IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Landlord and Tenant Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

*Citation and Commencement.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Landlord and Tenant Regulations No. 4 and shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1955.

*Agreements Pursuant to the Provisions of Section 4 (4) of the "Landlord and Tenant Act 1954."*

2. Every agreement pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (4) of section four of the *Landlord and Tenant Act 1954* shall be in the form or to the effect of the form in the First Schedule to these Regulations with such variations thereto as the circumstances of the particular case demand and shall be executed in duplicate and one copy thereof shall be retained by the lessor or intending lessor and the other copy by the lessee or intending lessee.

*Agreements to Have Explanatory Memorandum Endorsed Thereon.*

3. Every form of agreement to be entered into pursuant to the said sub-section (4) shall have endorsed thereon in clear writing, typing or printing an explanatory memorandum in the form of the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM ON EFFECT OF SECTION 4 OF THE LANDLORD AND TENANT ACT 1954.

*Class of Dwelling-houses to which Section Applies.*

The power to lessors and lessees to agree to a fair rent applies to any dwelling-house which was leased at the 31st December 1940 at a rent (not including the rent of any goods then leased therewith) of not less than the rate of £2 10s. per week and which, at the 1st November 1954—

- (a) was unoccupied; or
- (b) being occupied, was occupied by a lessee solely for residential purposes; and
  - (i) was not a boarding-house or a common lodging-house within the meaning of the *Health Act 1928*; or
  - (ii) was not sublet in part to any person.

*Under the Health Act 1928—*

"Boarding-house" means any house (not being the licensed premises of a licensed victualler) in which more than five persons exclusive of the family of the proprietor thereof are lodged or boarded for hire or reward from week to week or for more than a week;

"Common lodging-house" means any house (not being the licensed premises of a licensed victualler) in which persons are harbored or lodged for hire for a single night or for less than a week at any one time or any part of which is let for any term less than a week at a time.

*Method of Ascertaining Rent where Dwelling-house was Let Furnished.*

Where, at the 31st December 1940, a dwelling-house was let furnished, a part of the rent shall be deemed to have been payable as the rent of the premises and the remainder in respect of the goods in proportion to the relative values of the premises and of the goods respectively.

In the absence of evidence as to the relative values of the premises and the goods four-fifths of the total rent is to be deemed to have been payable as the rent of the premises.

*Fixation of Fair Rent by Agreement.*

The lessor and the lessee of a dwelling-house to which the section applies (including, where the premises are unoccupied, an intending lessor and intending lessee) may fix the fair rent thereof by agreement.

The agreement must be in writing in the prescribed form.

The fair rent so agreed upon becomes for all purposes the fair rent of the premises from the day specified in that behalf in the agreement but such day must not be earlier than the day upon which the agreement is entered into.

The parties may insert in the agreement fixing the fair rent a provision that no further proceedings for the fixing of the fair rent of the premises shall be commenced by either of the parties to the agreement during a period specified in that behalf in the agreement.

If the agreement contains no provision of the kind referred to in the last preceding paragraph, then neither party can seek a determination of the fair rent by a Fair Rents Board for the period of six months from the day upon which the fair rent is altered by the agreement, unless in the meantime there has been some substantial alteration of the premises, or of the goods leased therewith.

*Determination of Fair Rent by Board.*

No lessor or lessee is bound to enter into an agreement fixing the fair rent. If the parties do not choose to fix the fair rent by agreement, then, subject to the *Landlord and Tenant Act 1948*, either party is at liberty to apply to the appropriate Fair Rents Board for a determination of the fair rent.

The Board may then determine the fair rent to be such an amount as it considers equitable having regard to the matters referred to in section 21 of the *Landlord and Tenant Act 1948* but based on the capital value of the premises at the date of the application instead of as at the 31st December 1940.

*Effect of Section on Evictions.*

Section 4 makes no change in the law as to evictions. A lessee of premises to which the section applies can be ejected only upon an order in that behalf of a court of petty sessions obtained on one of the prescribed grounds contained in the *Landlord and Tenant Act 1948*.

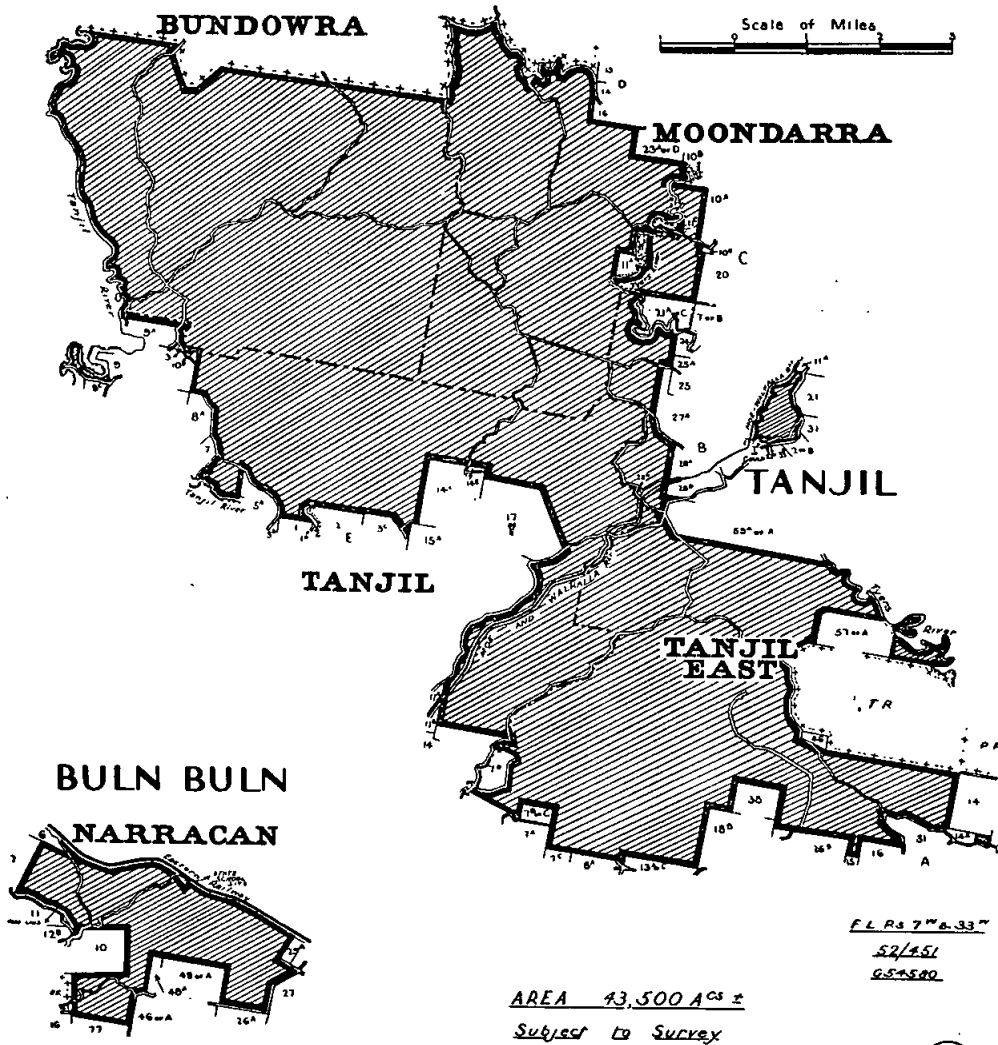
