## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 5790. "An Act to amend the *Totalizator Act 1930*."  
 No. 5791. "An Act relating to the Country Roads Board Fund and the Level Crossings Fund."  
 No. 5792. "An Act to provide for Reduced Rates of Entertainments Tax."  
 No. 5793. "An Act to amend the Police Offences Acts, the *Totalizator Act 1930*, the *Trotting Races Act 1946* and the Stamps Acts in respect of certain Financial Matters relating to Racecourses and Race-meetings, and for other purposes."  
 No. 5794. "An Act relating to Water Supply in the Bellarine Peninsula, and for other purposes."

### ENTERTAINMENTS TAX (AMENDMENT) ACT 1954. DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the third year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intituled the *Entertainments Tax (Amendment) Act 1954*, it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the twenty-fifth day of October One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four as the date upon which the said *Entertainments Tax (Amendment) Act 1954* shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

### PROCLAMATION
