AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "YARRA DOON RECREATION RESERVE."

TION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 1st July, 1929, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Warburton and of such portion of the Permanent Reserve along the Yarra River, Parish of Warburton, as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked W.27.2.30 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.3861, which areas are together known as "Yarra Doon Recreation Reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall-

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, and for maintaining good order in the Reserves, the Committee of Management or its employees may refuse any person admission to the Reserves or any structure therein;
- (b) climb or jump over the gates, fences, seats, tables, signboards, building equipment, notices, fittings or other improvements in or around the Reserves, nor stick therein or thereupon any

bills or in any way injure, damage, deface, write or paint on or otherwise mark any rocks, gates, fences, seats, tables, buildings equipment, notices, signboards, or other improvement, structure or fittings therein or thereon nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein;

- (c) remove or displace any board plate or fitting or written or printed notice for the exhibition of any regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserves.
- 2. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserves, dressing rooms, conveniences or appurtenances therein.
- 3. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management, light any fire in the Reserves, except in a place set apart by the Committee or as indicated by the caretaker for the purpose. No such fire shall be left burning or unattended, and before lighting such fire such person shall make provision for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth.
- 4. Every person whilst in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire.
- 5. No person shall' play, practice or engage in any game or sport in the Reserves at any time without the consent of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee thinks fit.
- All fees prescribed herein shall be paid to the secretary or specially authorized officer on demand.
- 7. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve, except in those parts specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a permit subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees as are hereinafter provided.
 - The charges for camping in the area are as follows:— Camping—for each tent 2s. per night or 10s. per week. Picnic parties—2s. per car and £1 per picnic bus or passenger bus.
- 9. No person shall park any motor-car, cycle or other vehicle or tether any horse within the Reserves, excepting at such areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose, and any person using such area shall obey any order given by the said Committee, the curator, or other employee of such Committee and pay on demand a fee not exceeding One shilling per day for entrance or use of such parking area.
- 10. Camping will be permitted for a period not exceeding six weeks unless special permission, in writing, is first obtained from the Committee of Management.
- Camping is only permitted on that area indicated by the authorized officer of the Committee of Management.
- 12. Camp sites whilst being occupied by a camp party must be kept in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and before a camp party leaves the Reserves such party shall collect and place in the receptacles provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage produced at the camp site allotted to such party.
- 13. No person shall bathe or prepare to bathe in the Reserve unless clad in a bathing costume which meets with the approval of the Committee of Management.
- 14. No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter or play on swings or other appliances erected on any children's playground, but parents and other attendants shall be at liberty to enter playground to watch the children who are in their charge.
- 15. The Committee of Management may at its discretion on such terms and conditions, and at such times as it may from time to time fix, lease, rent or hire to persons, clubs or associations any tennis courts or other part or parts of the Reserves.
- 16. The swings and other appliances erected in the children's playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children shall be waiting for them.
- 17. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the children's playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
- 18. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the children's playground or bring any animal into same.
- 19. Every person in the children's playground shall obey the directions of any duly authorized officer of the said Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct therein.
- 20. No fête, concert, carnival or aquatic display shall be held in the Reserves without the consent of the Committee of Management, nor shall fees for admission to

- the Reserves on days on which fêtes, concerts, carnivals or aquatic displays be charged without the consent of such Committee.
- 21. No assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character shall take place on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 22. No person shall offer for sale within the Reserves or deliver therein any article or commodity without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.
- 23. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erections in the Reserves.
- 24. No unauthorized person shall interfere with, damage in any way, destroy or have in his possession in the Reserves or take away therefrom, any animal, bird, bird's egg, or any live or dead or dressed timber or any vegetation, tree, shrub, fern, plants or flowers.
- 25. No person shall bring into or have in his possession or discharge in the Reserves any rifle or firearm of like nature or sporting gun or air gun, except with the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 26. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animals belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in the Reserves, or to graze or wander over or upon the same without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and upon payment of such fees as may be fixed.
- 27. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserves and shall be taken to the occupier of the Reserves with all power incidental to that status within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
- 28. For the purpose of this Regulation "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928, or amendments thereto.
- 29. No person shall bring or allow any dog or animal belonging to him or under his care or control to enter or remain in the Reserves, unless such dog or animal is held on a leash by such person, and all dogs or animals found swimming in any water or wandering in the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 30. No person except workmen employed in the Reserves shall enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, nor shall any person, without lawful excuse, enter any area enclosed for a special purpose.
- 31. No person shall drive any motor-car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor-cycle or horse, except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserves, and then only as near as practicable to the left-hand side of such road.
- 32. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall be fixed from time to time by the said Committee.
- 33. No person shall drive any motor-car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride a bicycle, motor-cycle or horse within the Reserves or in any parking area or along any road therein, recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances in the case, including the nature, condition and use of the road, parking area or Reserves, and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on any such road, parking area or in the Reserves.
- 34. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth on any site on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth for residential purposes.
- residential purposes.

 35. The Committee of Management shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserves of any bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent or which has not been properly erected or properly painted or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

- 36. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, or erection or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserves within fourteen (14) days after the Committee of Management has sent by registered post to his last known address a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any building, structure, or erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee of Management.
- 37. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee of Management may remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or erection or booth and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove same, but without pre-judice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

- 3. Fowlhouses, kennels, and similar structures may be constructed appurtenant to buildings of Classes I., II., and IV. occupancy provided that any such structure—
 - (a) Shall have a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet.
 - (b) shall be distant not less than 50 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
 - (c) shall be distant not less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a width of 25 feet or more:
 - (d) shall be distant not less than 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
 - (e) shall be distant not less than 20 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land;
 - (f) shall be constructed in a manner and of material to be approved by the surveyor;
 - (g) shall not be erected appurtenant to a building of Class II. occupancy without the authority of a Resolution of the Council.
- 4. (a) The occupier of any premises upon which fowls are kept—
 - (i) shall not without the consent of the Council use or permit such premises to be used or continue to use or permit to be used such premises for the accommodation of more than sixteen fowls;
 - (ii) shall cause such premises and any fowlhouse therein and all parts thereof and all things therein and any yard appurtenant thereto to be maintained and kept at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (b) An application for the consent of the Council to the keeping of more than sixteen fowls shall be in writing, signed by the occupier of the premises.
- (c) Any consent granted by the Council, pursuant to this By-law—
 - (i) may be in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk;
 - (ii) may be subject to such conditions as the Council may deem proper;
 - (iii) may be cancelled at any time by Resolution of the Council.
