the lounge; or

(b) in a dining room set apart for persons who partake of meals at the hotel and where service is made by a waiter or waitress to the tables in the dining room;

"Sales by the glass elsewhere than in a lounge or dining room" means sales of liquor by the glass which are not sales by the glass in a lounge or a dining room.

*Liquors Specified in the Schedules.*

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be the prices specified therein.

*Liquors in Schedules—Quantities Not Specified.*

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any liquors specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold in the Metropolitan Area in quantities other than those specified in the said Schedules, to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the next smaller quantity of such liquors specified in the said Schedules, or if there is no smaller quantity specified, then such price—calculated to the nearest downward halfpenny—as is in the same proportion to the maximum price fixed for the next higher quantity as the quantity actually sold bears to the next higher quantity.

*Non-Listed Liquors.*

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind of liquor (together with any container supplied therewith) for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order may be sold by any person in the Metropolitan Area to be an amount computed at the rate of one halfpenny for each fluid ounce of such liquor.

*Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.*

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any liquor specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

*Exhibition of Price List.*

8. Every person who sells or holds for sale by retail any liquors, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in each of the bars, dining rooms, and lounges at such place or places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him of any kind and quantity of such liquors.

## PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 636.

## BOTTLED LIQUORS.—VICTORIAN COUNTRY AREAS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

*Citation.*

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 636.

*Revocation.*

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 582 is hereby revoked.

*Application.*

3. This Order shall not apply to sales of bottled liquors in the metropolitan area.

*Definitions.*

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—  
 "Liquor or Liquors" means and includes ale, beer, lager, stout, and porter brewed and bottled in Australia;  
 "Metropolitan area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;  
 "Ballarat area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the principal Post Office at Ballarat;  
 "Bendigo area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the principal Post Office at Bendigo;  
 "Geelong area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 5 miles from the principal Post Office at Geelong;  
 "Bottle" means a container of at least 26 fluid ounces or a reputed quart.

*Sales by the Bottle.*

5. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any bottled liquors of the kinds described in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold at the places specified in that column to be the prices set out in the second column of such Schedule.

*Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.*

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bottled liquors specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
