# DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 33 OF THE LABOUR AND INDUSTRY ACT 1953.

#### POTTERY BOARD.

Clause 2 of the Determination published in Government Gazette No. 985 of the 22nd November, 1954, shall be replaced by the following clause:—

#### APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

2.
