PROCLAMATION OF CENTRAL GIPPSLAND WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Weights and Measures Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at the request of two or more municipalities declare such municipalities to be a Union for the purposes of the said Acts:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Acts and at the request of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria in respect of the Yallourn Works Area, and of the Councils of the Shires of Alberton, Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Morwell, Narracan, South Gippsland, Traralgon, Warragul and Woorayl, do by this my Proclamation declare the Yallourn Works Area and the Shires of Alberton, Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Morwell, Narracan, South Gippsland, Traralgon, Warragul and Woorayl to be a Union for the purposes of the said Acts under the title of "Central Gippsland Weights and Measures Union" and do further declare that the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union under the said Acts shall be as follows (that is to say):—

1. Each such municipality shall contribute one twenty-Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,

- 1. Each such municipality shall contribute one twenty-second part of the expenses devolving on the Union.
- 2. The Yallourn Works Area shall, in addition to the amount specified in clause 1 hereof, contribute an amount which shall bear the same proportion to the expenses devolving upon the Union and not contributed in accordance with clause 1 hereof as the number of persons residing in the Yallourn Works Area bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union the Union.
- 3. Of the expenses devolving upon the Union and not contributed in accordance with clauses 1 and 2 hereof:—
 - (a) One-half shall be contributed by the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area) in such manner that the amount to be contributed by each municipality in accordance with this sub-clause shall bear the same proportion to the total expenses to be contributed in accordance with this sub-clause as the number of persons residing in each such municipality bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area); and

 (b) the other half shall be contributed by the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn World Area); and
 - cipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area) in such manner that the amount to be contributed by each such municipality in accordance with this sub-clause shall bear the same proportion to the total expenses to be contributed in accordance with this sub-clause as the total net annual values of properties in the municipal district of each such municipality (other than the Yallourn Works Area) bear to the total net annual values of properties in all the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area).
- 4. For the purposes of clause 2 and of sub-clause (a) of clause 3 the number of persons residing in each such municipality shall be deemed to be the number of persons residing therein as disclosed by the last periodical census conducted by or on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- 5. For the purposes of computing the amount to be contributed by any municipality pursuant to sub-clause (b) of clause 3 hereof during any period ending on the thirtieth day of September in any year, the net annual values of properties in such municipality shall be deemed to be the net annual values of properties in the municipal district of such municipality during the twelve months next preceding the period for which the amount of contributions are being computed.
- 6. The foregoing provisions relating to the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union shall have effect from the first day of October next after the declaration or publication by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of Australia of the result of the periodical census showing the number of persons residing in each such municipality:

Provided that from the constitution of the Union until the thirtleth day of September next after the declaration or publication of the result of the census aforesaid the

apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving upon the Union shall be as follows (that is to say):

BY-LAW No. 63.

Water Supply.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and in exercise and execution of any powers and authorities in any wise enabling the Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following that is to say. following, that is to say:

- 1. This By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 56 duly passed by the Board on the seventh day of October One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two and gazetted on the seventeenth day of December One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two and any By-law amending the same and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. The said By-law No. 56 is hereby amended by substituting for clause 53 thereof the following clause:—
 - "53. (a) No person shall permit or allow any solid liquid or gas to have access or means of access to water supplied by the Board

prior to the delivery thereof. For the purposes hereof water so supplied shall be deemed to be delivered when it has

he deemed to be delivered when it has emerged free from any pipe fitting or appliance connected directly or indirectly with any water main arterial main or aqueduct of the Board.

(b) No person shall attach or fix or permit or allow to remain attached or fixed to any pipe in communication directly or indirectly with any water main arterial main or aqueduct of the Board or to any tap hose or fitting attached to or in commain or aqueduct of the Board or to any tap hose or fitting attached to or in communication with such pipe any appliance containing or having provision, for the containing of any solid or gas or of any liquid other than water supplied by the Board unless the Chief Engineer of Water Supply shall either generally or specifically have first consented to the attachment or fixing of such appliance".

3. The said By-law No. 56, as hereinbefore amended, is hereby ratified and confirmed.

- 3. The said By-law No. 53 as hereinbefore amended is hereby ratified and confirmed.


