Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that to the weekly earnings of each piece-worker shall be added the sum of 30s. in the case of males and 20s. 6d. in the case of females for each full week worked (or a pro-rata amount according to the time actually worked if less than a full week is worked).
