### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Avoca has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, acquired for roads within the shire, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those parts of Crown allotments 4a, 24 and 25, Township of Lower Homebush, Parish of Rathscar, and Crown allotment 39a, Parish of Rathscar, described hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Firstly: Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of Crown allotment 39B, Parish of Rathscar, distant 450 links east from the north-western angle of the said allotment; thence bearing 258 deg. 41 min. for 458.9 links, 249 deg. 21 min. for 433.6 links, 57 deg. 19 min. for 450 links and east 477 links to the point of commencement.

Secondly: Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of Crown allotment 24, Parish of Rathscar, distant 896 links on a bearing of 237 deg. 19 min. from the northern angle of the said allotment; thence bearing

 $226\ deg.\ 28\ min.$  for 392.8 links,  $35\ deg.\ 37\ min.$  for 200 links and  $57\ deg.\ 19\ min.$  for 200 links to the point of





N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Car Acts and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):--

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Motor Car Regulations 1954" and shall come into operation on the ninth day of August, 1954.

- 2. The Motor Car Regulations 1952 are hereby amended as follows:—
  - (a) In clause four of the said Regulations-
    - (i) The interpretation "De-restriction sign" is hereby revoked and the following interpretation substituted therefor:—

"De-restriction sign" means a sign which is erected on a highway so as to face on-coming traffic and so as to be clearly visible to such traffic and which consists of a disk having a white background with a diagonal black bar rising from left to right.

A diagram of the said sign is marked "B" in the Forty-sixth Schedule.

- (ii) The interpretation "Speed limit sign" is hereby revoked and the following interpretation substituted therefor:—
  - "Restriction sign" means a sign which is erected on a highway so as to face on-coming traffic and so as to be clearly visible to such traffic and which consists of a disk having a black border and a yellow background with "30" in black numerals.

A diagram of the said sign is marked "A" in the Forty-sixth Schedule.

- (b) The Forty-sixth Schedule is hereby revoked and the Schedule hereto substituted therefor which for all purposes shall be known as the Forty-sixth Schedule.
- (c) In clauses 188, 190, 191 and 192 of the said Regulations the words "Speed limit sign" wherever occurring are hereby revoked and the words "Restriction sign" substituted therefor.
- (d) In clauses 188 and 191 of the said Regulations the words "twenty-five" wherever occurring are hereby revoked and the word "thirty" substituted therefor.
- (e) In clause 190 of the said Regulations the words "but having a diameter of not less than ten nor more than fourteen inches and a border and numerals of a proportionate width and height, respectively" are hereby revoked.
- (f) After clause 192 there shall be inserted the following clauses:—

192A. Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, no person shall drive a motor car upon a highway at a speed exceeding fifty miles an hour.

A driver shall not be guilty of a breach of this clause if he proves to the satisfaction of a court that the speed at which he drove the motor car was not dangerous having regard to all the circumstances.


- 192B. (1) No person shall drive a motor car at a speed exceeding thirty miles an hour on any part of a highway:—
  - (a) in which there is provision for the lighting of the said part by means of street lighting; or
  - (b) which is defined by means of a restriction sign and a de-restriction sign.
- (2) Notwithstanding the fact that the highway on which he is driving is provided with lighting by means of street lighting a driver may drive the motor car at a speed exceeding thirty miles per hour on that part of a highway between a de-restriction sign and a restriction sign.
- (3) Nothing in this Regulation shall be construed to justify a driver of a motor car exceeding a speed on any highway which—
  - (a) may be regarded as driving recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public having regard to all the circumstances; or
  - (b) exceeds any maximum speed applicable to the motor car and fixed by or under any Act or Regulation.

- (4) The provision of this Regulation shall not apply to the driver of—  $\,$ 
  - (a) any motor car conveying members of the Police Force upon urgent police duty;
  - (b) any motor car of any fire brigade proceeding to any fire or answering any fire alarm;
  - (c) any ambulance answering an urgent call or proceeding to a hospital with any injured or sick person.



#### GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
- 2. The deposit specified in Schedule must accompany
- 3. The licensee shall do everything within his power to strip and remove all bark available on the area upon which he is licensed to operate.

- 4. Stripping shall be commenced within six weeks from date of acceptance of offer unless otherwise authorized by the Commission.
- 5. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified and is in possession of the requisite licence.
- 6. Notification, in writing, that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded to the officer in charge within 48 hours from date thereof.
- 7. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any area which the officer in charge directs is not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped.
- 8. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of and in accordance with the written conditions specified by the officer in charge.
- 9. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse or to obstruct any road or track.
- 10. Except with the permission of the officer in charge, no tree of less than 5 inches diameter shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 21 inches in diameter when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated in the licence. Wherever a size limit is stated it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the
- 11. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of issue of licence unless otherwise authorized, in writing, by the officer in charge.
- 12. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take such precautions as the officer in charge may direct to safeguard such bark from loss by fire.

Occupancy is attached on a site having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than prescribed in clause 808 of the Regulations in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such site existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area or was shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.
