Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the areas of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

AMENDMENT NT OF FOURTH SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1928 (No. 3748).

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section twenty-four of the Poisons Act 1928, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria do by this my Proclamation add to Part II. of the Fourth Schedule to the said Act the names of the following substances and preparations:—

Dieldrin and all substitution and/or addition products of dimethanonaphthalene whether described as Dieldrin, Aldrin, Endrin, Isodrin, or by any other name and preparations or admixtures thereof except preparations containing less than 2 per cent. of such substance and labelled as follows:-

- (a) with a statement of the percentage of Dieldrin, and

(b) with the following warning:—

"Not to be used for spraying into the air as for flies nor for general application to large areas nor for spraying bedding. When used indoors apply directly with brush or swab. Ayoid inhalation or contact with skin or food-


NOTICE is hereby given that Housing Commission, on the 28th day of June, 1955, resolved as follows:—

- 2. (a) Teachers so nominated shall while undertaking courses as aforesaid-
  - (i) teach as assistants in schools to which they are for the time being attached;
  - (ii) be granted full salary.
- (b) Time spent in undertaking courses as aforesaid shall be deemed to be service in the Education Department.
- 3. Each teacher so nominated shall as a condition of the nomination enter into the agreement referred to in clause 4 hereof.

- 4. The Minister is authorized to enter into an agreement in the form of the Schedule hereto and upon the conditions therein contained with each teacher nominated pursuant to and in accordance with this Regulation.
- 5. Each nomination shall be for one year only but may be continued for a further period under such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Director and approved by the Minister.
- 6. Teachers nominated as aforesaid by the Director for courses at the University of Melbourne shall be granted such remission of fees as may be provided in the regulations of the University.

#### AMENDMENT No. 1.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Workers Compensation Acts and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby amend the "Workers Compensation Regulations 1954" as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. Sub-clause (1) of clause 5 of the said Regulations is hereby revoked and the following sub-clause substituted therefor:—
  - "(1) wages, salaries, commission and all other earnings paid in cash including pay in respect of holiday, sickness and long service leave before the deduction of income tax or other amounts."
- 2. Clause 15 of the said Regulations is hereby revoked and the following clause substituted therefor:—
  - "15 (1) Where the premium is based on gross earnings the premium paid in respect of each period of indemnity shall be adjusted in accordance with the gross earnings of all persons in each class included in the indemnity during such period and for the purpose of enabling the Commissioner or Approved Insurer to so adjust such premium the employer shall within one month from the expiry of such period of indemnity or such further period as may be allowed in writing supply the Commissioner or the Approved Insurer with the correct classified account of all gross earnings of all such persons of each class employed by him during the period of indemnity.
  - (2) Where the premium is charged at a per capita rate the premium paid in respect of each period of indemnity shall be adjusted in accordance with the maximum number of each class of worker employed at the same time during such period and for the purpose of enabling the Commissioner or the Approved Insurer to so adjust such premium the employer shall within one month from the expiry of such period of indemnity or such further period as may be allowed in writing supply the Commissioner or the Approved Insurer with a correct account of such maximum number of workers of each class employed by him at the same time during the period of indemnity."
- 3. In condition No. 9 contained in Form 1 of the said Regulations for the expression "50 per cent." there shall be substituted the expression "75 per centum."
- 4. In the Schedule to Form 2 of the said Regulations the following expressions are hereby revoked:—
  - (a) "Estimated number of Employees";
  - (b) "Subject to adjustment in terms of condition No. 9 hereof".
- 5. Condition No. 7 contained in Form 2 of the said Regulations is hereby revoked.
- 6. Condition No. 9 contained in Form 2 of the said Regulations is hereby revoked and the following condition substituted therefor:—
  - "8. In the event of the Insured not having employed any employee during any one year of insurance 75 per centum of the prescribed Minimum Premium may be allowed as a rebate and be applied towards the next Renewal Premium."

If any such owner or occupier shall, within the time limited by such notice, fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such rats, ants, vermin, or pests, or noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier, and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

- 2. (a) Every owner or occupier of a property or premises shall keep such property or premises free of Argentine ants.
- (b) If the Health Inspector finds or believes that Argentine ants exist in or about any property or premises, he may give notice to the owner or occupier thereof to forthwith effectively destroy such Argentine ants.
- (c) Any owner or occupier so notified who, within seven days after service of the notice, has not effectively destroyed all Argentine ants in or about his property or premises shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 3. If at the expiration of seven days after service of the notice referred to in clause 2 (b) hereof on any owner or occupier of any property or premises such owner or occupier has not complied with the requirements thereof the Council may—
  - (i) cause measures to be taken to effectively destroy any Argentine ants existing in or about any such property or premises at the expense of the owner or occupier thereof; and
  - (ii) recover the cost thereof as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 4. Every person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence against this By-law continues after a conviction by any Court for such offence.
- 5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Footscray.

The owner or person apparently in control of any motor-car or other vehicle kept standing (whether unattended or not) in any street shall when requested by a member of the Police Force or an officer of the Council give to such member of the Police Force or officer information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor-car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor-car or vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law.
- 3. 'Motor-car' includes any vehicle propelled by internal combustion, steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any other power and used or intended for use on any highway, and includes an articulated motor-car, a motor-cycle, and a motor-tractor.
- 'Vehicle' includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power.
- 4. Any wilful contravention of this By-law shall be an offence.
- 5. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 6. By-law No. 131 of the City of Port Melbourne is hereby repealed."

And any person who contravenes any of the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be guilty of an offence.

Every person who drives any cattle from any point not within the said shire into, on to, or along any street or road within the shire shall prior to so doing give notice to the secretary of the shire for the time being of his intention so to do and shall simultaneously therewith furnish to the said secretary the particulars following, that is to say:

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several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested, or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
