Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1954, No. 5808.

RECLASSIFICATION OF ELECTORAL DISTRICTS OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is amongst other things enacted by the *Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1954* (No. 5808) that—

- (1) The said Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the sixth day of October One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four;
- (2) For the purposes of the said Act each of the electoral provinces of the Legislative Council and electoral districts of the Legislative Assembly shall be classified as being a metropolitan electorate, an urban electorate, an inner country electorate or an outer country electorate;
- (3) Initially such classification shall be as set out in the Schedule to the said Act;
- (4) Thereafter whenever there is any change in electoral provinces of the Legislative Council or electoral districts of the Legislative Assembly the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* reclassify the provinces or districts (as the case may be) having regard to the classification in the Schedule to the said Act, and such reclassification shall from the date fixed in the Proclamation be substituted for the classification of the provinces or districts theretofore existing and become the classification of provinces or districts for the purposes of the said Act.

And whereas the electoral districts of the Legislative Assembly as existing at the commencement of the aforesaid Act have been superseded by electoral districts of the Legislative Assembly, which came into force on the twenty-second day of April, 1955:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1954* and having regard to

the classification in the Schedule to the said Act, do hereby reclassify the electoral districts of the Legislative Assembly into metropolitan, urban, inner country and outer country electorates as set out in the Schedule hereunder:—

Urban Electorates.

Electoral Districts of—

Box Hill, Broadmeadows, Dandenong, Evelyn, Geelong, Geelong West, Grant, Mentone, Mornington, Scoresby.

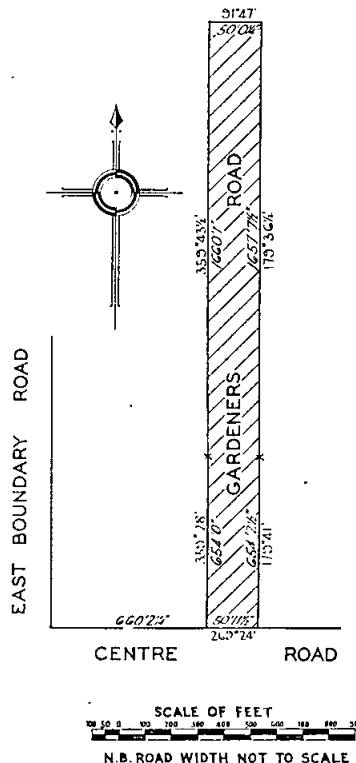
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and henceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land used for a street, being part of Crown portion 61, Parish of Moorabbin, County of Bourke, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act:—

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN
ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specify a day on from and after which any vermin shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land within the whole of Victoria, or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the eighth day of August One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five as the day on from and after which certain vermin, to wit rabbits, shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land within the whole of Victoria.

AUSTRALIA.—VICTORIA.

APOLLO BAY.

(1) Alteration in Port Boundary.

Former Definition.—*Port Rules and Regulations*, page 9.—The Port of Apollo bay includes all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters west of and within a line bearing North 20 deg. East from the eastern end of Hayley reef to the mouth of Wild Dog creek.

Alteration.—The Port of Apollo Bay shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbors, and navigable waters northward of the transit Hayley point beacons bearing 097 deg. 12 min. for a distance of 14.18 cables from the Front beacon, black, latitude 38 deg. 47 min. 08 sec. S., longitude 143 deg. 39 min. 52 sec. E., thence westward of a bearing 016 deg. 30 min. to the high line of the northern shore in the vicinity of Skene's creek outfall.

(2) Prohibited Anchorage.

Position.—White beacon Bunbury point, Lat. 38 deg. 45 min. 45 sec. S., Long. 144 deg. 40 min. 42 sec. E.

Details.—For the preservation of the submarine electric cable, anchorage is prohibited within the following limits, viz.:—Commencing on the high line of the northern shore 12.01 cables 005 deg. 46 min. from the above beacon, thence 10.6 cables 123 deg., thence 1 cable 155 deg., thence 4 cables 065 deg. to the eastern boundary of the port, thence 2.2 cables 335 deg., thence 303 deg. to the shore.

The axis of the outer section of the area is marked by two beacons surmounted by yellow diamond tops, with Telegraph Cable in black lettering, standing on the northern shore 0.4 cables apart in line bearing 334½ deg.

The axis of the inner section is marked by two fixed amber lights, shown from posts with red diamond-top marks, standing 0.4 cables apart, in line, bearing 303 deg.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be eighty-three point three three per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of July, 1955.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be one hundred point nought nought per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of July, 1955.

4. All expressions and terms defined in the Health Acts or in any regulations thereunder relating to premises referred to herein shall have the same meanings when used in these regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter.

5. (1) Before granting any application for registration or renewal of registration and at least twice more during each year of the currency of any registration the Council shall cause an inspection to be made of every premises registered with the Council.

(2) The inspector shall keep a record of the date of every such inspection, and of the result of the inspection in the form prescribed in the Schedule and such records shall be available for perusal on demand by an authorized officer of the Commission.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOOD PREMISES.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food Premises Regulations 1955 and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1955.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Approved” means approved in writing by the Council.

“Food premises” means any premises or part thereof, not being premises required to be registered under Part X. of the *Health Act* 1928 or section twelve of the *Health Act* 1935, where food of any sort is manufactured, prepared or stored for sale or is sold, and includes a milk bar.

“Proprietor” of any food premises includes the owner, the occupier or any person having the management or control thereof.

3. Every person who is required by the Health Acts to register food premises shall apply to the Council in the form prescribed in the Schedule to the Registration (Health Acts) Regulations and shall submit with such application a sketch plan of the building to a scale of not less than 8 feet to 1 inch showing the purpose for which it is intended to use each compartment, including any living accommodation.

4. Every person who proposes to add to or alter the building of any food premises or to alter the uses of any rooms therein shall apply to the Council for approval of the plans and supply such information as the Council requires.

5. No alteration in the approved use of any part of the premises shall be made without the consent in writing of the Council.

6. The Council shall not approve of the registration of any food premises which do not comply to the Council's satisfaction with the appropriate requirements of these Regulations and with any requirements as to construction, cleanliness, drainage, lighting and ventilation under any other regulations applicable to such premises: Provided that premises which are in use for the purpose at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations may be registered conditionally on any alterations necessary to bring them into compliance being completed within a reasonable time to be specified by the Council.

7. Where any premises used for the sale of food or for the manufacture, preparation, display, storage or packing of food for sale are by reason of their state, situation, construction or disrepair, in a condition whereby the food may be exposed to contamination or taint or may become dirtied or deteriorated the proprietor shall on receipt of a notice from the Council or its authorized officer cleanse, reconstruct or repair the premises as and within the time specified in such notice.

General Provisions.

8. Every room used for or in connexion with the manufacture, preparation or packing or storage of food for sale shall—

- (a) have floors in good repair and constructed of approved material suited to the process of work carried on, and when flour, blood or liquids are likely to be spilled thereon, have floors that are constructed of an approved impervious material and properly graded and drained. When floors are constructed of impervious material as aforesaid the material shall be carried up the walls to a height of not less than 3 inches, in such a manner that the angles between walls and floors are concavely rounded off;
- (b) have walls whose internal surfaces are finished with an approved material having a smooth even surface capable of being readily cleansed; and where walls are subject to wetting or fouling, have walls that are finished with an impervious material to a height of not less than 6 feet above the floor level and if so required by the Council are painted a light colour;
- (c) have a ceiling constructed with a smooth surface so as to be dustproof and if so required by the Council painted a light colour;
- (d) be lighted and ventilated in accordance with any regulations or by-laws in force in the municipality relating to such premises, and to the satisfaction of the Council; and when required by the Council shall be provided with mechanical ventilation;
- (e) be provided with sanitary accommodation as required by the Council for the persons employed in the premises, such accommodation being in no case less than is required by any regulations or by-laws relating to such class of premises.

Closets shall be separate for each sex, shall be convenient to the place of work, shall not open directly into any room in which food is prepared or stored, and pan closets shall be distant at least 50 feet therefrom, shall conform to the requirements of the General Sanitary Regulations and shall at all times be kept clean and in good repair: Provided that where a distance of 50 feet as required herein is impracticable, the Council may permit a pan closet to be erected or remain at such lesser distance as the Council specifies;

- (f) be provided with wash-hand basins in approved positions in the ratio of 1 to every 10 persons or part of 10 persons working on the premises; together with a sufficient supply of soap, water and clean paper towels or other approved hand-drying equipment; or be provided with equivalent hand-washing facilities to the satisfaction of the Council;
- (g) be provided with drainage to the satisfaction of the Council and when a public sewer is available shall be connected thereto;
- (h) be provided with facilities for storing outdoor clothing so that there shall be no contamination of food by contact with the clothing; and when more than four persons of either sex work on the premises, be provided with separate changing-rooms for each sex;

- (i) have adequate provision including hot and cold water and sinks in approved positions for the cleansing of all appliances.

9. Every shop or other place in which any food not in sealed containers is sold shall be provided with wash-hand basins in the ratio of 1 to every 10 persons or part of 10 persons working on the premises, together with a sufficient supply of water and clean paper towels or other approved hand-drying equipment.

10. All food premises shall be well constructed and in good repair and, as far as may be practicable, offer no entrance or harbourage for rats or mice.

Bakehouses and Cake and Pastry Kitchens.

11. Every building or room used as a bakehouse or as a cake or pastry kitchen shall comply with the following provisions:—

- (a) The portion of the floor immediately in front of every baker's oven that is heated by means of solid fuel shall be made of cement concrete finished smoothly with cement mortar, tiles or other even and non-inflammable material for a distance of not less than 6 feet from the oven;
- (b) ovens shall be so constructed as to prevent accumulations of rubbish in the top and sides thereof;
- (c) an adequately lighted ventilated and damp free storeroom shall be provided in which food ingredients used in baking shall be kept when not in use;
- (d) every room or compartment in which flour is used shall be kept free from all extraneous shelves ledges fittings or appliances not in actual use for the preparation of the food being manufactured on the premises;
- (e) effective provision shall be made for the exclusion of flies;
- (f) troughs, bins and other appliances if fixed shall be so placed and fitted as to have no spaces below or at the sides or back which cannot be readily inspected and cleaned and if movable shall be provided with wheels to facilitate removal for cleaning;
- (g) all troughs, bins and other appliances installed after the coming into operation of these Regulations shall be movable.

Meat Processing Premises.

12. Every room or place used for the boning, mincing, curing, canning, salting or other process of preparation of meat for sale shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) The floor shall be constructed of approved impervious material and be properly graded and drained. The material of which the floor is constructed shall be carried up the walls to a height of not less than 3 inches in such a manner that the angles between floor and walls are concavely rounded off;
- (b) the floor shall at all times be kept in good repair and free from cracks and inequalities;
- (c) the internal walls to a height of at least 6 feet above the floor shall be faced with impervious material with a smooth surface.

Butchers' Shops, Fish Shops and Poultry Shops.

13. (1) In this and the next succeeding Regulation—

“meat” means any edible part of the carcass of a bull ox steer cow heifer calf ram ewe wether lamb goat kid swine rabbit or of any poultry;

“fish” includes fresh fish, smoked fish, crustaceans or molluscs, but does not include salter fish or kippered herrings or canned fish.

(2) Every shop used for the retail sale of meat or fish shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) The floor shall be of tiles, cement, concrete or other approved impervious material: Provided that the Council may allow for such period as it seems expedient in any premises in use for such purpose at the time of the coming into operation of these Regulations flooring boards laid on a firm foundation and tightly clamped together;

- (b) the internal walls shall have a minimum height of 10 feet and shall be finished with a smooth impervious washable surface to a height of not less than 6 feet above the floor;
 - (c) the ceiling shall be constructed of material offering the least possible opportunity for lodgment of dust and flies and other insects;
 - (d) all windows shall be of glass or closely-fitted wire or approved gauze, and the main window opening shall be not less than one-half of the area of the inside front wall of the shop: Provided that in a butcher's shop which is within or forms part of another shop or store the window opening shall be not less than one-eighth of the total area of the walls, or one-half of the area of the wall which furnishes the principal means of ingress and egress for the public;
 - (e) no window in an external wall shall be within a distance of 30 feet of any fowlhouse, or stable;
 - (f) all tables, benches, shelves, trays and similar fittings and appliances which come into contact with meat or fish shall be impervious to water;
 - (g) every doorway shall be provided with a light swing frame, closely fitting and self-closing and covered with wire or approved gauze of a maximum mesh of one-sixteenth part of an inch; and every ventilation or other opening shall be covered with similar gauze;
 - (h) no shop shall have a sleeping room opening directly into it.
14. Every fish shop shall be provided with an efficient means of ventilation which will discharge trade odours in a position where no nuisance will be created.

Delicatessen (including Sandwich Shops).

15. (1) In this Regulation—

“meat” shall have the same meaning as in Regulation 12;
“delicatessen” means any place where prepared foods such as cooked meat, cooked pastry containing meat, pasties, savouries, sandwiches and similar foods are prepared or sold.

(2) In every delicatessen cooked meat, cooked pastry containing meat, pasties, savouries and similar foods containing meat which are ordinarily consumed in the state in which they are sold shall be stored, kept or displayed in a separate part of the shop away from other foods which are not in sealed containers or which are not completely enclosed in a wrapper, and the shop shall be designed accordingly: Provided that a case with a glass front and a top and sides shall be deemed to be a separate part of a shop for the purposes of this Regulation.

(3) All tables, benches, shelves and trays and all appliances shall as far as practicable be impervious to water.

(4) Adequate refrigerated storage space shall be provided for the storage of all cooked meats and products containing meat.

Milk and Cream Stores.

16. Every room used for the storage of milk or cream pending retail sale or for the bottling of raw milk or cream for sale shall comply with the following requirements:—

(a) All floors shall be constructed of concrete or other impervious and easily cleaned material and shall be impervious to moisture. Concrete faces shall be finished to a smooth plane surface. The floors shall be adequately graded so as to drain into channels which shall discharge in an approved manner over a gully-trap.

Angles between floor and walls shall be rounded off in a manner that will prevent lodgment of dirt and enable the premises to be cleaned with an ordinary scrubbing broom;

(b) interior walls and the interior surface of external walls shall be made of or lined with tiles, cement or other material so finished by painting or otherwise as to present a smooth surface and be impervious to moisture.

Faces of concrete shall be finished to a smooth plane surface with a steel tool;

- (c) ceilings, if any, and roofs of rooms not provided with complete ceilings shall be dustproof and the under surface shall be smooth and capable of being washed without damage;
- (d) all rooms shall be provided with adequate ventilation and with adequate natural and artificial lighting;
- (e) all doors opening to the outer air shall, as far as practicable, be self-closing;
- (f) all windows, doorways, vents and other openings to the outer air shall, as far as practicable, be flyproof;
- (g) adequate sanitary accommodation shall be provided in rooms not opening directly into any room in which milk or equipment or containers are handled, treated or stored and all doors of closets shall be self-closing;
- (h) adequate wash-hand basins fitted with waste pipes and with pipes to supply hot water (where possible) and cold water shall be provided conveniently adjacent to every closet.

An adequate supply of soap and paper towels shall be available.

The said basins shall not be used for any purpose other than personal ablution;

- (i) all refrigerated storage shall be constructed with impervious walls, floor and ceiling and shall be so constructed as to permit floor drainage to fall to the door opening or openings and shall be provided with mechanical cooling equipment which permits adequate access to all parts of the store for easy cleaning;
- (j) all plumbing and all door hinges, fastenings and other working or moving parts of the premises including fittings and fixtures shall be kept at all times in good sound and efficient working order;
- (k) every open-surface cooler shall either be situated in a dustproof room or else be provided with a tightly-fitting shield capable of protecting the surface of the cooler from contamination.

Milk Shops and Milk Bars.

17. All premises used for the retail sale of milk cream or ice cream shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) Every room where milk is kept shall be adequately lighted and ventilated;
- (b) if milk drinks or any other drinks are consumed on the premises the glass-washing apparatus required by the Cleanliness (Foods, Drugs and Substances) Regulations shall be installed;
- (c) all surfaces where milk is likely to be splashed or spilled shall be smooth impervious and washable.

Ice Cream Factories, &c.

18. Premises used in connexion with the manufacture or packing of ice cream, milk ices, flavoured ices or ice blocks for sale shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) An adequately lighted and ventilated storeroom shall be provided in which all the dry ingredients flavouring, colouring, wrappers and cartons used in the manufacture, packing or storing of ice cream, milk ices, flavoured ices or ice blocks shall be stored and protected from contamination by rats and mice, dust and flies and other insects;
- (b) all appliances which come in contact with any ice cream milk ices flavoured ices or ice blocks during its preparation, manufacture or packing shall be cleaned and sterilized by steam, boiling water or other approved method each working day.

Egg Processing Premises.

19. Premises used for the plumping of eggs for sale or the drying of egg pulp for sale shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) Adequate provision including boiling water, troughs, sinks or other approved equipment, shall be made for the cleaning and sterilizing of appliances and containers;
- (b) the floor shall be at all times kept in good repair;

- (c) every receptacle and appliance used in connexion with the pulping of eggs or the packing of egg pulp for sale or the drying of egg pulp for sale shall be made of impervious material and shall be so constructed as to be easily cleaned and sterilized.

Manufacture of Cordials, Syrups, Aerated Waters, &c.

20. All premises used for the manufacture, preparation or bottling of cordials; syrups; aerated waters and similar beverages shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Containers and other appliances in which liquid charged with carbon dioxide may flow or be held shall, if made of copper, be lined or coated internally with tin;
 (b) no such container shall be used if the tin coating is damaged or eroded.

21. (1) Every room in which such beverages are manufactured, prepared or bottled shall have a floor constructed of approved impervious material and properly graded and drained. The material of which the floor is constructed shall be carried up the walls to a height of not less than 3 inches in such a manner that the angles between the floor and the walls are concavely rounded off.

(2) The walls of every such room shall have internal surfaces of approved material with a smooth even surface capable of being readily cleaned and shall be impervious for a height of not less than 6 feet from floor level and shall be painted a light colour.

General and Supplementary.

22. The Council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for that purpose.

23. Every person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any Act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

And the Honorable Ewen Paul Cameron, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO APARTMENT HOUSES:

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Apartment House Regulations, 1955 and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1955.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

“Apartment” means any part of a building or any room or rooms in a building which part or room or rooms is or are used or intended to be used for the purpose of residence by any occupier or occupiers other than members of the family or employees of the proprietor having a right to the exclusive use thereof together with a right to use in common with others any kitchen, bathroom, laundry, or sanitary facilities in the building but does not include—

- (a) any part of or room or rooms in a boarding-house or a common lodging-house;
- (b) any part of or room or rooms in a licensed victualler's premises;
- (c) any suite of rooms being a portion or portions of a building and forming a complete residence including kitchen and bathroom and sanitary conveniences, under the exclusive control of the occupier.

“Apartment-house” means any house, tent or edifice building or other structure permanent or otherwise and any part of such premises which is used in whole or in part by more than three persons as apartments.

“Approved” means approved in writing by the Council.

“Inmate” of an apartment-house includes all persons residing therein.

“Proprietor” of an apartment-house includes the owner the occupier or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Tenant” means the occupier of an apartment in an apartment-house and includes any person residing in such apartment.

3. Every person who is required by the Health Acts to register an apartment-house shall apply to the Council in the form prescribed in the Schedule to the Registration (Health Acts) Regulations and shall submit with such application a sketch plan of the building drawn to a scale of not less than 8 feet to 1 inch showing the position and dimensions of each compartment (including outbuildings) and the purpose for which it is intended to use each compartment; together with any other plans and specifications required by the Council.

4. Every person who proposes to add to or alter the building of an apartment-house shall apply to the Council for approval of the plans and supply such information as the Council requires regarding the proposed uses of every compartment.

5. Every application for renewal of the registration of an apartment-house shall be made to the Council in the form prescribed for that purpose in the Registration (Health Acts) Regulations on or before the fifteenth day of November in each year and shall be accompanied by the certificate of registration then in force.

6. No alteration in the approved uses of rooms in an apartment-house shall be made without the consent in writing of the Council.

7. An application for registration or for renewal of registration of an apartment-house shall not be granted unless the house complies to the Council's satisfaction with the requirements of these Regulations and of any other relevant regulations or by-laws: Provided that the Council may grant an application conditionally on specified improvements to bring the premises into conformity with such regulations or by-laws being effected by a date fixed by the Council.

8. Every compartment in an apartment-house shall comply as to ventilation and lighting with the relevant provisions of the Housing (Standard of Habitation) Regulations 1939 or any regulations amending or replacing the same, and of any by-law of the Council.

9. Sleeping accommodation for tenants in an apartment-house shall comply with the following standards:—

- (a) The floor area of bedrooms shall be at the rate of 60 square feet per person, with a minimum of 80 square feet. A child under three years shall not be counted as a person; two such children shall count as one person.
- (b) The minimum horizontal dimension of any bedroom shall be 7 feet.

- (c) The minimum height from floor to ceiling or if there is no ceiling to the underside of rafters shall be 8 feet 6 inches except that when the room is in an attic the height over at least half the area of the room shall be at least 8 feet 6 inches and the walls in no part shall be less than 5 feet 6 inches high.
 - (d) One or more windows shall be provided opening directly to the external air and having a clear unobstructed glass area of at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room and shall be so constructed as to be openable to an extent of at least one-twentieth of the floor area.
10. An apartment-house shall be provided with at least one closet and one bathroom where the total number of inmates does not exceed eight; at least two closets and two bathrooms where the number of inmates exceeds eight but does not exceed twelve; and at least one additional closet and one additional bathroom for every additional ten or fraction of ten inmates. If required by the Council separate closets and bathrooms shall be provided for each sex. Where only one closet is provided for either sex it shall not be located in the bathroom.
11. Each closet shall have a floor constructed or covered with impervious material, shall be provided with ventilation and artificial lighting to the satisfaction of the Council and shall comply with the provisions of any relevant regulations and by-laws.
12. Every bathroom shall be totally enclosed and fitted with a good and sufficient door; shall have a floor constructed or covered with impervious material and shall be equipped with a suitable bath fixed in position and having a water tap over it if a suitable water supply is available and a waste pipe leading from it to an impervious drain. A shower recess may be permitted by the Council in lieu of a bath. When required by the Council means of delivering hot water to the bath or shower shall be provided.
13. A bathroom may contain a water closet but may not contain a pan closet or a chemical closet.
14. Every laundry for the use of tenants shall be provided with a copper and at least one wash trough, with water laid on to the copper and each trough if a suitable water supply is available and with waste pipes from each trough to an impervious drain.
15. Every kitchen shall be equipped with an appliance which is efficient, safe and readily accessible for the cooking of food, and when required by the Council with a sink having a water tap over it and a waste pipe leading to an impervious drain. Where a kitchen contains more than one cooking appliance there shall be one sink to every three cooking appliances.
16. Every gas stove which is not situated in a fireplace or fire recess shall be provided with a suitable hood or canopy discharging into the open air by means of a pipe not less than 6 inches in diameter fitted with a cowl at the outer end to prevent down-draught.
- The receptive surface of the hood or canopy shall be not less in area than the total floor area covered by the stove.
17. No cooking appliance shall be placed or remain in or upon any balcony, balconette, bathroom portico, stair, landing, verandah or passageway or any compartment other than a kitchen-living room or kitchen.
18. All detached sleepouts and tents forming part of apartment-houses shall comply with Regulation 3131 of the Uniform Building Regulations.
19. Every apartment-house shall be provided with means of egress complying in all respects with the requirements of buildings of Class III. occupancy in Chapter 27 of the Uniform Building Regulations or any amendment thereof.
20. (1) Every apartment-house of more than one storey shall be constructed of fire-resisting materials: Provided that the Council may waive this requirement in the case of an apartment-house which was in use as such at the coming into operation of these Regulations.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation "fire-resisting material" includes—

(a) in the case of external walls or walls enclosing any stairway or lift shaft—

brick stone concrete or other hard durable and incombustible material; and

(b) in the case of partitions—any of the materials specified in clause (a) hereof, and also terra cotta, cinder concrete, gypsum blocks, and steel framing covered on both sides with expanded metal lathing and cement mortar;

Provided that on the uppermost floor wood studding covered with any of the materials specified in clause (d) hereof may be used if allowed by the Council's building by-laws;

(c) in the case of stairs and landings—redgum jarrah or other approved hardwood not less than 2 inches (nominal) thick;

(d) in the case of ceilings and soffits—sheet metal of not less than 28 gauge, fibro-cement, fibrous plaster, or plaster on metal lathing or expanded metal;

(e) in the case of roofs—reinforced concrete slates tiles fibro-cement or galvanized iron.

21. The proprietor shall provide approved artificial lighting for all stairways, landings and passageways.

22. The proprietor shall not allow any dog to be or to remain in any, bedroom, bathroom, common room or any kitchen or pantry.

23. (1) The proprietor of an apartment-house shall be responsible for the cleanliness of the whole of the premises with the exception of compartments to which any tenant has the exclusive right, and shall keep or cause to be kept all appurtenances including baths, lavatories, sanitary conveniences and fittings and laundries at all times in a state of cleanliness.

(2) Such proprietor shall be responsible for keeping the whole of the premises in a proper state of repair.

24. (1) The proprietor shall keep or cause to be kept the yards and other areas around an apartment-house and all sheds and other outbuildings at all times clean and free from household rubbish, offensive matter and any accumulations of material likely to give harbourage to rats and other vermin.

(2) The proprietor shall provide a receptacle or receptacles complying with the Council's By-law for the reception of household garbage from each apartment and shall see that all receptacles are placed where required for emptying on the days appointed by the Council.

25. Upon receipt of a notice in writing from the Council or its authorized officer the proprietor shall take such steps as are specified to rid the house and its surroundings of any such rubbish, offensive matter or other accumulations, or to effect such repairs as are required.

26. The proprietor shall—

(a) keep a register in which he shall enter or cause to be entered in respect of every apartment the particulars prescribed hereunder:—

Designation or Description of Room or Rooms Comprising the Apartment.	Name of Tenant.	Number of Persons for whom Beds are Provided in each Bedroom.	Date when Tenancy Commenced.	Date when Tenancy Terminated.

(b) enter the particulars prescribed in the first four columns on the day on which each tenant commences his tenancy and in the fifth column on the day when a tenancy is terminated;

(c) record any alterations as to rooms or number of occupants as soon as they occur;

- (d) on demand by an authorized officer of the Council produce such register for inspection and allow such officer to make any extracts therefrom.

27. The Council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations and at its own cost do and provide all acts, matters and things as are necessary for that purpose.

28. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

REGULATIONS SPECIFYING SUBSTANCES AND MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE QUANTITIES THEREOF FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTIONS 221 AND 222 OF THE HEALTH ACT 1928 AS AMENDED BY THE HEALTH ACT 1935 AND THE HEALTH (AMENDMENT) ACT 1954.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Poisonous Substances Regulations 1955" and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1955.

2. No person shall manufacture or sell—

(a) any toys; or

(b) any wall paper decorative paper or paper serviettes—

in or upon which there is any paint colour facing dressing size or varnish or other matter containing any of the substances named in Column One of the First Schedule hereto in excess of the quantity set out in Column Two of the said Schedule opposite the name of such substance.

3. No person shall manufacture or sell—

(a) any paper used in the enclosure of any food (other than butter) which paper contains or has any paint colour facing dressing size or varnish therein or thereon which contains any of the substances named in Column One of the Second Schedule hereto in excess of the quantity set out in Column Two of the said Schedule opposite the name of such substance;

(b) any paper used in the enclosure of butter which paper contains or has any paint colour facing dressing size or varnish therein or thereon which contains—

(i) any of the substances (other than arsenic) named in Column One of the Second Schedule hereto in excess of the quantity set out in Column Two of the said Schedule opposite the name of such substance; or

(ii) any of the substances named in Column One of the Third Schedule hereto in excess of the quantity set out in Column Two of the said Schedule opposite the name of such substance; or

(c) any textile substance or leather intended for or capable of being used in the manufacture of human clothing (including hats and boots) and containing or dressed or weighted or filled with any of the substances named in Column One of the Fourth Schedule hereto in excess of the quantity set out in Column Two of the said Schedule opposite the name of such substance.

Provided that any person who manufactures or sells leather (other than sole leather or other leather customarily sold by weight) dressed with barium sulphate or other compound of barium insoluble in water shall not solely by reason thereof be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

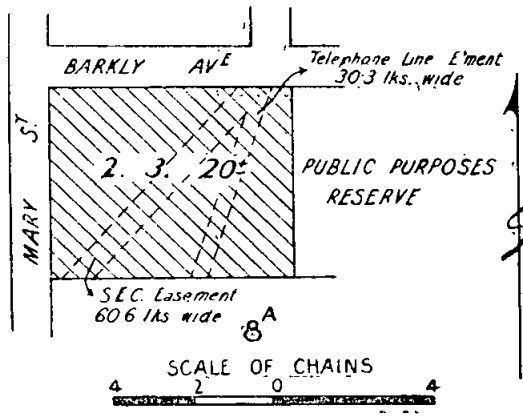
