KERANG TOWN COMMON DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Kerang Town Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of

Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Kerang Town Common by deducting therefrom 13 acres 20 perches, more or less, of land comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 15th September, 1954.

DECLARATION OF OFFENSIVE TRADES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare any of the trades usually carried on in or in connexion with wool-dagging to be offensive trades within the meaning of the said Acts.

This Proclamation shall take effect from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

THE OLIVER'S GULLY AND LANGI GHIRAN RESERVOIRS SPECIFIED AS INLAND WATERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SECTION 5 OF THE FISHERIES (INLAND ANGLING) ACT 1950.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation specify the Oliver's Gully and Langi Ghiran Reservoirs in the Parishes of Ararat and Colvinsby respectively as inland waters for the purpose of section 5 (1) (b) of the *Fisheries (Inland Angling) Act 1950*; such reservoirs being under the management and control of the Council of the City of Ararat which is a Water Authority within the meaning of the Water Acts.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation specify the Crocodile Reservoir in the Parish of Fryers as inland water for the purpose of section 5 (1) (b) of the *Fisheries (Inland Angling) Act 1950*; such reservoir being under the management and control of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

August 1939 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the sixteenth August 1939 respecting the prohibition of certain fishing in the Wurdee Boluc Storage Reservoir, Parish of Tutegong.

THE MARKING OF NETS AND/OR FIXED ENGINES IN ANY INLAND WATERS IN WHICH THE USE OF NETS AND/OR FIXED ENGINES IS OR MAY BE PERMITTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the fourteenth April 1953 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth April 1953 respecting the marking of nets, &c. in inland waters and provide that no person shall use any net and/or fixed engine in any inland waters in which the use of nets and/or fixed engines is or may be permitted, unless there is clearly and distinctly marked on each buoy stake or other similar object attached to such net and/or fixed engine the number of his current fishing licence or the registered number of his boat.

Marine Act 1928.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ALTERATION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act by this Proclamation do make Port Rule No. 48A, cited as "Port Rule (Mooring) 1954":—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Port Rule (Mooring) 1954 and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. These regulations shall apply in all ports under the jurisdiction of the Port Officer.

3. The Port Officer may authorize persons in writing for the purpose of these regulations in respect of any port or part of a port, and may at anytime withdraw any such authority. A person so authorized is referred to in these rules as the "designated person".

4. No person shall moor, or cause to be moored, a vessel except at a site allocated for such vessel by the Port Officer and any vessel moored in contravention of this clause may be removed from its moorings by the Port Officer or designated person.

5. Any person desiring the allocation to a vessel of a mooring site shall make application therefor to the Port Officer in the form of the Schedule hereto.

6. Upon being allocated a site such person shall advise the designated person as to when he will be ready to lay the ground tackle and the designated person shall fix a time and a date for the laying of the ground tackle.

7. No person shall moor, or cause to be moored, a vessel at a site so allocated except by means of ground tackle and any vessel moored in contravention of this clause may be removed from its moorings by the Port Officer or designated person.

8. No person shall lay any ground tackle except in the presence of the designated person.

9. Ground tackle shall consist of two anchors connected by a bridle of chain with a riding chain running from the middle of the bridle or such other gear as the Port Officer may approve. Each of such anchors shall be of a weight not less than one pound weight per foot of vessel length and the lengths and sizes of the chains shall be as required by the Port Officer.

Provided that metal or concrete sinkers may be used instead of anchors on the following conditions:—

Metal sinkers shall be of a weight not less than one hundredweight per five feet of vessel length;

Concrete sinkers shall be of a weight not less than two hundredweight per five feet of vessel length.

10. The owner of the vessel shall maintain, or cause to be maintained, the ground tackle in its allotted position.

11. At the request of the Port Officer the owner of the vessel shall in the presence of the designated person lift or cause to be lifted the ground tackle for inspection by the designated person and shall carry out all his directions as to the maintenance and repair of the ground tackle. If the owner objects to carrying out such directions he shall forthwith hand to the designated person for transmission to the Port Officer a written notice setting out the grounds of his objection and the designated person shall forthwith transmit such notice to the Port Officer. The Port Officer shall, after considering the representation (if any) made by the designated person and owner give whatever directions he thinks necessary to the owner and the owner shall carry out such directions instead of those originally given by the designated person.

12. The owner of a vessel to which a site has been allocated shall notify the Port Officer of any change of address within seven days of such change of address taking place.

13. The owner of the vessel shall upon disposing of it forthwith notify the Port Officer in writing of the fact of disposal and the name and address of the person to whom he has disposed of it.

14. If the person acquiring the vessel desires to retain the site he shall in writing notify the Port Officer within fourteen days of his acquiring the vessel of the fact of his acquiring the vessel, his name and address and of the fact that he desires to retain the site.

15. In the event of—

- (a) the notification referred to in the last preceding clause not being received by the Port Officer within the time specified therein or
- (b) a site allocated to a vessel not being used for a continuous period of six months or
- (c) the owner of the vessel to which the site was allocated not complying with these regulations or
- (d) a site not being occupied within three months of allocation—

the Port Officer may declare the site to be forfeited and in the event of his knowing the name and address of the owner of the vessel shall post a notice to that effect to such owner.

16. In the event of mooring sites being allocated to a vessel in more than one port or anchorage the Port Officer in his discretion may declare forfeit any mooring sites within the ports under his jurisdiction. The Port Officer shall hand or post written notice of such cancellation to the owner and therefor the sites specified in such notice shall cease to be allocated to such vessel.

17. Upon a site being so forfeited no person shall use such site for mooring a vessel until such site is allocated for such vessel subsequent to the forfeiture.

18. If within fourteen days of the forfeiture of the site the ground tackle is not removed the Port Officer may cause it to be sold privately where it lies to any person to whom the site has been allocated since the forfeiture or may cause it to be removed and sold by public auction or by private sale.

The Port Officer shall pay the proceeds of the sale less the expenses (if any) of removal storage and sale to the owner of the ground tackle if his name and address is known, and, if not, he shall pay them into consolidated revenue.

19. In the event of the name or address of the owner of a vessel to which a site has been allocated being unknown to the Port Officer or the designated person or in the event of his being absent from Victoria for a period of fourteen days or more the Port Officer may lift or cause to be lifted the ground tackle for the purpose of inspection and may cause any necessary repairs to be done to such tackle.

The expense of such lifting and repairing shall be paid by such owner, if not so paid within 90 days the Port Officer may sell or cause to be sold by public auction the vessel to which the site is allocated and shall pay the proceeds less the aforesaid expenses and the expenses of site to the owner if his name and address is then known, and, if not, into consolidated revenue.

20. In the event of a state of facts existing or arising whereby a vessel may become a danger to other vessels the Port Officer or the designated person may remove or cause such vessel to be removed from its moorings.

21. The Port Officer or designated person shall not incur any responsibility for the loss of or damage to a vessel removed from its moorings pursuant to these regulations. In the event of the name or address of the owner of such vessel being unknown, or in the event of his being absent from Victoria for a period of 14 days or more the vessel may be given into the custody of the police to be dealt with as an unclaimed chattel.

22. Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations the Port Officer may allocate transit sites to any such person or body as he thinks fit and these transit sites may be allocated by such person or body to any vessel for a period not exceeding seven days provided that no charge is made or payment accepted in respect of any such allocation.

MENTAL HYGIENE ACT 1928.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section Forty of the *Mental Hygiene Act* 1928 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time by Order published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim and constitute any house or premises provided by the State to be a receiving house:

And whereas it is desired to proclaim and constitute as a receiving house to be known as the Receiving House, Novar, all premises on certain land at Ballarat being all that piece of land with a frontage of two and a half chains to Webster-street, Ballarat, as described in Certificate of Title Volume 1713, Follum 342537, being part of Crown Allotment 36 Parish of Ballarat County of Grenville:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby as from the 15th October, 1954, proclaim and constitute all premises on land described in the said Certificate of Title as a receiving house to be known as the Receiving House, Novar.

MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1949.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act* 1949 (No. 5444) it is provided that a day be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district:

And whereas the Municipal Districts of the Cities of Melbourne, Port Melbourne and South Melbourne have been prescribed as Districts for the purposes of the said Act:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday the first day of November, 1954, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts of the Cities of Melbourne, Port Melbourne and South Melbourne—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottle and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

For the expression—

"Amendment of the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1928 (No. 3748) as amended by Act No. 3918."

appearing as the heading to the said Proclamation of the Seventh September, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, there shall be substituted the expression—

"Amendment of the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1928 (No. 3748) as amended by Act No. 3918."

"In the same manner as it applies to substances or preparations mentioned in the said paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule."

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Vermin Destroyer (Rat-Poison) Regulations 1954 and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1955.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Rat-Poison” means any substance used for the purpose of destroying rats and/or mice and any substance which has been or is by Proclamation declared to be a vermin destroyer (Rat-Poison) for the purpose of the Fungicides Acts.

3. For the purposes of section 8 (1) (c) of the *Fungicides Act* 1928 a label containing the following words and particulars (as the case may be) set out in the manner following is hereby prescribed:—

- (a) the words “Rat-Poison” shall be placed at the top of the label and immediately preceding the distinguishing name in red letters of not less than 18 points;
- (b) concise directions for use;
- (c) the net weight or number or true measure or volume of the contents of the package;
- (d) the words: “Warning—Destroy old containers and untaken baits. Keep away from children and domestic animals”;
- (e) a description of first aid procedure and appropriate antidote, followed by the words—“Obtain medical attention immediately for poisoned persons”.

4. No person shall sell any Rat-Poison in the form of individual baits wrapped in paper or other wrapping material.

5. No person shall sell any Rat-Poison other than:—

- (a) in a glass bottle or jar of dark blue, green or amber colour, rendered distinguishable by touch from ordinary smooth bottles or jars by means of points ribs flutes or stars blown on the surface; or
- (b) (subject to the provisions of Regulation 40 (6) of the Poisons Regulations) in a tin with a press-in lid; or
- (c) (subject to the provisions of Regulation 40 (11) of the Poisons Regulations) in a substantial inner packet contained in a cardboard container.

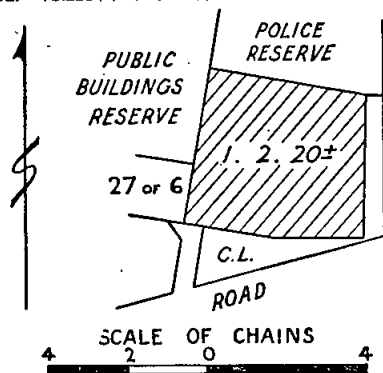

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under and in accordance with Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1946* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 86, for or with respect to:—

1. (a) The placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) The granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
- (c) Licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) Prescribing fees—
 - (i) for the granting or renewal of a licence,
 - (ii) for the transfer of a licence;
- (e) Providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and

- (f) insurance by licencees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

2. The repeal of By-law Nos. 54 and 73.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. By-law Nos. 54 and 73 are hereby repealed.

2. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the City of Camberwell.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Licensee” shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the City of Camberwell.

“Petrol pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit.

“Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

3. Any person carrying on or about to carry on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the City of Camberwell and used or to be used by such person for the purpose of such sale or supply. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.

4. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law the petrol pump in respect of which such licence has been granted and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on or under any footway for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pump.

5. (i) Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force or effect.

(ii) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence a licence fee of Eighty-four shillings (£4 4s.) per annum, provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

6. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

7. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire, the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

8. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

9. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the petrol pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

10. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application, in writing, to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence, in writing, signed by the licensee and an acceptance of such transfer (conditions upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings.

11. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to taken out by the transferor

shall be transferred to the transferee or the transferee shall effect a new policy in an insurance company of good repute to the same effect.

12. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall, before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted or if erected prior to the application before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof in some insurance company of good repute against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council or any duly appointed officer of the Council the said policy of insurance and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

13. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation, maintenance, or removal of a petrol pump, or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purposes of such installation, maintenance, or removal.

14. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence.

15. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

16. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 2 (BOOT REPAIRERS).

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Labour and Industry Act, the Wages Board which now has the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed—

(a) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of a boot repairer;

(b) in a boot repair shop selling grindery or other goods usually sold in such shops,

4. (a) In addition to the rates prescribed in clauses 2 and 3 hereof, any female employee required to do machining and/or solutioning of uppers; eyeletting; lacing; socking; pomming; attaching ornaments, buttons or buckles; cleaning; spraying; branding; sizing; solutioning and covering wood heels; skiving or trimming the insides and outsides of uppers (including cut-outs), shall be paid an additional $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.

7. (a) All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Trade Picnic Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, this provision shall apply only to the day so substituted.

(b) When Christmas Day, Boxing Day or New Year's Day fall on a Saturday or Sunday and no holiday is substituted in lieu thereof, employees shall have an additional day or days, as the case may be, added to his annual leave or be paid for each such day an amount equivalent to one-fifth of the ordinary weekly wage paid to such employees.

PAYMENT FOR WORK DONE ON SUNDAYS.

8. All time worked on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of treble time with a minimum payment as for a full day of 8 hours whether such full day is worked or not, provided that time worked in the alteration of plant or machinery necessary for resumption of work the next following working day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

SPECIAL RATES.

9. Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on day so substituted.

Provided that outside the Metropolitan District another holiday may be substituted for Melbourne Cup Day in clauses 7 and 9.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

9A. New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, or any other day by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the said days, shall be observed as public holidays.

MEAL INTERVAL.

10. An interval of not less than half an hour and not more than one hour shall be allowed for the midday meal.

REST PERIOD.

11. On Monday to Friday inclusive a rest period of not less than ten minutes each day shall be given to employees at a time suitable to the employer. Such rest period may be taken in periods of five minutes each.

PAYMENT OF WAGES.

12. (a) Wages shall be paid in the employer's time either on Thursday or Friday in each week except when holidays intervene.

(b) Not more than two days pay shall be kept in hand by the employer.

(c) Any employee whose services have been terminated by the employer before the usual time of payment shall be paid all moneys due to him within 30 minutes of such termination.

TEA MONEY.

13. An employee who is required to work overtime for more than one and one-half hours on any day after the usual finishing time shall be paid a meal allowance of 3s.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

14. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Labour and Industry Act 1953*, and any amendment which may be made thereto from time to time.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

15. (a) Employment shall be terminated by a week's notice on either side given at any time during the week or by the payment or forfeiture of a week's wages as the case may be. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employees without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, and in such cases the wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only or to deduct payment for any day when work is not available and/or the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any breakdown in machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

(b) A weekly employee to be entitled to the weekly wage shall be available, ready and willing, to perform his or her usual work during the days and hours usually worked by such class of employee.

SICK LEAVE.

16. (a) No deduction shall be made from the wages of any employee who has had not less than three months' continuous service with the same employer and who is unavoidably absent through illness for not more than 40 hours of working time in any year of service, provided he or she has submitted within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence if practicable evidence satisfactory to the employer that the same is not the result of his or her own misconduct.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (a) hereof if the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 80 hours of working time which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year without deduction of pay.

For the purposes of this sub-clause service prior to 1st May, 1948, shall be disregarded.

FACILITIES FOR MAKING TEA.

17. Facilities for making tea shall be provided by the employer for the employees at the commencement of rest periods and meal hours.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

18. The wages rate for adult males set out in clause 3 is based upon the following basic wage, and, pursuant to the provisions of Section 33 of the *Labour and Industry Act 1953*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically adjusted as prescribed by clause 19.

(b) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1954, the amount of the Basic Wage shall be as prescribed in clause 18.

(c) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February, a May, or an August, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, namely, by multiplying the last published Commonwealth Statistician's "all items" retail price index number by the factor .103 taken to one place of decimals, the resultant whole number being the amount of the basic wage expressed in shillings, but should the decimal number reach .5 or more the basic wage shall be taken to the next higher shilling.

(d) The wages rate for adult females is based on a basic wage being 75 per cent. of the basic wage for adult males calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded. The wages rate for adult females shall be adjusted by increasing or decreasing such rate by the amount of the difference from time to time in the said basic wage for females.

(e) The wages of Apprentices or Improvers shall be the appropriate percentages as set out hereunder, such wages shall be calculated to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

Labour and Industry Act 1953.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 12 (FUEL AND FODDER).

NOTES.—(1) This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Labour and Industry Act the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, Warrnambool, and of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

(2) By Orders in Council made on the 10th September, 1913, and 21st October, 1930, power was conferred on the Coal and Coke Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (a) coal importer;
- (b) coal mine owner;
- (c) gas company;
- (d) agent or contractor who distributes coal or coke for any coal importer, coal mine owner, or gas company.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Labour and Industry Act 1953* the Wages Board which now has the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (c) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of wood, coal or coke;
- (d) employed handling or distributing brewers' or distillers' grains"—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That on the 1st September 1954, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Work done on Sundays or on any of the specified holidays shall be paid for as follows:—

(a) On Sundays—

- (i) Time occupied in attending to horses, or in the essential conveyance of fodder for stock . . . Time and a half;
 (ii) All other work Double time.

(b) On any of the specified holidays—

- (i) Time occupied in attending to horses, or in the essential conveyance of fodder for stock . . . Time and a half;
 (ii) All other work Double time.

If any other day be substituted by Act of Parliament or Proclamation for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate prescribed shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

8A. New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, or any day by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the said days shall be observed as public holidays.

UNION PICNIC DAY.

9. Employees shall be entitled to absent themselves from work without loss of pay on Union Picnic Day, i.e., the last Monday in February in each year.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT.

10. An employee (other than a casual employee) willing, ready and available for work shall be paid the full weekly wage fixed herein. To terminate employment one week's notice shall be given on either side at any time during the week or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, and in such cases the wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only or to deduct payment for any day or part of a day the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any breakdown of machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

CASUAL LABOUR.

11. Casual hands, i.e., persons who are employed other than in a factory or shop during any week for not more than one-half of the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

12. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the *Labour and Industry Act 1953*, and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

SICK LEAVE.

13. (a) Any employee who, having had at least three months' service with the same employer, is absent from duty as a result of personal ill health or accident shall be entitled to sick pay as follows:—

- (i) During the first year—3½ hours' ordinary pay for each complete month of service.
 (ii) During any subsequent year of service—40 hours' ordinary pay.

Provided that, in either case such employee produces or forwards within 48 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence.

(b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall, provided an employee remains in the service of the one employer or any successor of such employer, be cumulative from year to year. For the purposes of this sub-clause service prior to the 1st November, 1949, shall be disregarded provided that any accumulated sick leave, not exceeding 80 hours of working time, standing to the credit of the employee on the 1st November, 1951, shall not be reduced by virtue of the provisions of this sub-clause.

No employer shall terminate the services of an employee during the currency of any period of sick leave with the object of avoiding his obligations under this sub-clause.

PAYMENT OF WAGES.

14. Wages shall be paid not later than Thursday in each week.

WASHING FACILITIES.

15. The employer shall provide hot water together with suitable washing facilities for the use of employees at meal times and on ceasing work.

16. The lowest piecework prices payable to any persons for doing work of a description referred to in the following Schedule shall be—
