- 2. Every determination of a Wages Board shall be communicated to the Minister, in writing, by the chairman of such Wages Board.

Boards of Reference.

- 3. Where a dispute of fact exists in relation to any provision of a determination of a Wages Board which has provided for the appointment of a Board of Reference, any person or persons concerned with such dispute may apply to the Board of Reference to have the dispute determined, by forwarding such application in writing to the chairman of the Board of Reference.
- 4. The secretary to any Wages Board which has provided for the appointment of a Board of Reference shall attend the meetings of such Board of Reference, and shall keep minutes of all its proceedings and the names of the members who attend each meeting.
- 5. All powers of any Board of Reference may be exercised by a quorum which shall consist of at least half the representative members and the chairman.
- 6. All questions which arise at any meeting of any Board of Reference shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members
- 7. Every determination of a Board of Reference shall be communicated to the Minister, in writing, by the chairman of such Board of Reference.

The chairman of any Wages Board or Board of Reference shall be reimbursed travelling and personal expenses reasonably and necessarily incurred in the performance of his duties at the rates and subject to the conditions prescribed by the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations for officers of the Public Service.

- (2) Any member of a Wages Board or Board of Reference, other than the chairman, who resides 20 or more miles from Melbourne shall, in addition, be reimbursed all fares and personal expenses reasonably and necessarily incurred in attending any meeting of such Board, such personal expenses to be reimbursed at the rate of 7s. 6d. for each meal and 12s. 6d. for each night's lodging.







1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette* Officer.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

2. Other matter.

- (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Ten a.m. on Tuesday.
- (b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.
- (c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the *Gazette* Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.
- (d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
