Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337). AMENDING PROCLAMATION DECLARING THAT POTATOES SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE POTATO MARKETING BOARD.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation, or on, from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 22nd December, 1953, it was provided and declared that on, from and after the 4th day of January, 1954, all potatoes should, subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, be divested from the producers of potatoes and become vested in and be the absolute property of The

Potato Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any potatoes coming into existence during the period from the fourth day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four to the thirty-first day of October One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, both dates inclusive, they should by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Potato Marketing Board as the owner thereof: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby amend the proclamation made on the 22nd December, 1933, by substituting for the expression "the thirty-first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four" the expression "the thirty-first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four." - 3. Sub-rule 4 of Rule 2 of the Solicitors (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules is amended by inserting at the end thereof the following proviso:—

"Provided that a solicitor who acts for a building society registered under the provisions of the *Building Societies Act* 1928 may agree with that society that, in respect of any loan by the society upon the security of any land used or intended to be used as a single dwelling-house, he will accept a fee which is less than that to which he would otherwise have been entitled under the Solicitors Remuneration Order but which shall in no case be less than two-thirds of the appropriate costs of the solicitor for the mortgagee as fixed by the relevant item of the Solicitors Remuneration Order."

ELECTRICAL TRADES APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the First Schedule hereto and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

 - "Probationer" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

Application of Regulations.

- 3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria, viz.:—
 - (1) Electrical Fitter.
 - (2) Armature Winder.
 - (3) Electrical Fitter and Armature Winder.
 - (4) Electrical Mechanic.

Educational Qualifications for Entry into Apprenticeship.

- 4. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades; provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination:—
 - (1) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—
 - (a) The Intermediate Technical Certificate or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria or the School Intermediate Certificate.
 - (b) The completion, in a manner satisfactory to the Commission, of the third year of the course of study of the Junior Technical Schools of the Education Department of Victoria.
 - (2) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Apprentice-ship Act 1928, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

5. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fifteen years; provided that a person who possesses the Junior Technical Certificate may, subject to the approval of the Commission, so enter the said trades at the age of fourteen years and six months.

Term of Apprenticeship.

6. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

7. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Seventh Schedule to the General Apprenticeship Regulations, with the following additions thereto:—

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.

- (1) After clause (f), the following additional clauses shall be inserted:—
 - "(g) Not require the apprentice, while under the age of eighteen years, to work overtime or shift work unless he so desires.
 - (h) Not require or allow the apprentice to work overtime or shift work at times which would prevent his attendance at classes for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course, as required by the General Apprenticeship Regulations.
 - (i) Provide the apprentice during the first and second years of the said term with all tools necessary for carrying out his work."

APPRENTICE'S AND PARENT'S OR GUARDIAN'S COVENANTS.

- (2) After clause (c), the following additional clause shall be inserted:—
- "(d) Replace any of the tools supplied for his use, as hereinbefore provided, if they should be lost or broken through his own carelessness."

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS.

- (3) In clause 6, the following additional proviso shall be inserted:—
 - "Provided further, that in calculating time lost to be served, the apprentice shall be credited with any overtime which he has worked in any week during the relevant year."

Minimum Rates of Wages of Apprentices.

8. The minimum rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trades shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the adult male basic wage for the area in which they are employed prescribed from time to time in the Metal Trades Award or in the determination of the Electrical Trade Wages Board; whichever is applicable:—

The total wages of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

Rates for Overtime and Shift Work.

9. When an apprentice works under conditions for which, or at any time when, a journeyman employed at the aforesaid trades would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions or at the same time, then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman. Provided, however, that an apprentice shall be paid for overtime worked at a rate not less than 2s. 3d. per hour and for shift work at a rate not less than 1s. 6d. per hour.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

- 10. (1) Subject to sub-regulation (2) of this Regulation—
 - (a) the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trades of Electrical Fitter, Armature Winder, or Electrical Fitter and Armature Winder, shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trades;
 - (b) the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Electrical Mechanic shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by such employer in such trade.

- (2) With the consent of the Commission and upon satisfying the Commission that he has the training facilities deemed adequate by the Commission for the training of each apprentice concerned, an employer may employ in the said trades such number of apprentices as the Commission may determine, in excess of the proportion prescribed by sub-regulation (1) hereof. Any apprentice employed pursuant to this sub-regulation shall not be included for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices who may otherwise be employed in accordance with the provisions of sub-regulation (1) hereof.
 - (3) For the purposes of this Regulation-
 - (a) an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman;
 - (b) the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time;
 - (c) "apprentices" means apprentices or probationers.

Trade Experience to be Given to an Apprentice.

- 11. The employer shall, by the best means in his power and to the extent to which his facilities permit, give or cause to be given to the apprentice gradual and complete instruction, to the satisfaction of the Commission, in the following processes (as the case may be):-
 - (1) Electrical Fitter.—All classes of electrical fitting and all things incidental thereto, including-
 - The correct methods of use of bench and machine tools commonly used in the trade.
 - The making, fitting, and repairing of electrical machines, instruments, and appara-tus, including the necessary testing of such machines, instruments, and apparatus.
 - (2) Armature Winder.-All classes of armature winding, and all things incidental thereto, includ-
 - The preparation, formation, and winding of all types of coils, including armature field, rotor, stator, transformer, magneto, automobile generator, starter, and electrical control gear coils.
 - The assembly and testing of windings for direct current and alternating current machines, including the testing of machines after assembly.
 - The stripping of electrical machines, repairing, and re-winding of coils, testing of rewound machines.
 - (3) Electrical Fitter and Armature Winder.—All classes of electrical fitting and armature winding, as prescribed above.
 - (4) Electrical Mechanic.—All classes of electrical mechanic's work, and all things incidental thereto, including-
 - The affixing, placing, jointing, or running of electrical conductors of all kinds and for all purposes from the point of supply to the point of supply to the point of utilization; the fixing of all kinds of conduits, duets, and other means of protecting and covering electrical conductors; meter fixing; the connecting up of generators, alternators, motors, transformers, electrical control gear, distribution boards, and of electrical instruments and electrical apparatus at the points of supply and utilization for power, lighting, heating, smelting, and safe working, or for any other purpose; the connecting up of radio apparatus, telephones, and bells; the erection, overhauling, and repairing of storage batteries; the installation of electrical plants, including the erection and connecting up of switchboards; and the effecting of repairs of an electrical nature to machines, installations, or appliances where it is necessary to carry out the work on the site or where such repairs are incidental to such work; the correct setting out of electrical wiring Installations and the testto such work; the correct setting out of electrical wiring installations and the test-ing of electrical installations and electrical appliances,

Classes for Instruction.

12. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or probationer who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

- 13. (1) The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice in the subjects of the first, second, third, or fourth years of his apprenticeship course, in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding year, shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto.
- (2) In order that an apprentice may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission, he shall, in addition to attaining the standard set soon, he shall, in addition to attaining the standard secout in sub-regulation (1) hereof, in the subjects prescribed for the fourth year of the apprenticeship course, make satisfactory progress as approved by the Commission in the subjects prescribed for the fifth year of the said course, until the completion of the term of his apprentice-

Standard of Proficiency.

14. Should the apprentice in any year pass at the first attempt in each of the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Trade Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

- 15. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall-
 - (1) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 4s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
 - (2) for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
 - (3) for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
 - (4) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 6s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage.

Payment of School Fees.

- 16. (1) The school fees of apprentices for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices, but on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and/or evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

 (2) In cases where the apprentice is prevented from
- (2) In cases where the apprentice is prevented from attendance at the said classes through illness or accident, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may require the apprentice to produce a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident and in that case, if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate, such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage.

- (3) In the case of an apprentice undertaking a correspondence course, the completion of not less than 80 per cent. of the test papers set for the period of instruction covered by the report, and the return of the same to the correspondence school, shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of possible attendances.
- (4) For the purposes of this Regulation, "apprentices" means apprentices or probationers.

PRINTING AND ALLIED TRADES APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprentice-ship Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the First Schedule hereto and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Printing and Allied Trades Apprenticeship Regulations."

Interpretation.

- 2. In these Regulations-
- "Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.

 "Prescribed" means prescribed by an appropriate industrial authority or agreement or by these Regulations, as the case may require.

 "Probationer" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

Application of Regulations.

- 3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, as carried on in the metropolitan district, the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong, Newtown and Chilwell, and Geelong West, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; provided, however, that these Regulations shall not apply to apprenticeship in daily newspaper offices in Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong. and Geelong-
 - (1) Hand composition.
 - (2) Hand and machine composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines.
 - (3) Letterpress printing.
 - (4) Stereotyping and/or electrotyping.
 - (5) Bookbinding and/or guillotine machine operating.
 - (6) Bookbinding and/or edge-gilding.
 - (7) Paper ruling and/or guillotine machine operating. (8) Lithographic art and/or photo-lithographic art.
 - (9) Lithographic camera operating and/or photo-lithographic plate-making, including photo-imposing on lithographic plates.
 - (10) Lithographic plate-making and lithographic
 - printing.
 - (11) Lithographic printing.
 - (12) Gravure art and/or gravure retouching.
 - (13) Gravure retouching and/or gravure planning.
 - (14) Gravure camera operating.
 - (15) Gravure plate and/or gravure cylinder making.
 - (16) Gravure depositing and grinding and polishing.(17) Photo-engraving art and/or photo engraving de-
 - signing.
 - (18) Photo-engraving camera operating and/or photo engraving photo-imposing on metal.
 - (19) Photo-engraving half-tone etching.
 - (20) Photo-engraving line etching.
 - (21) Photo-engraving finishing, including routing, mounting and proofing.
 - (22) Linotype mechanic (as carried on in daily newspaper offices).
 - (23) Screen printing art and/or screen printing de-

Educational Qualifications for Entry into Apprenticeship.

4. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove

that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades; provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination-

- If he possesses any one of the following educa-tional qualifications or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof—
 - (a) The Intermediate Technical Certificate or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria or the School Intermediate Certificate.
 - (b) The completion, in a manner satisfactory to the Commission, of the third year of the course of study of the Junior Technical Schools of the Education Department of Victoria.
- (2) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Apprentice-ship Act 1928, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

5. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fifteen years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

- 6. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be as follows:-
 - (1) In the case of a person who is less than sixteen years of age at the time of commencement of the term of apprenticeship, a term of six years.
 - (2) In the case of a person who is sixteen or more years of age at the time of commencement of the term of apprenticeship, a term of five years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

7. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in the said trades and the terms, covenants and condi-tions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Seventh Schedule to the General Apprenticeship Regula-tions, with the following additions thereto—

Additional Covenants, &c., to the General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.

- (1) In clause (f), for the expression "damage due to relessness" there shall be substituted the expression carelessness " " injury ".
- (2) After clause (f) the following additional clauses shall be inserted-
 - "(g) Not require the apprentice, except where employed in daily newspapers offices or on weekly newspapers connected therewith, to work on any holiday or during other than ordinary working hours without his consent.
 - (h) Not keep more than two days' pay in hand.
 - (i) So arrange the apprentice's duties that as he progresses in his knowledge and skill during his apprenticeship, his duties shall be varied, and he shall be placed on higher or more skilful work from time to time.
 - (j) Not require the apprentice to perform duties outside those connected with learning the said trade.
 - (k) Not permit the apprentice, while under the age of seventeen years, to work on night shift.

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS

(3) In clause 6, the following additional proviso shall

"Provided further, that in computing the period of one year, all time worked as overtime or at other than ordinary business hours shall, if the apprentice so desires, either be allowed as a set off against any time lost during that period or in reduction of the actual period of one year."

Minimum Rates of Wages of Apprentices.

8. The minimum rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trades shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the total wage for adult male hand compositors, for the area in which they are employed, prescribed in the determination of the Printers Board.

The total wages of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. being disregarded.

Rates for Overtime and Shift Work.

9. When an apprentice works under conditions for which, or at any time when, a journeyman employed at the same trade would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions or at the same time, then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

- 10. (1) Subject to sub-regulations (2), (3), and (4) of this Regulation, the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in each of the said trades shall not exceed the following proportions, as the case may be-
 - (a) If three or more journeymen are permanently employed in the said trades, one apprentice may be employed in each trade to every three or fraction of three journeymen so employed in such trade;
 - (b) if less than three journeymen are permanently employed in the said trades, one apprentice may be employed in any such trade in which at least one journeyman is so employed, provided that the Commission is satisfied that a proper vacancy exists for an apprentice in such trade;
 - (c) for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices who may be employed in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subclause, an employer who works at any of the said trades for the full time prescribed for an ordinary week's work in such trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman.
- (2) (a) The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer in the trades mentioned in sub-clauses (17) to (21) both inclusive, of Regulation 3 shall not exceed the following proportion: If two or more journeymen are permanently employed in any one of such trades, one apprentice may be employed in any such trade to every two journeymen employed in such trade
- (b) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided, an employer who, on the 26th day of April, 1950, employed apprentices in excess of the proportion prescribed by paragraph (a) of sub-Regulation (2) of this Regulation, but not in excess of the proportion prescribed by Regulation 14 of the Printing and Allied Trades Regulations as in force on the 28th day of August, 1950, may continue to employ such apprentices until their training as apprentices is completed or otherwise terminated, but such apprentices shall be included for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices who may be employed in accordance with the aforementioned paragraph.
- (c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices who may be employed in accordance with paragraph (a) of sub-Regulation (2) hereof, an employer who works at any of the said trades for the full time prescribed for an ordinary week's work in such trades shall be deemed to be journeyman.

- (3) The number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in each of the following trades, insofar as they are carried on in connexion with a daily newspaper office or weekly newspaper work connected therewith, shall not exceed the following proportions, as the case may be:—

 (a) Hand and Machine Composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines—one apprentice may be employed to every five or fraction of five linotype machines in such office, irrespective of whether the office publishes a weekly newspaper or not, provided that no more than eight apprentices may be employed in such trade in any such office at any time. office at any time.
 - office at any time.

 (b) Letterpress Printing—one apprentice may be employed to every three journeymen permanently employed on flat-bed machines, provided that not more than two apprentices may be employed in such trade in any such office at any time. Provided also, that no employer shall take into his employ another apprentice within a period of three years from the time when he first employed an apprentice who is still employed by him at the time of the employment of that other apprentice.

 (c) Stereotyping and/or Electrotyping—one appren-
 - or that other apprentice.

 (c) Stereotyping and/or Electrotyping—one apprentice may be employed to every six or fraction of six journeymen permanently employed in such trades (both day and night shifts included), provided that not more than one apprentice may be employed on either day or night shift to each journeyman employed on such shift.

(d) Linotype Mechanic—one apprentice may be employed to every six or fraction of six journeymen permanently employed in such trade.

Provided, however, that with the consent of the Commission and upon satisfying the Commission that he has the training facilities deemed adequate by the Commission for the training of each apprentice concerned, an employer may employ in the said trades such number of apprentices as the Commission may determine in excess of the proportion prescribed.

- (4) For the purposes of sub-Regulations (1), (2), and (3) of this Regulation
 - of this Regulation—

 "Apprentices" means apprentices or probationers.

 "Permanently employed" means continuously employed for a period of not less than six calendar months immediately preceding the time when, under this Regulation, the duration of the employment of a journeyman is to be calculated.

 "Stereotyping and/or Electrotyping" shall be deemed to be one trade, and "Bookbinding and/or Guillotine Machine Operating" shall be deemed to be one trade.

Trade Experience to be Given to an Apprentice.

- 11. The employer shall give or cause to be given to the apprentice gradual and complete instruction to the satisfaction of the Commission, in the following processes (as the case may be)-
 - (1) Hand Composition.—All phases of hand composition and all things incidental thereto, including tabular and jobbing work, the latter to cover the principles of design, book-work, the casting-off of copy, the making up of pages, the allotting of margins, the lay-out of pages, and locking up and registering of formes, proof-reading, and revising.
 - reading and revising.

 (2) Hand and Machine Composition, with Instruction in the Mechanism of Slug-casting or Type-casting Machines.—All phases of hand composition and all things incidental thereto for the first three years, and, in addition, machine composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines during the last three years of apprenticeship when the period of apprenticeship is six years and during the last two years when the period is five years.
 - (3) Letterpress Printing.—All phases of letterpress printing and all things incidental thereto, including making-ready, the mixing and use of inks, black and colour printing, and the care of cylinder letterpress printing machines, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines. machines.
 - (4) Stercotyping.—All phases of stereotyping and all things incidental thereto, including the making of stereo-metal and flong, moulding, packing and repairing moulds, casting, trimming, cutting, routing, sweating, anchoring, mounting,

- and planing (metal and/or wood), all bench work, and the care, control, and use of all electrical apparatus and plant used in the process of nickelling stereos where such apparatus and plant are part of an employer's business.
- and plant are part of an employer's business.

 (5) Electrotyping.—All phases of electrotyping and all things incidental thereto, including preparing wax and/or matrix moulding preparing wax and/or matrix moulding lead, moulding, building up, black-leading, stopping out, oxidizing, attending bath, lifting shells, backing up, slabbing up, sweating, anchoring, mounting and planing (wood and/or metal), and all bench work, and the care, control and use of all electrical apparatus and plant used in the process of coppering, nickelling, and the depositing of any other metal or alloy.

 (6) Backbinding —All phases of bookbinding and all
- (6) Bookbinding.—All phases of bookbinding and all things incidental thereto, and at least one of the following branches and all things incidental thereto—Finishing, marbling, blocking, stamping, or indexing.
- (7) Guillotine Machine Operating.—All phases of guillotine machine operating and all things incidental thereto.
- (8) Edge-Gilding.—All phases of edge-gilding, bevelling and goffering, and all things incidental thereto, including the mixing and use of sizes.
- (9) Paper Ruling.—All phases of paper ruling and all things incidental thereto, including makingready, setting pens or disks on machines, mixing inks, ruling proofs, and care of ruling machines, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines.
- (10) Lithographic Art.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of lithographic art and all things incidental thereto, including designing, sketching, drawing, aerographing, keying, reproducing and retouching and colouring photographs.
- (11) Photo-lithographic Art.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of photo-lithographic art and all things incidental thereto, including retouching and colouring photographs, stripping, opaquing, imposing, staging, dot reducing, retouching, and colour correcting negatives and/or positives.
- (12) Lithographic Camera Operating.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of lithographic camera operating and all things incidental thereto, including the following operations, viz.:—Making line, continuous tone and/or screen wet plate, dry plate, film and/or paper negatives and/or positives; photo-lithographic transfers making single and multiple negatives and/or positives; projection enlarging on glass, film, or lithographic metal plate; masking.
- (13) Photo-Lithographic Plate-Making.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of photo-lithographic plate-making and all things incidental thereto, including plate graining, step and repeat transferring, plate coating (i.e. whirling), sensitizing, developing, deep-etching, processing, rolling up, etching, proofing and preparing lithographic metal plates for lithographic printing.
- for lithographic printing.

 (14) Lithographic Plate-Making and Lithographic Printing.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of lithographic plate-making and lithographic printing and all things incidental thereto, including stone polishing and/or plate graining; manual and/or step and repeat transferring, plate coating (i.e. whirling), sensitizing, developing, deepetching, processing, rolling up, etching, proving and preparing lithographic metal plates for lithographic printing; the mixing and use of inks; the texture of paper and all things affecting paper during or incidental to the printing process; the care of lithographic printing machines and automatic feeders, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines.
- (15) Lithographic Printing.—All phases of lithographic printing and all things incidental thereto, including the mixing and use of inks; the texture of paper and all things affecting paper during or incidental to the printing process; the care of lithographic printing machines and automatic feeders, including instruction in the mechanism of such machines.

- (16) Gravure Art.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, designing, sketching, drawing, aerographing, retouching and/or colouring photographs, lettering for reproduction, and all things incidental thereto.
- (17) Gravure Retouching.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, retouching, staging, opaquing, colour correcting and reducing, and all things incidental thereto.
- (18) Gravure Planning.—Making up or laying out negatives or positives, and the processes of registering, making margins and positioning, and all things incidental thereto.
- (19) Gravure Camera Operating.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of gravure camera operating, including the process of making line, continuous tone and colour separation negatives on dry plate, film, or sensitized paper materials, and/or making contact or projection negatives or positives for gravure printing-down processes, including instruction in connexion with colour correction and all things incidental thereto.
- (20) Gravure Plate Making.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, the process of sensitizing carbon tissue, printing down carbon tissue, polishing, mounting, carbon tissue to plates, developing, painting out, mixing and preparing etching solutions, etching and finishing off, i.e. hand engraving faults, charcoaling tones, and repolishing, proofing and preparing ready for machines and all things incidental thereto.
- tnereto.

 (21) Gravure Cylinder Making.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, the process of sensitizing carbon tissue, printing-down carbon tissue, polishing, mounting carbon tissue to cylinders, developing, painting out, mixing and preparing etching solutions, etching and finishing off, i.e. hand engraving faults, charcoaling tones and repolishing and proofing and preparing ready for machines and all things incidental thereto.

 (22) Gravure Denositing and Grinding and Polishing
- (22) Gravure Depositing and Grinding and Polishing.

 —All phases of these processes, including a knowledge of the formulae for copper depositing, in the correct preparation of depositing baths, and in the proper care and use of the grinding and polishing machine.
- (23) Photo-Engraving Art and/or Photo-Engraving Designing.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, designing, sketching, drawing, aerographing, tracing, keying, retouching and colouring photographs, and all things incidental thereto.

 (24) Photo-Engraving Camera Operating.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of photo-engraving camera operating, and all things incidental thereto, including the coating, sensitizing, developing, fixing, reducing and intensifying of wet plate negatives and positives, the exposure of fine and coarse screen half-tone and line, wet and/or dry plate or film negatives and positives, and the use and care of camera lenses, screens, stops and filters, and other duties incidental to the process of camera operating, and in the last year at least of his apprenticeship, colour operating.

 (25) Photo-Engraving Photo-Imposing on Metal.—So
- apprenticeship, colour operating.

 (25) Photo-Engraving Photo-Imposing on Metal.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, the preparation of and use of sensitizing and enamel printing solutions for copper, zinc, and other materials, and the polishing, graining, coating, whirling, exposing, and fixing under line and half-tone wet and dry plate or film negatives and positives on zinc, copper, and other materials, and stripping, ruling, and ghosting of negatives and positives, and the use and care of arc lamps and metal plate cutting guillotine. An apprentice must be taught all formulae of solutions used in printing zinc, copper, and other materials, the correct method of printing from negatives, line, half-tone and dry plate, and other duties incidental to the photo-imposing section.

 (26) Photo-Engraving Half-tone Etching.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, the etching of coarse and fine screen half-tone zinc, copper, and other materials, and the use and care of acid and acid-etching baths and etching machines, engraving, and other duties incidental to half-tone etching.

- (27) Photo-Engraving Line Etching.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, the proper care and use of acids and acid-etching baths, and etching machines, ink rollers and slabs; the dusting and rolling methods of etching line on copper or zinc plates or other materials, plates, retouching and stopping out for tints, engraving, and other duties incidental to line etching.
- (28) Photo-Engraving Finishing.—All phases of routing, mounting and proofing, and in the proper care and operation of machinery appropriate to the trade and all things incidental thereto, and, in the last year of apprenticeship, colour proofing in premises where this class of work is carried out.
- (29) Linotype Mechanic.—All phases of the mechanism of linotype machines, including attention, adjustment, and repairs, as the mechanical equipment of the employer's business will permit.
- (30) Screen Printing Art and/or Designing.-So far Screen Printing Art and/or Designing.—So far as the employer's plant and facilities permit, all phases of screen printing art and/or designing, and all things incidental thereto, including designing, sketching, drawing, lettering, or copying artwork or layouts, and the use and application of colour, and the work associated with stencil cutting, and the application of a stencil to a screen, and screen printing and racking racking.

Classes for Instruction.

12. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or probationer who has the necessary qualifications may subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice. 13. The standard of education to be attained by an apprentice-

- (1) In the subjects of the first, second, third, or fourth year of his apprenticeship course in order that he may qualify to proceed to the classes for instruction prescribed for the next succeeding
- year; and
 (2) in the subjects of the final year of his apprentice-

ship course in order that he may qualify in respect to education for the "final certificate" of the Commission—
shall be not less than 50 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission in each of the subjects prescribed for such year of the said course, or such average percentage of marks in all of the said subjects as is deemed by the Commission to be equivalent thereto. Commission to be equivalent thereto.

Standard of Proficiency.

14. Should the apprentice in any year pass at the first attempt in each of the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than the following average of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Trade Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year—

(1) in the case of the trades of hand composition, hand and machine composition with instruction in the mechanism of slug-casting or type-casting machines, or letterpress printing—70 per cent.

(2) In the case of any other trade—75 per cent.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency

- 15. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—
 - (1) for the first occasion on which he attains such

 - for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 2s. 6d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
 for the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;
 for the third occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 7s. 6d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage;

(4) for the fourth occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 10s. 0d. per week, in addition to the prescribed minimum weekly wage.

Provided that in the case of an apprentice who entered the first year of his apprenticeship and had completed at least one year of his trade course at a technical school before the 20th day of February, 1952, he shall, for the first occasion in which he attains the prescribed standard of proficiency in any year, be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of 5s. 0d. per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage, for the second such occasion 7s. 6d. per week, and for the third such occasion 10s. 0d. per week.

Payment of School Fees.

- 16. (1) The school fees of apprentices for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction shall be paid by such apprentices, but on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 100 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day classes and not less than 80 per cent. of the prescribed evening classes, the employer shall cent. of the prescribed evening classes, the employer shall refund to the apprentice the school fees paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice has, in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid. aforesaid.
- (2) In cases where the apprentice is prevented from attendance at the said classes through illness, accident, or for other reasons accepted by the Commission, such occasions shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may require the apprentice to produce a medical certificate as proof of such illness or accident, and, in that case, if the apprentice fails to produce such certificate, such occasions shall be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage. attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage.
- (3) In the case of apprentices undertaking a correspondence course, the completion of not less than 80 per cent. of the test papers set for the period of instruction covered by the report, and the return of the same to the correspondence school, shall be deemed to be equivalent to a record of 80 per cent. of possible attendances.
- .(4) For the purposes of this Regulation, "apprentices" means apprentices or probationers



The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise till sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year), as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or tennis matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language,
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management
- 6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- $8.\ \mbox{No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.}$

- 9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve
- 10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building erection, or enclosure on the occasion of fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Fifty pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee may, in its absolute discretion, make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or inding, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
- 11. No person except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
