WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the third year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. intituled the Transfer of Land Act 1954 It is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Friday the first day of July One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five as the day upon which the Transfer of Land Act 1954 shall come into operation.






And whereas the Soldier Settlement Commission, after consultation with the councils of the municipalities concerned, has so certified:




Parish of Budgeree, County of Buln Buln, being the section of road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(B.713(4) (D.2214).






Parish of Allambee, County of Buln Buln, being the sections of road indicated by hachure on plans hereunder.—(A.177(11) (D.16338).




Parish of Mostyn, County of Dundas, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.216(2) (D.17046).







RATING BY-LAW FOR 1955.

THE Devenish Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Devenish Urban District.



AMENDING PUBLIC BUILDING REGULATIONS 1955.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Public Building Regulations 1955" and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Building Regulations 1952 and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. Regulation 59 of the Public Building Regulations 1952 is hereby repealed and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—
 - 59. (1) Stairs from balconies or galleries shall not communicate with any basement or cellar.
 - (2) Every staircase stairway and landing shall be constructed of fire-resisting materials as specified in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, 1945, or any amendment thereof. The linings (if any) of the spandrels and of the underside of stairs and landings shall be of fire-retardant material as specified in the said regulations.
 - (3) The construction of external wooden staircases shall conform to the following provisions except where the Commission in any specific case permits an alternative construction of equivalent strength:—
 - (a) Stringers shall be securely morticed into newel posts, and, where transoms are not provided, shall be secured to newel posts by angle or flat iron brackets adequately bolted to the posts and screwed to the stringers.
 - (b) Treads shall be supported at the ends by mild steel angle cleats securely coach-screwed or bolted to stringer and tread
 - (c) Staircases 5 feet wide or over shall have central carriage pieces, and transom pieces securely bolted to newel posts shall be provided to support carriage pieces and stringers.
 - (d) Each flight shall be provided with transverse tie-rods spaced as directed, threaded at each end, and fitted with nuts and wrought iron thrust plates.
 - (e) Flying newels attached to masonry walls shall be adequately secured thereto to the satisfaction of the Commission.
 - (4) All housing morticings and tenoning of external timber stairways shall be treated with an approved preserving liquid before fabrication.
 - (5) All external wooden staircases shall have each tread and landing treated and maintained with an approved material so as to present a non-skid surface.



APPLIANCES TO BE SUBMITTED FOR APPROVAL.

PURSUANT to Section 7 of the State Electricity Commission Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria doth hereby prescribe the following class and type of electrical appliance and apparatus intended, suggested, or designed for use in or for the purpose of or for connection to any electrical installation, and that electrical appliances or apparatus of the said class or type shall not, after the 1st day of July, 1956, be sold hired or exposed for sale or hire, or advertised for sale or hire, unless the appliance or apparatus has been approved by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, and is stamped or labelled as prescribed, that is to say:

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "CARBOOR RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regula-tions in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Carboor temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 3rd February, 1954, as a site for Public Recreation and known as the "Carboor as a site for Public Recreation, and known as the "Carboor Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve"). The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"):—

REGULATIONS

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, shows, sports, fêtes, musical performances, outdoor gatherings, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve, but no person shall be permitted to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve on days on which fees for admission are not being charged without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

2. No person shall-

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend anter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person under authority from the Committee or employed by it at the Reserve in the execution of his lawful duties.
- (f) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and con-sistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
- 5. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any sport, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first obtained.
- 6. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 7. No person shall park a motor-car, vehicle, or motor-cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 8. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any kind in the Reserve at any time without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person, club, or other body using the Reserve shall damage any building thereon or the fittings on such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body

shall be responsible for such damage and pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

- 10. No person shall, in the Reserve interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein structures therein.
- 11. No person shall remove any wood or timber from the Reserve, unless with the consent of the Committee first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the said Committee.
- 12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
- 13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, pigs, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person shall camp on the Reserve or erect thereon any building or any other structure without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.
- 16. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.—(Rs.3366.)

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, lawns, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates in or around the Reserve, nor stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, gates, fences, seats, or trees, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any dog, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 - 6. No person shall camp in the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall erect in the Reserve any structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve any article or articles without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 11. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or notice and fixed or set by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
- 12. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- 13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 14. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of membership of any of the sporting clubs in the Reserve, or any part thereof, with the consent of the Committee of Management:—
 - (a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
 - (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
 - (c) Walking on the sporting areas at any time, unless entitled to use the same as provided in Regulation No. 17 hereof, and unless wearing rubbersoled footwear without heels.
 - (d) Crossing or trespassing on the playing areas during the progress of a match or practice.
- 15. Public betting in any part or division of the Reserve shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.
- 16. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
- 17. No person shall be entitled to play any game or practise, or take part in such practice, in any part or division of the Reserve, unless he be a member or authorized guest of one of the clubs that have been granted permission, in writing, to play or practice, as the case may be, by the Committee of Management, and unless he can produce, on demánd, satisfactory evidence that he is a member or authorized guest of the clubs: Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the sporting areas of the Reserve and play thereon, on paying to the club or association for the time being permitted to use the sporting areas of the Reserve, or to the Committee of Management, a reasonable amount as fee.

18. No play shall take place in the sporting areas on Good Friday, Anzac Day, and Sundays during church services. The churches desiring this arrangement to notify Committee of Management as to date and hours.—(Rs.7179.)

Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), Jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of

the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
